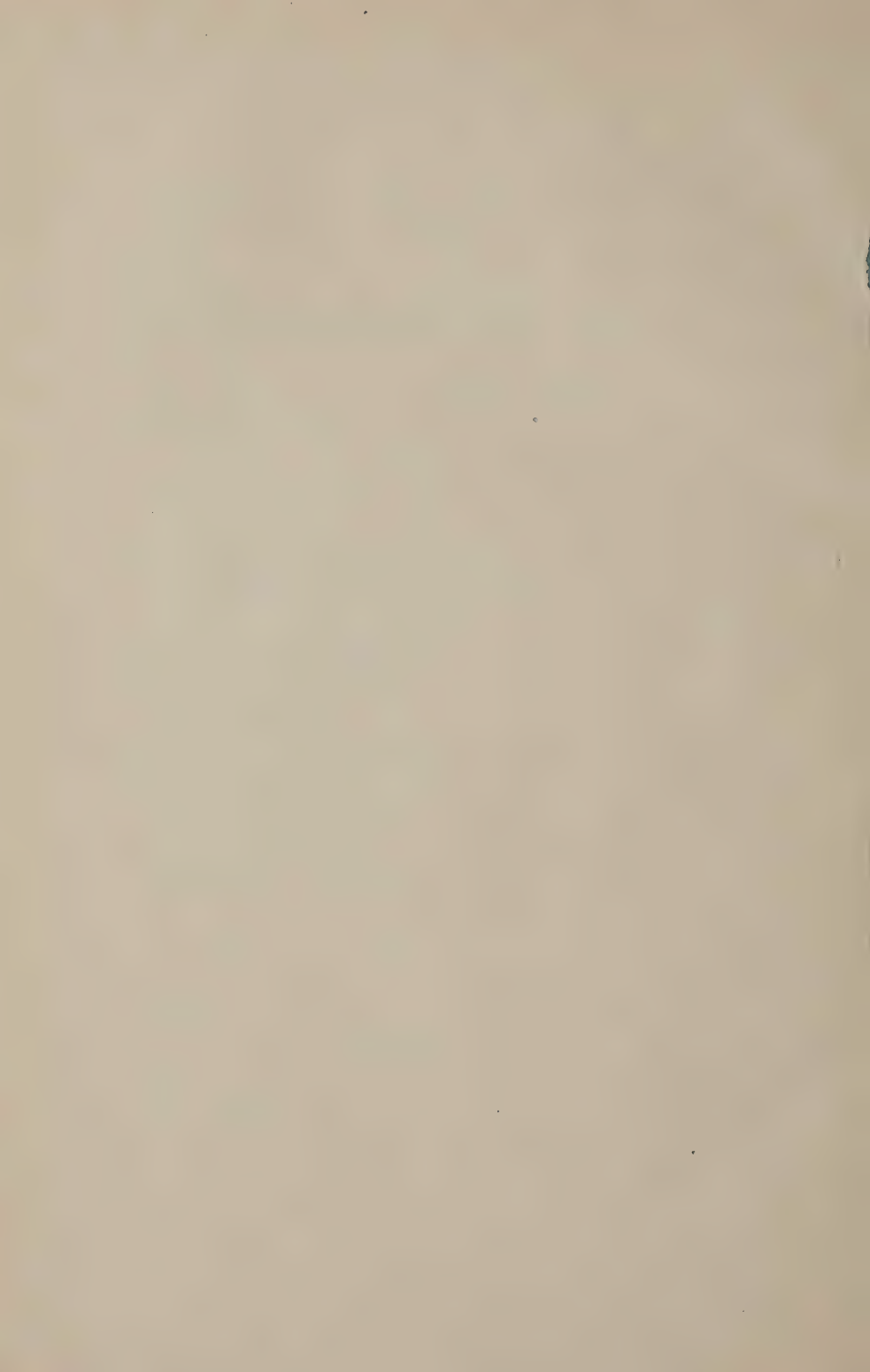

The great majority of criminal cases are prosecutions for drunkenness.
