

WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING TOWN OF MADBURY, N. H.

March 11, 1958

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Madbury, County of Strafford and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Madbury on Tuesday, the 11th day of March A.D. at 7:30 o'clock in the evening to act upon the following articles.

ARTICLE 1. To choose the following Town Officers.

A town clerk for the ensuing year.

A selectman for the ensuing three years.

A treasurer for the ensuing year.

A collector of taxes for the ensuing year.

Two auditors for the ensuing year.

A trustee of trust funds for the ensuing three years.

ARTICLE 2. To choose all other town officers.

ARTICLE 3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow a sum or sums not exceeding in the aggregate \$7500. in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the current municipal year, and to issue in the name and on the credit of the Town negotiable notes therefor, said notes to be paid in the current municipal year from taxes collected during the current municipal year.

ARTICLE 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$326.70 for class V highways to match the sum of \$2,178.03 to be contributed by the State.

- ARTICLE 5. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum not exceeding \$2,504.73 for the purpose of making improvements to the following Class V roads within the Town: Mast and Freshet such sums to be raised through the issuance of bonds or notes under and in compliance with the provisions of chapter 83, laws of 1951 as amended by chapter 31, laws of 1953, and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the date and place of payment of such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other steps as may be necessary to negotiate such bonds or notes as shall be to the best interests of the Town of Madbury.
- ARTICLE 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$70.00 for the Seacoast Regional Development Association.
- ARTICLE 7. To see what action the Town will take to raise and appropriate the sum of 'five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for purchase of a fire truck at a future date. Said \$500.00 to be placed in the "Fire Truck Capital Reserve Fund" created in 1956 under Article 9 of the 1956 Warrant.
- ARTICLE 8. To see what action the town will take to raise and appropriate the sum of Eighty-eight dollars and fifty cents (\$88.50) to pay yearly premiums on insurance for members of the Volunteer Fire Department.
- ARTICLE 9. To see what action the Town will take relative to the playing of Beano in the Town of Madbury.
- ARTICLE 10. To see what action the Town will take on the proposed budget for the current year.
- ARTICLE 11. To see if the Town will vote to change the building code in part or in whole.

ARTICLE 12. To see if the Town will vote to adopt as a Town Ordinance, for the protection of the clams and oysters within the Town limits, the Regulations for the Taking and Possessing of Clams, Clam Worms, and Oysters, promulgated as of February 1, 1958, by the Director of the Fish and Game Department; including the ten dollar penalty for any violation thereof, and all other provisions: as therein more fully set forth; and to delegate to the said Director and the Officers of the Fish and Game Department the authority to enforce said ordinance and regulations in the Town's behalf within the Town limits; such ordinance to remain effective until these regulations are changed or superseded by the Director of the Fish and Game Department.

ARTICLE 13. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

ARTICLE 14. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

RECORD OF TOWN MEETING

March 12, 1957

ARTICLE 1. Balloting for town officers:

For Town Clerk: Edna P. Twombly had 20 votes and was declared elected as town clerk for the ensuing year. The oath of office was then administered by Moderator Kenneth S. Morrow.

For Selectman for the ensuing three years: Paul M. Raynes had 31 votes and was declared elected. The thanks of the townspeople to Richard G. Hale for his faithful service to the town in the office of selectman for the past twenty years was expressed by a standing vote.

For Treasurer for the ensuing year: Loretta J. Morrow had 28 votes and was declared elected.

For Tax Collector for the ensuing year: Dorothy S. Dugan has 29 votes and was declared elected.

For Auditors for the ensuing year: Merrill S. Huntley and Charles S. Jennison each having 15 votes were declared elected.

For Trustee of Trust Funds for the ensuing three Years: Harold S. Jones had five votes and was declared elected.

ARTICLE 2. Voted that the selectmen be authorized to choose all other town officers.

ARTICLE 3. Voted to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow a sum or sums not exceeding in the aggregate \$7500 in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the ensuing municipal year, and to issue in the name and on the credit of the Town negotiable notes therefor, said notes to be paid in the current municipal year from taxes collected during the current municipal year.

- ARTICLE 4. Voted to raise \$268.34 for Class V high-ways to match the sum of \$1788.93 to be contributed by the State.
- ARTICLE 5. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 for purchase of a fire truck at a future date. Said \$500 to be placed in the "Fire Truck Capital Reserve Fund" created in 1956 under Article 9 of the 1956 Warrant.
- ARTICLE 6. Voted to table the article to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$70 for the Seacoast Regional Development Association.
- ARTICLE 7. Voted to establish a Planning Board of seven members with duties set forth by State Law, to make a study of the Town's development and to report to the Town appropriate recommendations for the promotion and maintenance of the Town's best development. The Board to consist of one selectman and six other citizens appointed by the selectmen.

Following the recess for lunch Selectman Daniel W. Hoyt announced the appointment of Edward P. Jennison to fill out the unexpired term of John V. Dahlberg as Trustee of Trust Funds and that of Everett H. Day to a new three year term on the Board of Directors of the Building Code.

ARTICLE 8. Voted to include in the Building Code an ordinance that no junk yard shall be established or operated in the Town of Madbury without a written permit from the Building Code Directors and the payment in advance of a \$100 fee. For each calendar year an annual fee of \$100 shall be paid to the Town Treasurer, and upon non-payment by March first all privileges of operating such a junk yard shall automatically expire. All junk yards licensed shall be required to meet all N. H.

State standards for the operation of such facilities. This ordinance to take effect on passage. The definition of a junk yard shall be a place where second hand iron and metals are bought and sold as a business.

ARTICLE 9. Voted to table the article to see if the Town will join the Southeastern New Hampshire Regional Planning Committee and appropriate \$200 as the Town's share of the two year development program for the said Committee.

ARTICLE 10. The proposed budget for the current year of \$15,063.34 was approved as printed.

ARTICLE 11. Reports were received from the Building Code Directors and the Fire Chief.

ARTICLE 12. Voted to hold the 1958 annual town meeting in the evening, the hour to be determined by the selectmen.

Voted to support naming the Air Force Base at Newington the Pease Air Force Base.

REPORT OF FIRE DEPARTMENT

December, 1957 marked the tenth anniversary of the incorporation of the Madbury Volunteer Fire Department. In ten years we have progressed from just an idea to an active department, composed of the basic truck supplied by the town, two portable pumps, and forestry equipment for thirty men.

The past year has seen the Pacific Marine Portable Pump reconditioned, the addition of two 275 gallon auxiliary tanks for use with our portable pumps as supplementary tank units.

In an effort to improve our comunications, a two way radio has been purchased through Civil Defense, with Fire Department funds, and will be installed for use this spring.

The knowledge of fire fighting techniques for our personnel has been increased through training meetings and attendance at the New Hampshire Fire Chief's Club annual Fire School.

Among the activities of the Department are, the recording of training with actual fire, on color slides, and production of a short movie illustrating the use of our equipment.

Activities for fellowship and fund raising were, a "Lamb Roast" at Col. Putney's, Chicken barbecue and suppers at the station, and a raffle.

For the protection of personnel, the Department purchased an Accident Insurance and it is hoped the townspeople will provide funds for its renewal at Town Meeting.

I wish, personally, to thank all those who have cooperated with the Fire Department, and invite those who can to join us in improving the Fire Forces of the Town of Madbury.
