TENTATIVE WARRANT STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Madison, in the county of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Madison on Tuesday, March 9th, 1948, at nine of the clock, in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing, including Delegates to State Constitutional Convention.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

As follows:

3. To see what action the town will take in regard to discounts on taxes.

4. To see what sums of money the town will authorize the selectmen to hire in anticipation of taxes.

5. To see if the town will vote to include all present Highway Districts in 1 District under the supervision of one Summer Highway Agent.

6. To see if the town will vote to combine Snow Removal and Winter Sanding under the supervision of Winter Highway Agent.

7. To see if town will vote to instruct the selectmen to turn highway funds over to the agent as needed and when available said agent to pay all highway bills from his account.

8. To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to sell the Cletrac Tractor and Plow.

9. To see if the town will vote to instruct the

selectmen to trade the Ford Truck and authorize them to raise and appropriate money to carry out the trade.

10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for alterations at the I. O. O. F. Hall.

To transact any other business which may legally come before the meeting.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Madison:

The school year ending June 30, 1947 was historic in New Hampshire education. During this year twelve Lay-Professional Councils of thirty-six members each on a state wide basis, were formed for the purpose of studying New Hampshire schools and advising on their program. These 432 members and hundreds of guests studied the purposes and curriculum of elementary. secondary, adult, higher, and vocational education in the state; policies on cooperation among school districts; financial policies; and the responsibility of local, state and federal agencies for the welfare of the educational system of our state. The conclusions of the twelve committees were coordinated in a single report and published by the State Board of Education. This report is an outstanding contribution to the field of education and should be read by every citizen.

One of the most important outcomes of this work was the stimulus to greater cooperation between citizens, parents and members of the profession. Our schools would benefit greatly by similar projects on a local scale. This is being done in two districts through recently formed Parent-Teacher Associations.

Of primary importance was an act by the 1947 Legislature whereby state aid was increased to \$2,000,000.00. Most of our towns benefitted materially by this, with a consequent relief of real estate taxation.

But the problems of our schools never cease. A marked increase in school population in most towns, increases in cost in all departments, and the scarcity of qualified teachers raise important questions that demand the serious consideration of every citizen. In your schools today are your future selectmen, representatives, school board members, doctors, lawyers, teachers, and merchants. They must be trained adequately to discharge the responsibilities on the local. state and national level that you now bear. Teachers for the present year are: Headmaster Lorne E. Hulsman Ass't Mrs. Faith Twombley Junior High Mrs. Erma Lyman Corner Mrs. Martha Kelley Silver Lake Mrs. Manora Clayton

During the latter part of 1946-47 a Citizens' Committee was formed to work in conjunction with the School Board to perfect plans for the reorganization of the six lower grades. The primary grades of 1, 2, and 3 are now located in the Silver Lake School and grades 4, 5, and 6 in the Corner School. This places under each of the two teachers three grades, makes for more homogenous grouping, and is resulting in much more efficient instruction. The installation of oil-burning heaters and running water in each school adds greatly to the comfort and convenience of the pupils and teachers.

Three elementary teachers accepted with appreciation the provision of financial assistance for summer school attendance and studied during the six-week session at the University of New Hampshire. The result shows in renewed professional enthusiasm and the use of many valuable methods for the improvement of instruction.

The use of instructional motion pictures shown approximately twice a month during the year was instituted last year. Most of the pictures dealt with the social sciences and the sciences. The teachers report that these have proved to be an important addition to instruction in these fields.

The sincere and cordial cooperation of members of the School Board, teachers, parents, citizens and pupils is heartily appreciated.
