TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Hampton in the County of Belknap in said state, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town House in said New Hampton on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To choose a delegate to the Constitutional Convention.

4. To choose one trustee of Trust Funds for three years.

5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the repair of Highways and Bridges and make appropriation for the same.

6. To see if the Town will vote to accept State-Aid, to be expended on the Robie Road so-called, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,571.00 for the same, the State contributing \$5,142.00. 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the improvement of Highways and Bridges, this sum to be expended under the supervision of the Selectmen.

8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of Class V roads.

9. To set apart and establish as a capital reserve fund, as authorized by Chapter 160 of the Laws of 1943, and amendments thereto, the sum of \$36,500.00 received from the United States for flowage rights and easements in the following portions of public highways: (a) Easterly half of Central Bridge; (b) Approach Road to Central Bridge from bridge easterly to 395-foot contour line; (c) River Road, from junction with Bridge Approach Road southerly to 395-foot contour line; (d) Blake Brook Road, from junction with River Road easterly to 395-foot contour line, said capital reserve fund to be used for the alteration, reconstruction or improvement of the portions of said bridge and highways in which easements were acquired, and to authorize the payment to the trustees of trust funds, the said sum of \$36,500.00 as a capital reserve fund for said purposes.

10. (By request) To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the tarring of road leading from Plaisted School road toward the Dean Babbitt place.

11. To see what action the Town will take in regard to new equipment for snow removal and make appropriation for the same.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the control of the White Pine Blister Rust. 13. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.

14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Home Day.

15. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of old cemeteries.

16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care and maintenance of the New Hampton Village Cemetery.

17. (By request) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$171.00, which is 1/100th of 1% of the assessed valuation of the Town, to the Lakes Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region.

18. (By request) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$85.50 to the Newfound Region Association, to aid in advertising and other activities for the benefit of the Town, in cooperation with other towns of the Newfound Region.

19. (By request) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for Forest Fire Equipment, the money to be spent at the discretion of the Warden and the Chief of the Fire Department.

20. (By request) To see if the Town will vote a sum of money for the support of the Laconia Hospital and make appropriation for the same.

21. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the purchase of chairs for the Town House.

22. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

23. To transact any other business that may properly come before said meeting.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the New Hampton School Board:

My third annual report as your Superintendent of Schools is hereby respectfully submitted. This year has seen a more thorough analysis of the school program in conjunction with the survey undertaken in accordance with the vote of the School District Meeting in March, 1946. Definite recommendations contained in a published report will be available at this year's School District Meeting. The people of New Hampton have demonstrated their confidence in the present school board, and it is to be hoped that the school board will feel that a program for school improvement can be recommended to the community this year.

New Hampton is fortunate in staffing its schools with teachers who are interested in the welfare of the pupils under their direction. This year two additions to the staff brought Miss Edith Germane, a graduate of the University of Missouri, and Mrs. Edith Plant, a graduate of Plymouth Teachers College, to the Village and Plaisted schools, respectfully. Miss Marion Woodman and Mrs. Bertha Cote left the service of the school district after many years of conscientious service.

The reading program introduced last spring has proved beneficial to the pupils of the district and appreciated by the teachers who have seen its merits. The employment of Mrs. Estelle Watts as music supervisor for a day and a half a week has provided music instruction for all the pupils in all the schools and has been appreciated by teachers and pupils alike.

It is a pleasure to serve as your Superintendent of Schools and to work with the New Hampton School Board nd teachers.

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL NURSE

Summary of the health work done by the school nurse for the past year:

Pupils inspected: 107; School Visits, 75; Home Visits, 33.

Pupils have been weighed and measured twice. Vision tests have been completed with the Telebinocular. Individual inspections have been made when necessary for head and skin conditions.

Dr. Feiner did the physical examinations on 80 pupils.

Result of examinations: Defective teeth, 19; defective vision, 5 (5 have been corrected); defective speech, 1; enlarged tonsils, 21; enlarged adenoids 3; enlarged glands, 23; wax in ears, 10; cardiac condition, 2; skin condition, 4.

Two pupils were taken to Dr. Hernandez and 1 pupil to Dr. Leavitt for visiion tests and glasses; 1 pupil had a tonsilectomy; 1 pupil went to the T.B. Clinic.

The Red Cross furnished all of the New Hampton Schools with Vitamin and Cod Liver Oil Tablets.

I wish to thank the Red Cross, the teachers and the school authorities for their cooperation.
