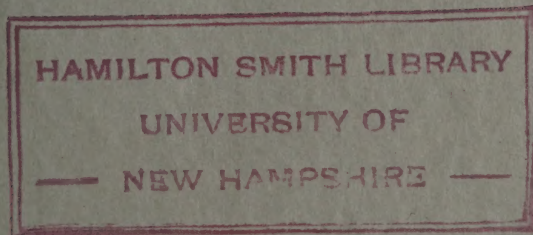

The State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Northwood in the County of Rockingham in said state qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Northwood, on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the year ensuing and make appropriations for the same.

3. To hear the report of the Budget Committee and act thereon.

4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

5. To see if the Town will accept State Aid for construction of the Class II road known as Sherburne Hill Road, and raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,096.50.

Or will accept State Aid for construction of Class V roads and raise and appropriate the sum of \$462.54.

6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town highways.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$900.00 for street lighting.

8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$65.00 for care of cemeteries, as provided in Chapter 55, Section 4, Laws of 1925.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the observance of Memorial Day.

10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate in excess of that required by law for the Northwood Public Library.

11. To see if the Town will vote a discount on such part of taxes as are paid on or before July 15, 1939.

12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for interest on temporary loans.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 to repair the Charles Bennett Road, so-called.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 to purchase a V plow for snow removal.

15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to buy land for parking space at Sandy Beach, and raise and appropriate money for same.

16. Goldsmith Road. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to convey to Kennard E. Goldsmith, "The Bennett Road" from a point on the easterly side of the road, leading to Strafford, as now laid out a distance of 800 feet, more or less, to Bennett Field, in exchange for a conveyance from Kennard E. Goldsmith to the Town of a completely constructed highway, fifty feet wide, leading from the wall of Goldsmith on Strafford Road to the Bennett Road, as now laid out on the southeasterly side of Goldsmith land at land of Bennett.

17. To transact any other business to come before said meeting.

The foregoing Condensed Statement of Net Town Funds brings together the results of all the current financial operations of the town.

It concentrates in one place, a general picture of current town finances, taken as one whole, and contains all the financial factors which enter into that whole.

It presents a summarized account of all the transactions of an entire fiscal year in one statement, and preferably on one page (single or double).

It presents the account strictly in terms of Net Town Funds only, after accounting for, and eliminating, all other items of record.

It is free from minute details which sometimes obscure matters of major importance. Matters of detail may be found in special departmental reports.

It arranges the general sources of Town Funds and the general purposes of Town Expenditures in their logical relations, among themselves, and to each other, and to the total sum involved.

Since the statement is thus generalized, it exhibits some facts and figures which have an important bearing upon financial and operating policies, and which can not be shown in separate departmental reports—which, indeed, can not be shown in any piece-meal manner.

Woodland problems of timber salvage and fire control created in many towns by the September hurricane are of the greatest importance. **GOOD CITIZENSHIP CALLS FOR PERSONAL AND WIDESPREAD ACTION!**

The salvage of every thousand feet of logs which can be sold means money for landowners, wages for workers, employment for trucks, teams and machinery, as well as reduced forest fire hazard for all. If owners of windthrown timber have not yet acted, they should communicate with those who can help. TOWN CHAIRMEN are fully informed; STATE ADVISORY AGENTS can help to start logging by suggesting names of operators and giving other useful advice; FEDERAL AGENCIES are increasing the number of log storage places as rapidly as possible. INDIVIDUALS MUST NOW COOPERATE!

Forest fire danger for several years will be greater than usual. So much work must be done by public agencies to reduce hazard along roadsides, near improved and other exposed areas that many places will remain hazardous for some time to come. INDIVIDUAL LANDOWNERS MUST TAKE A PERSONAL INTEREST! Aid in clean-up work through the Agricultural Conservation Program is available to any woodland owner at \$4.00 per acre on areas up to 15 acres. The County Agent should be consulted.

Support your local Forest Fire Wardens and Deputies. They are planning, with State and Federal agencies, an intensive campaign to control fires. Help them by strict observance of the fire laws. Kindle no open fires without a permit from the Warden except when the ground is covered with snow. Cooperate by reporting fires you may see and in other ways. Fire fighting tool supplies are inadequate and should be reasonably increased by many towns. YOU CAN HELP, AND IT WILL PAY, TO PREVENT FOREST FIRES!

Report of Superintendent of Schools

To the Citizens of Northwood:

One of the most significant trends in modern education is the new emphasis on adult education. According to Mr. Edgar A. Paris, State Supervisor of Adult Education, over 1,200 adults are being reached by classroom education, recreational classes, correspondence courses, and C. C. C. Camp instruction carried on in cooperation with the Federal Works Progress Administration. As part of the Northwood school system, such classes are being carried on at the Ridge Schoolhouse by Dr. John S. French of Northwood. The schedule is as follows:

Mondays, 7-10 P. M. Technical Mathematics.

Tuesdays and Wednesdays, 3-4:30 P. M. Educational Problems.

Fridays, 7-10 P. M. Social Problems.

These classes are free to all interested, and no assignments for outside reading or study are required. Informal discussion is encouraged. Aside from furnishing the place of meeting, there is no expense to the District.

The only limit to the expansion of such adult education is the demand of the community. Part-time classes in agriculture would easily be available under trained leadership. In some countries, local adult education has developed practically into a "People's University." It would seem that America, with our traditions of the Lyceum, the Singing School, and the forum at the general store, should welcome and profit by such opportunities.

Meanwhile the regular work of the schools is making gratifying progress. The health work of the schools, under the present nurse, Miss Margaret Mac-

donald, and her predecessors has borne fruit in the relatively small number of physical defects now appearing in the regular examinations. Dental conditions lead the list; but these are being coped with in the clinic sponsored by the Harvey Lake Woman's Club.

One change in teachers took place this fall, when Mrs. Jean F. Bennett assumed charge of the lower grades at the Ridge School, in place of Miss Ruth Brown, who accepted a position in the schools of Rochester. In order to equalize enrollment in the two rooms, Grades I to V were placed together at the Ridge.

The school property came through the September hurricane quite well, except for the loss of the weather-vane at the Ridge School.
