TOWN WARRANT

State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Orford, in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Orford, on Tuesday the 8th day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act on the following subjects.

- Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers. The polls will be opened from ten o'clock in the A.M. until six o'clock in the P.M. for you to cast your ballot for one Selectman for three years, Town Treasurer for three years, Town Clerk and Road Agent for one year, also to vote on anything that may be on the ballot.
- Article 2. To hear the budget of the Town and raise and appropriate any money recommended therein or pass any vote relative thereto.
- Article 3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year.
- Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate \$32,000.00 for Town Highways and Bridges for the ensuing year, and authorize the withdrawal of Six Thousand, Five Hundred, Sixty-Eight Dollars and Forty-Seven Cents (\$6,568.47) for this purpose, from the Revenue Sharing Fund, established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 with the balance of \$25,431.53 to be raised by Taxation.
- Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate \$500.00 for the Orford Free Library and \$500.00 for the Orford Social Library and authorize the withdrawal of this amount of \$1,000.00 for this purpose from the Revenue Sharing Fund, established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972.
- Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate \$500.00 for the Orford Social Library to pay for needed improvements to the Library, and authorize the withdrawal of this amount for this purpose from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972.
- Article 7. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Insurance purposes.

TOWN WARRANT - Continued

- Article 8. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of electric lights.
- Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.
- Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to sell and administer property acquired by Tax Deed.
- Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$173.00 as its share of the cost of publicizing and promoting the natural attractions of the Dartmouth Lake Sunapee Region.
- Article 12. To see if the Town will accept State Aid for the construction of Class V Roads and raise and appropriate \$659.51 and the State will contribute \$4,396.71.
- Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the Planning Board.
- Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$125.00 to cover expenses of Memorial Day.
- Article 15. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of the Fire Department.
- Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500.00 to be turned over to the Trustees of Trust Funds toward a new Fire Engine.
- Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,500.00 for Ambulance Service.
- Article 18. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Parks Commission and Care of Common, and also for filling and landscaping the Town Beach at Indian Pond.
- Article 19. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Police Department and Equipment.

 Also to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be turned over to the Trustees of Trust Funds toward a car or cruiser.
- Article 20. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of the Orford Community Health Service.

TOWN WARRANT - Continued

- Article 21. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Lebanon Airport.
- Article 22. To see how much money the Town will yote to raise and appropriate for Tax Mapping.
- Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for and receive Federal Disaster Assistance Funds, through the State Disaster Coordinating Office, and to expend the funds so received, to repair the damage to Town Roads and or Bridges, caused by any disaster for which Federal Funds are available.
- Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$440.00 for the continuance of the Baker River Audio Visual Center established by Federal Grant in 1974.
- Article 25. To see if the Town will vote to continue its membership in the Regional Planning Commission, now organized and named the Upper Valley-Lake Sunapee Council, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$579.00 as the Town's share of the annual operating expenses of the Regional Planning Commission to be used in conjunction with other state and federal funds available for planning purposes.
- Article 26. To see what action the Town will take in regards to refuse disposal and how much money it will vote to raise and appropriate for this purpose.
- Article 27. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$450.00 as Orford's contribution to the purchase of medical equipment which will make Cottage Hospital an even better Health Care Center for all residents of Orford.
- Article 28. To hear reports of Agents, Auditors and Committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
- Article 29. To transact any business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF DISTRICT FIRE CHIEF AND TOWN FOR-EST FIRE WARDEN

Since its beginning in 1893, the State Forestry Department has recognized the fact that forest fire prevention and suppression is a joint state and town or city responsibility. Local authorities recommend names of persons to the State Forester, who appoints one person as town or city fire warden and several other persons as town or city deputy fire wardens to a three-year term.

The local forest fire warden controls the kindling of all outside fires, when the ground is not covered with snow, by issuing a written permit for kindling a fire. Permits are only issued at such times and

in such places as the fire warden deems as safe.

The State Forest Fire Service trains the local forest fire organization in modern forest fire prevention and suppression tactics. The State also provides backup personnel and equipment for suppression and prevention activities.

The combination of State and local forces has resulted in one of the smallest acreage loss due to forest fires in the United States for the past 20 years.

REPORT OF ORFORD PLANNING BOARD

The Orford Planning Board has met at regular intervals throughout the year. Our purpose - to protect and preserve for the citizens of Orford the Town's future, its growth and its proper and just development.

The Board has received an application from Mr. Ralph Wright of Haverhill, N. H. to subdivide 60 acres into 10 lots, which are located on the Piermont Height Road and the Piermont-Orford line. This

subdivision is now in the preliminary stage.

We have received an application from Miss Kathleen E. Kane to start a Nursery and Child Care Center, in the Orford Congregational Church. After a public hearing, it was approved by the Board of Selectmen and the Planning Board.

Upper Valley-Lake Sunapee Council and the Town of Piermont have been working to change the regulations of the New Hampshire Air Pollution Commission. The following changes have been made: Limit extension, hardship cases on a case by case basic for towns with a population of under 1,000, this extension is renewed each year.

National Flood Insurance Program - to-date we have not received notification. When received we will have one year to apply and to meet the Federal Insurance Administration requirements. The Board

has been working toward meeting these requirements.

The Board encourages anyone with questions to seek out a board member or to attend a Planning Board Meeting, which is held on the third Monday of each month in the new town office in Orfordville at 7:30 P.M. These meetings are open to the public.

UPPER VALLEY - LAKE SUNAPEE COUNCIL

The Council - until four years ago known as the Upper Valley Planning and Development Commission - has undergone a period of rapid growth and change. From what originated as an economic development association, it has become a comprehensive regional planning agency. And, where it originally served just six towns, it now serves thirty-one communities in New Hampshire and Vermont, from Orford on the North to Charlestown on the South; from Canaan on the East to the three Vermont member towns of Hartford, Norwich and Thetford.

The Council operates on an annual budget of about \$100,000. It is under the direction of a 47 member board of directors composed of two directors from each of its member communities (plus 5 directors-at-large). These directors are appointed by the member communities, set the policies and programs to be administered, and assure complete local control of the Council's activities.

Yet, the membership dues from local communities - Orford's share for the coming year figured on a per capita basis will be just \$579.00 - account for only 30 percent of the Council's revenue. The rest, 70 percent, comes from state and federal sources; sources available to the Council because of its status as a comprehensive regional planning agency recognized by the federal government and the states of New Hampshire and Vermont. In other words, these added sources of revenue have increased the Council's income and thus its ability to serve its members at a two-to-one ratio of service to local dollars spent.

That money has been used for many programs of benefit to the towns. There are major regional programs such as housing, transportation and landfill studies. There are information-gathering programs, in which the Council intervenes with federal sources and assists towns in dealing with the new flood insurance or public works or community development laws - and applying for federal dollars.

There are seminars and workshops on such topical issues as recreation grants and tax mapping or historic preservation. And there is the ever-popular technical assistance program in which the Council staff works directly with Selectmen or the Planning Board on zoning, master plan, subdivision regulations, mapping and other direct assistance.

These are a few of the types of services which the Council has provided in the past year. These types of services will be continued in its new fiscal year, which will begin July 1, 1977. The exact components remain to be set and will depend largely on what the town-appointed directors see as pressing needs this spring. The Council is not a regional government; it is a membership group, established to serve its member towns and cities.

While each town or city has its own pressing problems, it does not exist in a vacuum. Many of its neighbors face some of these same problems. Or a neighbor's solutions may cause it problems. This is where a regional planning program can help, working with and for local communities to seek solutions to these common problems.

The tax bill which is sent to every person taxed, or his agent, if known, as provided in section 11, shall show the rate of municipal, school and county taxes separately, and each bill shall also show the assessed valuation of all lands and buildings for which said person is being taxed. The 1976 rate breakdown reflects a proportionate share of the Reimbursement a/c Property Exempted by 1970 Special Session for each unit of government.

RSA 76:13 provides that if tax bills are mailed on or before November 1 interest is not charged if payment is made on or before December 1. However, if tax bills are mailed between November 2 and 15 inclusive interest is not charged if payment is made on or before December 15. In the event that tax bills are not sent until after November 15 interest shall not be charged on taxes paid on or before December 30.

The tax bill which you mail must contain the date from which interest will be charged and this date is determined by the date you send the last bill on the list committed to you. It is also required by statute that you notify this department in writing of the date on which you send the last bill. There is enclosed a form for this purpose,

You are hereby notified to meet at Memorial Hall in said district on Friday, March 4, 1977 at 5:00 P.M. to act on the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose by non-partisan ballot a Moderator, a Clerk, a Treasurer, and two Auditors, each to serve one year, and two members of the School Board, each to serve three years. (Polls will open at 5:00 P.M. and will close no earlier than 10:00 P.M.)

NOTE: Articles 2 THROUGH 5 WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED UNTIL 8:00 P.M.

Article 2. To see what sum of money the District will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the payment of salaries for school district officials and agents and for the payment of statutory obligations of the District.

Article 3. To see if the District will vote to create a Cooperative School District Planning Committee consisting of three qualified voters of the District of whom at least one should be a member of the school board and to elect the members thereof or determine that they should be appointed by the moderator.

Article 4. To see if the District will vote to accept the provisions of Public Law 89-10, designed to improve educational opportunities with particular reference to children of low income families, and to appropriate such funds as may be made available to the District under said federal act for such particular projects as may be determined by the School Board. Further, to see if the District will authorize the School Board to make application for such funds and to expend the same for such projects as it may designate.

Article 5. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE PRINCIPAL

To the Citizens of Orford:

The school year 1975-76 was a busy and productive year from the description of the many projects started and completed since my last report.

The elementary and high school curriculums in language arts and mathematics were revised to provide a skills sequence for all grades. The skills sequence provides minimum skills for children to be learned in language arts and mathematics.

A new health curriculum was established in Grades 9-12 with a variety of electives and required courses. This program was completed after faculty, community and students discussed the needs in the health area.

This year there are eleven juniors and seniors attending Oxbow Vocational School. These students are taking courses in advanced vocational training areas that are not available at Orford High School. This program is funded in part by the State of New Hampshire.

The specialized learning program passed by the voters last year has been implemented with thirty-three (33) students involved in the program. Specialized services for learning for disabled students is now available with a complete staffing pattern for all grades.

The library services continue to expand the materials available to all students. Filmstrips, records, periodicals, and books available have more than doubled in the last two years of the new library program. The necessary equipment to show or listen to these A-V materials is also more available than previously. We have added a new sound filmstrip projector, multi-listening centers, filmstrip projectors and record players. Research materials are more available to the high school students. Our goal of 6,000 volumes in the library is now half achieved. We hope to continue improving the number available to provide a quality research materials center for our high school students.

A Kindergarten pre-screening program was initiated last spring. Mrs. Snyder, our Kindergarten teacher, met with the Kindergarten children and parents several times to determine the needs of those children entering Kindergarten in the fall of 1976.

A Federal grant for the establishment of an experimental energy project for \$3,000 was received for 1976-77. This project is known as Project Dome. The purpose of the project is to establish a windmill and greenhouse that will be operated on solar and wind energy. The students have done research, gone on field trips to Goddard College, and mini-trips to the Hanover-Norwich area. We hope the results of the project will provide the insights and needs for alternative energy.

Renovations and repairs remain a high priority. The buildings and classrooms are constantly surveyed for those needs of repairs, painting and renovation. Classrooms were painted in the Orfordville School and Academy building. The science room exhaust system was

renovated to provide a good exhaust for the use of chemicals in chemistry. The furnaces received an annual check.

The P.T.A. built a new playground for the Middle School and started construction of a tennis court. Both additions are greatly appreciated by the children in the school.

ORFORD COMMUNITY HEALTH SERVICE

To the Citizens of Orford:

This past year, OCHS has continued to expand its efforts to offer public health care and counseling to all citizens of our town. One aspect of our program was to expand the Well-Child Clinics to include various screening tests for adults as well as children. Thus we renamed the clining The Orford Community Clinic. The response has been slow, but we are in hopes that gradually more adults will come and acquaint themselves with the services we have to offer at the clinics. They are held on the third Thursday of each month either in Lyme (even months) or Orford (odd months). For more details you can call Mrs. Mattoon (353-4853) or any Board Member.

We are in the process of renegotiating our contract for Medicare billing with North Country Home Health Agency in Littleton in order to continue to have this service available to our elderly citizens.

Piermont is still contracting with OCHS for Public Health services. The arrangement seems to be most satisfactory for both towns.

Statistics for 1976 show that the number of nursing visits were "about the same as last year:

- 1. Number of Nursing Visits: 347 (of which 207 or 60% were to the elderly.)
- 2. Number of Children seen at clinics: 125 (101 physical examinations were done.)
- 3. Money received from patient visits: \$152.60
- 4. Money received from Medicare reimbursements: \$592.80

Your OCHS Board is continuously reviewing the programs the Agency sponsors in an effort to determine ways of improving and/or expanding them to fulfill the needs of the towns it serves. It is becoming increasingly evident that Public Health is going to play a much greater role in the delivery of medical care. This is because hospitalization is prohibitively expensive and hospital stays are shorter.... leaving more convalescent care to be done at home by families with the help of the public health nurse. But an even more compelling reason is that the medical community is finally beginning to realize that it is better medicine to spend more effort preventing health problems than to have to cure them. (It's also less expensive.)
