### TOWN WARRANT

### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Sanbornton in the County of Belknap in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Sanbornton on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same.
- 3. To see if the town will vote to accept State aid for construction of Class V roads and raise, appropriate, or set aside for said purpose, the sum of \$380.95.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to purchase a tractor for the use of the highway department and raise and appropriate money for the same.

- 5. To see if the town will authorize the Selectman to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through the Tax Collector's deeds.
- 6. To see what action the town will take in regard to discount on early payment of taxes.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire such sums and amounts as necessary to defray town charges in anticipation of taxes.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400 for White Pine Blister Rust Control. By request.
- 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the Laconia Hospital. By request.
- 10. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the decoration of soldiers' graves and the proper observance of Memorial Day.
- 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for care of neglected cemeteries.
- 12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 for the use of the Winnisquam fire department.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate money for binding a set of town reports.

14. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

# REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

Sanbornton is very fortunate this year in having a teacher in each of its schools. The teacher shortage is a reality in New Hampshire, as elsewhere. Many rural schools in this state have been closed this year because a teacher could not be secured for them. We were able to retain three of the four teachers of the previous year and to secure a teacher of experience to fill Mr. Merrill's place in 7th and 8th grades, he having declined reelection.

The school work so far this year, has been very satisfactory and pupils seem interested in their work. They miss not having the music teaching. It is hoped that Mrs. Gilchrist may be able to take over this work a little later.

Money appropriated for out of door sports, we have not been able to economically make use of. Basketballs and footballs have so increased in price that buying for four schools is prohibitive.

Many of the pupils are buying stamps filling their books and getting bonds and have been doing this continually.

There were 119 pupils registered last year in the four schools. The largest school was the Gaza, and is the largest this year.

The superintendent is giving monthly tests this year, the results of which together with the daily records of the teacher, will determine promotion or non-promotion. Satisfactory scholarship will be required for promotion and graduation.

Too many pupils and some parents do not seem to realize that regular attendance is an essential to progress in school work. A day lost seems a trifle, but a day lost this week and a day next week and so on, is a big factor in failure to do satisfactory work. No pupil absent in total days amounting to three or four weeks ought to expect the same progress as a pupil who has been a regular attendant.

We urge parents to see to it that their children are in school "every day the schools are in session", as the state law requires.
