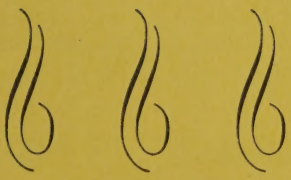

**WARRANT FOR THE TOWN MEETING**

The polls will be open from 11:00 A.M. to 7:00 P.M.

*To the inhabitants of the Town of Webster, N. H., in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at Grange Hall in said Webster on Tuesday, the 4th day of March, next at 11:00 of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
  - a. Town Officers' Salaries
  - b. Town Officers' Expenses and Town Reports
  - c. Election & Registration
  - d. General Expenses
  - e. Expenses Town Hall & Other Town Buildings
  - f. Rent of Grange Hall
  - g. Police Department
  - h. Conservation Commission
  - i. Insurance
  - j. Planning & Zoning
  - k. Damages & Legal Expenses
  - l. Civil Defense
  - m. Town Dump
  - n. Interest
  - o. Tax Map Committee
3. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for maintenance of highways and bridges.
  - a. Summer Maintenance
  - b. Winter Maintenance
  - c. Street Lighting
  - d. General Expense of Highway Department
4. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$729.86 for Class V road construction.
5. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for Public Welfare.
  - a. Town Poor
  - b. Old Age Assistance
6. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the Town Library. \$1,600.00

7. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for Patriotic purposes.
8. To see what sum the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of the cemeteries. \$1,800.00
9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$59.00 toward the operating deficit of the Concord Hospital this being based on the number of patients admitted from Webster.
10. To authorize and empower the Board of Selectmen to borrow for the Town, by issuance of notes, a sum not exceeding \$100,000.00 in anticipation of taxes for the year 1975, said notes payable from said taxes within one year of issuance, and to authorize the Board of Selectmen to determine the rate of interest on such notes and to provide for the sale thereof.
11. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to enter into an agreement with the town of Hopkinton under the provisions of New Hampshire RSA-53A providing for the joint ownership, construction, maintenance, and operation of a refuse disposal facility and appropriate the sum of \$11,450.00 for the same.
12. To see if the Town will vote \$500.00 for the maintenance of the park and playground.
13. To see if the Town will vote to sell the surplus fire (tank) truck and apply proceeds of sale to debt of new tank truck.
14. To see if the Town will vote to apply the \$750.00 from the 1974 sale of the old fire truck to the 1975 appropriations of the Fire Department.
15. To see what action the Town wants to take on the support of the Fire Department.

17. To see if the Town will vote to designate the Mutton Road from the home of Perley Bowers to the Boscawen-Webster town line as scenic, under the provisions of RSA 253:17 & 18 for the purposes of protecting and enhancing the scenic beauty of the Town of Webster. (By petition)
18. To vote by ballot on the following question:  
Are you in favor of the adoption of the zoning ordinance as proposed by the Planning Board?
19. To see if the Town will confer upon the park and recreation commission the powers and responsibilities specified in the New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, Chapter 31:44 through 31:50a as amended.
20. To see if the Town will vote to approve the ordinance enacted by the Selectmen in 1974 as printed in the town report.
21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw and expend funds from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for one or more of the following purposes:
  - a. To use as set-offs against budget appropriations for the following in amounts to be determined by the Selectmen:  
Fire, Town Dump, Road Maintenance.
  - b. To place in the capital reserve fund for a new Town Hall.
22. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Town Charges: Raised as follows: Town Officers' Salaries, \$5,700; Town Officers' Expenses, \$1,900; Election & Registration, \$250; General Expenses, \$1,000; Expenses of Town Hall and Other Town Buildings, \$1,700; Rent of Grange Hall, \$1,000, Police Department, \$6,000; Fire Department, \$2,500 (need for more hose cited) Insurance, \$2,310, to cover increase in Town Officers' bonds and additional amount to cover insurance on the new fire truck; Fire Chief Kenneth F. Hoar announced the new truck would be delivered March 16th; \$250 was raised for Planning & Zoning; \$1,000 for Damages & Legal Expenses; \$200 for Civil Defense; \$1,500 for Town Dump; \$1,500 for Interest.

Article 3. \$30,000 voted for Summer & Winter Maintenance; \$200 for Street Lighting; \$2,000, General Expense of Highway Department.

Article 4. \$732.90 voted for Town Road Aid.

Article 5. \$500 voted for Town Poor and \$500 for Old Age Assistance.

Article 6. It was voted to raise \$1,320 for support of the Town Library.

Article 7. \$400 voted for Old Home Day.

Article 8. After a brief discussion, it was voted to raise \$1,800 for the care of cemeteries.

Article 9. \$71 voted toward operating deficit of Concord Hospital.

Article 10. Voted to authorize and empower the Board of Selectmen to borrow for the Town, by issuance of notes, a sum not exceeding \$100,000, in anticipation of taxes for the year 1974, said notes payable from said taxes within one year of issuance, and to authorize the Board of Selectmen to determine the rate of interest on such notes and to provide for the sale thereof. Unanimous vote.

Article 11. \$950 voted for the maintenance of the park and playground. (A great need for new toilets at the Park, also bleachers and baseball backboard.)

Article 12. James Mullins explained the purpose of the Conservation Commission and after a discussion, it was voted by a vote of 65 to 40 to establish a Conservation Commission, as set forth in the warrant; said Commission to consist of 5 members.

Article 13. Following a report of the Dump Committee, there was a lengthy discussion in regard to this problem concerning waste disposal. The report may be seen on Pages 37 and 38 of the 1973 Town Report. Jeremy Pendleton made the motion to authorize the Refuse Disposal Committee to negotiate with surrounding towns, to make further study relative to landfill and to investigate other methods of refuse disposal; to let the Committee recommend, when they come back with figures. Seconded by Frank Novak. So voted.

Jeffrey Bennett made a motion to appropriate \$3,000 from Revenue Sharing Funds for Refuse Disposal Fund, then revised his motion as follows: To appropriate \$3,000 to be raised by taxation and to be set aside in a Capital Reserve Fund, to be used for the solution of Refuse Disposal. Voted 100 to 3. Approximately \$7,000 Revenue Sharing Funds will be available by end of 1974.

Jeremy Pendleton stated he did not intend to include RSA 53A or B in his motion (in reply to an inquiry).

Article 14. Discussion about the Town's first fire truck; the Fire Co. have decided to leave the pumper, as is, and get rid of the cab and chassis. Voted to empower the Selectmen to sell the cab and chassis of the first fire truck at public auction to the highest bidder.

Article 15. A vote to put the Revenue Sharing Fund into a Capital Reserve Fund was defeated; a motion was made and seconded to put the Revenue Sharing money into the Refuse Disposal Fund and it was so voted.

Article 16. Voted to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, contract for and accept grants of federal or state aid, or both as may be available and to expand such grants for re-construction of town roads, bridges or portions thereof, destroyed by flooding and to do all things necessary to carry out the purposes of this Article. Unanimous vote.

Article 17. Due to illness, etc., little work has been done by the Tax Map Committee; however, plans are made for further study and work this year. — Concerning Homeowner's Exemption, Article not on ballot and it was voted to pass over, due to lack of information. Suggestion was made to look into increased rates of interest for Trust Funds, in preference to savings accounts. — A letter from Governor Meldrim Thomson read relative to obtaining the

sentiment of the voters, in regard to an oil refinery in New Hampshire. 38 in favor, 43 opposed. — Jeremy Pendleton spoke of the resignation of James Roberts, as Police Chief, expressing appreciation for his many years of service and his excellent work in building up our Police Department to the way it is today; a hearty round of applause followed. Acknowledgment was made for the many years of service of William Phelps, as Town Treasurer and many other town officers for a period of about 50 years; also to Mrs. Helen Scribner, a School Board member for several years and Tax Collector for more than 21 years. — A suggestion was made to extend the voting hours another hour for ballot voting (for Town Officers).

The meeting adjourned.

### SELECTMENS' REPORT

With 1974 now behind us, we look back on another year of growth and progress for the Town of Webster.

Many new people have moved here. There are more who will come to share our uncrowded living conditions and more moderate way of life. We believe by good planning, such as a controlled growth program, that the town can absorb such growth without any great financial difficulty.

New revenue was not enough to offset inflation in 1974. The tax rate was raised 50 cents per thousand dollars of valuation. Educational expenses and County taxes accounted for the largest gains in expenditures.

The town of Webster is very fortunate to have so many capable citizens who have given their time on various committees and boards. We wish to thank all of them for their dedication to our community.

A new fire truck was purchased for the Hy-Mar Fire Department, the Police Department was upgraded with the purchase of some new equipment, and a new rock rake was purchased for the Highway Department.

The southeast side of Clough Hill was rebuilt with TRA funds. A betterment project was started on Mutton Road. with plans to continue improvement on said road in order to bring it up to Class V Highway specifications.

Paul S. Jones, our elected Road Agent, was unable to continue his duties due to serious illness. His death was a loss to our community. Robert Mock was appointed Road Agent until town meeting 1975. The state law allows a road agent to be elected for a one year term only.

The consequences of progress will face us in 1975 with a new dump site and possible recycling of refuse, a tax map that should be prepared for us by 1980, new positions and committees to be filled, and ordinances to be considered. To face these coming problems, we will need the help and cooperation of each and every one of the people in the Town of Webster.

### WEBSTER CONSERVATION COMMISSION

The Conservation Commission, voted in last year at Town Meeting, had five appointed members by August, and met for the first time in September. Members are Marion Davis, Pat Inman, Susan Novak, Clarence Jeffrey and Gerald Carney.

Activities of the Commission to date have included assigning projects to several members (inventory of Town wetlands, inventory of natural springs and watering troughs, mapping of these and several other topics, preparation of a project for school children next spring, and preparation of a slide presentation on wildflowers for this spring) as well as a major project being planned and prepared for this year which will commemorate the United States Bicentennial.

Plans for the future include public education programs on field reclamation and recycling of home waste, studies of soil survey maps obtained from the Soil Conservation Service for use in land use planning, and various ongoing activities which the Commission is charged by law to undertake such as the review of dredge and fill applications.

Any ideas and suggestions for future activities will be appreciated and considered.

### PARKS & RECREATION COMMISSION REPORT—1974

During the past year your Commission has continued in its efforts to enlarge the useable area of the Park by clearing brush and trees. We plan additional cutting this Spring.

As in the past, this work is done with volunteer help. Anyone interested in assisting this Spring should contact members of the Commission. This past Summer we installed new restrooms from funds appropriated, stained the picnic tables, bleachers and painted the flagpole.

With the increased use of the Park we have seen a corresponding increase in litter and vandalism. We would appreciate every citizen's assistance in curtailing this problem.

In view of current economic conditions the Commission decided to limit its budget request for the coming year to a minimum.

The trustees of the library wish to thank the people of Webster who have made use of the services available to them.

As you have noticed, the library is now open 13 hours per week, in accordance with the recommendation of the Statewide Library Development Program. The newly-formed Friends of the Webster Free Public Library help greatly by contributing 5 hours of their time each week to make this possible.

### FIRE CHIEF'S REPORT

This has been a little different as far as fires go this year. We have had a few small fires due to wood burning stoves, which in turn is the fault of the owner. Some do not realize how much heat comes from a wood stove, therefore, do not leave room enough around the pipe where it goes through the wall so it gets hot and sets the wall on fire. I think you should have at least a foot and a half for the pipe to go through.

This year the Once A Month Club used what money it had to buy a tank truck that cost a thousand dollars. We paid seven hundred down and owe three hundred that we hope to pay off this spring.

This year we have a proposed budget that you will see in the Town Report. We hope that some of it will be favorable to the voters of the town. Some of the articles are important such as the hose and a folder tank and nozzles. Therefore we need a larger appropriation.

The hose is needed to give the fire company a better rating. Also I am told we have to have the hose to make a difference in the insurance rates.

We have had very few fires; one building fire, the rest grass and chimney fires.

We have had stand-by for mutual aid a few times and we have had drills two and three times each month all summer that were very satisfactory.

The fire company has had a very good year.

### **REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF**

All open burning when the ground is not covered with snow is controlled by the Town Forest Fire Warden in cooperation with the New Hampshire Forest Fire Service. Anyone wishing to kindle a fire out-of-doors when the ground is not covered with snow must have a written permit signed by the Town Forest Fire Warden. If the fire is to be kindled on land not owned by the person kindling the fire then he must have the permission of the landowner. No outdoor fires can be kindled between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. unless it is raining, without the additional approval of the District Forest Fire Chief.

The 1974 forest fire season was one of the worst in the past two decades. Woodlands in central and southern New Hampshire became so dry in mid August that the Governor and Council, upon the recommendation of the State Forester, enacted a partial woodlands closure in Sullivan, Cheshire, Hillsborough, Merrimack and Belknap Counties and a complete woodlands closure in Strafford and Rockingham Counties plus the Towns of Barnstead, Gilmanton, and Alton in Belknap County. Through the excellent cooperation of the citizens of our State no major forest fire occurred at any time during the year.

### POLICE REPORT

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the residents of Webster for the cooperation they have rendered the Webster Police Department this last year. Your support, both financially and morally has helped us gain a high level of law enforcement in our town.

Statistically speaking there was an increase in some areas and decreases in others. Most of the increases came in the way of law enforcement rather than in crimes committed. The dispatcher will summons all necessary help.

**REPORT OF DUMP COMMITTEE**

During the past year the committee has pursued the mandate of our last Town Meeting to look into the feasibility of recycling. Once again the major advice given to us is the fact that Webster is too small to go it alone. In any recycling plan it is volume which makes the project successful. With this in mind our continued study with the Town of Hopkinton has now centered around recycling with a landfill operation as the answer to our refuse problem.

**A few points relative to favoring recycling—**

1. Approximately 50% of solid waste should be able to be recycled, thereby using only one-half as much land.
2. Receiving something in return for material instead of burying it all at a complete cost.
3. All studies seem to indicate that in the near future this will be the method used in handling refuse.
4. Receiving markets for recycled materials are being built within the state.

**A few points against recycling—**

1. Additional costs for labor, machinery and building to handle and store material.
2. Uncertainty of stability in market for materials.
3. Of utmost importance, it requires public participation and co-operation in the separation of materials.

Some of the other possibilities which we have worked on this past year are:

1. Present dump site was tested by the Soil Conservation Service with their recommendation that we look elsewhere for a site. State officials received the S.C.S. report and also gave the same advice.
2. Possible rental or lease from the Town of Boscawen was voted down by them at their Town Meeting.
3. Additional consideration given to other parcels of land within the Town and with no satisfactory progress made.
4. Thought given to the taking of a suitable site by eminent domain.
5. Buying a parcel of land from Robert Roby and operating a land-fill dump across the Webster-Hopkinton town line from the site of the Hopkinton dump.

The opinion of this committee is that there are two options open to us: Join with Hopkinton or Go it alone on the Roby land. Either option consists of varying plans as to method of operation, such as:

1. Landfill
2. Recycling and Landfill
3. Recycling and Inceneration

The committee has chosen the option of joining with the Town of Hopkinton with the recycling and landfill method as the best way to handle the refuse from the Town of Webster.

The site will be a continuation of the present Hopkinton dump. An additional 85 acres has been purchased by the Town of Hopkinton. The dump will be open three days per week. The cost will be apportioned per capita with joint ownership of land, buildings and equipment. The governing board will be two members from each town with final approval by the joint boards of Selectmen.

It is felt that with the population of the two towns that there is a potential for a good revenue return from recycling. We feel that in a short period of time enough material can be recycled to offset the additional costs involved. There is sufficient land to handle the land-fill operation.

Incineration was ruled out due to the cost of the operation of an incinerator.

It was felt that a landfill operation is an operation at an absolute cost and would cut the life of the site in half.

The estimated cost for the Town of Webster to implement this plan for 1975 is \$9,200. Our share of the costs paid by the Town of Hopkinton in 1974 is \$2,347. On a per capita cost the Town of Webster's share will be approximately 20%. The following is a breakdown of costs.

These figures on this plan are based on a straight land fill operation with the dump being open one day each week. The access road to this area would be the same as to the Hopkinton dump located in the Blackwater section of the Town of Hopkinton.

A few critical points which should be given consideration are:

1. Due to the newness of recycling we have not given any estimates as to the revenue which might be derived from the sale of recyclable materials.
2. Without using any estimated revenue figure to offset the added cost of recycling the cheapest method to handle our refuse would be a straight landfill operation.
3. All advice is not to try to go into any operation on our own.
4. All reports indicate that it is costing towns six to ten times their present budget to change from an open burning dump to a sanitary landfill operation.
5. Public cooperation is needed in the separation of materials in a recycling operation.
6. All transportation of refuse from home to dump is the responsibility of the individual.

Following this report is a copy of tentative articles of agreement for a Refuse Disposal Plan for Hopkinton and Webster.

### REFUSE DISPOSAL AGREEMENT

WHEREAS the Towns of Webster and Hopkinton are currently under an order to cease operation of their existing refuse disposal facilities;

AND WHEREAS the Towns of Webster and Hopkinton desire to enter into an agreement to share the costs and benefits of a refuse disposal facility for the welfare of the citizens of both towns;

AND WHEREAS the Towns of Webster and Hopkinton desire to retain direct budget control over such facility;

IT IS HEREBY AGREED under the provisions of NH RSA 53: A as follows:

1. There is hereby established a Refuse Disposal Committee which shall consist of two citizens from Webster and two citizens from Hopkinton who shall be appointed by the Selectmen from their respective towns. Initially, the Selectmen from each town shall appoint one member to a one year term and another member to a two year term. Thereafter each Board shall appoint one member to a two year term annually. In the event of a vacancy, the Selectmen of the Town whose position is vacant shall appoint a member to fill the unexpired term.

2. The Refuse Disposal Committee shall, subject to the joint supervision of the Selectmen of the towns who are parties to this agreement have the power and duty to plan, develop, manage and operate the refuse disposal facilities and to expand the joint funds appropriated for such purpose.

3. All costs of land, construction and operation of the refuse disposal facility shall be shared on a per capita basis between the Towns of Webster and Hopkinton. Ownership of the land and facilities and all revenue derived therefrom shall be shared between said Towns on a per capita basis.

4. The facility shall be constructed on the premises purchased by the Town of Hopkinton for the purpose from Robert H. Roby.

5. Another city or town may be admitted as a party to this agreement but only on a majority vote at a duly called Annual or Special Town Meeting of each of the towns who are then party to the agreement.

6. This agreement may be amended at any time but only upon a majority vote at a duly called Annual or Special Town Meeting of each of the towns who are then parties to this agreement.

7. The procedures for the preparation and adoption of an annual budget shall be as follows: The Refuse Disposal Committee shall prepare a proposed annual budget and apportionment between the towns which are parties to this Agreement. The proposed budget and apportionment shall be submitted to a joint meeting of the Selectmen of all towns which are parties to this Agreement. The Selectmen by majority vote of those present and voting (a quorum being present), may accept or modify the budget and apportionment. A quorum shall consist of a majority of the members of each board of selectmen. The budget share for each town shall then be submitted to the Budget Committees of each town for action in accordance with RSA 32. In the event that a town should fail to appropriate the funds approved by the joint meeting of Selectmen in its annual budget, then the right of that Town and its residents to use the facilities or share in any benefits thereof shall terminate 90 days after the date of such town's failure to so appropriate, unless the towns party to this agreement mutually settle such impasse during such 90 day period.

8. The Refuse Disposal Committee shall have the authority to permit other towns who are not parties to this agreement to lease the use of the refuse disposal facilities in common with the parties hereto, on such terms and conditions as it finds are in the best interest of the towns who are parties to this Agreement.

9. Any town may withdraw from this Agreement after written notice to the Selectmen of all towns party to the Agreement given at least one year prior to their next annual town meeting. Upon any such withdrawal, the current fair market value of the equity of the withdrawing town in the real and tangible personal property comprising the facility shall be appraised by the Property Appraisal Division of the State Department of Revenue Administration and such sum repaid to the withdrawing town in installments over a term not to exceed 10 (ten) years without interest.

10. The annual population census figures of the State of New Hampshire Department of Comprehensive Planning shall be used to determine the per capita shares of the Towns which are parties to this Agreement.

**A MESSAGE FROM THE "TAX MAP GROUP"**

By 1980 every town in New Hampshire must have a tax map as per New Hampshire Statute 31., 95a of August 29, 1971.

To construct a tax map, many hundreds of hours of research and drafting are required, plus searches for any available existing maps from various sources. In addition, layout boundaries from deeds or other sources.

The tax map must be as accurate as possible in order to serve the purpose for which it was intended — namely for use of the town officers and the public. At completion, the map must be updated each year.

A reputable engineering firm has offered a quotation of \$20,700 to furnish such a map for the Town of Webster, and update same for a period of three years after completion of the map. They would require three years to complete the project.

A group of qualified Webster citizens have volunteered their free services to construct such a map for the Town of Webster.

This is an earnest appeal to you to assist in any way by providing information pertaining to your property boundaries etc. By doing this you will be helping us to help you.

## WEBSTER, NEW HAMPSHIRE PROPOSED ZONING ORDINANCE

### ARTICLE I Purpose

This Ordinance is established in pursuance of authority conferred by Chapter 31 of the Revised Statutes Annotated of the State of New Hampshire, or any amendments thereto, in order to preserve and improve the attractiveness of the Town of Webster as a rural residential and farming community and to continue its desirability as a place in which to live and do business and to promote the health, welfare, morals, convenience and safety of its citizens.

### ARTICLE II Definitions

Unless otherwise expressly stated, the following words shall, for the purpose of this Ordinance, have the meaning indicated. Words used in the present tense include the future. The singular number includes the plural and the plural the singular. The word "person" includes a partnership, corporation, or other entity. The word "building" includes the word "structure". The word "shall" is mandatory, not directory.

**Building.** Any structure enclosed and isolated by exterior walls constructed or used for residence, business, industry, other public or private purposes, or accessory thereto, excluding structures for storage of crops.

**Commercial Purposes.** Any use of land or buildings for the purpose of manufacturing, repairing or selling at retail or wholesale a product, goods or service.

**Dwelling.** A building or part of a building which contains living and sleeping accommodations.

**Frontage.** Shall mean that portion of a lot bordering on a highway, street or right-of-way.

**Lot.** A parcel of land occupied or to be occupied by a building or mobile home, together with such open spaces as are required by the provisions of this Ordinance.

**Mobile Home.** Any vehicle used, or so constructed as to permit its being used as a conveyance upon a public street, and designed to permit long term occupancy as a dwelling for one or more persons. Such a vehicle is equipped with running water and sanitary facilities such as bath and toilet.

**Non-conforming Use.** Shall mean use of land, buildings or premises which is not a use permitted by the provisions of this Ordinance for the district in which such land, building or premises is situated.

**Property Line.** The line dividing adjacent lots.

**Right-of-Way.** Means and includes all present and proposed town, state and federal highways or private ways open to public use and the land on either side of same as covered by statutes to determine the widths of ways.

**Setback.** Means the distance between the nearest portion of a building and a lot or right-of-way line.

**Street.** A thoroughfare, road, highway or public way open and available to public use. "Street" shall mean the entire width of the right-of-way.

**Residence.** A dwelling or mobile home.

### ARTICLE III Uses Permitted

1. The Town of Webster shall be a district of agricultural or residential uses only. Business, commercial and industrial uses are prohibited in this district except as hereinafter provided.

2. A building lot shall have no more than one single family residence, commercial establishment or mobile home thereon, multi-unit dwellings are prohibited.

3. Home products may be bought, sold and exposed for sale in this district.

4. Agricultural use: "Agricultural Use" shall mean land used for for agriculture, farming, dairying, pasturage, horticulture, floriculture, silviculture and animal and poultry husbandry. All such uses in accordance with the law are permitted.

### ARTICLE IV Lot Area and Yard Requirements

I. Lots shall be at least one acre minimum in size.

II. Each lot shall have a minimum of 150 foot frontage on road or highway that serves it.

III. There shall be observed the following setbacks in the construction of new buildings or in the relocation of existing ones:

(a) Minimum distance between any building and the edge of a right-of-way shall be fifty (50) feet.

(b) Minimum distance from lot sidelines to any building shall be thirty (30) feet, providing, however, that small detached accessory buildings may, as a special exception, be approved to within fifteen (15) feet of a lot line, upon a finding of no detriment to the neighborhood.

(c) Minimum distance from a lot rearline to any building shall be forty (40) feet, providing, however, that small detached accessory buildings may, as a special exception, be approved to within twenty (20) feet of a lot rearline, upon a finding of no detriment to the neighborhood.

IV. No building, residence, trailer or mobile home may be located anywhere in this district unless it meets all of the area and yard requirements of a residence in this district.

## ARTICLE V Commercial Exceptions

**Commercial Exceptions.** Business, commercial or industrial uses may be permitted special exception by the board of adjustment, upon submission and approval of a site plan, provided, however, that the following regulations and restrictions shall be observed:

1. No business, commercial or industrial venture or use shall be permitted which could cause any undue hazard to health, safety or property values or which is offensive to the public because of noise, vibration, excessive traffic, unsanitary conditions, noxious odor, smoke, unsightliness, or other similar reason.

2. Before mining, excavation, or removal of soil, rock, sand or gravel or similar material, a special exception must be received from board of adjustment. When the removal of materials is completed, sufficient grading must take place to allow covering with two (2) inches of top soil and seeding with suitable cover crop, except when ledge rock is exposed. The board of adjustment may require the posting of a bond with the Town Treasurer to insure compliance.

3. All known abutters of any proposed business, commercial, or industrial site shall be notified by the board of adjustment by certified mail at least one week prior to any public hearing regarding said site. The names and addresses of the known abutters shall be supplied by the applicant on a plat plan to be submitted to the board of adjustment.



**ARTICLE VI**  
**Non-conforming Building, Land or Uses**

1. Non-conforming properties lawfully in existence and in active use when this ordinance is passed and adopted may continue indefinitely in their present use.

2. Any and all non-conforming property may be altered and expanded as the business and conditions warrant, providing, however, that any such expansion does not make any existing conforming structure non-conforming within the terms of this ordinance; nor shall the use of such property be materially altered in purpose.

3. Any and all non-conforming property which is partially or totally destroyed by reason of obsolescence, fire or other act of God may be restored, remodeled and operated, if done within two (2) years, providing, however, that proximity to a lot line or right-of-way may be no nearer than the lesser of the original building and the setbacks defined in this ordinance.

**ARTICLE VII**  
**Controlled Growth**

To control the growth of the Town of Webster, New Hampshire in a manner not to exceed the capacity for providing the expanded services to support such growth, the following restrictions are set:

A. Building permits for new dwellings are limited annually to 5% of the number of dwellings in the Town at the start of each calendar year.

B. Said permits will be limited to four (4) per developer, within a calendar year.

C. Mobile home permits will be issued from the above allocations in an apportionment not to exceed the current ratio of mobile homes to residences as of the date this article is approved. If this ratio produces a number less than one (1) but more than one-half ( $\frac{1}{2}$ ) it shall be counted as one (1).

**ARTICLE VIII**  
**Building and Construction**

A Building Inspector may be appointed annually by the Board of Selectmen and he shall be the administrative officer under this article; if the selectmen do not appoint a building inspector his administrative powers and duties shall be vested in the Board of Selectmen.

A. Any person, before commencing new construction of any building or structure to be used as a dwelling must first obtain a permit

from the Building Inspector. Any such permit shall be void unless the work is started within six (6) months of the date of issuance. The outside of the structure must be completed within two (2) years of issuance of permit.

### **ARTICLE IX Board of Adjustment**

The Board of Selectmen shall appoint a Board of Adjustment consisting of five (5) members, conforming in duties, membership and term of office to the provisions of Chapter 31 of the New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated as amended. Thereafter, as terms expire or vacancies occur, the Board of Selectmen shall be responsible for filling vacancies and maintaining a full membership on the Board of Adjustment.

### **ARTICLE X**

Every person, persons, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance upon conviction shall be fined not more than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for each day such violation may exist. The Board of Selectmen may institute in the name of the Town any appropriate action or proceedings to prevent, restrain, correct or abate violations of this Ordinance.

### **ARTICLE XI**

The invalidity of any provisions of this Ordinance shall not affect the validity of any other provision.

### **ARTICLE XII**

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage.

### **ORDINANCE**

1. No music concert, dance, theatrical or dramatic representation, carnival, circus, parade or procession or any other open air public meeting shall be permitted in the Town of Webster unless a special license therefor shall first be obtained from the Board of Selectmen.

2. Such special license shall be granted upon the following conditions:

a. The Licensee shall provide adequate toilet facilities to the satisfaction of the Health Officer for the Town. At the time application for the special license is made, a written approval of such facilities from the Health Officer shall be presented by the Licensee.

b. The Licensee shall provide, at his own expense, adequate police protection as determined by the Chief of Police for the Town. At the time an application for the special license is made, a written approval of the police protection shall be presented by the Licensee.

c. The Licensee shall, at his own expense, provide equipment and facilities for the disposal of all refuse.

d. The Licensee shall provide adequate parking facilities for the maximum number of expected vehicles and no vehicles shall be parked on any public street or way to constitute a traffic or safety hazard.

e. The Selectmen find that the proposed activity is not contrary to the health, safety, morals or general welfare of the Town.

3. Every such special license shall be in writing, and shall specify the day of the permit for the activity for which the license was obtained. Every Licensee shall pay in advance for such special license for the use of the Town a sum not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars for each day the proposed activity shall take place.

4. If any person shall violate the provisions of this Ordinance, he shall be fined not more than Five Hundred Dollars.
