

To the Residents of Auburn:

Predicting the future is always difficult but it appears that Auburn's growth rate and capital expenses will both increase in the 1980's. The Selectmen encourage all residents to take part in the decisions affecting the future of the community. Town elections will be on Tuesday, March 13th, with voting taking place at the Auburn Village School from 10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.. The School District Meeting will be Friday, March 16th, at the School at 8:00 p.m.. The Town Meeting will also be held at the School on Saturday, March 17th at 2:00 p.m..

Have you considered improving your wood lot? Under the direction of professional foresters, the Selectmen would like to encourage landowners to prune, thin, and selectively cut their woodlots. Thining out excess low quality trees will free up the best and improve the value of your lot. Remember, N.H. has a Timber Tax that applies to all timber sales (Although the State administers the program, the Town receives the tax)

The Town of Auburn vs. the MWW court case has been appealed to the N.H. Supreme Court to be heard in March. A decision from the Court will probably not be received until late summer. Depending on that decision, the Selectmen will need to make financial arrangements that may be necessary.

For the Selectmen's Office, 1983 was a year of change and transition. In March, Gerry Lacourse retired after serving 12 years as a Selectman. Mr. Lacourse has remained as an advisor to the Board on the MWW case. The Board misses the continuity that Mr. Lacourse brought to the Selectmen's Office. In March, Brenda M. Beer, became the Town's first woman Selectman.

Please take time to read the reports of the committees and departments in this Town Book for information explaining articles on the warrant. Without the dedicated volunteers on the committees, who give countless hours of their time, this Town would not function. On behalf of the Town's residents, the Board would like to "thank" all the volunteers. A special "thanks "to Gene Thomas, who has worked many late nights on our successful grant application for \$50,000 for the proposed recreation area in the Sandy Acres development.

Town Warrant State of New Hampshire Rockingham, S.S.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Auburn, in the County of Rockingham in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the gymnasium in the Auburn Village School in said Auburn on Tuesday, March the thirteenth next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

First: To bring your ballots for:

Moderator for Two Years

Town Clerk for Three Years

Tax Collector for Three Years

One Selectman for Three Years

Treasurer for One Year

Highway Agent for One Year

One Auditor for Two Years

One Library Trustee for Three Years

One Auburn Village Cemetary Trustee for Three

One Police Commissioner for One Year

One Police Commissioner for Three Years

One Supervisor of the Checklist for Six Years

Second: To see if the Town will vote to adopt the BOCA Basic Building Code/1984, ninth edition, excluding "Section 515.0 Physically Handicapped and Aged", as printed and issued by the Building Officials and Code Administrators International, Inc. as the standard for building construction in the Town of Auburn. (Submitted and recommended by the Planning Board and recommended by The Building Inspector/Zoning Officer.)

Third: To see if the Town will vote to rezone a parcel of land located at the intersection of the east side of Route 28 By-Pass and the south side of Rattlesnake Hill Road shown on Tax Map # 1 as Lot 16-9. This parcel, consisting of 22 acres, is currently zoning Commercial and is proposed to be rezoned to Agricultural-Residential. This change will eliminate commercial frontage on Rattlesnake Hill Road. (Submitted and recommended by the Planning Board and recommended by the Zoning Board of Adjustment and the Building Inspector/Zoning Officer.)

Fourth: To see if the Town will vote to increase the term of the Town Highway Agent from one (1) year to three (3) years, beginning with the term of each Town Highway Agent who shall be elected at next year's regular town meeting. (Authorized by RSA 231:62-a.)

Polls will open at 10:00 A.M. and close at 7:00 P.M.

You are also notified to meet on Saturday, March the seventeenth the next, at 2:00 P.M. at the Auburn Village School to consider the following articles:

Fifth: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Sixth: To see if the Town will vote to accept such Trust Funds as may have come in during the year and Trust Funds as have not been previously accepted.

Seventh: To see if the Town will vote to use the income of the H.B. Burnham Fund for the schools or library.

Eighth: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept gifts for the use of the Town as may now or hereafter be forthcoming.

Ninth: To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to make application for and to receive and spend such advances, grants-in-aid, or other funds for Town purposes as may now, or hereafter be forthcoming from Federal, State, Local or private agencies.

Tenth: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to dispose of any/or all property acquired by tax deed, by public auction or sealed bid, with the right to reject all bids.

Eleventh: To see if the Town will authorize the Planning Board to prepare, and from time to time to amend, a recommended program of Municipal Capital Improvement Projects projected over a period of at least 6 years, as authorized by RSA 674:5.

Twelfth: To see if the Town will vote to accept and spend Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) in grant monies from the Land and Water Conservation Fund and a matching amount from private parties in donations of land, personal property, services and/or cash for the development of a Recreational Area for the Town of Auburn on land on Wilson Crossing Road in Sandy Acres. (This grant is included in the Budget.)

Thirteenth: To see if the Town will vote to establish an Industrial Development Advisory Board, whose membership will be determined by and appointed by the Selectmen, to serve until the next annual meeting without pay, to advise the Selectmen with respect to industrial development in the Town.

Fourteenth: To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to reappraise all of the real estate in the Town, including land and buildings, and to raise and appropriate the sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) for use in the current year to retain outside professional assistance for such purpose. (This money is included in the Budget.)

Fifteenth: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell or lease approximately 138 acres of land located on Wellington Road, known as the Rifle Range, by public auction or sealed bids, with the right to reject all bids or alternatively to negotiate with other parties to develop the property jointly with the Town.

Sixteenth: To see if the Town will authorize and direct the Selectmen's Representatives to the Tri-County Solid Waste Management District to review the considerations, consistant with the District Plan, which may be involved in participating with Citizens and Vikon Recovery, etc., Resource Recovery Project in Manchester or any other Solid Waste Project.

Seventeenth: To see if the Town will establish a Recreation Commission consisting of five citizens, who shall serve without pay, one of whom shall be a Selectmen as a member ex-officio, to exercise the powers conferred on the Town by RSA, Chapter 35-B.

Eighteenth: We, the undersigned registered voters petition the town of Auburn, New Hampshire to appropriate

the sum of One Thousand one hundred and twelve dollars (\$1,112.00) to the Salem Community Action which is part of Rockingham County Community Action, Inc. a private non-profit Social Service Agency.

This amount represents 2.5% of Forty four thousand five hundred thirteen dollars (\$44,513.00) the value of services rendered to Auburn residents from September 1, 1982 to September 30, 1983.

The adjourned business meeting was called to order by Moderator, C. Donald Stritch at 2 p.m. on Saturday, March 12, 1983. Invocation was given by Rev. Hubert J. Topliff, Pastor of the Longmeadow Church. Mr. Stritch read the results of the election held on March 8, 1983.

Article 3: To see if the Town will vote to incur debt for temporary loans in anticipation of taxes. Article 3 was moved by Danield Carpenter. Seconded by Daniel Trombly. Article 3 Passed.

Article 4: To see if the Town will vote to accept such Trust Funds as may have come in during the year and Trust Funds as have not been previously accepted. Article 4 was moved by Patricia Allard. Seconded by Undice Griffin. Article 4 Passed.

Article 5: To see if the Town will vote to use the income of the H.B. Burnham Fund for the schools or library. Article 5 was moved by David Griffin. Seconded by Hubert Topliff. Article 5 Passed.

Article 6: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept, in the name of and in behalf of the Town, gifts, for the use of the Town. Article 6 was moved by Gerald Lacourse. Seconded by Marcia Trombly. Article 6 Passed.

At this time the Moderator recognized Mr. Harry Flanders, Representative to the General Court in Concord. Mr. Flanders responded.

Article 7: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to dispose of any/or all property acquired by tax deed, by public sale with the right to accept or reject all bids. Article 7 was moved by Linda Therriault. Seconded by Theobald Therrien. Article 7 Passed.

Article 8: To see if the Town will authorize the Board of Selctmen to make application for and to receive and spend in the name of the Town, such advances, grant-in-aide, or other funds for Town purposes as may now, or hereafter be forthcoming from Federal, State, Local or private agencies that would be of benefit to the Town. Article 8 was moved by Walter Emerson. Seconded by Susan Anderson. Article 8 Passed.

Article 9: To see if the Town will vote to collect taxes semi-annually as provided in RSA 76:15-a (Supp. 1981). Article 9 was moved by Richard Miller. Seconded by Carol Casper. After discussion the question was moved by Daniel Trombly. Seconded by Susan Tardiff. Article 9 Passed.

Article 10: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw and discontinue the Capital Reserve Funds in the name of the Town of Auburn the balance of the 1953 Grader Trust Fund, the 1967 Police Cruiser Trust Fund, and the 1970 Fire Truck Trust Fund and to expend the amounts plus interest received as set-offs against the Budget. (Approximately \$2,500.). Article 10 was moved by Daniel Carpenter. Seconded by Susan Tardiff. Article 10 was passed.

Article 11: To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of eight thousand two hundred and fifty dollars (\$8,250.) for the Auburn Police Department to purchase a cruiser. (Amount included in the Budget. Recommended by the Budget Committee). Article 11 was moved by Lloyd Wood. Seconded by Theobald Therrien. Discussion followed and Article 11 was passed.

Article 12: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the withdrawal of Ten Thousand (\$10,000) from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for use as set-offs against budget appropriations to be raised by taxes. And, further to authorize the Selectmen to make pro-rata reductions in the amounts if estimated entitlements are reduced and to take any other action hereon. (For Tarring and Shimming.) (Amount included in the Budget. Recommended by the Budget Committee.) Article 12 was moved by Joseph Stacy. Seconded by Armand Gagnon. After discussion Article 12 adopted.

Article 13: To see if the Town will vote to appropriate twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) for the re-construction and re-surfacing of Wilson Crossing Road from Nutt Road to By-Pass 28 and authorize the withdrawal of the amount required for this purpose from the Federal Revenue Sharing Fund; and further to authorize the Selectmen to make pro-rata reductions in the amounts if established entitlements are reduced or take any action hereon. (Amount included in the Budget. Recommended by the Budget Committee) (Total amount of project is \$35,000). Article 13 was moved by Walter Emerson. Seconded by Herbert Tardiff. An amendment was offered by John Perras "so that such work will not alter the unique character of Wilson's Crossing Road such as its direction, curves, topography or unique landmarks". Seconded by Mrs. Perras. After discussion Mr. Wood moved the amendment. The amendment was defeated. Vote was taken on Article 13. Count was Yes 78. No 53. Article 13 was passed.

At this time Mr. Stitch requested that Brenda Beer come forward to receive the oath of office as Selectman. He asked Gerald Lacourse, the out-going selectman to administer the oath to Mrs. Beer who is the first woman to hold the office of Selectman in the Town of Auburn.

Article 14: To see if the Town will bote to appropriate the sum of Nine Thousand Seven Hundred Forty-Two Dollars and Twenty-nine cents (\$9,742.29) to be funded by the State of New Hampshire Additional Highway Subsidy Funds 1983 for the re-construction of a portion of Eaton Hill Road. And, further to authorize the Selectmen to make pro-rata reductions if the amounts of estimated entitlements are reduced and to take any action thereon. (Amount included in the Budget. Recommend by the Budget Committee.) Article 14 was moved by Ethan Howard. Seconded by Daniel Trombly. Article 14 was Passed.

Article 15: To see if the Town will vote to approve the following ordinance relating to unvented space heaters:

- 1. Unvented Space Heaters
 - In accordance with the provisions of NHRSA 158:28 and NHRSA 31:60-a, unvented space heaters may be used in accordance with those statutes and with the regulations promulgated by the State Fire Marshall as directed by those statutes and as defined therein: In unoccupied structures.
- 2. No person shall sell or offer for sale nor shall any person install or use an unvented space heater in the following places:
 - a. In a retail establishment
 - b. In any office
 - c. In any business garage, filling station, public garage, repair garage, or service station.
 - d. In any structure unless a competent person is in attendance.
 - e. In any place of public assembly, educational facility or medical facility.
- No unvented space heater may be maintained or serviced except by the manufacturer's authorized agents.
- 4. Permit inspection by local officials of the structure where the heater is to be used.
- Installation of smoke/heat detectors in areas where the heater is to be installed.
- 6. Installation of an approved fire extinguisher.

- 7. All unvented space heaters must be, at all times when in operation, placed upon a non-combustible base. Said base shall be a least 3 feet on all sides.
- 8. Permits to purchase and operate an unvented space heater may be obtained from the Chief of the Auburn Fire Department or another officer of the Department designated by him. If the applicant is not the owner of the structure in which the unvented space heater is to be used, a notarized letter from the property owner must be presented indicating his consent to the use of the unvented space heater in that structure.
- 9. The penalties in the proposed zoning ordinances (#804 & #805) shall apply to this ordinance.

Article 15 was moved by Daniel Trombly. Seconded by Dennis Beer. Martin Sullivan moved the question. Article 15 was Passed.

Article 16: We, the undersigned, being legal voters in the Town of Auburn, N.H. do hereby petition the Board of Selectmen of said Town, to place the following article on the warrant for the 1983 annual meeting:

ACID RAIN WARRANT ARTICLE

To see if the Town will vote to go on record in support of immediate actions by the Federal Government to control and reduce acid rain which is harmful to the environment and economy of Auburn, N.H. and to the health and welfare of the people of Auburn, N.H.

These actions shall include:

- 1. Reduce by at least half the major cause of acid rain, sulfur dioxide emissions, by the year 1990.
- 2. Conclude negotiations and adopt a treaty with the government of Canada that will commit both nations to this same goal.

The record of the vote on this article shall be transmitted to the New Hampshire Congressional Delegation and to the President of the United States. (Signed by Kathleen A. Perras and eleven other legal voters.) Article 16 moved by Kathleen Perras. Seconded by Stanley Barriger. Mr. Durand moved the question and Article 16 passed.

Article 17: We, the undersigned registered voters petition the Town of Auburn, New Hampshire to appropriate the sum of Eight Hundred Thirty One Dollars (\$831,000) to the Greater Salem Community Action Center which is part of the Rockingham County Community Action Program, Inc. a private non-profit Social Service Agency.

This appropriation will help continue and expand such important programs as: Weatherization; Home Energy Assistance; Head Start; WIC Program; Family Day Care; and other forms of assistance. (Signed by Thelma Blake and nine other legal voters).

Article 17 was moved by Pauline MacDonald. Seconded by David Sawyer. Mr. Durand moved the question. His motion was defeated. Discussion continued. Mr. Joseph Wheeler member of the Board of Directors for Community Action Program requested to speak and explain the program and answer questions. Permission was granted. Mr. Cronin moved the question and Article 17 was not passed.

Article 18: The undersigned legal residents of the Town of Auburn, New Hampshire request the Selectmen to place the following question on the warrant for the 1983 Town Meeting:

"Shall the citizens of the Town of Auburn, New Hampshire ask members of the New Hampshire Congressional delegation to support or co-sponsor a resolution in the United States Congress to: Request the President of the United States and the Soviet Union adopt a mutual freeze on the testing, production, and deployment of nuclear weapons and of missiles and new aircraft designed primarily to deliver nuclear weapons, with verification safeguards satisfactory to both countries."

Rather than permit the threat of nuclear war to increase, the United States and the Soviet Union should adopt an immediate mutual freeze...in a democracy we are all

responsible for pushing the button.

"I like to believe that people in the long run are going to do more to promote peace than are governments. I think that people want peace so much that one of these days governments had better get out of their way and let them have it." - President Dwight Eisenhower, 1959. (Signed by William E. Thomas and thirteen other legal voters). Article 18 was moved by John Thompson. Seconded by John Perras. Discussion followed. Mr. Trombley moved the question. Article 18 was not passed.

Article 19: To hear the report of the Budget Committee and pass any vote in relation thereto. Article 19 was moved by James Andrus to accept the budget in the amount of Five Hundred Eighty Seven Thousand Seven Hundred Eighty Four Dollars and Six cents (\$587,784.06). Seconded by James Headd.

Mr. Albert Burtt, Jr. proposed to amend the 1983 Budget to "the sum of \$583,714.06 by reducing the police budget by the sum of \$4,070.00, this provides a 4% increase over 1982's budget or a police budget of \$62,697, in addition of the \$8,250. for the Police Cruiser."

Vote was taken on the amendment and the amendment was defeated. More discussion followed. Mr. Tardiff moved the question. Vote was taken on the original motion in the amount of \$587,784.06. Article 19 was passed.

Article 20: To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting. Chief Lloyd Wood asked the citizens of the Town used the assigned street numbers on their properties in order to assist the Fire Department as well as the Police Department. Donald Dollard suggested that a public address system be installed for use at Town Meeting.

The Annual Town Meeting was adjourned at 4:35 p.m. March 12, 1983.

MWW vs Town of Auburn

The following narrative is an attempt to clarify questions concerning the Manchester Water Works v. Auburn case.

Until 1953, public utility land was assessed on the basis of its value at the time of purchase. Since then, public utility land has been taxed at its highest and best use like all other property. Despite many challenges on Water Works land valuation, the courts and the Land Tax and Appeals Board has basically upheld the Town's position. In the 1959 Manchester Water Works v. Auburn case, the New Hampshire Supreme Court ruled that Water Works property values had to be proportional to all other property in Town. At that time, Water Works property had to be appraised every five years by the State Department of Revenue. Recently, these last two provisions have been changed by the Legislature.

In 1979-1980, Auburn was reappraised by the Department of Revenue. When the Selectmen went to Concord to have the tax rate set in 1980, they discovered that Water Works property had increased 1.4 times while all other land in Town had increased 3.5 times. Because of this discrepancy, the Selectmen refused to accept the tax rate as established by the Department of Revenue. Lloyd Price, the Commissioner of the Department of Revenue, consulted with the Attorney General's Office and concluded that the 1959 proportional ruled mandated that all property in Auburn be valued at 3.5 level. Ray D'Amours, head of the Appraisal Division, testified in the most recent Court case that these figures were not proportional; that lakeshore property had increased in New Hampshire over the past 10 years and at a much faster rate than backland.

The Manchester Water Works appealed this decision to the Rockingham County Superior Court. The case was heard before Master R. Peter Shapiro and reviewed by Arthur E. Beane, Jr., Presiding Justice. The trial concluded before last year's Town Meeting and the decision was released in June, 1983. Shapiro rejected the position of the Town and ruled that the true value of the Water Works property was \$6.1 million. The Town has appealed the Master's decision to the New Hampshire Supreme Court where oral arguments will be heard in March, 1984. A decision—is not expected from the Court until this summer.

If the Master's decision is upheld, the Town has been appraised by two different approaches, at two different times, under very different economic circumstances. For these reasons, the Selectmen recommend a complete reappraisal of the Town.

Audit Report

To the Members of the School Board Auburn School District Auburn, New Hampshire

We have examined the combined financial statements and the individual fund and account group financial statements of the Auburn School District as of and for the year ended June 30, 1983, as listed in the accompanying table of contents. Our examination was made in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and, accordingly, included such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances.

As described in Note 1E, the combined financial statements referred to above do not include financial statements of the General Fixed Asset group of accounts, which should be included to conform with generally accepted accounting principles.

In our opinion, except that omission of the General Fixed Asset group of accounts results in an incomplete presentation as explained in the above paragraph, the combined financial statements and the individual fund and account group financial statements referred to above present fairly the financial position of the Auburn School District at June 30, 1983 and the results of its operations for the year then ended, in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles applied on a basis consistent with that of the preceding year.

Our examination was made for the purpose of forming an opinion on the combined financial statements taken as a whole. The individual fund and account group financial statements and supplemental schedules listed in the table of contents are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the combined financial statements of the Auburn School District. The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the examination of the combined financial statements and, in our opinion, is stated fairly in all material respects in relation to the combined financial statements taken as a whole.

A sub-committee was appointed more than one and a half years ago to develop and implement a Management by Objective System for the Auburn School District. One of the key elements to the system was an instrument developed to evaluate the performance of a Superintendent of Schools. This group has met on several occasions to reach the finalization of said system.

During the 1982-83 school year as part of the Management System, five objectives were pursued: (1). An MBO system will be initiated for the SAU # 15 office during the 1982-83 school year, (2). A curriculum evaluation process will be developed by the end of the 1982-83 school year; (3). A long range (5 year) plan for the delivery of special services will be developed for the Auburn School District; (4). A Budget Preparation Handbook will be developed; (5). The central office computer system will be upgraded.

Although the first year was advantageous to the district, the second year has brought about a more refined instrument. The administrators have a clearer understanding of their roles and how to meet the expectations of the Auburn School District.

As an ongoing process, it is now my responsibility to formulate an assessment and evaluation instrument for the Assistant Superintendents and also the Auburn School District administrators and supervisors.

The 1982-83 academic year witnessed a continuation and expansion of the cooperative purchasing program. Utilizing the buying power of the four SAU #15 school districts, the Auburn School District realized significant savings in the purchasing of athletic and physical education equipment and supplies as well as audio visual equipment and supplies which were purchased cooperatively for the first time in 1982-83. Moreover, refinement of procurement techniques and continued savings were also achieved in such areas as art, office and scholar supplies; bakery and dairy products; microcomputer hardware; school furniture and equipment; and heating oil.

As in past years, cooperative handicap transportation arrangements among the four SAU # 15 school districts have also helped the Auburn School District contain costs.

As I described in my 1981-82 report, a new sewage disposal system conforming to State standards was constructed during the summer of 1982. Other outdoor construction activity involved repairing the damaged well cover structure, paving a sidewalk in the rear of the building so that the primary grade students can access the parking lot during the wet season, and a draining system for the right field area and the field below the abandoned leach bed. Regarding the latter area, plans are underway to level and grade that surface, using volunteer help and donated materials, to provide a second playing field.

In order to preserve the capital investment in the school, the roof maintenance program was continued in 1982-83. A portion of the roof over the second story area was replaced while the remainder of this roof was repaired and restored.

In its recent report "A Nation At Risk", the National Commission of Excellence asks for reform of our Nation's schools. The Auburn School District echoes the Commission's desire to develop students to the fullest by expecting

schools to have genuinely high standards rather than minimum ones. A thorough review of all curricular offerings in grades 1-8 has been initiated this year which will assist in identifying specific instructional strengths and weaknesses. Language Arts and Science disciplines are the major areas which are being reviewed initially at the Auburn Village School.

ECIA Chapter I programs for children in grades 1-6 continue to be funded which improve reading through a focus on building self concepts, and expanding communication skills. The one to one tutorial instructoinal approach as well as the strong emphasis on parent participation in the learning process combine to make this a most effective program for those students who are selected to participate.

ECIA Chapter II Block Grant funding has been allocated to the enhancement of computer education opportunities for the children of Auburn. Financing from this grant is providing all students in grades 4-6 with an awareness level of computer instruction. Each student in grades 7-8 is being afforded the opportunity to participate in a Computeronics course as a result of Chapter II funding.

In an effort to efficiently work within the spirit of the Federal Special Education Law PL 94-142, Resource Room teacher Jane Murray has become certified as a SAIF (Specialist in the Assessment of Intellectual Functioning). This will enable most diagnostic testing to occur in-house and thus represent a savings to the district.

I wish to thank all Auburn School Board members, the citizens of the community of Auburn. Principle Ray Bourque and all school staff members for their continued support throughout the past year.

Principal's Report

The school population of September 7, 1982 was 401 and when school closed in June, it was 398.

During the past school year the staff has been extremely valuable in helping me complete my objectives for 1982-1983.

The New Hampshire Writing program has become part of our Language Arts curriculum to give the students more time to develop writing skills. Mrs. Pinard, Chairperson, has attended classes, along with Mrs. Hannon and Mrs. Marcotte. These teachers have been the instructional leaders for the other staff members. Mr. Donald Graves from the University of New Hampshire will be available to our school district for consultation during the 1983-1984 school year.

The Accountability Committee, chaired by Mr. Griffin, has developed a monitoring system to insure compliance with the program at each grade level.

During the past school year the Science Committee, chaired by Mr. Hayward, has evaluated the existing curriculum and his committee recommended a new curriculum for the 1983/84 school year. The committee then reviewed several texts and gave their final choice to the school administration for adoption for the 1983-1984 school year.

In-Service Days provided part of the necessary time for committees and individual teachers to carry out the directions issued by the school administration.

With the aid of Mr. Cawley, Superintendent of Schools, the following objectives were developed and accepted by the Auburn School Board for me to work on during the 1983-1984 school year.

- Review the existing Accountability Guidelines with the Accountability Committee and review policy on Accountability with the School Board for the 1984/84 school year.
- 2. To develop a Gifted and Talented program during 1983/84 if the study from the Gifted and Talented Committee report to the School Board demonstrates the need for such a program.
- To develop a student recordkeeping system within the Auburn School District, encompassing both regular and handicapped students.
- To implement the Curriculum Design as set forth by the Assistant Superintendent for Instruction.

During the past year a well planned athletic program provided many valuable experiences for Auburn students in soccer, boys' and girls' basketball, baseball, softball and cheerleading. Many of our atheletes are now participating members of High School, Freshmen, Junior Varsity and Varsity teams.

During this past school year we completed the playground drainage project, which seems to be working effectively. The proposed walkway from the asphalt driveway to the primary entrance was also completed.

The roof over the kitchen area and the gym entrance was completed as scheduled.

As has been a practice in past years, a regularly scheduled painting and repair program was completed. The cupola, outside doors, hall ceilings, and two classrooms were painted.

Graduation exercises were held on Thursday, June 16, 1983, when forty-five students recieved diplomas. The guest speaker was Eleanor Podles, District Senator.

Honor speakers were Ronald Bobroff, Lisa Seneschal, and Terry Brown. Departmental awards went out to Terry Brown, Social Studies; Daniel Coughlin, Science; Lisa Senechal, English; Ronald Bobroff, Mathematics. Honor Student Award went to Ronald Bobroff. P.T.A. Award-Most Improved went to Rebecca Lavoie. Millie Preston Service Award went to Denise Morin. School Board Award-Citizenship went to Glenn Gibby.

Mr. Daniel Trombly, Vice President of the Citizen's Scholarship Fund of Auburn, made the presentation of the second annual Millie Preston Scholarship Fund Award to Diane Doyon. Diane is pursuing a medical career at Hofstra University in Hamstead, New York. A second award was presented to Kim Fischer who is attending Notre Dame College and working toward a degree in Special Education.

I would like to thank the parents, faculty, staff, students, School Board Members, the Superintendent of Schools and his staff, and those other valuable members of the community whose major efforts have been focused on supporting quality education.

Auburn School Board Report

In 1980, the School Board formed an energy Committee, which made recommendations for making our school energy efficient. In accordance with the committee's findings, many projects have been completed. The final phase of the conservation project, (the replacement of windows, insulation of walls and ceilings in the primary area), are to be undertaken in 1984/85. Money for this item is included in the budget.

We, as taxpayers, are paying more for our schools because of two major reasons:

- 1. Increased costs; and,
- 2. Decreasing state and federal funding.
 In this area, all citizens of the town can help by contacting state and federal representatives, and demanding that

state and federal representatives, and demanding that they vote for increased aid to local school districts.

Over the past five years, we have seen a reduction in high school dropouts. This is due to both a hardening economy and an improvement in our education in the elementary grades. However, it is apparent from our students' performance in high school that two particular areas still need improvement. (English and Social Studies). In an effort to improve these areas, as well as to see that all educational areas are maintained at their current level, a Curriculum Committee has been formed. It is the responsibility of this group to constantly review what is being taught and the methods used to teach it.

The Board has formed a School Needs Committee. This committee is charged with determining the long range goals of the Auburn Village School in the realm of education.

We thank the Auburn PTA for its efforts in the development of a playground area in the school yard. We would also like to thank all the individuals and corporations who contributed to this effort.

Special thanks to Board Member Bill Wood for the fine job he has done as a member of the Budget Committee as well as his efforts as Chairman of the Supervisory Union Board. These same thank yous are extended to Herb Tardiff for his efforts in negotiations with the Auburn Teachers Association.

We thank, Raymond Bourque, for his continued leadership and unselfish giving of his time to help all people in the community.

We give special thanks to all the members of the community, who have in anyway given their support to the Board.

We again urge you to take an active interest in your school. We welcome your questions, ideas, and advice that are offered in a spirit of co-operation for it is you and your children who will benefit from the quality of the education at the Auburn Village School.

Visiting Nurse Assocation Home Health Agency of Greater Manchester, Inc.

The Visiting Nurse Association- Home Health Agency of Greater Manchester, Inc. founded in 1897 has a history of many years of providing health care at home and in the community to those who need services. The agency is a voluntary non profit agency committed to the community and the people we serve. Services are provided to Auburn, Bedford, Candia, Goffstown, Hooksett, Manchester with limited services to Amherst, Milford and Mont Vernon. The agency is nationally accredited by National League for Nursing and American Public Health Association. It is Medicare and Medicaid certified and also a United Way Agency. During this past year Mrs. Peggy Wornick of Auburn served on the Board of Directors.

The Agency provides home care services 7 days a week, 24 hours a day and other agency services are regularly uled. Services are provided within its funding resources scheduled. Services are provided within its funding resource of the Agency. The agency works hard to provide necessary services to people who are unable to pay for them and rely on town appropriations to assist with these services. The Town appropriations are vital to the continuation of services to the Town of Auburn. Fees are usually discussed at the initial visit and adjustments to the fee are made on an individual basis.

The Home Care Program, which includes Hospice Services, continues to be the largest program in the agency. Residents of the area receive high quality care from the staff in the privacy and comfort of their home. It is believed that this contributes significantly to a person's rate of recovery from illness and one's happiness.

During 1982 asd 1983, the elderly and chronically ill have been faced with increased Medicare and Medicaid denials for reimbursement of services. This has been a major factor, along with the increasing number of elders, in the agency's continued need to rely heavily on town appropriations.

The agency has also continued to provide Immunization clinics, adult health screening programs, including Blood Pressure screening, Foot Care Clinics to the community. Other prograq s include the Occupation Health Services Program and the Parent Child Health Program which includes the Teenage Pregnancy Program. Walk-in Blood Pressure Screening, health counseling and teaching are provided Monday-Friday from 1-4 p.m. at the office, 194 Concord Street, Manchester.

During this past year in Auburn, the Agency served 29 residents with 432 home visits. 20 hours of clinics were held in the Auburn area.

The total value of services rendered to Auburn resident during 1983 was \$14,192. Services rendered without payment were subsidized with town appropriations of \$4,007, grants, United Way, donations and other solicitations.

Planning Board Report

After serving three years in a most concientious and capable capacity, Mr. Albert H. Burtt resigned as Chairman of the Auburn Planning Board. Mr. Burtt, has been and will be greatly missed. Additionally, Mr. James R. Andrus and Mr. John Perras tended their resignations to the Planning Board. Attorney Alex Komaridis, also, resigned as the Planning Board's counsel. All of the individuals mentioned above donated countless hours for the Town's welfare and will be sorely missed.

The vacated members' seats were filled by Mr. Louis Gamache, Mr. Frank Clark, and Christine Chase O'Neill. Mrs. Brenda Beer was selected as the Selectmen's representative in 1983

The major accomplishment of the year was the passage of the new Zoning Ordinances by the Town's voters. The Planning Board, also, implemented a formal fee schedule and a new "green area" regulation, revised formal notice procedures, and re-instated application and checklist forms.

The Planning Board organized attorney selections proceedings and after interviewing three law firms selected the firm of Wadleigh, Starr, Peters, Dunn, and Cheisa which presently, represents the Town on other matters.

Finally, the Board is placing before the Town, for the voters' approval, two important questions which will appear on the Town ballot in March. The Board urges a "Yes" vote on each question. The first is to change the Town Building Code from the present National Building Code, which will eventually be phased out, to the more applicable and current BOCA Building Code. This change is also recomended by the Auburn Building Inspector.

The second is a change in zoning classification of a 22 parcel of land located at the junction of Route #28 By-Pass and Rattlesnake Hill Road. The land is located on Tax Map #1. This parcel is currently zoned Commercially but due to access restriction and abutting residential use, the Planning Board feels it would better serve the Town if this parcel is rezoned to Agricultural-Residential. This change is also supported by the Zoning Board of Adjustment, the Zoning Officer, and the Board of Selectmen.

The Auburn Planning Board has experienced an extremely active year in relation to planning funtions. Applications placed before the Planning Board this year resulted in the following approved actions:

Report of the Southern New Hampshire Planning Commission

A wide range of services, resources and technical assistance is made available to your municiple officials through the Town's membership in the Southern New Hampshire Planning Commission. A professional staff having diverse planning and engineering skills, backgrounds and experiences works under the direction of your representatives developing and carrying out a cost-effective planning program to help meet the development needs of your community.

Staff services provided under the Commission's local assistance program are largely decided by the planning board and/or board of selectmen according to what they determine are their Town's planning and community development priorities. Manpower allocations are made on the basis of the communities membership fees.

Local assistance services provided during the year included:

Updated and printed a new "Zoning and Road Map" following the 1983 Town meeting;

Assisted the Selectmen's office with the preparation of the 1983 Community Development Block Grant application;

Met with the Chairman of the Planning Board and the Building Inspector to evaluate the Town's administration and enforcement of the National Flood Insurance Program requirements. The evaluation indicated that procedures were adequate to assure continued compliance.

Provided members of the Planning Board, Zoning Board of Adjustment, Board of Selectmen, and the Building Inspector with the schedule of the Fall, 1983 Municipal Law Lecture Series:

Acting in the Town's interest, testified at Legislative hearings relative to the recodification of the State's planning and zoning statutes, and was successful in securing necessary amendments prior to the legislations passage. As a follow up, submitted written comments, questions and suggestions to the N.H. House Committee on Municipal and County Government in an effort to further improve this important legislation during the next session;

Provided the Planning Board and the Board of Selectmen with a suggested schedule for public notices and hearings pertaining to zoning and/or building code amendments, if any, to be considered by the March 1984 annual Town meeting;

Assisted the Planning Board in their efforts to resolve pending litigation:

Provided Supervisory School Union #15 with 1980 Census information;

Provided the Selectmen's office with opinions regarding interpretations of various provisions of the Auburn Zoning Ordinance;

Provided copies of the composite tax map for the use of the Auburn Recreation Commission:

Provided the Planning Board with information regarding statutory requirements for the filing of applications and the notification of abutters and the public on subdivision proposals;

Counseled the Board of Selectmen regarding the preparation of their response to the Federal Highway Administration's proposal to include N.H. Route 101 in a national network of highways on which tandem trailer trucks (up to a gross weight of 80,000 lbs.) would be allowed unrestricted daily use;

At the request of the Selectmen's office, provided traffic count data for the use of the Planning Board in the evaluation of a proposed subdivision.

Regional Planning programs and special studies, which can vary from year-to-year, are carried out on a contractual basis depending upon the availability of other funds which are allocated for specific projects or designated geographical areas. The sources of these funds may include other municipal appropriations, the Federal Highway Administration, the Urban Mass Transportation Administration, the Department of the Interior, teh ministration, the Department of the Interior, the Federal Emergency Management Agency, etc.

Auburn Volunteer Fire Department

The Auburn Volunteer Fire Department responded to 170 calls for the year ended December 31, 1983.

84 Rescue and Medical Emergencies

24 Chimney Fires 4 Electrical Fires

12 Brush Fires 4 Dumpster/Incinerator Fires

There are thirty-four active firefighters and medically trained personnel on the fire department roster. Throughout the year, members have attended fire schools, training drills, Emergency Medical Technician training, Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation courses and MAS Trouser training.

In January, 1983, the department sponsored the first annual Green Burn and Open House for the citizens of Auburn This function allowed Auburn residents to dispose of their Christmas trees and inspect the firehouse.

In the spring of 1983, the Fire Association purchased a \$4,000.00 emergency vehicle. This vehicle is a former ambulance converted into a well equipped rescue vehicle. The Women's Auxilary, constant, active supporters of the Volunteer Fire Department, purchased an \$800.00 radio for this vehicle. The town is still under contract with Southern New Hampshire Ambulance Service for patient transport.

The Association also purchased a cascade air system so the department can refill its survivair tanks and fire extinguishers.

A Communications center was constructed in the front of the firehouse. Other building renovations include insulating and sheetrocking the downstairs level, a new roof, a new linoleum floor for the office, and painting the interior and exterior of the building. The time for these projects is donated by the firemen and Auxilary but the costs are defrayed by the continued donations from organizations, businesses and the citizens of Auburn. This support is appreciated.

The department is continually purchasing new fire and medical equipment. Purchases include protective gear, a bag/mask resuscitator, radios as well as the replacement of supplies.

Two dry hydrants were installed by the fire department this fall. One is located on Bunker Hill Road and the other on Hooksett Road.

The fire department eliminated the obsolete red phone system this year and contracted with the Town of Derry for a central dispatch service. This service allows the department to maintain more accurate records, faster response time and most importantly, assurance that all calls will be answered.

In response to the growth and needs of the town, the fire department is continuing to work with town officials on the plans for a second firehouse to be located near Wilson's Crossing Road.

The fire department continues to offer courses in rescue training to the public.

Report of Town Forest Fire Warden and State Forest Ranger

Once again, our cooperative town and state forest fire prevention and control program leads the nation in least acres burned per forest fire. Less than one-half acre per fire statewide average.

At the town level, your Forest Fire Warden is responsible for the prevention and control of all grass and woods fires when the ground is not snow covered.

Forest fire prevention is achieved at the town level by issuing a written permit for every fire that is to be kindled on the ground out of doors when the ground is not covered with snow. Each person wishing to have an outside fire must obtain this written permit from the town Fire Warden before kindling the fire. Any person that does not obain a fire permit, when one is required, is violating our forest fire permit law and is subject to a court appearance and could be fined up to \$1,000 and receive a jail sentence of up to one year.

No fire permit will be issued between 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. unless it is raining. The reason for this is twofold: the fire danger increases steadily between 9:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m., then subsides to a safe level between 2:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m. This happens because the sun dries out the fine fuels that easily ignited and dries the air which permits rapid fire spread. Also during this part of the day fire fighters are not readily available in most communities so an escaped fire could burn longer and cause greater damage before being suppressed.

Your cooperation in burning only when conditions are safe is greatly appreciated.

Auburn Police Department

1983 was a year in which Auburn Police Department continued to grow. It continued its 24 hour service to the community. Normal patrol shifts are divided between day and night patrols.

In January each of the Officers were briefed on a new program whereby the Auburn Police Department would assist the Auburn District Court in locating persons who were issued bench warrants. 445 person were arrested out of 1.393 warrants issued.

In February each of the officers received training on the current NH Fish and Game Laws. The Chief was appointed to the Public Affairs Committee of the New Hampshire Association of Chiefs of Police. This is a committee that works closely with your elected legislators concerning pertinent legislation.

In March each officer received in-service training in the changes in Off-Highway Recreation Vehicles.

In April each officer received in-service training in the new Uniform Accident reporting system. Each officer received in-service training in Timber and Forest Laws.

In May the Chief completed a course in Arrest, Search, and Seizure sponsored by the FBI and St. Anselm's College.

In June the new Ford police cruiser was put into service. It replaced the 1977 Dodge police cruiser. The Chief attended the Chief's conference.

In July, the Auburn Police Department extended its patrol coverage and in cooperation with the Water Shed Patrol patroled by boat and by OHRV.

In August the department assisted at Olde Home Days. Officer Joseph Ober and Officer Michael Willett put on a K-9 demonstration. Officer Willett completed in-service training with the PR-24 night stick and conducted a training session with the Auburn Police Department.

In September the officers completed a training session concerning Child Abuse.

In October the Chief attended the International Association Chief's of Police in Detroit, MI. He completed training sessions in DWI programs, Police Stress, and Management of Small Police Departments. Each officer completed a 4 hour training session on fingerprinting. With the assistance of the Lady Lion's Club and the PTA, the Auburn school children were fingerprinted.

In November there was an in-service training seminar conducted on DWI, Detection, Screening, and arrest.

In December the department added Flak jackets and First Aid kits to its cruisers. We would like to thank the Auburn Fire Department in assisting us with the first aid supplies.

The Auburn Police Department would like to acknowledge the continuing assistance from its neighboring public safety agencies. The department would also like to recognize the special talents of Officer Edward Picard for his ability to assist police agencies with his composite drawings of criminal suspects, Officer Joseph Ober and the use of his K-9 Bullet. There are two citizens that the department would like to thank. Mrs. Patricia A. Tropiano who has assisted us with the thefts involving jewelry, precious metals, and silverware. Because of her unique talents in describing missing items, a large number of items have been returned to the victims. Rev. Hubert J. Topliff has assisted several families in times of domestic problems and in the times of personal loss of family members.

In closing, the Auburn Police Department would like to thank the residents and the organizations of Auburn for their time and efforts and the Police Commission and Selectmen for input, advice and counsel.

1983 Road Committee Report

The Road Committee had several meetings in 1983. They met with representatives for other Town and State department in order to consolidate ideas. Barbara Lee joined the Committee as the Secretary.

In 1983, twenty traffic signs were purchased and set out by the Road Agent. The speed limit for all town roads was set at 35 mph. Seven speed signs were erected on roads entering the community. The Town intends to continue the sign program in 1984.

Wilson Crossing was the major project of 1983. The ledge near the Boyce's home was removed and the road was straightened. In 1984, the Telephone Company will move their wires at the corner of Wilson Crossing and Route 121 so that the corner can be rebuilt. The paving of the dirt portion of Wilson Crossing took much longer than expected. Lane Construction will return in the spring and put down another coat of our material at no further cost to the community.

The Town accepted bonding to ensure the completion of Cameo Court, Pine Ridge Court, Margie Lane, and McEvoy Drive. Once bonding arrangements are made housing construction can begin. Harold and Priscilla Towne are requesting a sub-division before the Planning Board off Gardner Road. The Townes have entered into agreement with the Selectmen to upgrade Gardner Road which is presently a Class 5 road.

In 1983, S.N.H.P.C. was asked to do a traffic survey of Hills Road and found the 25 homes will generate 250 trips in and out of a development each day.

The Road Committee is recommending \$40,000 for the work on Eaton Hill Road. This money is to be used to blast ledge by Hrycuna's property and the removal of other ledge outcroppings. Then, the road bed will be prepared for tarring and shimming.

The Road Committee feels that Eaton Hill, Coleman Road, and Chester Turnpike should be rebuilt over the next few years. \$30,000 is recommended for the tarring and shimming which can be used to make surface repairs

throughout the community. The Town, also, plans to remove ledge on Old 101 this year.

The Selectmen's Office applied for a Community Development Grant in 1983. If it is approved, \$100,000 will be used to upgrade the private roads of Appletree, Hunting Road Extension, and Peach Tree to a condition where the Town could take them over. This is Federal money and would not affect the tax rate.

The Road Committee would like to thank Ted Barwell, S.N.H.P.C., and the Selectmen's Office for their advice and imput.

Recreation Committee

Two significant accomplishments were made by the Auburn Recreation Committee in 1983, First, a four week summer recreation program for children aged 7-13 was conducted during the period of June 20 - July 15, 1983. Michael Champoux of Salem, N.H. was the Director of this program. Total atendance for the four week period was 637 with an average daily attendance of 34 children. The summer program featured arts, crafts, and games conducted in morning and afternoon sessions, and was highlighted by outings to Bear Brook and Hampton Beach State Parks as well as a cook-out, carnival, and "Halloween" party, Mr. Champoux was assisted by the following young adults from Auburn: Susan Lord, Kristen Marzloff, Karen Marzloff, Paul Neveu, Michael Thomas, and Sean Thomas. Mrs. Jackie Wood assisted with arts and crafts. Special "thanks" to Mr. Raymond Bourgue and the Auburn Village School for making facilities and equipment available for the program. Based upon the success and popularity of this year's summer recreation program, it is the Recreation Committee's intent to make it available again in 1984.

Second, the Town's application for a \$50,000 Land and Water Conservation Fund Grant for the development of much needed outdoor recreation facilities was recommended for approval by the State of New Hampshire. This development was made possible by the donation of approximately 28 acres of land by Haron Corporation in the recently developed "Sandy Acres" sub-division located off Wilson Crossing Road in the southwest section of town. Donations of cash, materials, and services by many local businesses and organizations make up the balance of the local share. This project is presently structured in two phases and will provide for the construction of tennis courts, outdoor basketball court, soccer field, two baseball fields, several playground areas, parking and roadways in the first phase. Development will commence after the land is turned over to the Town of Auburn by the developer.

Future Planning Committee

In 1983, the Future Planning Committee attempted to pinpoint areas where tax dollars would be required to meet the needs of the community. Once problems are identified, the community can plan solutions in an orderly fasion.

The population projections predicted for Auburn by the Office of State Planning in 1975 indicate the need for planning. At that time, they felt Auburn's population would reach 3,382 in the year 2000. That figure is probably very close to our population at the present time, and from all appearances, 1984 will be another boom year in the construction industry.

According to N.H. State Statute, RSA 674:5, the Planning Board has jurisdiction over Capital Improvement Plans. They are requesting a "yes" vote on the article in the Warrant. A Capital Improvements Plan, mandated by Town Meeting, can prepare the community for the future and allow the Planning Board to regulate the community's growth to meet those problems.

Burning Regulations

TO REPORT A FIRE DIAL 483-2521

The State of New Hampshire requires that written permits be obtained for all open fires at all times when the ground is not snow covered.

Permits may be obtained from the Forest Fire Warden, Mr. Martin Sullivan, for grass, brush, campfires, etc. Permits must be obtained on the day burning is to be accomplished. Burn when there is no wind, on rainy days and damp days, in a safe place and in accordance with the terms of the permit. Burn before 9:00 A.M. and after 5:00 P.M. Keep some buckets of water close by; if wind develops, promptly extinguish the fire. All fires must be extinguished before you depart the scene.

Parking During Snow Storm

A. From November 1 to April 1 of each year no person shall park any motor vehicle on any public highway between the hours of 11:00 P.M. and 8 A.M. or at any time in such a manner as to impede snow removal operations.

- B. Any vehicle parked in violation of section A hereof may be towed by the road agent, the chief of police or their agents or by independent contractors engaged by the road agent or the chief of police: any vehicles so towed shall be stored and released to the owner only upon payment of the cost of towing and storage by the owner.
- C. Any person violating section A hereof shall be subject to a penalty not to exceed twenty-five dollars for each offense.

Dog Ordinance

- A. RESTRAINT: All dogs shall be restrained from running at large within the limits of the town, except when they are on the owner's or keeper's property or being used for hunting or training purposes.
- B. PENALTY: Any person or persons, firm or corporation violating any provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction, be fined not more than fifteen dollars (\$15.00) for each offense.
