

TOWN MEETING WARRANT

The State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Bath qualified to vote in town affairs. You are notified to meet at the Town Hall in Bath on Tuesday, March 11, 1958, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

- Article 1. To choose a Town Clerk, one Selectman for three years, one Trustee of trust funds for three years, one Library Trustee for three years, a Treasurer, an Auditor, one or more Highway Agents, and all other necessary officers and agents for the ensuing year.
- Article 2. To hear the reports of officers and agents heretofore chosen and to pass any vote relating thereto.
- Article 3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for town officers' salaries and expenses, for repairs, maintenance and construction of highways and bridges, for the support of the Town Library, for Old Age assistance and the support of the town poor, and for the observance of Memorial Day and Old Home Day, and for all necessary town charges and expenses for the ensuing year.
- Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for the construction of class 5 roads and to raise and appropriate or set aside the sum of \$780.60 and the State will contribute \$5,203.99.
- Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not exceed \$100.98 for the town's share of cooperative participation in the White Mountains Region Association.
- Article 6. To see what action the Town will take on the following question: Shall the provisions in Chapter 171A of the Revised Laws relative to playing games of beano be adopted in this town?

- **Article** 7. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Municipal Accounting Division and to make an appropriation to cover the expenses of such audit.
- **Article** 8. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to purchase a complete set of curtains for the Town Hall stage, and to raise and appropriate the money for same.
- Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to dispense with the delivery of inventory blanks until April 1.
- Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired through the Tax Collector's deed.
- Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- Article 12. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF FIRE DEPARTMENT

The appropriation of last town meeting to cover the purchase of a portable pump and some hose, has had far reaching results.

A good number of civic minded men of the town have organized a fire department and are showing every evidence of having one of the best departments in the area in the near future.

Using the portable pump as a nucleus they, through the generosity of G. C. Minot obtained a pickup truck which was entirely rebuilt by Roscoe Olney and Arthur Minot, each spending more than 100 hours on the project ably assisted by Albert Lamarre, Vale Badger, Bill Houston and many others. Not satisfied with this they formed a department with Roscoe Olney as Chief, Arthur S. Minot, Assistant Chief, Albert Lamarre, Engineer, Holman Whitney, Treasurer, and Vale Badger, Secretary. Financing themselves through a very successful Turkey Supper and some donations, they bought a Boyer Pumping engine capable of putting out 500 gallons per minute. This too has been entirely overhauled and is ready for action, only being limited by an inadequate supply of $2\frac{1}{2}$ inch hose.

The town can be justly appreciative of these men who have given their time and energies to an important cause.

Along with the above mentioned men the following have been of great assistance: Jasper Ide, Elwin Clough, Harry Poor, Lawrence Chase, Linwood Tewksbury, John Poor, Harry Whitcomb, Arthur Burt, John Whitney and many others who helped in converting

the unused Town Hall cellar into an acceptable Fire House.

SCHOOL WARRANT

The State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Bath qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said district on the 12th day of March, 1958, at eight o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
- 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose agents, Auditors, and committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

- 9. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to expend the proceeds (\$1,305.20) received from the sale of the Carbee school property for the support of schools.
- 10. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to dispose of the land and building known as the "Swiftwater School" property and to issue deed for same.
- 11. To see if the district will vote to authorize the application of any unanticipated income to expenses.
- 12. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The resignation of both Miss White and Mrs.

Bowles, late in the summer of 1957, caused two vacancies in the teaching staff of the Bath School. We were fortunate to fill each vacancy before the September opening of school.

Mrs. Agnes Andross of Lisbon was employed as Principal and teacher of the pupils in the upper grades. Mrs. Andross holds a B. Ed. degree from Plymouth

Teachers College and is an experienced teacher.

The primary room vacancy was filled by Mrs. Thelma Whitcher of South Ryegate, Vermont, who is a graduate of Lyndon Teachers College and holds a B. S. in Ed. degree from that institution. She also is a teacher with several years of experience.

The resignation in June of Mrs. Danforth precipitated the closing of the Swiftwater school. The school board, in so doing, is to be commended for taking this step of improving the educational opportunities for the few pupils who attended the school. Not only was this action beneficial to the pupils but also economically favorable to the district.

Under the present New Hampshire Building Aid law, whereby a school district may receive 30% of its payment of principal on an approved bond issue, or 50% if in a cooperative school system, it is of utmost importance that the educational opportunities of Bath be seriously considered insofar as the possibility of build-

ing expansion is concerned, or the forming of a cooperative school district with neighboring communities for improved offerings for grades seven and eight or seven through twelve. When a district may obtain up to 50% of the principal payment of its building cost, it seems economically sound to avail the district of such an opportunity.

The current magazine and paper articles, as well as the programs on radio and television, stressing the importance of advanced courses in science and mathematics are matters of which educators have been conscious for the past decade, as has been shown by the giving of tests and by the compiling of statistics in our New Hampshire schools by the State Department of Education. The results of these have shown conclusively that the larger secondary schools—having enrollments of 350-500 pupils—have more efficiently met these scholastic challenges than can possibly be accomplished by the small high school.

The solution for our rural districts is consolidation. Your superintendent of schools has recommended this procedure of improving instructional opportunities for the past eight years. Much has been accomplished at the elementary level, but our actual accomplishments at the secondary level lag at least 25 years behind the best recommended practices attained by larger systems.

Appreciation is again expressed for the continued support of the citizens of the community, the constructive policies of the school board, and the initiative and loyalty of the teaching staff and other school personnel.

The report of our school nurse, Mrs. LaMott, follows.

Routine vision and hearing screening tests were completed. When symptoms of defects were found, written notices were sent to parents and follow-up home visits were made.

A Well Child Conference was held in the Town Hall February 14 and March 14. Nine children received immunization for tetanus, diphtheria, and whooping cough.

One pupil attended the Child Guidance Clinic held in Littleton October 11, 1956.

There were several polio clinics during the year. Thirty-five pupils completed their third polio inoculation. Two pupils received their 1st and 2nd polio inoculations. The polio clinics were conducted by Mrs. Loretta Russell, R.N., Public Health Nurse, for the State Department of Health.

In March, a Fluorine Clinic was held with all children in grades 1 through 6 given an opportunity to participate. The State Department of Health, Bureau of Dental Services, furnished the services of a dental hygienist, the equipment, all materials used, and special films and literature. Board and room for the hygien-

ist was sponsored by the local school district. The Fluorine program consisted of:

- 1. Examination and cleaning of pupils' teeth.
- 2. Four applications of the Fluorine to the teeth.
- 3. Special classroom instruction in proper dental care.

Forty-five pupils from the Bath village and Swiftwater schools attended these clinics.

The metal index file was purchased for our health records. This is a folding file which holds all of the pupil health cards for the Bath School District.

In November, 1956, I had an opportunity to attend The American School Health Association Convention in Atlantic City, New Jersey. There were five school nurses present from New Hampshire. We enjoyed the meetings and exhibits which we visited. It was very interesting to meet the experts from all parts of the United States and to hear what they are doing in their various school health programs.

I want to thank Mr. Bennett, the teachers, pupils, and parents for their kind cooperation in the School Health Program.
