

TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Bedford in the County of Hillsborough, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday, the ninth day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- Article 1. To bring forward your ballots for the necessary Town officers for the ensuing year and the ensuing three years.
- Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriations for same.
- Article 3. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the poor, and assistance to the aged.
- Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,500.00 for the maintenance of highways and bridges and for any other necessary expenses of the Town.
- Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes up to the sum of \$15,000 if needed.
- Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 for the Town Library.

- Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$15.00 for the care of the clock on the church.
- Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$225.00 for the care of the New Cemetery and pumping water for same; \$30.00 for the care of Joppa Cemetery; \$10.00 for the care of the Old Cemetery on the Back River Road; and \$7.00 for the care of the Beals Cemetery.
- Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$804.04 for the construction of Class V highways, the State to contribute \$3,216.16.
- Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for the tarring of Class V highways, under the direction of the Selectmen.
- Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for Memorial Day and patriotic purposes.
- Article 12. To see what action the Town will take regarding rates of pay for labor employed by the Town.
- Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to adopt a non-partisan ballot system for Town elections.
- Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to accept \$100.00 in trust, from Fred H. Merrill, the interest from which to be expended for the care of his lot in the Bedford Center Cemetery.
- Article 15. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees and of other officers heretofore chosen, and to

transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The annual school meeting was held in the Town Hall, Bedford, New Hampshire, Saturday, March 7, at two o'clock.

Officers elected for the ensuing year were as follows:

Moderator-William Melendy.

Clerk-Bernice H. Wiggin.

School Treasurer-Henry Blood.

Member of School Board for three years—Etta M. Hodgman.

The town auditors were elected to serve as school auditors.

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$24,012.28 necessary to balance the school board's budget.

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100 for grading playgrounds of three schools.

Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300 for music supervisor for all schools.

Voted to have student traffic patrol.

Voted to have the school district meeting with town meeting if possible.

Three members of the board met at the close of the annual meeting. Mrs Hodgman was given the oath of office. Mrs Barnard elected chairman and Mrs. Hodgman, clerk for the ensuing year.

The Board attended the Union meeting at Hudson on May 14th. Mr. Gaius H. Barrett was recommended for nomination as acting Superintendent of Schools at an excess salary of \$1,400.

Office expense was set at \$19 per teacher.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

Hudson, New Hampshire February 8, 1943

To the School Board and Citizens of Bedford:

I herewith sumit my second annual report as Superintendent of Schools:

We were very fortunate in being able to keep all of our teachers except one. Agnes Trefethen who taught seventh and eighth grades at Stevens Buswell resigned and was replaced by Anna O'Connor.

The teaching program is being carried on this year the same as last. There seems to be a great advantage in giving our standard tests soon after the middle of the school year. If weaknesses in different subjects show up or eighth grade pupils are below standard in any subject they can be given special work and drill in those subjects.

Eighteen of the 1942 graduates entered the Manchester West High School. Two of these left school before the mid year. The sixteen who remain made an excellent record for their first half year. The general average marks for all, for the half year was 84. These pupils, their parents and teachers are to be congratulated.

Mrs. Katherine Bartlett of Goffstown was secured for the work of Music Instructor and supervisor in the schools. The results have been very gratifying. We hope that the music work can be continued. After two or three years we shall be able to see the cumulative results of this work.

Pupil traffic patrols have been organized for all three schools buildings. Badges and belts have been supplied by

the New Hampshire American Automobile Association. The plan is working well and we plan to continue the program for the coming year.

During the past year the teachers have been called upon by the Federal Government to ration sugar, gas, fuel oil and canned fruits and vegetables. Naturally this service interferes a little with the ordinary work of the school, however in the course of the school year, as far as we can see, the school work is about up to where it should be.

The new ceilings at Donald St. and new water pipes at Peter Woodbury schools are greatly appreciated. The grounds and buildings are in much better shape. The repairs for the coming year are being cut down as much as possible because of the difficulties of securing labor and materials. We hope that enough fuel oil will be supplied so that alterations and new heating equipment will not be necessary at the Stevens Buswell School.

Transportation of school children has become and may become still more a serious problem. We may be obliged to change some of the transportation routes and discontinue others. This will mean that many of our children will have to walk a greater distance than has formerly been the case. The local regulation setting a mile and a half limit may be changed for the duration. We plan, in so far as possible, within the O.D.T. regulations to meet all reasonable needs of the Bedford children.

I would like to express my appreciation for the fine cooperation of the School Board, teachers, pupils and all others concerned who have helped to make a most successful school year.
