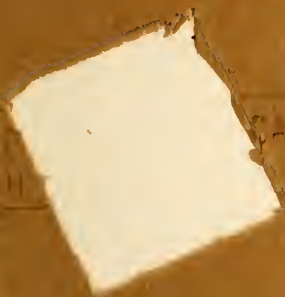

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Campton in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Campton on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the followig subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for the maintenance of its highways and bridges and make appropriation of the same.
4. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.
5. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Campton Cemetery also to clean up and fence other cemeteries in town.
6. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.
7. To see how much money the town will vote to raise for the White Mountain Region Association.
8. To see if the town will vote to raise \$400.00 for White Pine Blister Rust control.
9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate money to pay for the lease of land for government sawmill site and sawed lumber storage.
10. To see what action the town will take in regard to the rate of pay for road work and to pass any vote in relation thereto.

11. To see what action the town will take in regard to the rate of interest to be paid on trust funds and to pass any vote in relation thereto.

12. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the Peg Wood Hill road from the junction of the Page road so called to the Donovan place, subject to gates and bars.

13. To see if the town will vote to accept the reports of Agents and Officers heretofore chosen.

14. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

COMMISSIONERS' REPORT

The Precinct has outstanding notes on the water system to the amount of \$ 5,300.00. One note of \$ 500.00 came due in 1941 and we were obliged to have it renewed. There is a \$ 700.00 note due this year. A note for \$ 200.00 due 1942 was called for during April of 1941. The expense for materials, labor and interest for repairs and leaks from January 31, 1941 to January 31, 1942 is \$ 988.52. This amount about equals our receipts from water rents. These leaks occur in a certain section of the Precinct where the pressure is heaviest and apparently the pipe is weakest. The time is not far away when about 800 to 1000 feet of new pipe will have to be installed. The intake on the Winter Brook supply should have better storage space to take care of sudden rises and falls of water during the season. The intake on the small reservoir necessitated a long needed repair job this past summer at a cost of nearly \$200.00. We would heartily request that you will see your way clear to raise at least \$ 500.00 to apply on the outstanding notes as practically all the income from the service is being eaten up in repair work and interest.

The Precinct is fortunate in having a new supply of fire fighting equipment and three good supplies of water. The rub comes in being able to hold the supply in a weak pipe line.
