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EDWARD A. BARNEY 1881 - 1971

Loved and revered by young and old, "Ned" Barney was a man whose career ranged from that of a Congressional assistant in the nation's capital to that of country editor and printer. Best known for his forty years as editor and publisher of the Canaan Reporter, the weekly paper founded by his father in 1867, Ned also served for over a quarter-century as judge of the Canaan Municipal Court. To many he was "Judge" Barney from that time on.

For many years following his retirement in 1946 Ned Barney was active in probate work, but he never stopped writing. His many articles of reminiscence appeared regularly in Mascoma Week (successor to the Canaan Reporter) and delighted readers with the unfailing Barney wit.

"Gene" Lorden's record as a public servant has few equals. If one were to add up the years he served as Canaan's police chief (29), its fire chief (33) and its overseer of the poor (41) the total would come to well over a hundred years. And it would not even include his 11 apprentice years as a deputy policeman before he was elected chief. He remained active in town office until aged 79, four years before his death.

Beyond this impressive record of service to his home community Gene Lorden will be remembered for the bright sparkle in his eye and the characteristic pithy comment that accompanied it.

TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Canaan in the County of Grafton in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said Canaan on Tuesday, the Seventh day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of tax revenues.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to convey by quitclaim deed all property acquired by tax deed, or to take any other action thereto.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to continue the present policy of joint cooperation with the State of New Hampshire in the construction of bridges and to hire the necessary funds to provide the Town's share in any construction authorized and undertaken in the year ensuing.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money for Town bridge construction or to take any other action thereto.

- 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Tax Collector to receive partial payments from any person, firm or corporation owning taxable property and before tax bills of the amount of taxes assessed against said property for the year has been received. Such sums shall be divisable by ten but not less than ten dollars, and the Tax Collector shall receive such payments and give a receipt therefor and credit the amount toward the amount of taxes eventually assessed against said property.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept gifts, and/or Federal or State Aid in the name of the Town of Canaan.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote the sum of \$400.00 for the Lebanon Regional Airport, as requested by them or take any other action.
- 10. Pursuant to a petition of ten or more legal voters: To see if the Town will vote to join the Upper Valley Planning and Development Council (UVPDC) and to raise and appropriate the sum of sixteen hundred and twenty dollars (\$1,620) as the Town's share of operating the Council for the current year.
- 11. Pursuant to a petition of ten or more legal voters: To see if the Town will vote in favor of authorizing the Selectmen to study the feasibility of establishing a water precinct, for the purpose of acquisition and purchase of the properties of the Crystal Lake Water Company of Canaan, New Hampshire.
- 12. Pursuant to a petition of ten or more legal voters: To see if the Town will vote to install a light at the base of the road leading to the Verne Hines property in Canaan.

13. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Canaan Board of Selectmen to issue and enforce the following Building Permit Ordinance for the Town of Canaan, or act thereon:

SECTION I. On and after the date upon which this Ordinance is adopted by the Town of Canaan it shall be unlawful for any person or persons, firm or corporation to construct, reconstruct or establish any preconstructed building or edifice, including mobilehomes, except those mobilehomes moving into licensed Mobilehome Parks, on any plot of land in the Township of Canaan without having obtained a written building permit issued by the Board of Selectmen of the Town of Canaan. The cost of such permit will be fifty cents (\$.50) and application for such permit must be made in writing to the Board of Selectmen in the form required by them, at least seven days before starting construction or of moving a structure onto said property. Changes in present structures or new construction, involving an expenditure of less than three hundred dollars are exempt from this Ordinance, also ordinary maintenance of existing structures.

SECTION II. PENALTY. Any person or persons, or corporation who violates any provision of this Ordinance may, upon conviction, be punished by a fine of not less than ten dollars (\$10.00) or more than fifty dollars (\$50.00) and each day's failure of compliance with any such provisions may constitute a separate violation.

14. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to restrict the use of the town beach on Canaan Street Lake to Canaan, Orange, Grafton, & Dorchester residents and their guests, and to issue appropriate tokens and/or stickers at seasonal fees to the above users and resident boat launchers, and further issue said tokens and/or stickers at significantly higher rates to non-residents for boat launching only. Such revenue

would go towards proper maintainance of the Town beach on Canaan Street Lake.

- 15. Pursuant to a petition of ten or more legal voters: To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to have plans prepared for simple sanitary and dressing facilities at the public wharf area on Canaan Street Lake, to be undertaken with the financial cooperation of the Canaan Lake Association.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a new truck and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$17,000.00 for that purpose; and in order to pay for the same to authorize the Selectmen to use the sum of \$8,500.00 from the 1972 appropriations, and to pay the balance of the cost of said truck to authorize the issuance of a note in an amount not to exceed \$8,500.00, payable one year from the date of the note, in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act (Chapter 33, New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated) and to authorize the Selectmen to issue and negotiate said note and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take any other action that may be necessary to purchase said truck.
- 17. Pursuant to a petition of ten or more legal voters: To see if the Town will vote to ask the Selectmen to set a 25-mile per hour speed limit on the entire length of Canaan Street, and to erect signs to that effect.
- 18. Pursuant to a petition of ten or more legal voters: To see if the Town will vote to ban the drinking of alcoholic beverages on the public ways and beaches of Canaan.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to rescind the action taken at a previous town meeting that permanent police officers shall be elected by ballot; and commencing with

the 1973 annual meeting and thereafter special police officers and the chief of police shall be appointed by the Selectmen in accordance with provisions of New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated Chapter 105.

20. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees or any other officers heretofor chosen and to pass any vote relating thereto and to transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

MASCOMA AREA HEALTH COUNCIL Summary of Services for Town Report

January 1, 1971 through December 31, 1971

The Mascoma Area Health Council, ending its second full year of service to Canaan, Enfield, Grafton and Orange, reports that during the calendar year 1971 its visiting nurses made 1,353 calls at the homes of area residents for nursing service and health promotion. In addition, the Council provided free of charge for all pre-schoolers of the Towns 3 immunization clinics. 1 clinic for the testing of hearing and vision, and 5 well child conference clinics (at which each child received a full physical examination by a doctor or pediatrician). Defects and deficiencies discovered in the course of these clincis were discussed with parents and referred to further testing and treatment. The Council is at present maintaining a schedule of one free well child conference clinic each month, with a goal of having each child examined regularly from birth to school age.

The Council, founded in 1969, employs two nurses, who share the work load to give the area the equivalent of one full time nurse, maintaining a public health program and home nursing service. Mrs. Gertrude Clark, R.N., of Grafton, and Mrs. Toni Sadowsky, R.N. of West Lebanon, are the present nurses. Mrs. Clark has been with the Council since early in its history. For the first two years of its existence the Council was aided by a Grant from the State of New Hampshire to cover the salary of one of the two nurses. The four Towns served have contributed on the basis of population. It appears

that the State Grant will not be available for the coming year.

The Council maintains its office at Mascoma Valley Regional High School, with its own telephone (632-7234). Its services are available to all, regardless of ability to pay. It is dependent on, and grateful to, the Methodist Churches of Canaan and Enfield and St. Helena's Catholic Church of Enfield, which have provided space for its clinics, and to Mascoma Valley Regional High School for its office space there. A pamphlet describing the Council and its work and services is available on request.

REPORT OF CANAAN HISTORICAL MUSEUM

The Museum was founded in the Bi-Centennial year of 1961. It is located on the second floor of The Town Library and is open Saturdays from one to four, July and August, and by special appointment for schools and groups. Admission is free and all help is voluntary. Funds are acquired through membership, donations, food and handcraft sales, cards, maps and Bi-Centennial Histories.

Last year 260 people visited the Museum and seemed delighted by the variety of displays that have been so generously lent or donated over the past eleven years.

We are now registered with the National Trust for Historic Preservation. Peter Smith, their assistant for Museum Services, was sent up from Washington. He visited the Museum, Old Meeting House, the two churches and other early buildings in the Canaan Historic District. He plans to return and was most helpful.

The Museum has also joined the Associated Historical Societies of New Hampshire. Rita Webster and Elsie Crocker attended the annual meeting in Exeter.

Due to unforseen circumstances, Roxie Gould has resigned from her appointment at the Museum. She has been helpful in many ways and will be missed. Our thanks and warm wishes go to her.
