WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Columbia, in the County of Coos, in the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall on Tuesday, the 10th day of March, next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To vote to bring in ballots for election of Town Officers to be elected by ballot for the Town of Columbia for the year ensuing.

Article 2. To see if the Town will instruct its Selectmen to appoint all other Town Officers as required.

Article 3. To see what sum of money the Town will raise for the support of Town Charges for the ensuing year.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to enter into data processing contracts as provided by RSA 8-C:11.

Article 5. To see what action the Town will take with reference to hiring the Colebrook Fire Department and the Stratford Fire Department for the purpose of extinguishing fires in said Town, and in the event of favorable action to make necessary appropriation for the same.

Article 6. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate to support the general operations of the Stratford Fire Department.

Article 7. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate to support the operation of the Colebrook Communications Center.

Article 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise as a contribution for the support and services of the Upper Connecticut Valley Mental Health Service.

Article 9. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate as a contribution for the support and services of the Ver-Shire Center.

Article 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Ambulance District A-1 services.

Article 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Upper Connecticut Valley Hospital Association to help defray the cost of maintaining standby alert personnel to cover medical emergencies.

Article 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for operating expenses and matching funds of the Northern Coos Community Health Association.

Article 13. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the upkeep of cemeteries.

Article 14. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the purpose of appraising all new and remodeled buildings, mobile homes, land transfers, etc. to keep the Town at 100% valuation.

Article 15. To see what sum the Town will vote to raise for the White Mountains Region Association for publicizing and otherwise promoting the natural and commercial factors upon which the economy of the North Country is based.

Article 16. To see what sum the Town will vote to appropriate as the Town's share for operation of the North Country Council for one year, beginning July 1, 1981.

Article 17. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the poor for the year ensuing.

Article 18. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the Old Age, Blind and Disability Assistance for the year ensuing.

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for construction of Class V Roads and raise and appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$575.56 the State to contribute the sum of \$3,837.07.

Article 20. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of summer roads and bridges.

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to authorize its Selectmen to take action regarding plowing or otherwise keeping winter roads open in said Town for the year ensuing, as in their judgment seems conducive to the best interest of the Town and appropriate money for the same.

Article 22. To authorize the Selectmen to accept and expend \$7,511.79 revenue from the State Highway Department (Duncan Fund) for additional Class V Highway maintenance.

Article 23. To authorize the Selectmen to accept and expend \$6,829.60 revenue from the State Highway Department (Highway Subsidy) for additional maintenance, construction and reconstruction of Class V highways.

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to accept additional State Highway aid for the construction and reconstruction of Class V Highways and appropriate the sum of \$5,160.67 which will be an increase in the normal town appropriation for said purpose and the State to contribute the sum of \$5,160.67 as additional highway subsidy.

Article 25. To see what action the Town will take regarding Waste Disposal and appropriate money for same.

Article 26. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to contribute to the Colebrook Library.

Article 27. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate money for the final payment on the contract for preparation of Tax Maps and for the yearly maintenance of the Tax Maps.

Article 28. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the withdrawal from Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for use as set-offs against budgeted appropriations for the following specific purposes and in amounts indicated or take any other action hereon:

Article 29. To see if the Town will vote to petition the Representatives and Senators who represent the Town in the General Court to support in the current session of the General Court, the concurrent resolution to amend the State Constitution to limit the annual increase in spending by the State or any city, town, or other governmental unit of the state to five percent.

Article 30. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to incur debts for temporary loans in anticipation of the taxes for the ensuing year, and to pay such debts out of tax money when same is received.

Article 31. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, contract for, and accept aid relative to disasters and incur debts for temporary loans for same should the need arise.

Article 32. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's Deeds.

Article 33. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply any surplus remaining in their hands at the end of the fiscal year 1980 to the defraying of Town Charges and Appropriations for the year 1981 in order to effect a proportionate reduction of the amount to be raised by taxes.

Article 34. To see if the Town will vote to accept the reports of agents, auditors, selectmen, and all other officers and ratify and confirm the same.

Article 35. To transact any other business which may legally come before this meeting.

PROCEEDINGS OF SCHOOL DISTRICT MEETING
MARCH 11, 1980

The Columbia School District Meeting was called to order at 12:50 P.M. by the Moderator, Margaret Salls.

Article 1. Finley MacDonald made the motion that this article be passed over until the completion of the following articles. Seconded by Isabelle Parkhurst and the motion carried.

Article 2. Motion was made by Finley MacDonald to accept the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees or Officers of the Columbia School District. Fred Foss seconded the motion. The vote was in the affirmative.

Article 3. Isabelle Parkhurst made the motion that the School Board be authorized to make application for and to accept, on behalf of the District, any or all grants or offers for educational purposes which may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the State of New Hampshire and/or the United States. The motion was seconded by Ray Placy. The Moderator declared the vote in the affirmative and the motion carried.

Article 4. Finley MacDonald made the motion that the District raise and appropriate the sum of \$258,131.00 for the support of schools, for the payment of salaries for the School District Officials and Agents, and for the payment of the statutory obligations of the District. This motion was seconded by Edward Poulin. The Moderator called for discussion on the article. Roger DeBlois was concerned about the work-study project going on at present and Mary Lou Placy and Edward Poulin, school board members, agreed there are problems and this area is being studied carefully in hopes for improvement in the near future. No other questions were forthcoming and the Moderator called for a vote. The vote was unanimously in favor.

Article 5. The motion was made by Isabelle Parkhurst and seconded by Mary Lou Placy that Article 1 be adopted and polls be opened by balloting. The motion carried.

No further business to come before this meeting, the motion was made by Mary Lou Placy and seconded by Lucille Lalande to adjourn the meeting without Day or Date at 6:20 P.M.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Controversy is now growing in regard to programs for handicapped pupils and costs associated with providing these services. Federal and state mandates have placed an ever increasing financial burden on local school districts with little or decreased monetary support being received from the agencies mandating such programs. The State of New Hampshire is presently faced with a 5-6 million dollar deficit in support of programs related to handicapped pupils. In question is not the need and validity of programs for the handicapped but who will pay for the cost of the program and in what proportion.

Present state regulations mandate that each local school district provide a free and appropriate education program for every identified handicapped person, age 3 to 21 years. School districts that cannot provide an appropriate program locally are responsible for providing a program out-of-district on a tuition cost basis.

Newly proposed and revised state regulations mandate that local school districts provide, in addition to local handicap programs that it may now operate, additional staff assistance and instructional resources in any regular education class having more than 30 percent of its enrollment as educationally handicapped. Such staff assistance and resource shall include but not be limited to: interpreters for the deaf, teacher aides, prosthetics and orthotic equipment (auditory trainers/low vision equipment), note takers for the deaf and blind, consultative help for the regular class teacher, in-service training for the regular class teacher, and other supportive equipment and help deemed appropriate in the handicapped student's individualized education plan.

Sentiment is also growing and parents are now requesting that local school districts provide specialized programs of education for pupils identified as gifted and that monies allocated for such programs at least be equal to that of monies allocated to other specialized education programs.

As the controversy continues, serious concern has to be given to how local school districts will meet these issues in light of limited and already strained financial resources. Faced with pending reductions in federal support monies now received and very likely similar reductions in state support monies along with the increased cost of maintaining existing schools and programs, school district decisions on how to provide the best educational program for all pupils will indeed be difficult.

Project C.H.O.I.C.E., our federally funded Career Education Program, finished its second year of operation and funding. The curriculum was taught to all students in grades 2, 4, and 8. Meanwhile, a curriculum was written and implemented for grade 6. The initial evaluation report conducted during the school year indicated career information growth for those who were given the course at a significantly greater rate than those who did not take the career courses. This was true in all grades.

Once again standardized tests were given to all students in the district, grades 1-11, and also to St. Albert's pupils, grades 1-8. It appears that while nationally the test scores seem to be dropping, the results for the district indicated no such loss.

Finally, this past year in cooperation with Stratford High School, persons in the district were afforded the opportunity to prepare and take the G.E.D. (high school equivalency test). I am happy to report that better than 15 persons received their equivalency certificates.

6. Rubeola vaccine (measles)
7. Mumps vaccine

Free pre-school clinics are available in this area to meet the above requirements. For information and/or clinic dates, call the Home Health Agency at 237-8083.

COLEBROOK - COLUMBIA TITLE I REPORT

The 1979-80 Colebrook-Columbia Title I ESEA Project is designed to help children in grades 1-8 avoid failure in reading.

Title I reading classes are conducted on a daily basis and the individualized activities presented give the children incentive for and practice in the basic skills and understanding needed to become good readers.

In grades 1-2 this federally funded program is used to reinforce the specific skills of the basal reading program and to enhance the individualized approach to reading. Two of our teacher aides also provide supportive help to first graders in the regular classrooms.

A reading/language instructional system which defines each student's reading/language needs and capabilities and then provides the necessary learning experiences to meet these needs is the primary source of instruction in grades 3-4.

In grade 5 the major goal of reading - development of comprehension - is emphasized.

This fall, due to the receipt of a special concentration grant, Title I services were extended to include grades 6-8. Teaching reading in the content areas of science and/or social studies is the instructional approach to reading improvement. Title I participants are taught how to interpret materials required in these subject areas.

At present Title I provides individualized, supportive help in reading for 116 children in grades 1-8.

The staff includes 1 Director/Teacher, 1 Teacher (social studies and science), 1 Educational Associate, 2 Educational Assistants, and 3 teacher aides.

All Title I planning, progress and evaluation activities must be reviewed and advised by a Parent Advisory Board. My appreciation and compliments are extended to the people who serve on this board. They have not only dedicated hours to fulfilling federally mandated duties but have participated in actual program operations to help the children.

In May the Title I staff journeyed to Plymouth, Connecticut to present the keynote workshop at a Regional Title I conference.

This fall two of the staff were chosen to participate in the State Title I Planning Conference. Projected Title I needs at the State level were determined and prioritized for the next five-year period.

In October we conducted a workshop at the New Hampshire CEC Conference held in Portsmouth.

My thanks are also extended to the Title I staff. Their personal efforts to motivate and create happy and successful reading experiences in the classroom and their performances at workshops should be commended.

I would also like to take this opportunity to thank Manchester Manufacturing for helping us provide the children with an exciting learning experience by donating material and the use of a sewing machine. Research combined with the ingenuity of children, staff and several mothers resulted in the presentation of a terrific spring program for the public.

Title I participants clad in native dress representing five different countries and a Chinese dragon displayed exceptional perceptual motor skills through dance.

I am extremely pleased to report that this has been a very rewarding year. The combined efforts of the children, the parents, the school and the community are responsible for making this possible. It is indeed a pleasure to work with all of you.
