TOWN WARRANT

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Derry qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby instructed to meet at the Veterans' Memorial Building, in said Town, on the second Tuesday of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

By vote of the Selectmen, the polls for this meeting will remain open from ten o'clock in the forenoon until six o'clock in the afternoon, and as much longer thereafter as the Town, at the opening of the meeting, may vote.

1. To elect a Selectman for three years, Town Clerk, Treasurer, Collector of Taxes, Library Trustees, Trustees of the Trust Funds, Cemetery Trustee, Auditors, four Delegates to a Convention to revise the Constitution of the State and other necessary Town officials for the year ensuing.

2. To vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of the poor, for laying out and repairing highways, for building and repairing bridges, for the suppression of moths, for the police department and municipal court, for hydrant service and electric lights, for salaries of Town officials, for the Board of Health, for the expense of the Town Halls, for the support of libraries, for State and County taxes, for the observance of Memorial Day, for aid to the Derry Visiting Nurse Association, for playground purposes, for co-operating with the State and Federal governments in control of insect pests and white pine blister and for all other necessary charges arising in said Town, and pass any vote relating thereto.

3. To see if the Town will authorize the Board of Selectmen to sell and convey any real estate acquired through deeds from the Collector of Taxes or as a reimbursement for assistance furnished to citizens, and pass any vote relating thereto.

4. To see if the Town will authorize its Selectmen to incur debts for temporary loans in anticipation of the taxes of the municipal year in which such debts are incurred and made payable therefrom by such vote, and pass any vote relating thereto.

5. To see if the Town will direct the Collector of Taxes to allow a discount to all persons paying their taxes within such period as the Town shall limit, to fix the rate of such discount, and pass any vote relating thereto.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding \$562.66 (1/100th of one percent of the Town's valuation based on the 1947 assessment) to the Merrimack Valley Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town in cooperation with the other thirty-seven communities in the Merrimack Valley Region. The Budget Committee recommends that the sum of \$500.00 be appropriated under this article.

7. By petition, to see if the Town will vote to adopt the non-partisan ballot system for the election of town officers under the provisions of Chapter 22 of the 1943 Session Laws of the State of New Hampshire, determine the number of separate nominating petitions necessary to be filed by a candidate to be elected by ballot for town office, and pass any vote relating thereto.

8. By petition, to see if the Town will vote to improve the road leading from the black road to North Salem, New Hampshire, by tarring the same. The Bud-

get Committee recommends that no money be raised under this article.

9. By petition, to see if the Town will vote to grade, gravel and tar Lincoln Street from Crystal Avenue to Franklin Street and to raise and appropriate therefor a sum of money not in excess of \$800.00. The Budget Committee recommends that favorable action be taken under this article and that the sum of \$800.00 be raised for that purpose.

10. By petition, to see if the Town will raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purpose of improving and tarring Laconia Avenue extending from Crystal Avenue to Folsom Road. The Budget Committee recommends that the sum of \$600.00 be raised and appropriated for that purpose.

11. By petition, to see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to take action to secure the permission of the Courts of New Hampshire to convey the land situated on the Easterly side of Birch Street devised to the Town for a playground under the will of Harrison Alexander, and to apply the proceeds thereof for the construction and maintenance of suitable playground facilities on land of the Town adjoining Veterans' Memorial Field, said playground to be known as Alexander Playground, appropriate any money necessary therefor, and pass any vote relating thereto. The Budget Committee recommends that no money be raised for this purpose.

12. To see if the Town will ratify and approve the action of the Selectmen in conveying to Norman D. Gallien and Sybil Gallien by deed dated November 10, 1947, a portion of the Webster land, so-called, purchased by the Town for the use of the Town Dump, and pass any vote relating thereto.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money not exceeding \$500.00 for defraying the expenses of band concerts, and pass any vote relating thereto. The Budget Committee recommends that the sum of \$500.00 be raised and appropriated for this purpose.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,128.61 to match a State appropriation of \$4,514.45 for the purpose of construction and reconstruction of Class 5 Highways, and pass any vote relating thereto. The Budget Committee recommends that the amount suggested be raised.

15. To hear the report of the Town officials relative to the present situation in regard to the construction of a sewerage system in the Town, and pass any vote relating thereto.

16. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to install parking meters on the streets of the business section of the Town, to establish reasonable charges for parking to be paid through such meters, and pass any vote relating thereto.

17. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to acquire a centrally located parcel of land for the purpose of a public parking lot, to raise and appropriate money for the same, and pass any vote relating thereto. The Budget Committee refers this to the action of the Town Meeting without recommendation.

18. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, and Committees heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

19. To appoint any necessary committee on any article embraced in this warrant.

20. To transact any other business that may lawfully come before such meeting.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES

The special appropriation voted last year has been expended, in accord with the suggestion of the trustees, in redecorating the exterior and interior of the library. The trustees hope that they may be allowed to continue the program inaugurated with the installation of the asphalt tile floor and this year the painting. The program that the trustees have in mind involved an improvement of the lighting facilities over a minimum of three years.

The librarian has continued to render the same courteous, efficient service as has been evidenced the past several years. The resignation of Mrs. Jensen required adjustment in personnel that has been worked out so that at the present time two assistants, Mrs. Christine Butman and Mrs. Willard Whitcomb are dividing the duties. This will, it is anticipated, work out advantageously for trained personnel familiar with our facilities are available in case of illness.

The comment of last year still holds true. The borrowings continue at a high level. The type of reading is commendable. Non-fiction reading is in constant demand. The value of your library as an instrument of self-education is in direct ratio to the demand for such non-fictional reading.

Recreation, study and research are the three types of service rendered to the library. It is the endeavor of the trustees to provide for these in ratio to the public demand for such service. The courteous, helpful attitude on the part of the librarian and staff make it possible to render these services to the reading public.

LIBRARIAN'S REPORT

The 43rd annual report is herewith presented:

Routine work has been carried on as usual. We have had a slight gain over last year's circulation. Non-fiction leading with a gain of 780, while fiction had a drop of 450. The school box circulation is not quite as high as of last year.

Loss of books in circulation is much higher this year. The main reason seems to be that the people moving from town are neglecting to return their books before leaving. A few have reported books lost from their cars between their homes and the library.

Prompt return of borrowed books, when due, would be appreciated by the librarian. Only one copy of a book is purchased and if it is borrowed and not returned for two or three weeks it deprives others from reading the new books.

We have had many gifts of books the past year, Mrs. Marjorie Hylan gave us a set of "Ridpath's Universal history of literature." Many of the popular books of the year have been given by various patrons of the library. All have been gratefully received by your librarian.

The increase in our budget allowed us to purchase more children's books this year. Many of these are for the very young children. We have a great need of more books for the first three grades. This is the group

where they receive very rough usage. They wear out much faster than those for the older groups. The new books of biography and other non-fiction are very popular with the boys and girls of the 5th and 6th grades and Junior High.

Transcribed story hours for the children were held throughout the winter. This was made possible by the gift of a Victor machine by Mrs. Helen Hood. We have had some records given to us and Mr. Arthur Bertrand has kindly loaned us records suitable for the various grades.

Stormy weather prevented many from coming to the library to hear the Christmas Carols during the holidays.

Books are being sent to Shutins. Girl scouts are taking care of this service for the winter.

Mrs. Lillian Jensen resigned her position as assistant librarian Sept. 1st. Mrs. Christine Butman was appointed to take her place with Mrs. Winnifred Harding as 2nd assistant. Mrs. Harding has now resigned and Mrs. Lottie Whitcomb is with us.

Mrs. Harriet Low and your librarian attended the New Hampshire Library Association meeting held at the Plymouth Teachers college. Your librarian and her assistants, Mrs. Butman and Mrs. Harding were in attendance for one-day at the New England Library Conference. This conference was held at the New Ocean House, Swampscott, Mass.

The old oil burner, burned out when lightning went through it, was sold for salvage. We tried the plan of selling our discarded books for 5 cents each. This proved so popular that we will continue the plan in the future.

Extension Division of Home Service under Miss Ruth Stimson held several demonstrations in the li-

brary. At present art craft classes are held each Wednesday afternoon, Mrs. Edith Lang instructor.

Interesting exhibits have been shown throughout the year. Outstanding among these were the art subjects loaned by Mrs. Walter Pillsbury and Tom Grady. Mr. Grady loaned us his prize winning picture "Still Life." This was entered in the National Army Arts contest and won 2nd prize. It was exhibited at the National Gallery of Arts in Washington, D. C. and at the Fine Arts Museum of Boston, Mass.

"Toys of yesterday" proved a very interesting and amusing exhibit. Toys 25 years old and over were loaned by friends of the library. This collection of toys was of great interest to the older patrons as it recalled many happy memories of their childhood.

Book-Week was observed by the usual display of new books, gay posters and decorations. The particular object this year was a "Treasure chest for children of America." Each child was asked to give at least one favorite book to be sent to a school in the south. The response was gratifying, 8 boxes have been sent or a total of 450 books.

To quote Mrs. Elizabeth Watts, Director of the Hindman school: "Your wonderful boxes of books arrived last week and we appreciate your thoughtfulness in sending the kind of books the children like so well. If you could see the children as the librarian reads to them, or as they come to pick out a new book to take home to read, you would know from their shiny eyes how happy the books are making them."

We hope to be able to send a new box of books once in a while throughout the year.

Many favorable comments have been heard from our patrons on the new paint job in the library.

The Garden Club, under the direction of Mrs. Harding furnished the attractive decorations for the holiday.

We wish to thank those who have helped us make this such a successful year. Those who contributed books, exhibits and decorations for the library and our "Treasure chest." To Mrs. Hood and Mr. Bertrand for making story hour interesting for the children.

Thanks also goes to the newspapers for their publicity for the past year.

Teaching Personnel

Again the problem of teacher replacement was a serious one. The economic advantages of out-of-state or larger city teaching positions attracted 7 of the staff. One teacher retired because of marriage and one other retired. Three teachers were secured for the junior high school who were inexperienced. In the elementary grades all the new teachers to Derry were teachers of several years experience. In almost every instance geographic location was an important factor

in securing the services of all these teachers who proved to be valuable instructors. Teaching service and staff morale is at the highest level it has been for several years.

The other factor that is important in meeting the educational needs of pupils is providing adequate tools. Books and supplies fall in the category of tools. The large items in books purchase met certain needs. In Junior High School there were two definite needs. The girls in Home Economics were supplied with a text for the first time since the course has been offered. A broadening of the guidance course so that the graduating class might plan programs of work at the secondary level was inaugurated. This involved supplying the eighth grade with a basic text "Planning Your Career." The extension of this work in guidance will eliminate mistakes of course selection that lessen a pupil's chance of success at the Senior High School level.

At the primary level graded supplementary readers were provided. These give all pupils an opportunity to develop to the fullest their powers in the reading area. The main purpose of such supplementary materials is to provide all children with the opportunity to build a more satisfactory reading foundation. It provides the opportunity for "over learning" so that "forgetting" is less prominent in the succeeding grade.

Science was extended so that in a comparatively short time we will have this portion of the curriculum adequately supplied. The Junior High and the fifth grade at Floyd were supplied this year.

The beginning was made in correcting a situation in the English field. The eighth grade was furnished with a new text which more adequately meets the needs of the pupils for secondary work.

Geographies were provided for the fourth grade. The problem of sufficient number and variety of texts

was thus attacked at all grade levels. The availability of state aid funds made possible the general program embarked upon this year.

Proposed expenditures will complete the science and English program and provide reference materials in all schools. Provisions for the basic subjects plus the extension of curricula materials will afford an educational opportunity that will more adequately meet the needs of all.

Physical Plant

The regular program of building maintenance was followed out as usual. This involved painting by the janitors of two rooms, varnishing of floors, refinishing desks and miscellaneous minor repairs. In addition the cesspool at Oak St. was capped in a safer manner. The urinal at Oak St., a course of constant trouble, was fixed so that the wastes are carried away more satisfactorily. The so called music room at Oak St. was renovated. The drinking fountain, on the second floor, at Oak St. was replaced.

During the Christmas vacation the foundation of a central kitchen to serve as the center of a broadened hot lunch program was begun. A stove, sink and some shelving were installed. The continuance of this program will result in a kitchen that will be adequate in every respect.

A program of improved seating was also inaugurated. Deliveries are still slow but there are on order at present sufficient modern adjustable seating units to replace one room of the antiquated non-adjustable seats in Junior High.

Much of this program of improvement of physical plant was made possible through the broadened state aid program.

Proposed as a continuance of this program of physical improvement that will aid in the instructional

area are the following: The beginning of a program of lighting improvement, the installation of facilities for the science program at junior high, equipping the home economics laboratory with more adequate and modern furniture and installation of a water heater at Floyd. These projects are the continuation of a program of modernization that has been long delayed. Shortages of materials and labor was and continues to be a deterrent as far as rapid progress is concerned.

Finances

The overall budget shows an increase of \$6,833. The increase of estimated income of \$8,550 allows for a decrease in tax levy of \$1,717.

An analysis of the increases reveals that salaries for all personnel account for \$10,565. This item includes provision for an additional first grade teacher to care for the anticipated increase in entering pupils. Transportation has been increased \$2,000. Retirement for teachers is also increased \$560. This amount is established by statute. Hot lunch is substituted for other activities and increased \$225. This is necessary to meet the dietary standards set by the Federal and State agencies administering the program. Other items have nominal increases. The elimination of a deficiency appropriation and the special appropriation from current operating budget plus a decrease in the text book item balances these items sufficiently to make the proposed budget \$6,833 in excess of last year.

Income has been increased \$8,550.00 These figures are on the basis of the actual income for the current year, in which all items except trust funds show an increase.

Two special articles involving \$3,000 are presented to the voters of the district for consideration. One in-

volves fencing a gift plot for playground use and the other inaugurates a program creating a capital reserve to prepare for a building program which future elementary enrollments will necessitate.

Conclusion

The educational program of the nation, state and community face problems in the immediate future that are serious and involve heavy financial responsibilities.

The first which faces the whole nation is the problem of school housing. To house adequately the unprecedented number of elementary pupils who will be entering school in the next 5 years requires an expansion of existing facilities in all communities. In light of this fact the warrant has an article which enables the district, in a small way, to begin to prepare for the needed expansion.

A second problem which is also of serious import is the matter of teacher procurement. The economic situation of teachers had been such that the number interested in entering the field has been limited. The educational system of any community cannot be any better than its teachers. In fact of a continuing shortage of elementary teachers the problem of obtaining and retaining trained competent personnel becomes a problem that must be met with measures that enable the schools to be staged adequately. In effect the financial support of public schools will probably continue to rise until these problems are solved.

The work of the schools has progressed satisfactorily. The problems involved in operating a school system are many and varied. The solution of the problems is and will continue to be a matter of concern to all. That problems have been solved as satisfactorily as they have is the result of the cooperation of all. Par-

ents, teachers, pupils and school board members have conscientiously sought to solve cooperatively the problems that have arisen. This cooperation, I appreciate sincerely, and with such cooperation good educational opportunity for all children will be provided.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Derry Village School Board:

I herewith submit my sixth annual report as superintendent of schools in Derry Village:

Statistical Reports

Enrollment

The total enrollment for grades one through six for the period ending January 31, 1948 was 59 as compared to 57 for the same date last year and 54 two years ago.

Physical Plant

The greatest improvement in several years in the physical plant was made since the last report. The repairs included retopping the chimney, and pointing up masonry, rebuilding the steps on the front porch, and replacing several rotted window sash in the cellar.

The painting of the exterior improved the appearance of the building as well as preserving it. The greatest change was produced in the classrooms. The electrical fixtures were replaced by modern fluorescents with sufficient light to produce 30 foot candles on each

desk. In order to have the greatest efficiency the decorative scheme was changed to give higher reflective-value. In addition there is created, I believe, a happier busier attitude on the part of the students who are working in a more home like, pleasanter atmosphere. There is no question that the physical well being of the children is improved by the relief of eye strain due to the change in both rooms.

The question of board surface is being investigated at the present time to ascertain if we can add to the attractiveness of the room and also increase the visibility of written material on the board. A recent development in the field of writing surface makes it possible to use colored surfaces which will harmonize with the room color scheme and at the same time increase the reflective factor and visibility.

Another project under consideration is the installation of germicidal lamps. The engineering department of General Electric are expected to make recommendations in regard to this. In those communities where these facilities have been installed the incidence of diseases caused by air borne bacteria has definitely been reduced.

It is a hope that we may have one of the best school plants in the state with the best of conditions for physical and mental health of our students. The completed and contemplated projects are directed towards the fulfillment of such a hope.

Miss Josephine Stewart resigned to accept a position in Oregon. Mrs. Sophie Raudonis, a teacher of several years experience was secured in her place. The work of both rooms has progressed satisfactorily. The school has been fortunate to retain Mrs. Follansbee during these years when teacher turnover has been excessively high.

Both your teachers conscientiously strive to contribute to the development of the whole child. Lessons of sportsmanship, safety, health, and attitudes that will lead to the development of good citizens are taught both by precept and example. The development of group consciousness and self discipline is evidenced almost daily.

The enrollment continues to show evidence of increases. The statistical data compiled by the actuarial department of Metropolitan Life Insurance Co. indicates that we can expect a peak enrollment in 1956. The figures indicate practically a third higher enrollment than we had in 1945. This is figured on a national basis. If we follow national trends and seemingly we will it would indicate approximately 65 pupils in that year. In light of the figures a reasonable estimate is that our capacity will be taxed by the anticipated enrollments.

Books are being purchased to provide a wider range of subject matter and degree of difficulty. Science books were added. Supplementary readers at the primary level were purchased. Gradually these additions will mean the development of room libraries that will provide all kinds of opportunities for youngsters to develop special interests. It will develop special abilities. It will develop critical reading habits and permit the teacher to begin the development of sound methods of study and research.

Budget

Despite increases in necessary items the decreased estimated number of tuition students has decreased to the point where an increase of only \$20 in the gross budget is proposed. The increase in estimated assets is sufficient to result in a \$540 decrease in tax levy.

This is a 5% decrease despite rising costs. It can be attributed to the amount of state aid made available to the district.

Conclusion

The development of the physical facilities is the beginning of a definite program to provide the best educational opportunity for the children of the district. Health and physical well being are basic of the development of the child. With an ideal physical environment the possibility of a full development is greatly enhanced.

The progress made in providing this type of environment is due to the continued interest of the school board. The support and encouragement they have so willingly afforded makes possible a program of progress. With the cooperation of all pupils, parents, and teachers added to the helpful attitude of the board the future educational opportunity for the children of the district is bright.
