WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of Lisbon, in the county of Grafton and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Lisbon on Tuesday, the 8th day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and to make appropriations for the same.

Article 3. To hear reports of agents, auditors and special committees heretofore chosen, and to pass any vote in relation thereto.

Article 4. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repairs of the highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

Article 5. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to issue druggists' permits to any druggist who is a registered pharmacist doing business in Lisbon to sell liquor for medical use upon a physician's prescription, under the provision of Chapter 147, Sec. 14, of the Laws of 1917.

Article 6. To see how much the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the public libraries in addition to what is required by law, and to determine how the same shall be divided.

Article 7. To see if the town will vote to discount all taxes paid on or before July 5th, 1927.

Article 8. To see if the town will vote to light the streets of Lisbon Village District all night during the entire year; Sugar Hill from the dwelling of H. J. Field to the Hotel

Lookoff, the Baptist Church through Lover's Lane to Franconia line, from Goodnow school house to the Homestead, and from the Lisbon and Franconia town line to the dwelling of Joseph Pelletier. Sugar Hill and vicinity to be lighted the entire year until midnight and from five A. M. until daylight. All of the above premises to be lighted with electricity; and to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Article 9. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the benefit of the District Nursing Association.

Article 10. To see what action the town will take towards applying for state aid for the maintenance of the trunk line and state aid highways, and to raise and appropriate the necessary money to secure the same.

Article 11. To see if the town will vote to apply for state aid construction, and raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Article 12. To see if the town will vote to apply for Federal and state aid reconstruction to be applied on the Dartmouth College highway, and raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Article 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate money to properly observe Old Home Day.

Article 14. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the proper observance of Memorial Day.

Article 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate four hundred dollars to help destroy the white pine blister.

Article 16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate three hundred dollars to extend the cement sidewalk from the Sunset annex to the road leading down to the Sunset farm house, on Sugar Hill.

Article 17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate money for lighting Barrett's station at North Lisbon.

Article 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of two thousand dollars for improvement of the road leading from the Baptist Church on Sugar Hill, to the state aid road leading to Franconia.

Article 19. To see if the town will vote to discontinue a part of the so-called Weston road, and, if so, what part.

Article 20. To see if the town will vote to discontinue a part of Georgeville road, so called, commencing at Burl Smith's and coming out on the road leading from Pearl Lake to Sugar Hill.

Article 21. To see if the town will vote to repair the road leading from the Roscoe Beane place to the Blake place and to the Smith place, and raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Art. 22. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to oil the road from the corner at the Homestead on Sugar Hill, past the Sunset Hill House to Hotel Lookoff, and the road leading to Peckett's from its intersection with the Franconia road, and raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Article 23. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding three thousand dollars for the purchase and reforestation of a town forest.

Article 24. To see if the town will vote to accept the new library building, and tear down the building where Andross' store is located upon the expiration of the lease.

Article 25. To see if the town will vote to buy a fire apparatus jointly with the Lisbon Village District, and to raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Article 26. To see what action the town will take towards fixing the compensation of the tax collector.

Article 27. To see if the town will authorize the tax collector to appoint deputies.

Article 28. To see if the town will vote to buy the back numbers of town reports from J. G. F. Elliott, and raise and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

Article 29. To see if the town will vote to light the Salmon Hole bridge.

To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
