WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING
TOWN OF MADBURY, N. H.

March 10, 1959

*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Madbury, County of
Strafford, and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote
in Town Affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in
said Madbury on Tuesday, the 10th day of March A.D.
at 8:00 o'clock in the evening to act upon the following
articles.

ARTICLE 1. To choose the following Town Officers.

- A town clerk for the ensuing year.
- A selectman for the ensuing three years.
- A treasurer for the ensuing year.
- A collector of taxes for the ensuing year.
- Two auditors for the ensuing year.
- A trustee of trust funds for the ensuing three years.

ARTICLE 2. To choose all other town officers.

ARTICLE 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize
the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

ARTICLE 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise
\$332.37 for class V highways to match the sum of \$2,167.63
to be contributed by the State.

ARTICLE 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and
appropriate the sum of \$70.00 for the Seacoast Regional
Development Association.

ARTICLE 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to continue the construction of Old Stage Road.

ARTICLE 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$25.00 to be expended in cooperation with the New Hampshire Forestry and Recreation Commission for the opening and maintaining of trails and old roads for forest fire protection. The New Hampshire Forestry and Recreation Commission to provide a matching sum not in excess of \$25.00 for this purpose.

ARTICLE 8. To see if the Town will vote to accept a 1956 ton and one half International truck chassis, as a gift from Mr. John Elliott, to be used as a fire truck.

ARTICLE 9. To see what action the Town will take in transferring the money in the "Fire Truck Capital Reserve Fund" to the selectmen for the purpose of purchasing fire equipment for the International truck chassis.

ARTICLE 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of eight hundred dollars (\$800.00), to be used with the "Fire Truck Capital Reserve Fund," for equipment on the International truck chassis.

ARTICLE 11. To see what action the Town will take to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for purchase of a fire truck at a future date. Said \$500.00 to be placed in the "Fire Truck Capital Reserve Fund" created in 1956 under Article 9 of the 1956 Warrant.

ARTICLE 12. To see what action the Town will take to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for the purchase of new fire hose. Said \$100.00 will purchase approximately 300 feet of 1½ inch hose.

ARTICLE 13. To see what action the Town will take on the proposed budget for the current year.

ARTICLE 14. To see what action the Town will take relative to the playing of Beano in the Town of Madbury. Said Beano to be run and sponsored by the Madbury Volunteer Fire Department.

ARTICLE 15. To see what action the Town will take in changing any article of the building code.

ARTICLE 16. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

ARTICLE 17. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

RECORD OF TOWN MEETINGMarch 12, 1958

ARTICLE 1. Balloting for town officers:

For Town Clerk for the ensuing year: Edna P. Twombly had 65 votes and was declared elected. The oath of office was then administered by Moderator, K. S. Morrow.

For Selectmen for the ensuing three years: Edward Jennison had 16 votes, D. W. Hoyt had 1 vote and Harry C. Cheney, Jr., having 64 votes, was declared elected.

For Treasurer for the ensuing year: It was voted that the clerk be instructed to cast 1 vote for Loretta J. Morrow and this being done, Mrs. Morrow was declared elected.

For Tax Collector for the ensuing year: Dorothy S. Dugan having 47 votes, was declared elected.

For Auditors for the ensuing year: Merrill Huntley had 48 votes and Charles Jennison had 47 votes and they were declared elected.

For Trustee of Trust Funds for the ensuing three years: Jess P. Gangwer had 21 votes and was declared elected.

ARTICLE 2. Voted to empower the Selectmen to choose all other necessary town officers.**ARTICLE 3. Voted to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow a sum or sums not exceeding in the aggregate \$7,500 in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the current municipal year, and to issue in the name**

and on the credit of the Town negotiable notes therefor, said notes to be paid in the current municipal year from taxes collected during the current municipal year.

ARTICLE 4. Voted to raise \$326.70 for Class V highways to match the sum of \$2,178.03 to be contributed by the State.

ARTICLE 5. Voted by 45 to 2 to appropriate \$2,504.73 for the purpose of making improvements to the following Class V roads within the Town: Mast and Freshet, such sums to be raised through issuance of bonds or notes under and in compliance with the provisions of Chapter 83, Laws of 1951 as amended by Chapter 31, Laws of 1953, and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the date and place of payment of such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other steps as may be necessary to negotiate such bonds or notes as shall be to the best interests of the Town of Madbury.

ARTICLE 6. Voted to table the article to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$70 for the Seacoast Regional Development Association.

ARTICLE 7. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 for purchase of a fire truck at a future date. Said fund to be placed in the "Fire Truck Capital Reserve Fund" created in 1956 under Article 9 of the 1956 Warrant.

ARTICLE 8. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$88.50 to pay yearly premiums on insurance for members of the Volunteer Fire Department.

ARTICLE 9. Voted against authorizing the Selectmen to issue licenses for Beano games in the Town.

ARTICLE 10. Approved a budget of \$15,001.70 as estimated by the selectmen for 1958.

ARTICLE 11. Voted to change the building code, increasing the required depth of a house lot from 100 feet to 150 feet, the required frontage to remain at 100 feet.

ARTICLE 12. Voted to adopt as a Town Ordinance, for the protection of the clams and oysters within the Town limits, the Regulations for the Taking and Possessing of Clams, Clam Worms and Oysters, promulgated as of February 1, 1958, by the Director of the Fish and Game Department; including the ten dollar penalty for any violation thereof, and all other provisions as therein fully set forth; and to delegate to the said Director and the Officers of the Fish and Game Department the authority to enforce said Ordinance and Regulations in the Town's behalf within the Town limits; such ordinance to remain effective until these regulations are changed or superceded by the Director of Fish and Game Department.

ARTICLE 13. Heard the report of Mr. Henry Corrow, local Director of Civil Defense.

ARTICLE 14. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

The selectmen proclaimed March 9 through the 16th as Girl Scout Week.

Voted to hold the 1959 Town Meeting in the evening, the hour to be set by the Selectmen.

REPORT OF FIRE DEPARTMENT

To the Citizens of Madbury:

In 1958 the Fire Department received fewer calls than in previous years. In spite of this fact, fire losses were the second highest on record, with 1957 being first.

Madbury was more fortunate with forest fires. Approximately 1/10th of an acre was burned, which is below the state average for area protected.

Many citizens are not getting permits for open fires or incinerators. State law requires a permit for open fires, and provides penalties for not obtaining one. The Madbury Incinerator Ordinance requires you to have a permit each year for your incinerator.

In the interest of a better fire record, have an approved incinerator, and obtain permits for outdoor fires.

In 1958 our department was improved by the addition of a 2-way radio for the truck, and a monitor receiver set. Our Pacific Marine portable pump was reconditioned and ready for use. A 275 gallon tank was equipped for emergency use.

A 2-way "Walkie Talkie" type radio is on order through Civil Defense. The Fire Department has funds on hand to purchase this equipment. Plans for a supplementary whistle at the fire station are progressing rapidly.

Articles have been prepared for the Town Warrant for badly needed hose, and to enable the citizens to take action on equipping a new truck.

Equipment is not enough. Manpower is still our greatest need. Join your Fire Department and help protect your town.

Our heartiest thanks to all who have helped us in 1958.
