# Warrant

---

To the inhabitants of the Town of Milan in the County of [L. S.] Coos in said State, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at I.O.O.F. Hall in said town on Tuesday the eleventh day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the ensuing year.
2. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for town officers' salaries.
3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for town officers' expenses.
4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the maintenance of repairs of highways and bridges.
5. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid for Milan Hill road and the State will contribute \$1,910.00 provided the town will raise \$955.50.
6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for town poor.
7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for old age assistance.
8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for public libraries.
9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for cemeteries.
10. To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$57.00 for the White Mountains Region Association for advertising purposes.
11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for continuing the road around Cedar Pond.
12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repair and painting of town buildings in Milan.
13. To see if the town will vote to accept the remainder of the budget as prepared by the Selectmen and raise such sums of money as may be necessary.
14. To choose by ballot one trustee for the cemetery trust fund.

15. To choose by ballot one trustee for the public library.
16. To see if the town will vote to give the Selectmen authority to hire money in anticipation of taxes.
17. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the old road on the east side of Androscoggin Bridge running parallel with the new road as far as the East Side road.
18. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to secure the assistance of the State Tax Commission in reappraising the taxable property in the town, in order to secure a greater equality as between taxpayers and to insure the assessment of all property in the town on the same standard of value and to raise and appropriate money to pay for the same.
19. To see if the town will vote to petition the Tax Commission to have an audit made by the division of municipal accounting and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.
20. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

# Report of Superintendent of Schools

---

To the School Board and Citizens of Milan:

I hereby submit the annual report of your Superintendent, it being the twenty-seventh in the series of such reports.

During the school year 1945-46, four schools were maintained for a year of 36 weeks; the three schools at Milan Village and the one-room school at West Milan.

The total enrollment during the year was 97 pupils and the percent of attendance was 92.6%.

Nine pupils were graduated from the eighth grade in June. Six of these have entered Berlin High School. A total of thirty Milan pupils is reported as in attendance at Berlin High School.

The present school year opened with two new teachers at Milan Village School.

Mr. Nicholas Megas, a graduate of Bridgewater, Mass., State Teachers' College, is now in charge of the sixth, seventh and eighth grades. Mrs. Charles Armstrong, a graduate of Plymouth Teachers' College, is now teaching the first and second grades.

The school at West Milan, due to too large an enrollment this year for one teacher, has now been divided with upper grades (14 pupils) upstairs under the direction of Mrs. Bessie G. Stiles as teacher.

Mrs. Gladys Fancy is again doing the health inspection work. The teacher shortage is still very acute and I feel that we were fortunate in having some local or nearby teachers who are able to carry on for a time at least.

During the year the schools have all been visited by your Superintendent. Standardized tests have been given and the work of individual pupils has been carefully inspected with an effort made to keep all pupils at work at the highest possible level.

As mentioned in my last year's report, the school lunch situation is something that still needs attention. State aid for this project is available.
