TOWN WARRANT

The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Hampton, in the County of Belknap, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said New Hampton on Tuesday, the eighth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the repair of highways and bridges and make appropriation for the same.
4. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid, to be expended on the Robie Road, so-called, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for the same, the State contributing \$17,000.00.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$697.13 for Town Road Aid, the State contributing \$2,788.50.
6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for permanent improvement of Highways and Bridges and make appropriation for the same.
7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of Class V Roads.
8. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to tar the road from Bristol Bridge at South end of the Town to Horace Moody's, by tarring a new piece each year, using the interest money available from funds received for same road from Government.
9. To see what action the Town will take in regard to new equipment for snow removal and make appropriation for the same.
10. To see if the Town will vote to paint the Town House and raise and appropriate money for the same.
11. To see if the Town will vote to re-roof the tractor house and raise and appropriate money for the same.
12. (By Request) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$26.00 to the Newfound Region Association, to aid in advertising and other activities, with other towns in the Newfound Region.

13. (By Request) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$177.00 which is 1/100 of 1 per cent of the assessed valuation of the Town to the Lakes Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region.

14. (By Request) To see if the Town will vote a sum of money for the support of the Laconia Hospital and make appropriation for the same.

15. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.

16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Home Day.

17. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of old cemeteries.

18. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care and maintenance of the New Hampton Village Cemetery.

19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.

20. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

21. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting and to make an appropriation to cover the expense of such audit.

22. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN

Your local organization to prevent and extinguish brush and woods fires is glad to report a good year of forest protection in 1948. In spite of danger conditions nearly equalling at times those of 1947 when great losses were suffered in New Hampshire and New England, fire damage and loss this year have been gratifyingly low.

With the continuing cooperation of all the people, we can hope to have another successful year in 1949. Let us remember that in any year, over 90 per cent of all fires are caused by carelessness and that all of these man-caused fires are preventable.

Today, we have more slash and uncut grassland than for many years in the past. Smokers, campers and tourists who use our outdoors are also more numerous than ever before. We must therefore be ready for fires which might occur but, above all, prevention by everyone is the greatest need.

A few simple precautions taken by every citizen will help, as follows:

- (1) Always get a written permit from the warden before kindling a fire outdoors when the ground is not covered with snow.
- (2) If you smoke, always extinguish matches and tobacco before dropping or throwing them down. In automobiles, always use the ash trays.
- (3) Report fires and smokes to the warden without delay.

The observance of these and other simple rules will go far to insure safety from fire damage and your cooperation in this way is earnestly solicited.

The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the Town of New Hampton, qualified to vote in District affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said District on the 8th day of March, 1949, at two o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or Agents of the District.
6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
8. To see what sum of money the District will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the District, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the Selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the Town.

9. To see if the District will vote to aid in the payment of high school transportation.
10. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the New Hampton School Board:

My fourth annual report to the New Hampton School Board is one of progress. The past year has seen a vote by the New Hampton School District to construct a consolidated grade school in the New Hampton village. This action by the community will affect the educational lives of boys and girls of New Hampton for generations to come.

An unfortunate delay in undertaking construction was occasioned through the failure of the Laconia Evening Citizen to insert a legal notification of the meeting as required by law. This oversight will be rectified by the Legislature at this session, and it should be possible to undertake construction some time this spring.

This year, with but fourteen pupils scheduled to attend the Plaisted School, it seemed desirable to provide children living in this area with the opportunity to attend school at Ashland. This seems to have been a wise move, for children are provided with a better educational opportunity at a lower cost to the community than would have been possible under the previous arrangement.

A new program in the field of social studies has been introduced in grades four and five this year and should provide pupils with a better background in this subject matter area.

The resignation of Miss Edith Germane to be married was noted with regret. Mrs. Edith Plant agreed to teach at the Village School in her place. Mrs. Plant, last year, taught at the Plaisted School.

Some mention should be made of the fine graduation program presented last June. The work of Mrs. Estelle Watts as music supervisor in cooperation with the various teachers resulted in a program in which all of the pupils gave a most creditable performance.
