TOWN WARRANT

State of New Hampshire

To the inhabitants of the Town of Orford, in the County of Grafton, in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Orford, on Tuesday the 14th day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act on the following subjects.

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers.

The polls will be opened from ten o'clock in the

A. M. until six o'clock in the P. M. for you to cast your ballot for one Supervisor of the Checklist for six years, one Selectman for three years, a moderator for two years, Town Clerk and Road Agent for one year, also to vote on anything that may be on the ballot.

- Article 2. To hear the budget of the Town and raise and appropriate any money recommended therein or pass any vote relative thereto.
- Article 3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to defray Town Charges for the ensuing year.
- Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to reopen the road across Archertown Brook, and build a bridge across same known as High Bridge and Cutting Road, also to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$550.00 to build bridge, and also vote to post this bridge to no trucking.
- Article 5.
- Article A. To see if the Town agrees to participate in the National Flood Insurance Program by directing the Board of Selectmen to complete the eligibility application and submit the required information to the Federal Insurance Administration.

Article B.

NO

B. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the following ordinance:

Section 1. Appoint an inspector of buildings (selectmen, other designee).

Section 2. No person, firm or corporation shall erect, construct, enlarge, alter, repair, improve, move or demolish any building or structure, within the Town of Orford without first obtaining a separate building permit for each building or structure from the Building Permit Officer (Board of Selectmen or Building Inspector). Article 5.

Article B. (continued)

Section 3. Any person, firm, or corporation violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of \$10. and each day's neglect to obtain such a permit shall constitute a separate offense.

Section 4. Appeals shall be as provided in RSA 156: 4-a, b, c.

Article C.

To see if the Town will vote to establish the following building regulation pursuant to RSA 156 as follows:

- 1. The Building Permit Officer (Board of Selectmen or Building Inspector) shall review all building permit applications for new construction or substantial improvements to determine whether proposed building sites will be reasonably safe from flooding. If a proposed building site is in a location that has a flood hazard, any proposed new construction or substantial improvement (50% or more of the market value of structure) including prefabricated and mobile homes) must (1) be designed (or modified) and anchored to prevent flotation, collapse, or lateral movement of the structure, (II) use construction materials and utility equipment that are resistent to flood damage, and (III) use construction methods and practices that will minimize flood damage.
- 2. The Building Permit Officer (Board of Selectmen or Building Inspector) shall obtain, review, and reasonably utilize any base flood elevation data available from a Federal, State, or other source, until such data has been provided by the Administrator, as criteria for requiring that (1) all new construction and substantial improvements of residential structures have the lowest floor (including basement) elevated to or above the base flood level and (II) all new construction and substantial improvements of non-residential structures have the lowest floor (including basement) elevated or floodproofed to or above the base flood level.
- 3. The building Permit Officer (Board of Selectmen or Building Inspector) shall require that all mobile homes to be placed within Zone A on the community's Flood Hazard Boundary Map shall be anchored to resist flotation, collapse, or lateral movement by providing over-the-top and frame ties to ground anchors. Specific requirements shall be that (1) over-the-top ties be provided at each of the four corners of the mobile homes, with two additional ties per side at intermediate locations and mobile homes less than 50 feet long requiring one additional tie per side (II) frame ties be provided at each corner of the home

with five additional ties per side at intermediate points and mobile homes less than 50 feet long requiring four additional ties per side; (III) all components of the anchoring system be capable of carrying a force of 4,800 pounds; and (IV) any additions to the mobile home be similarly anchored.

Item D

Resolution A.

WHEREAS, certain areas of Orford are subject to periodic flooding from (STREAMS, RIVERS, LAKES, Etc.), causing serious damages to properties within these areas; and

WHEREAS, relief is available in the forms of Federally subsidized flood insurance as authorized by the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of this Town Meeting to require the recognition and evaluation of flood hazards in all official actions relating to land use in the flood plain areas having special flood hazards; and

WHEREAS, this body has the legal authority to adopt land use and control measures to reduce future flood losses pursuant to New Hampshire RSA chapter 31, 36, 156, and 156A.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That this Town Meeting hereby:

- 1. Assures the Federal Administration that it intends to enact and maintain in force for those areas having defined flood hazards, as delineated by the Flood Hazard Boundary Map issued by the Federal Insurance Administration dated July 26, 1977 and any published revision to this map, adequate land use and control measures with effective enforcement provisions consistent with the criteria set forth in section 1910 of the National Flood Insurance Program Regulations: and
- 2. Vests (the Planning Board or Town Manager or other duly authorized Municipal Officer) with the responsibility, authority, and means to:

(a) Assist the Administrator, at his request, in his delineation of the limits of the area having special flood, or floodrelated erosion hazards. Article 5.

2. (continued)

(b) Provide such information as the Administrator may request concerning present uses and occupancy of the floodplain, of flood-related erosion areas.

(c) Cooperate with Federal, State, and local agencies and private firms which undertake to study, survey, map and identify floodplain areas and cooperate with neighboring communities with respect to management of adjoining floodplain areas in order to prevent aggravation of existing hazards.

(d) Submit on the anniversary date of the community's initial eligibility an annual report to the Administrator on the progress made during the past year within the community in the development and implementation of floodplain management measures.

- 3. Appoints the Building Permits Officer (Board of Selectmen or Building Inspector) to maintain for public inspection and to furnish upon request, for the determination of applicable flood insurance risk premium rates within all areas having special flood hazards identified on a Flood Hazard Boundary Map or Flood Insurance Rate Map, any certification of floodproofing, and information on the elevation (in relation to mean sea level of the level of the lowest habitable floodplain (including basement if habitable) of all new or substantially improved structures, and include whether or not such structures contain a basement, and if the structure has been flood-proofed, the elevation (in relation to mean sea level) to which the structure was flood-proofed.
- 4. Agrees to take such other official action as may be reasonably necessary to carry out the program.
- Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$500.00 for the Orford Social Library, to pay for a new heating system for the Library and authorize the withdrawal of this amount for this purpose from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972.
- Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$500.00 for Orford Free Library, and \$500.00 for Orford Social Library, and authorize the withdrawal of this amount of \$1,000.00 for this purpose from the Revenue Sharing Fund, established under the provisions of the State and Local Act of 1972.

- Article 8. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for insurance purposes.
- Article 9. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of electric light.
- Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$35,000.00 for Town Highways & Bridges for the ensuing year.
- Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.
- Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to sell and administer property acquired by Tax Deed.
- Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$173.00 as its share of the cost of publicizing and promoting the natural attractions of the Dartmouth Lake Sunapee Region.
- Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for the constructing of Class V Roads, and raise and appropriate \$655.07 and the State will contribute \$4,367.15.
- Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for the Planning Board.
- Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Tax Collector to appoint a Deputy Tax Collector for collecting Resident Taxes only.
- Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$125.00 to cover expenses of Memorial Day.
- Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,500.00 for ambulance service.
- Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$65.00 for White Pine Blister Rust.
- Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 as Orford's contribution to capital expenditures for Cottage Hospital in the coming year.
- Article 21. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Lebanon Airport.

- Article 22. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Tax Mapping.
- Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$4,700.00 for the Fire Department and authorize the withdrawal of this amount of \$4,700.00 for this purpose from Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972.
- Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for the Police Department, and authorize the withdrawal of this amount of \$3,000.00 for this purpose from Revenue Sharing Fund, established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972.
- Article 25. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$1,993.91 to be turned over to the Trustees of Trust Funds toward a new Fire Engine, and authorize the withdrawal of \$916.78 for this purpose from Revenue Sharing Fund, established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 and also take \$1,077.13 from the Anti-Recession Fund.
- Article 26. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Parks Commission and care of Common.
- Article 27. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the use of the Orford Community Health Service.
- Article 28. To see what action the Town will take in regards to refuse disposal, and how much money it will vote to raise and appropriate for this purpose.
- Article 29. Shall we adopt the provisions of RSA 72: 43-B and 43-C for Expanded Exemptions on Real Estate which provides for a resident 65 years of age up to 75, a \$5,000.00 exemption; a resident 75 years of age up to 80, a \$10,000.00 exemption; a resident 80 years of age or older, a \$20,000.00 exemption; provided that the resident owns the real estate individually or jointly with another or his spouse with whom he has been living for at least 5 years as man and wife; said resident had a net income of less than \$7,000.00 or combined income with spouse of less than \$9,000.00; and owns assets of any kind, tangible or intangible, less bona fide encumbrances, not in excess of \$50,000.00.

- Article 30. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for and receive Federal Disaster Assistance Funds, through the State Disaster Coordination Office, and to expend the Funds so received, to repair the damage to Town Roads and or Bridges, caused by any disaster for which Federal Funds are available.
- Article 31. To see if the Town will vote to continue its membership in the Regional Planning Commission, now organized and named the Upper Valley-Lake Sunapee Council, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$600.00 as the Town's share of the annual operating expenses of the Regional Planning Commission to be used in conjunction with other state and Federal funds available for planning purposes.
- Article 32. To see if the Town will vote to pass this Draft Resolution. Be it resolved by the Town of Orford that the New Hampshire Housing Commission be and is authorized to operate in the Town of Orford, in the State of New Hampshire, that said New Hampshire Housing Commission is authorized to sponsor a project for person's under Section 8 of the U.S. Housing Act of 1937 as amended for the following accommodations of existing standard housing of 5 dwelling units.
- Article 33. To hear reports of Agents, Auditors, and Committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
- Article 34. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

RESIDENT TAX BILLS

As a result of the enactment of Chapter 3 of the Laws of the Special Session of the 1976 Legislature, persons who wish to obtain motor vehicle registrations must first pay their resident tax for the current year as well as the year previous, before the local Town Clerk may lawfully issue vehicle permits.

It should be noted that current taxes are due and payable as soon as the Resident Tax Warrant has been committed to the local Tax Collector. It is of no consequence that the Resident Tax Bills have not been mailed out in as much as RSA 80:1 stipulates that "Resident Taxes" shall be paid to the Collector on demand without previous notice."

There is a penalty to the Town Clerk who violates the above Statute and also to the person who registers.

The above message from your Town Clerk is inserted in the Town Report in an effort to clear up the confusion on the collection of the Resident Tax.

LAWS RE LICENSING OF DOGS

RSA 466 relative to the licensing of dogs has been amended - EFFECTIVE AUGUST 30, 1977 NEW paragraphs are as follows:

466:4 FEES. The fee for every license for a year shall be \$3.50 for a neutered male or spayed female dog, \$6.00 for an unneutered male and \$6.50 for an unspayed female dog, and such proportionate sum for licenses for dogs becoming 3 months of age after May 1, or which may be brought from out the state after May 1, as the remaining portion of the year bears to the sum required for a license for a whole year; provided, that the owner or keeper of such spayed female dog or neutered male dog shall furnish a certificate from the person performing the operation, to the satisfaction of the clerk of the town or city wherein such dog is owned or kept.

466:6 KENNELS. The owner or keeper of 5 or more dogs shall annually on or before April 30 procure a license authorizing him to keep such dogs upon the premises described in the license or off the premises while under his control. The fee shall be as follows except that no fee shall be required for the dogs of such owner or keeper which are under the age of 3 months; and for dogs becoming 3 months of age after May 1, or which may be brought from without the state after May 1, the fee shall be such proportionate sum for licenses as the remaining portion of the year bears to the sum required for a license for a whole year:

- I. If the number of dogs does not exceed 5, the fee shall be \$12.00
- II. If the number exceeds 5 but does not exceed 10, the fee shall be \$20.00

LAWS RE LICENSING OF DOGS - Continued

466:6 KENNELS. (continued)

- III. If the number exceeds 10 and does not exceed 25, the fee shall be \$25.00
- IV. There shall be an additional fee of one dollar for each dog in excess of 25.

466:6a BREEDERS HEALTH CERTIFICATE.

I. No dog shall be offered for sale or sold in the state or out of the state by a breeder without first being innoculated against distemper, hepatitis and heptospirosis and unless accompanied by an official health certificate issued by a licensed veterinarian within 14 days. Said certificate shall be in triplicate, one copy of which shall be sent to the state veterinarian, one copy of which shall be kept by the breeder of said dog for a period of at least 3 years and one copy of which shall be given to the purchaser.

II. For purposes of this section an official health certificate means a certificate signed by a licensed veterinarian on a form approved by the state veterinarian, containing the name and address of the breeder the age, sex, breed and description of the dog, a list of all types of vaccines or medication administered to said dog, and the certification of the veterinarian that the dog is free from visual evidence of communicable diseases such as kennel cough (infectious tracheo bronchitis) canine distemper, external and internal parasites (including coccidiosis).

III. No breeder shall offer for sale any dog less than 8 weeks of age.

IV. All incorporated or chartered humane societies with operation shelters in the state of New Hampshire are exempt from the requirements of this section relative to selling or transferring dogs.

V. In this section "breeder" means any person who breeds dogs for sale, gift or transfer in any manner.

VI. Any person who violates the provisions of this section shall be guilty of a violation.

466:7 LATE FEE. Additional Charge where payment of license fee is delayed. In addition to the license fees provided in RSA 466:4, there shall be a charge of one dollar for EACH MONTH or any part thereof that the fees remain unpaid if said fees are not paid before June 1 in any year.

466:9 PAYMENT OF FEES.

I. Clerks of the towns and cities shall issue said licenses, receive the money therefor and pay the same into the treasuries of their respective towns and cities on or before June first each year, retaining to their own use 50 cents for each license and submitting 50 cents for each license to the state treasurer for the purpose specified in paragraph II. The clerks shall return to their respective town or city treasurer a sworn statement of the amount of moneys thus received and paid over by them.

II. The 50 cents received by the state treasurer for each license issued pursuant to paragraph I shall be credited to a special nonlapsing fund to be used exclusively for the operation of the veterinary diagnostic laboratory established under RSA 443:96, and are hereby continually appropriated for such purpose to be expended under the supervision of the commissioner of agriculture.

REPORT OF DISTRICT FIRE CHIEF AND TOWN FOREST FIRE WARDEN

Forest Fire Control in New Hampshire is a joint state and town/city responsibility (RSA 224).

The Director, Division of Forests and Lands (State Forester) appoints a forest fire warden and several deputy forest fire wardens in each town/city upon the recommendation of local authorities.

The local forest fire warden is responsible for forest fire prevention and suppression activities in his town. He regulates the kindling of outside fires when the ground is not covered with snow by the issuance of written permits only when conditions are safe. He is responsible for suppression with the town/city and state sharing the cost. Suppression costs in excess of 1/4 of 1% of the assessed valuation of the town are assumed by the state.

The state provides training for the local fire organization and helps coordinate activities between towns/cities. The state also supports local forces with backup personnel, equipment, and supplies for suppression and prevention.

This combination of state and local cooperation, started in 1893, works well, for New Hampshire has enjoyed one of the smallest acreage losses due to forest fires in the United States for the past 25 years.

REPORT OF ORFORD PLANNING BOARD

The Orford Planning Board has met at regular intervals throughout the year. Our purpose: To protect and preserve for the citizens of Orford the Town's future, its growth and its proper and just development.

The application of Ralph Wright to subdivide 60 acres into 10 lots, which is located on the Piermont Height Road and the Piermont-Orford Town line - approval is pending, State agency approval.

We have received six applications, for single residential lots, which have been approved.

National Flood Insurance Program: This Federal program is based on the premise that activity in flood-prone areas can have an effect on others, particularly downstream; and that by preventive action and a federally-subsidized insurance program, the effect of bad floods could be minimized and huge disaster-relief programs cut back.

The resolutions would establish a building permit system, a building inspector, certain building codes or restrictions within the flood-prone area, and agree that later, when the town got into the final phase of the program, it would institute zoning.

(If it adopts or adopted the above, the town anticipates completely detailed mapping in about three to four years, at which time it would be ready for the final phase and the zoning).

The kicker was that if a town did not enter the program, no federally-insured bank would be allowed to grant a mortgage on property within the flood-prone area. This would effectively halt the sales or construction of anything in that area.

This fall, that restriction was eased somewhat, to remove the sanctions against mortgages but now, if a town votes not to go into the program, no Federal Loans - VA, FHA, FMHA or SBA for business - can be made on property in the flood area. Banks can grant mortgages, although it is too early to tell what they will do if flood losses are not covered by insurance.

Orford received its first identification maps in July 1977. They will be on display at Town meeting, it shows that about One Million Dollars of the Town's assessed valuation is within the area designated as flood-prone.

The Board encourages anyone with questions to seek out a board member or to attend a Planning Board meeting, which is held on the third Monday of each month in the new town office in Orfordville at 7:30 P. M. These meetings are open to the public.

The OCHS clinics continue to offer immunizations, blood work, urinalysis, vision and hearing tests, nutritional counseling, speech evaluation and blood pressure readings for all ages, and physical examinations for children. The clinics are held on the third Thursday of the month (Lyme-even months, Orford-odd months).

"Mini-Clinics" are held every Friday morning from 9:30 to 11:00 a.m. at the Elm Corner Market, and Wednesdays from 10:00 to 11:00 a.m. at the Brookside Store. At these, Mrs. Matoon provides B. P. readings and health courseling. No appointment is needed.

Piermont is still contracting with OCHS for Public Health Services. The arrangement seems to be satisfactory for both towns.

North Country Home Health Agency did not wish to renew their contract with us to provide supervision for our nurse. This supervision is required for us to qualify for medicare reimbursement. They felt because they serve a large number of towns in their immediate area, it was not economically feasible to continue supervisory visits to Orford. Hiring our own supervisor would increase our budget well over 300%. Federal supervisory requirements preclude any Orford nurse serving even as a volunteer supervisor. We are hoping to enter into a shared-supervisor agreement with nearby towns, and have allocated money in the budget for this. If no agreement is reached, the money will be returned to the town. Until we have supervision, our citizens who qualify for medicare must leave home for reimbursable care.

Mrs. Matoon completed a 96 hours Extended Assessment Course at U. V. M. this year. This enables her to do skilled physical examinations previously done only by physicians. She can be reached at her office in the high school from 9:00 to 9:30 a.m. each weekday except Wednesday. Her office phone is 353-4853, and her home phone is 1-802-685-2274.

REPORT OF EXECUTIVE COUNCILOR FOR DISTRICT ONE

As Executive Councilor for District One which covers 62% of New Hampshire (102 towns and 3 cities), I am pleased to submit this short report to the citizens of Orford.

The Executive Council of New Hampshire is elected from five districts portioned by population. The work of the Council has been described as similar to that of a board of directors for State business. The New Hampshire Constitution provides that the Council shall from time to time advise the Governor in the affairs of State. State law as passed by our General Court mandates much of State government to be acted upon "with the advice and consent of the Council."

Our meetings in the State House Council Chambers are open to the public, and I would welcome having any citizens from our District attend any of the meetings.

The responsibilities of the Governor and Council are so diversified as to defy any attempt at exact classification. Their activities extend to the appointment of certain public officials, to a general supervision over State departments, to State expenditures, to pardon matters and to a variety of other duties. . . State officials and employees, State fiscal matters, pardons, commutations and reprieves, eminent domain and related responsibilities, State contracts and leases, public waters, State industrial and recreational interests and miscellaneous responsibilities.

From time to time, as Councilor if I can be of help to cities, towns, counties, agencies and individuals, I stand ready to do so especially if the problem or concern has to do with State government. However, as many of you know, much of our government, at the local level, is funded by not only local dollars but State and Federal monies are many times involved which means that several levels of government are involved. In such cases we must turn to our local town administrative assistants, regional planning commissions, county officials and others for help and guidance.

RSA 76:11 provides for delivery of the list (warrant) to the collector within thirty days of receipt of approval of the tax rate unless for good cause the time is extended by the department. The collector shall within thirty days after receipt of the warrant from the selectmen (assessors) send out the tax bills unless for good cause the time is extended by this department.

RSA 76:11-a Information Required. The tax bill which is sent to every person taxed, or his agent, if known, as provided in section 11, shall show the rate of municipal, school and county taxes separately, and each bill shall also show the assessed valuation of all lands and buildings for which said person is being taxed. The 1977 rate breakdown reflects a proportionate share of the Reimbursement a/c Property Exempted by 1970 Special Session for each unit of government.

<u>RSA 76:13</u> provides that interest at 9% per annum shall be charged on all taxes except resident taxes not paid on or before December 1, except that in the case where a tax bill was sent to a taxpayer on or after November 2 and before April 1st, interest shall not be charged until 30 days after the bills are mailed. The collector shall state on the bill the date from which interest will be charged.

The tax bill which you mail must contain the date from which interest will be charged and this date is determined by the date you send the last bill on the list committed to you. It is also required by statute that you notify this department in writing of the date on which you send the last tax bill. We enclose a form for this purpose.

You are hereby notified to meet at Memorial Hall in said district on Friday, March <u>10</u>, 1978 at 5:00 P.M. to act on the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose by non-partisan ballot a Moderator, a Clerk, a Treasurer, and two Auditors, each to serve one year, and one member of the School Board to serve three years. (Polls will open at 5:00 P. M., and will close no earlier than 10:00 P. M.)

NOTE: ARTICLES 2 THROUGH 4 WILL NOT BE CONSIDERED UNTIL 8:00 P.M.

Article 2. To see what sum of money the District will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the payment of salaries for school district officials and agents and for the payment of statutory obligations of the District.

Article 3. To see if the District will vote to accept the provisions of Public Law 89-10, designed to improve educational opportunities with particular reference to children of low income families, and to appropriate such funds as may be made available to the District under said federal act for such particular projects as may be determined by the School Board. Further, to see if the District will authorize the School Board to make application for such funds and to expend the same for such projects as it may designate.

Article 4. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE PRINCIPAL

To the Citizens of Orford:

My sixth annual report for the 1976-1977 school year is short in comparison to the many activities that have been completed in the Orford schools during the year. This has been a busy, as well as a productive, year.

We have eleven junior and senior students attending the Oxbow Vocational program. This is a cooperative school program with seventy-five percent of the cost paid by the state and federal government including transportation. Students are participating in building trades, automotive mechanics and health care courses.

A new career awareness program was initiated this fall with a grant of \$2,600.00 from the federal government. This program is designed to help students become more aware of the occupations available to them after graduation. The program includes materials for classes such as periodicals, filmstrips, speakers, A-V equipment for our school library, and field trips.

Our Title IV project, DOME, is near completion and will be in operation this spring. Project DOME will be a self-sustained energy project dependent upon solar and wind energy.

Our learning disabilities program has thirty-two students receiving specialized services. We are most pleased with the progress that students in this program have been making.

A return to traditional grades at the Orfordville School this year was instituted with a return to the 1-4 grade pattern with which parents are most familiar.

Teachers are working on a skills sequence reporting system which will be used to report to parents the progress of their students. This system of reporting in grades K-8 will be in addition to the traditional report cards which are released each quarter.

School activities in addition to athletics include: field trips to Hopkins Center and Squam Lakes Science Center, Christmas program, annual science fair, school musical for grades 9-12, an annual gymnastics show, winter carnival, and the middle school field day.

Rules and regulations for the use of Memorial Hall are included in my report so that citizens interested in using our facilities may know the procedure necessary to follow:

Regulations for Use of Memorial Hall

1. It is the policy of the School Board to encourage the greatest possible use of the facilities of Memorial Hall by the citizens and organizations of Orford whenever such use does not conflict with the school program.

2. All dates for the use of Memorial Hall are to be arranged through the office of the principal. If the principal is not in town, e.g. during vacations, arrangements may be made directly with the custodian.

ORFORD PRINCIPAL'S REPORT - 2

Regulations for Use of Memorial Hall (continued)

Arrangements should be made well in advance of use. School events have precedence over non-school activities. The principal will have a master schedule in his office to list events. The principal will keep the custodian informed of dates assigned.

3. The custodian is in charge of Memorial Hall at all events, subject to the principal. At sports or other school practice sessions, the coach or teacher is directly in charge of students, but even if the custodian is not employed specifically to be at such sessions, he will be kept informed of these so that he may check the building after such sessions.

4. No charge is made to Orford organizations for the use of Memorial Hall itself.

If the kitchen is to be used by non-school groups a fee of \$3.00 is charged.

No kitchen fee is charged to the P.T.A. or to school organizations. However, a cleaning fee will be charged if the custodian has to clean the kitchen after use by any group, whether school or non-school.

The custodian's fee for meetings ending by 10 p.m. is \$3.00; for dances or other events continuing after 10 p.m., \$5.00.

Outside police are to be employed for control of parking, etc., by the using organization at its own expense. The custodian will police the Hall itself.

5. There is to be no smoking inside the gymnasium or the locker rooms. Smoking is to be permitted in the corridor only. Matches, butts, etc., are to be placed in receptacles provided.

6. Except at dinners or banquets, no food or drink is to be consumed inside the gymnasium. They may be sold and consumed in the corridor only. All waste is to be placed in receptacles provided.

7. Groups using the kitchen are responsible for cleaning the kitchen thoroughly after use, including mopping the floor, cleaning up counters and cabinets of any spilled food or drink, putting dishes and other equipment in their proper places, cleaning the stove (especially if food cooks over on the burners), etc. Otherwise a cleaning fee is to be charged.

8. Groups using the kitchen are to furnish their own dish towels.

9. Groups using Memorial Hall are expected to pay for any damage. In particular, the gym floor can be damaged by heavy shoes at dances, appliances and dishes may be broken in the kitchen, etc.

ORFORD PRINCIPAL'S REPORT - 3

Regulations for Use of Memorial Hall (continued)

10. A rental charge, in addition to the custodian and kitchen charges, will be made for use of Memorial Hall by out-of-town organizations. The School Board's permission for use should be secured by out-of-town organizations.

Note: Small groups at ordinary meetings should use a room in the old building, rather than Memorial Hall. It is expensive to heat and light the Hall for meetings not requiring the facilities and area of Memorial Hall. Meetings at which small children are present in numbers must be adequately supervised. It is not possible for the custodian alone to prevent damage, e.g. by <u>sliding</u> and running on the asphalt tile floor.

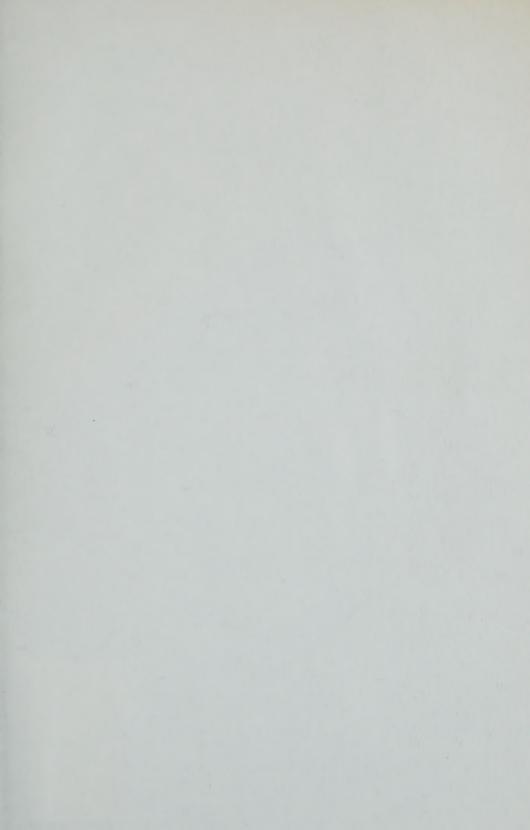
