#### **Town Warrant**

#### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stratford, County of Coos, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in said village of North Stratford, on Tuesday the 12th day of March, 1957, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

ARTICLE 1. To elect a clerk for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 2. To elect two auditors for the ensuing year, or to see if the town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting, and to make an appropriation to cover the cost of same.

ARTICLE 3. To elect a treasurer for the ensuing year.

ARTICLE 4. To elect one selectman for three years.

ARTICLE 5. To elect all other town officers.

ARTICLE 6. To see if the town will vote to continue the services of the Public Health Nurse, and raise money for same.

ARTICLE 7. To see if the town will vote to appropriate \$50.00 toward Blister Rust Control. This amount to be set aside for future use.

ARTICLE 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for building and repairing highways and bridges; and for town maintenance.

ARTICLE 9. To see if the town will vote to raise \$86.61 for Town Road Aid, thereby obtaining from the state the sum of \$577.41 to be expended on Class IV and V highways.

ARTICLE 10. To see if the town will vote to appropriate \$500 to buy a dump site; build and maintain a gravel road to same, and maintain dump thereafter. A committee of three citizens appointed to see that it is done.

ARTICLE 11. To see if the town will vote to maintain a Blinker Light over the middle of road near the corner of Town Hall.

ARTICLE 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the following: Libraries; Memorial Day; Memorial Trust Fund; Skating Rinks; Sewers; Street Lighting; Cemeteries; Retirement of Long Term Notes; Interest; Insurance; Personal Bonds and any other money for the town.

ARTICLE 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$111.20 to the White Mountains Region Association, being 10c per \$1000 of the assessed valuation (1/100th of 1%), for the purpose of issuing and distributing printed matter and otherwise publicizing the advantages of the town, in cooperation with the other 45 towns of the region.

ARTICLE 14. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to sell at public auction, any real estate acquired by the town through tax collector's deeds, and at public auction or by private sale any other real estate acquired or owned by the town and not presently used for public purposes, and until such sale is made, to administer such property in the best interests of the town.

ARTICLE 15. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen and town treasurer to borrow a sum or sums not exceeding in the aggregate \$15,000 in anticipation of the collecting of taxes for the current municipal year, and to issue in the name, and on the credit of the town negotiable notes therefor; said notes to be repaid during the current municipal year.

ARTICLE 16. To hear reports of agent, officers and committees heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relative thereto.

ARTICLE 17. To transact any other business that may be legally brought before said meeting.

#### REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS 1956-1957

#### To the School Board and Citizens of Stratford:

In the several years that I have compiled the school reports for the School District of Stratford there has been no time when the financial and educational affairs of the district seemed to in better form than at present. At the last annual meeting an adequate if not liberal budget was appropriated making it possible to provide experienced and well trained teachers and to purchase needed books and supplies.

The planned program of repairs was carried forward to embrace complete renovation and painting two rooms at the high school building and a new pumping outfit and repair of toilet facilities at the Hollow School. The driveway to the high school building has been resurfaced and the concrete area around the building has been refaced in part. Sufficient furniture to complete the main room and an additional teacher's desk have been purchased and installed. Plans are included in the new budget to continue this repair program until the buildings and grounds are being properly maintained.

The educational program is being examined and revised in accord with studies being made by the State Board of Education. It is planned to add required subjects to the courses now offered so that the high school will have all recommended subjects except shop and home economics. Every effort is being made to offer music to all grades.

At the expiration of the McMann conveyance contract in June, 1956, the Stratford Hollow Route was put up for bid. The only bid received was in the amount of \$5,500.00. The Board rejected the bid and entered a contract with a bus rental service by which the same route will cost approximately \$4,000.00. Full benefit of this arrangement will not come until the school year 1957-1958 at which time the L. P. Brown contract will have been completed.

The High School Activities Organization under the leadership of Principal Cushing and the Student Council has assumed the responsibility of having showers installed at the town hall and are paying for them out of Activities funds. These funds represent the earnings of the group through their sale of tickets, season tickets, and contributions of individual classes, or other activities. The Principal and his school should be given a great deal of credit for this material and permanent contribution to the usefulness of the town

hall. It is suggested that every visitor to the building during School District meeting or Town meeting should inspect the new facilities.

The P.T.A. has continued its interest in the affairs of the school and has been helpful in the dental clinic and music program particularly. They have promoted the purchase of new instruments and music stands. The organization provides two scholarships to deserving students who are attending teachers college.

In addition to the above the Stratford Alumni Association provides an annual scholarship to a student at college level.

As a part of this report the statistical and financial data required by the statutes are included. Particular attention is called to the financial statement in the budget. It will be noted that of the \$72,730.92 appropriated by the district at the last annual meeting \$41,048.72 has been received from the State School Fund and at least \$5,000.00 will be received from tuition. Only \$26,655.87 was assessed on the local taxpavers. This makes it possible for Stratford to have excellent schools for its children at a local cost that is markedly below the average for the State as a whole. Under these conditions it is the earnest desire of the School Board to get the salaries of teachers at an adequate level, the teaching material and supplies in favorable inventory, and the building and grounds in good repair against the day when these outside sources of revenue may be lessened.

In general the children in school seem to be benefiting by the forward looking program which is being offered. Test results tend to show a marked improvement. There is much still left to be accomplished but the Board feels that definite progress is being made. It is with a great deal of pleasure that I bring you this optimistic report,

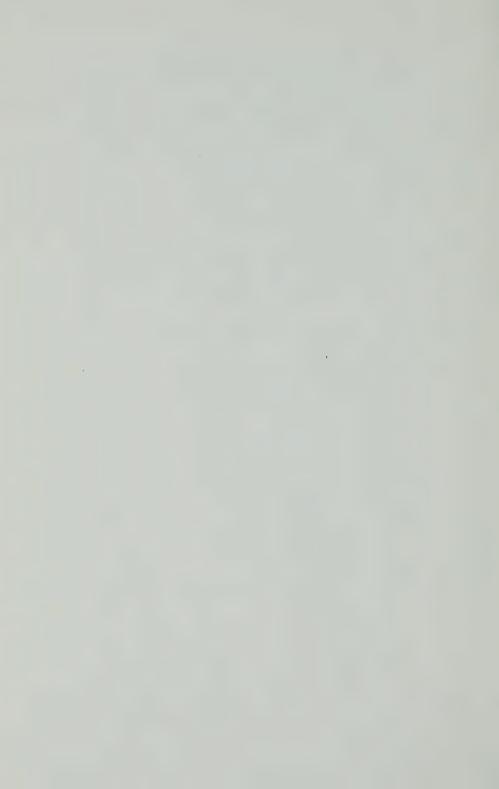
