Technical Report

Field Period: September 15 to September 20, 2016

Hours: 9 a.m. to 9 p.m.

Median Completion Time: 19 minutes

Sample Size: 593 randomly selected Maine adults (RDD)
513 randomly selected Maine likely voters in the 2016 General Election (RDD)

Sampling Error: +/- 4.0% (all respondents)
+/- 4.3% (likely voters)

Congressional Subsections:

266 likely voters in the 1st Congressional District (6.0% MOE)
247 likely voters in the 2nd Congressional District (6.2% MOE)

Response Rate (AAPOR #4): 20%

These findings are based on the latest Portland Press Herald Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center and funded by the Portland Press Herald. Five hundred and ninety-three (593) randomly selected Maine adults were interviewed in English by landline and cellular telephone between September 15 and September 20, 2016. If a household included more than one adult, the adult who had the most recent birthday was selected to be interviewed. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The design effect for the survey is 1.1%.

The random sample used in the Portland Press Herald Poll was purchased from Marketing Systems Group (MSG), Horsham, PA. MSG screens each selected telephone number to eliminate non-working numbers, disconnected numbers, and business numbers to improve the efficiency of the sample, reducing the amount of time interviewers spend calling non-usable numbers.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households. Additionally, data were weighted by respondent sex, age, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%. The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions.
