WARRANT FOR THE TOWN MEETING

The polls will be open from 11:00 A.M. to 7:00 P.M.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Webster, N.H., in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Grange Hall in said Webster on Tuesday, the 2nd day of March, next at 11:00 of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
 - a. Town Officers' Salaries
 - b. Town Officers' Expenses and Town Reports
 - c. Election & Registration
 - d. General Expenses
 - e. Expenses Town Hall & Other Town Buildings
 - f. Rent of Grange Hall
 - g. Police Department
 - h. Conservation Commission
 - i. Insurance
 - j. Planning & Zoning
 - k. Damages & Legal Expenses
 - l. Civil Defense
 - m. Sanitary Landfill
 - n. Interest
 - o. Tax Map Committee
3. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for maintenance of highways and bridges.
 - a. Summer Maintenance
 - b. Winter Maintenance
 - c. Street Lighting
 - d. General Expense of Highway Department
4. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$721.37 for Class V road construction.
5. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary for Public Welfare.
 - a. Town Poor
 - b. Old Age Assistance
6. To raise and appropriate such sum of money as may be necessary for the support of the Town Library. \$1,200.00.

7. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for Patriotic purposes.
8. To see what sum the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of the cemeteries. \$1,800.00
9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$97.00 toward the operating deficit of the Concord Hospital, this being based on the number of patients admitted from Webster.
10. To authorize and empower the Board of Selectmen to borrow for the Town, by issuance of notes, a sum not exceeding \$100,000.00 in anticipation of taxes for the year 1976, said notes payable from said taxes within one year of issuance, and to authorize the Board of Selectmen to determine the rate of interest on such notes and to provide for the sale thereof.
11. To see if the Town will vote \$500.00 for the maintenance of the park and playground.
12. To see what action the Town wants to take on the support of the Fire Department.

a. Fires & Maintenance	\$2,300.00
b. 25 men at \$25.00 per year	625.00
c. Future Fire Equipment	2,500.00
d. Scott Air Packs	1,000.00
13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize and instruct the Board of Selectmen to contract with the best available Visiting Nurse Association Program, and to raise and appropriate a sum of money therefore. (The Board of Selectmen proposes to expend not more than \$1,500.00 for this purpose.)
14. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund the sum of \$7,500.00 for use as a set off against the operating budget appropriation for Sanitary Landfill.
15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the withdrawal from Revenue Sharing Funds the sum of \$500.00 to be placed in Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of future Sanitary Landfill Buildings or equipment.
16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to change the use of \$1,227.90, which is the remainder of \$3,000.00 after purchase of items B through E under Article 15 of 1975 Warrant, and to use said amount as a set off against budget appropriations for one of the following: Fire Depart-

ment, Road Maintenance, V.N.A. (Visiting Nurse Association) Program.

17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$556.00 for the continuation of services to the low income residents of Webster through the Kearsarge Valley Area Center of the Community Action Program. Belknap-Merrimack Counties, Inc.
18. To see if the Town will authorize and instruct the Selectmen to appoint a committee to investigate availability of Federal Funds for the construction of a Town Hall, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for expenses that may be incurred.
19. To vote by ballot on the following question: "Shall we adopt the provisions of RSA 72: 43-b and 43-c for expanded exemptions on real estate which provide for a resident sixty-five years of age up to seventy-five, a five thousand dollar exemption; a resident seventy-five years of age up to eighty, a ten thousand dollar exemption; a resident eighty years of age or older, a twenty thousand dollar exemption, provided that the resident owns the real estate individually or jointly with another or his spouse with whom he has been living for at least five years as man and wife; said resident had a net income of less than seven thousand dollars or combined income with spouse of less than nine thousand dollars; and owns assets of any kind, tangible or intangible, less bona fide encumbrances, not in excess of thirty-five thousand dollars?"
20. To see what action the Town will take on unencumbered Revenue Sharing Funds and accrued interest that may be available by end of December, 1976.

REPORT TO TOWNS

Upon recommendation of town selectmen and city councils, the Division of Forests and Lands appoints a forest fire warden and several deputy forest fire wardens in each town and city every three years. The town or city warden is responsible for maintaining a force of men and adequate equipment to suppress any wildfire that occurs in his town or city during his term of appointment. The fire warden must authorize all open burning when the ground is not covered with snow. No open fires can be authorized between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m., unless it is raining, without the additional permission of the state district fire chief.

Any person wishing to kindle an open fire when the ground is not covered with snow must first obtain the written permission of the forest fire warden. Camp and cooking fires also require the warden's permission.

The Division of Forests and Lands, through its Forest Fire Service, assists all cities and towns in meeting these requirements by training the warden and deputy forces in wildfire suppression tactics, making hand tool suppression equipment available at fifty percent of cost, supplying pieces of Federal excess property for use as fire attack vehicles and sharing up to fifty percent of the cost of wildfire suppression costs.

Wildfire prevention is also a joint state, city or town program. Smokey Bear is available from the Forest Fire Service for local fire prevention programs. Posters and Junior Ranger kits are available for distribution by local fire departments upon request to the Forest Fire Service. Each forest fire warden is expected to carry on a continuous wildfire prevention program within his town or city.

POLICE REPORT

Examining last years records (1975) it can well be noted that an increase did in fact occur in police activities, mostly caused by an influx of persons entering our town from other areas. A high percentage was of the undesirable type which care less for the citizens of Webster, this element brought forth the need of police regulations in the way of excluding persons from gathering on the Black Water River Bridges and other areas for the purposes of taking part in the indecent life styled activities that would have had an adverse effect on our residents. We enjoyed a court decision in our favor relative to these regulations last summer when persons were tried and convicted, proving that home rule still exists in the small towns.

Our patrols were increased again in 1975 and the quality of our police work upgraded. Two of our police officers attended classes and seminars updating their knowledge and skills making for a better department. More arrests were performed and convictions in court were of a high percentage. 1975 was a busy year for the police department and no doubt 1976 will be even more active.

The plans set forth for the coming year are for more surveillance of the troubled areas of the town. We expect more problems from the bridges and highways with the increases still coming from out of town. At present we are attempting to reorganizing the Civil Defense unit which is now inactive in our town. More emphasis will be placed on education if possible for upgrading our efficiency and professional qualities as police officers. We would like to work closer with the juvenile problem as we are showing a definite increase in that area.

This year the department is asking for \$8,500.00 from the tax payers and residents at town meeting. The increase over last years appropriation will be used for items such as Cruiser repair and Merrimack County Dispatch service. The cruiser is starting to show wear and should be repaired and needs a new coat of paint. Plans at

this time are to keep it in service for at least two more years. Merrimack County Dispatch is asking for \$800.00 for the year of 1976, our share of the systems costs. This system is needed by our town for 24 hour police protection. It should be noted that we have used this system for over 2 years without cost to the town.

I am in hopes that you, the town of Webster tax payers and residents will pass this proposal at town meeting time as it is needed and if upon passage it will be disbursed with you in mind giving you the services that you need and deserve.
