Vision—3 new glasses—3 lenses changed

A very successful dental clinic was held at which 59 children were treated. The Campton Red Cross and Woman's Club helped with this.

Two pairs of glasses were furnished by the State Sight Conservation.

90 school calls, 61 home calls and 36 business calls were made.

At the beginning of the school year 1942 Dr. Cheney again examined the children and recorded these defects:

All children above the second grade were tested with the audiometer for hearing and 12 were found to have defective hearing. These children were examined at a clinic financed by the Red Cross and treatment advised.

Two children were taken to the Orthopedic Clinic in January where both had treatment recommended. Five vision defects have been corrected.

We expect to have the usual dental and tonsil clinics in the spring.

The co-operation of all interested has been greatly appreciated.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

The ninth annual report of the present superintendent of schools is hereby submitted. In the interest of conservation and economy it is brief. Since the last report Mrs. Lavinia Dole resigned from the school board.

The February enrollments are Village Grammar 24, Village Primary 32, Beebe River Grammar 21, Beebe River Primary 19, Blair 22, West Campton 19, West Road 9, Center 14, and Livermore Falls 11, making a total of 171 pupils. Two changes have occurred this school year. Mrs. Leona Edgell is teaching at the West Road school. Much to the regret of the administration of the schools Mrs. Betty P. Saunders of the village grammar school resigned her position in the early winter. At present Mrs. Lavinia Dole is teaching this room. The shortage of teachers is very acute and there seems but little relief for the duration.

During the summer an opportunity arose to introduce music supervision in the district in conjunction with other districts in this supervisory union. Violet M. Nardone of Newton, Mass., was appointed to the position of Supervisor of Music. She has studied music at Boston University and the New England Conservatory of Music. Considering the short time and the fact that the district has had no recent music supervision the music is very gratifying. Acknowledgement is made of the loan of a piano at the Blair school by the Union Grange Fair Association and the offer of another by Mr. and Mrs. Lester E. Mitchell. It is hoped that other people will feel inclined to make similar contributions to the music program. Miss Nardone would like a piano in every room in the district.

The Board is asking for a deficiency appropriation of \$1,000.00 to be available at once. This is due primarily to higher cost of high school tuition, introduction of music and raises of teachers' salaries. The tuition at Plymouth is the per capita cost of instruction for the previous year which cannot be determined until

June. The per capita tax increased from \$54.73 to \$66.17 an increase of \$11.44 per pupil. This is a very modest rate of tuition. The Board thought it should take the step to introduce music when it had the opportunity. The Board raised the salaries of the teachers in view of the increased cost of living. With favorable openings in larger places both in schools and government it is a sound policy to pay teachers a reasonable salary to retain them.

The children collected a large amount of scrap in the material drive in the fall and it was gratifying to see the interest and cooperation of the general public with the children. The pupils appear to be responding very well to the appeals for purchase of War Savings Stamps and Bonds.
