TOWN OF GILSUM

TOWN MEETING MARCH 14, 1989

The moderator, Mr. Ernest Peter opened the polls at 1:00 p.m. on March 14, 1989 at the Gilsum Church Vestry to bring in the ballots for both the election of Town Officers for the ensuing year, and for the proposed changes to the zoning and building codes. The checklist had 427 registered voters of which 100 people voted The polls closed at 6:00 p.m. and the ballots were counted. The following were elected to office:

Both the proposed amendments to the building regulations and to the zoning ordinance passed.

The annual Town Meeting of Gilsum, held in the Town Hall, was called to order at 7:37 p.m. by Moderator Ernest Peter. The meeting began with a moment of silent prayer, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

The list of newly elected Town Officers was read and those present were sworn in.

The following articles were acted upon during the meeting:

 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000 to be placed in the FIRE TRUCK Capital Reserve Fund.

Article 1. was read by Mr. Peter, moved to the floor by Mr. Lounder, seconded by Mr. Jones, no discussion, voted on by a show of hands, and approved unanimously.

 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000 to be placed in the DUMP TRUCK Capital Reserve Fund.

Article 2. was read by Mr. Peter, moved to the floor by Miss Roberts, seconded by Mr. Marshall, no discussion, voted on by a show of hands, and approved unanimously.

3. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of purchasing a RESCUE VEHICLE, and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000 to be placed in this Capital Reserve Fund.

Article 3. was read by Mr. Peter, moved to the floor by Mr. Newman, seconded by Mr. Hughes, discussed briefly, voted on by a show of hands, and approved unanimously.

4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000 to be placed in the TOWN HALL Capital Reserve Fund.

Article 4. was read by Mr. Peter, moved to the floor by Mrs. Malott, and seconded by Mr. Cushing. Mrs. Hastings questioned the amount presently in the fund, and Mr. Hasbrouck responded \$9,666 principal and interest. Mrs. Lounder questioned the amount of money needed to re-wire the Town Hall. Mr. Hasbrouck explained the Town received an estimate of \$3,216 to add exit lighting, emergency lighting, and smoke detectors. Mrs. Lounder was instructed to request a warrant article for next year's Town Meeting in order to appropriate the funds. Mr. Peter explained the purpose of the fund is for improvement and modernization to the Town Hall.

 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000 to be placed in the CEMETERY Capital Reserve Fund.

Article 5. was read by Mr. Peter, moved to the floor by Mr. Bianchi, and seconded by Mr. Klein. Discussed briefly, voted on by a show of hands, and disapproved unanimously.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,450 to be used to defray the legal costs and payments of Robert Coppo, Ralph Merchant and Paul Marshall. Said amounts are the results of legal actions in 1988, against the Town and the Selectmen of 1983. (By Petition)

Article 6. was read by Mr. Peter, moved to the floor by Mr. Lounder and seconded by Mrs. Peter. Mr. Coppo explained the purpose of the article, voted on by a show of hands, and approved unanimously.

7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate funds to reappraise all property in Town. (By Petition)

Article 7. was read by Mr. Peter, moved to the floor by Mr. Simmons, and seconded by Mr. Carter. Mrs. Cushing expressed concern that since the Town had not been re-appraised since 1982, a heavier tax burden is being placed on the new property owners. Mr. Hasbrouck explained the appraisal procedure, voted on by a show of hands, and approved 29 to 25.

8 To receive the report of the Budget Committee, to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town expenses; and to act in any manner thereto.

Article 8. was read by Mr. Peter, moved to the floor by Mrs. Lounder, and seconded by Mr. Bianchi.

* Town Officers Expenses:

A motion was made and seconded to increase the Town Officers Expenses from \$6,899 to \$7,899. Voted on by a show of hands, and approved 31 to 17.

** Cemeteries:

A motion was made and seconded to increase Cemeteries from \$00.00 to \$2,000. Voted on by a show of hands, and approved unanimously.

*** General Government Buildings:

A motion was made and seconded to increase General Government Buildings from \$4,950 to \$5,450. Voted on by a show of hands, and approved unanimously.

The appropriated amount of \$205,593 was voted on by a show of hands and approved unanimously.

To see if the Town will vote to elect the position of Town Clerk on a two-year basis.

Article 9. was read by Mr. Peter, moved to the floor by Miss Roberts, seconded by Mr. Hughes, no discussion, voted on by a show of hands, and approved unanimously.

10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Trustees of the Gilsum Library to accept any gifts or grants from persons, estates, or governmental sources that may become available during the year; pursuant to R.S.A. 202-1:3.

Article 10. was read by Mr. Peter, moved to the floor by Mrs. Peter, seconded by Mr. Lounder, no discussion, voted on by a show of hands, and approved unanimously.

 To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Trustees of Trust Funds to open new funds that may arise during the year.

Article 11. was read by Mr. Peter, moved to the floor by Mrs. Malott, seconded by Mr. Hastings, no discussion, voted on by a show of hands, and approved unanimously.

12. To see if the Town will vote to create a General Cemetery Maintenance Trust Fund pursuant to R.S.A. 3119-a (the income only to be expended) for the purpose of maintaining all Town Cemeteries.

Article 12. was read by Mr. Peter, moved to the floor by Mr. Klein, seconded by Mr. Parker, discussed briefly, voted on by a show of hands, and approved unanimously.

13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 13. was read by Mr. Peter moved to the floor by Mr. Hughes, seconded by Mr. Pond, no discussion, voted on by a show of hands, and approved unanimously.

14. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a committee to take charge of the observation of Memorial Day.

Article 14. was read by Mr. Peter, moved to the floor by Miss King, seconded by Mr. Whyte, no discussion, voted on by a show of hands, and approved unanimously.

15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to issue permits, without charge, for the supervised activities held on the Town Parade Grounds or the Baseball Field, said permits to include the erection of temporary structures.

Article 15. was read by Mr. Peter, moved to the floor by Mr. Mercer, seconded by Mr. Salisbury, no discussion, voted on by a show of hands, and approved unanimously.

16. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell any or all pieces of real estate, either by auction or private sale, acquired by tax deed, said property to be advertised for sale for three weeks prior to sale.

Article 16. was read by Mr. Peter, moved to the floor by Mr. Pratt, seconded by Mr. Lounder. Mr. Hasbrouck explained the article and Ms. Miller referred to page 25 of the 1988 Annual Town Report for those persons who wished to know a description of Town owned land and buildings. Voted on by a show of hands, and approved unanimously.

17. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the Town's Representative to the General Court to respond t our solid waste crisis by taking all necessary measures to insure that New Hampshire adopt legislation to permit consumers to return for refund of deposit within New Hampshire all soda, beer, wine cooler and liquor containers, and that all unclaimed deposit moneys shall be collected by the State and no less than 80% shall be returned annually to individual municipalities for the sole purpose of implementing, expanding or reimbursing community recycling projects. (By Petition)

Article 17. was read by Mr. Peter, moved to the floor by Mr. Newman, seconded by Mr. Granucci, no discussion, voted on by a show of hands, and approved unanimously.

18. To see if the Town will send a message to the Legislature and Governor calling for a comprehensive toxics transition law requiring coordinated programs of planning, research and development, education, enforcement, and economic incentives to achieve toxics reduction by substitution with safer substances. (By Petition)

Article 18. was read by Mr. Peter, moved to the floor by Mr. Jones, and seconded by Miss Marshall. The article was explained by Miss Marshall, and Mr. Cushing made a motion which was seconded to amend the article to:

To see if the Town will send a message to the Legislature and Governor calling for a comprehensive toxic waste transition law requiring coordinated programs of planning, research and development, education, enforcement, and economic incentives to achieve toxic waste reduction by substitution with safer substances.

The amended article was voted on by a show of hands and disapproved. The original article, "To see if the Town will send a message to the Legislature and Governor calling for a comprehensive toxics transition law requiring coordinated programs of planning, research and development, education, enforcement, and economic incentives to achieve toxics reduction by substitution with safer substances" was voted on by a show of hands and approved.

19. To see if the Town will vote to abolish the dumping fee for large items, such as tires, apliances, furniture, building materials, stumps, batteries, metal items. (By Petition)

Article 19. was read by Mr. Peter, moved to the floor by Mr. Salisbury, seconded by Mr. Marshall, discussed, and disapproved.

20. To transact any other business which may legally come before this meeting.

Article 20. was read by Mr. Peter. We gave the members of the Board of Selectmen, the Solid Waste Committee, and those involved in the conservation effort a round of applause for their outstanding work.

Mr. Salisbury questioned the status of the Town-owned Foss property, and Mr. Hasbrouck stated that hopefully there is a party who will be taking the house.

Ms. Ballou expressed concern about the proposed natural gas line that is scheduled to come through the Town of Gilsum. Mr. Hasbrouck explained the location of the proposed gas line.

Mrs. Peter made a motion to have the Town adopt the provisions of R.S.A. 31:106. The motion was seconded by Mr. Cushing, voted on by a show of hands, and approved unanimously.

Mr. Lounder made a recommendation that the Townspeople call their representatives to enforce regulations to include disposal costs in the price of large appliances.

A motion was made by Mrs. Lounder, and seconded, that the Selectmen be instructed to appropriate the funds necessary to re-wire the Town Hall in next years Warrant. Voted on by a show of hands and approved unanimously.

Mr. Cushing mentioned how the Upper Ashuelot Watershed Association raised funds sufficient enough to hire BCI Geonetics Inc. to do a study of the landfill site in Gilsum. The results of the report have been sent to the appropriate people, and the public was thanked for their support.

Mr. Hasbrouck explained who prepared the Middle School survey, and the reasons for doing so. Mr. Young, Mr. Hasbrouck, and Mr. Peter all expressed their personal opinions in reference to the construction of the proposed Middle School.

Mr. Jones made a motion and Mr. Cushing seconded it that the meeting be adjourned.

Meeting dissolved at 10:45 p.m.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Gilsum, in the County of Cheshire, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Congregational Church Vestry in said Gilsum on Tuesday, the 13th day of March, 1990, next at 1:00 PM of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- To see if the Town will vote to approve re-zoning of property from Rural Residential to Commercial/Industrial.

Property (owned by Douglas and Jacqueline Hill, legal residence: 123 Elm Street, Keene, New Hampshire 03431), is as shown on Map drawn by Thomas Flavin, Jr., dated January 24, 1990 (with the exception of Phase I, which will remain as Rural Residential). The property consists of 197.14 acres, located east of Route #10, north of the Keene/Gilsum Town Line and west of the Sullivan/Gilsum Town Line. (By Petition) (2/3 Vote Required)

[Planning Board Recommendation at February 12th meeting: TO APPROVE RE-ZONING: 2 voted \underbrace{YES} 2 voted \underbrace{NO}]

The business meeting will be called to order in the TOWN HALL at 7:30 p.m. to act on the following subjects:

- 1. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000 to be placed in the FIRE TRUCK Capital Reserve Fund.
- 2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 to be placed in the TOWN HALL Capital Reserve Fund.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of $\frac{$723}{and}$ to be transferred to the General Cemetery Maintenance Trust Fund to take any other action in relation thereto.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of $\frac{\$900}{\text{with}}$ to rebuild the rear fire exit of the Town Hall and to authorize the withdrawal of \$900 from the Capital Reserve Fund created for Town Hall maintenance and repair. (Majority Vote Required)
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000 to purchase a Rescue Vehicle and to authorize the withdrawal of \$1,000 from the Capital Reserve Fund created for that purpose. (Majority Vote Required)

- 6. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the Rescue Vehicle Capital Reserve Fund created in 1989. The Rescue Vehicle has been purchased. Said funds, with accumulated interest to date of withdrawal, to be transferred to the town's general fund. (Majority Vote Required)
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$30,000 to start reconstruction of the Hammond Hollow Road.
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$74,300 to purchase a new highway dump truck, and to authorize the issuance of \$67,000 of bonds or notes in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act (RSA 33) and to authorize the Town officials to issue and negotiate such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon; furthermore, to authorize the withdrawal of \$6,500 from the Dump Truck Capital Reserve Fund created for this purpose. The balance of \$800 to be raised by general taxation. (2/3 Ballot Vote Required)
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$20,000 to purchase a used highway truck; furthermore, to authorize the withdrawal of \$6,500 from the Dump Truck Capital Reserve Fund created for this purpose. The balance of \$13,500 to be raised by general taxation. (Majority Vote Required)
- 10. To receive the report of the Budget Committee, to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town expenses; and to act in any manner relating thereto.
