The business portion of the Town Meeting will begin at 7:30 p.m.**

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Goshen in the County of Sullivan in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Goshen Town Hall in said Goshen on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March, next at one of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see if the Town will vote to adopt written welfare guidelines as proposed by the Board of Selectmen. Chapter 380 of the Laws of 1985 requires the Town to adopt written welfare guidelines prior to April 1, 1986. (Copies of the proposed guidelines are on file with the Town Clerk.)
4. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the proposed regular National Flood Insurance Program; thereby changing from 'Emergency' to 'Regular' NFIP. Thus allowing flood insurance policyholders to purchase higher levels of coverage if they desire to do so.
5. To see if the Town will authorize the Board of Selectmen and the Town Treasurer to appoint a Deputy Treasurer in accordance with RSA 41:29A.
6. (By Petition) To see if the Town will vote to oppose the burial, storage, transportation and production of high level radioactive waste in the Town of Goshen and State of New Hampshire; and to call upon Congress to conduct independent investigation with full public participation into the feasibility and prudence of the U.S. Department of Energy's (DOE's) present plan to dispose of radioactive waste and into the DOE's competence to carry out such a plan.
7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to enter into a 5 year lease-purchase agreement with New England Equipment Company Inc. Purpose of said agreement is to purchase one John Deere Backhoe - Model 310, s/n 724443.
8. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate and authorize the withdrawal of \$8,400.00 from the Highway Department Capital Reserve Fund for the first year's payment on the backhoe.
9. To see if the Town will vote to increase the Road Agent's hourly wage from \$7.00 per hour to \$8.00 per hour. Actual wage per hour at the discretion of the Board of Selectmen.
10. To see if the Town will vote to increase the Town Dump Attendant's hourly wage from \$3.35 per hour to \$4.00 per hour. Actual wage per hour at the discretion of the Board of Selectmen.



RSA 76:11 provides for delivery of the list (warrant) to the collector within thirty days of receipt of approval of the tax rate unless for good cause the time is extended by the department. The collector shall within thirty days after receipt of the warrant from the selectmen (assessors) send out the tax bills unless for good cause the time is extended by this department.

RSA 76:11-a Information Required. The tax bill which is sent to every person taxed, as provided in section 11, shall show the rate of municipal, school and county taxes separately, and each bill shall also show the assessed valuation of all lands and buildings for which said person is being taxed. The 1985 rate breakdown reflects a proportionate share of the Reimbursement a/c Property Exempted by 1970 Special Session for each unit of government.

RSA 76:13 provides that interest at 12% per annum shall be charged upon all taxes except resident taxes not paid on or before Dec. 1, except that in the case where a tax bill was sent to a taxpayer on or after November 2 and before April 1st, interest shall not be charged until 30 days after the bills are mailed. The collector shall state on the bill the date from which interest will be charged.

The tax bill which you mail must contain the date from which interest will be charged and this date is determined by the date you send the last bill on the list committed to you. RSA 76:13 also requires that you notify this department in writing of the date on which you send the last bill. There is enclosed a form for this purpose.

## REPORT OF THE FIRE DEPARTMENT

In 1985 your Fire Department responded to 29 calls recorded as follows: dwelling 2, other buildings 1, chimney 7, brush 2, grass 1, vehicle 2, auto accident 3, wires down 2, dump 1, faulty furnace 1, mutual aid 5, medical assist 1, false alarm (good intent) 1. Estimated fire loss in Goshen was \$6,250. A total of 249 men responded representing 365 man hours of service fighting fire. Records show over 500 hours donated to clean up, training, meetings and auction.

Our annual auction and other fund raising activities have earned \$2,000 (net) for our equipment fund. Please remember we pick up year round for the auction so give us a call at 863-2055 or 863-3143 if you have something to donate.

The grid maps you voted for in town meeting last year are being prepared by Cartographic Associates Inc., Littleton, N.H. and I expect delivery within 3 months. Upon delivery, the firefighters will prepare the individual building number stickers and distribute them to your homes.

In early 1985 your Fire Department purchased a good used pumper-tanker for \$5,000. We have spent nearly \$4,000 on this truck for parts, renovation and added equipment. The men in the department have done most of the work and have done a great job. Value of this refurbished apparatus is \$20,000.

Through the years several citizens have made donations to the department, sometimes in memory of loved ones. This money is used to buy training aids and special equipment that we otherwise would not have. It is never used to buy gas, oil or expendables.

I want to stress again, to report a fire in Goshen, dial 542-5155, give your emergency message to the dispatcher and we will be notified by radio pager. Please remember, 542-5155 is the number to call to report a **Fire Emergency Only**. For burning permits call Warden Arthur Nelson at 863-1509. For all other Fire Department business, call 863-2055 or 863-3143.

I offer my sincere thanks to the firefighters for their many hours of work and participation. A special thanks to the wives and families for sharing the time away from home, and to the dispatchers, auction crew, town officials, and to all the citizens and taxpayers for the help and cooperation given to make the Goshen Volunteer Fire Department a very effective service to the Town.

### CONSERVATION COMMISSION

The Conservation Commission meets at 7:30 p.m. on the fourth Wednesday of each month at the meeting room in the Firehouse. All meetings are open to the public, and visitors are welcomed.

The Commission has been made responsible for the management of the Gunnison-Williamson Park area and in that capacity, a forestry plan has been adopted, and the Commission is listed as a Co-Operator with the Sullivan County Soil Conservation Service. Our lease with the New Hampshire Water Resources Board has been amended twice and an agricultural use of the site is now under consideration. A parking area was designated adjacent to the pine grove and monument, and the Water Resources Board furnished the required fence and erected it at its own expense. On October 12, members of the Commission put up signs that had been printed by the Water Resources Board, and officially opened the area to the public.

By the terms of the lease, boats or canoes powered by gasoline or other combustion engines shall not be allowed on the lake. Motors powered by electricity, however, are permitted. All motorized vehicles, other than snowmobiles on snow cover, shall be allowed only on the access road from Route 31 and the designated parking area. Violations of this provision shall be considered unauthorized trespass by the operators and subject to prosecution by appropriate law enforcement officials as a misdemeanor.

The area has been called one of the beauty spots of New Hampshire, and the people of Goshen are urged to visit and make use of this beautiful facility that is truly their own.

## REPORT OF THE PLANNING BOARD

The Goshen Planning Board has enjoyed an interesting and varied year.

A number of meetings were taken up with applications for Major and Minor Subdivisions. In most cases, the applicants were proposing lots of five or more acres each, which reduced the amount of detail which had to be presented prior to obtaining approval. Also, we found applicants were much better this year in meeting deadlines for submission of materials to the Board, so we were able to process applications at the lowest cost for required legal notices, etc. We discovered however, that late applications can double the cost of last minute legal notices. These costs have to be met by the applicant.

In order to keep our Zoning Regulations legal in accordance with State Law, the Board had to adopt a Master Plan containing those minimum elements that would keep our town in compliance. The Board worked on this project whenever it had the time during the year. Finally, in December, the appropriate public hearings were held, and the minimum plan was adopted. The Board feels that many additions to the plan will be necessary before the plan is truly complete. We will be working on improving the Plan over the next few years. Each step of this process will require a public hearing. Watch for the notices and attend the hearings as we badly need input from everyone in town.

The Board has also given consideration to changes in the Zoning Regulations. Changes were proposed, and a public hearing was held. As a result of input received at the public hearing, additional changes have been proposed. However, the State required timelines will prevent these changes from being considered at Town Meeting this March. We expect that following further consideration, and proposals of some additional changes, we may request a Special Town Meeting later this year to vote on much needed changes in the Zoning Regulations and the possible adoption of a new Building Code.

There is more work to be done than can be accomplished by the elected members of the Board. Anyone interested in getting involved on Board Advisory Committees would be more than welcome. Just show up on the first Tuesday of the month and we may be able to get you involved in a whole new world of interesting activity!

## SULLIVAN COUNTY REGIONAL REFUSE DISPOSAL DISTRICT 1985 Annual Report of Activities

After six years of discussion and planning by your District Committee, a 200 ton per day waste-to-energy facility is now well under construction in Claremont, New Hampshire.

A revised twenty year waste disposal contract was signed with Signal Environmental Systems on April 12, 1985. The contract provides that Signal will be the owner and operator of the facility and is responsible for up to \$7.6 million in financial contributions in the form of equity or debt secured solely by Signal. An additional \$18.15 million in Industrial Revenue Bonds were sold by Signal through the New Hampshire Industrial Development Authority on August 12, 1985.

Clark-Kenith, Inc. began construction of the facility for Signal during May 1985. Construction is expected to be completed during the spring of 1987, at which time the District municipalities must begin delivering waste to the facility.

Hydrogeologic modeling for the 78 acre ash disposal site in Newport is now complete and engineering and permit applications will begin early in 1986. The ash disposal site must also be in operation by the spring of 1987. Funds for construction are included in Signal's bond issue even though the ash disposal site is owned by the District.

The New Hampshire Air Resources Commission is in the final stage of adopting hydrogen chloride emission standards for the facility. This will necessitate some changes in the design of the air pollution control system and an increase in the disposal fee paid to Signal. Negotiations are underway with Signal to determine the appropriate control system and costs.

During 1986 the District will be working on development of a recycling system which may be fully utilized by member municipalities. A full-time recycling manager is included in the budget for 1986.

The District will also be working with the member municipalities to assist them in the development of a transportation system necessary to deliver waste to the facility when it becomes operational.

## REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Citizens of the Goshen-Lempster Cooperative School District:

Two additional programs were initiated at the school this year. Due to an affirmative vote at the School District meeting last year, a physical education program was started this school year. It is a program from which the students are benefiting greatly. The students will now have a similar background in this area as the other students have in the local high schools.

The second addition to the school curriculum is a Chapter I math remedial and reinforcement program. This program is similar to the reading program under Chapter I which we have had for many years. Chapter I is a federally funded program.

During the past few years, the School Board has worked hard to develop a salary schedule which puts the Goshen-Lempster School District in line with surrounding communities. This, of course, is very important because it allows the School Board to be competitive with other districts in the selection and employment of the very best teachers possible.

There are several people who should receive special recognition for their service to the School District:

1. Mr. and Mrs. Charles Newton have for many years operated the school buses in a very efficient, safe manner. Mr. Wayne Hart became the new bus contractor in September 1985.
2. Mr. John Bonfiglio continues to serve the District as the teaching principal. The school operates a good educational program largely due to the effective, experienced leadership which Mr. Bonfiglio provides.
3. Mr. Robert Seavey, who will be leaving the School Board in June, has been an interested, effective School Board member for the past five years. The school is in good hands when we have School Board members of Mr. Seavey's caliber.

## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Nineteen eighty-five was a year of significant change and growth at the Goshen-Lempster School. The introduction of new programs and the addition of faculty members have contributed to increased services for students. A Chapter I Math Program (federally funded) was initiated in September. The program is a full-time operation conducted by Mr. Ronald Purmort, formerly their Chapter I Reading instructor (a position now filled by Mrs. Lillian Bryce). Chapter I Math serves as a remedial and reinforcement resource for students who are having difficulty with their math lessons.

September also brought the inception of Goshen-Lempster's first formal Physical Education Program (a state mandated service for which the school has been in non-compliance). P.E. Instructor Judy Thackaberry is creating and implementing a curriculum which is aimed at developing health-related fitness (cardiovascular endurance, muscular endurance, strength, body composition, flexibility) and skill-related fitness (agility, coordination, balance). Research findings indicate that physical education enhances the development of the **whole** child (social, emotional, mental and physical being). Through cooperation and teamwork, physical activities may be channeled as an emotional release as well as a recreational activity. A student's intellect becomes rounded through problem solving while utilizing game rules and judgment to produce strategies.

New staff members (not mentioned) on board in September were: Ms. Sandra Lord (grade 3/4), replacing Ms. Janet Johnson; Ms. Jean MacWilliams (grade 6,7,8 English and Social Studies), succeeding Mr. Stephen Harrison; and Ms. Lori Pedley (Special Education), replacing Ms. Holly Blake. In addition, the student transportation service (formerly rendered by Mr. and Mrs. Charles Newton) is now being provided by Mr. and Mrs. Wayne Hart of Unity. Gratitude and appreciation go out to Mr. and Mrs. Newton from all of the school personnel and surely from all of the parents who, for years, have been able to depend on an impeccable school bus service.

Many activities, assemblies and trips have rounded out the educational experience this past year. Last winter our students were visited by two International 4-H Youth Exchange (IFYE) participants (representing Egypt and India) who gave slide presentations and displayed artifacts from their host countries. Last spring seventh and eighth graders took a first-hand look at the American democratic system as Joel Maiola (Congressional Aide to U.S. Congressman Judd Gregg) provided direct telephone communication between the students and Congressman Gregg in Washington, D.C. The students received answers to their questions on U.S.-Soviet relations, federal budget issues, nuclear war and acid rain.

Field trips take the classroom out into the world and bring the world into the curriculum. Some of the trips that were conducted this year were:

Mrs. Rudenfeldt organized music assemblies this past year and prepared students for the N.H. Southwest Junior High Music Festival, conducted by Mrs. Rudenfeldt. Goshen-Lempster students chosen for the festival were: Jennifer Adler, Stephanie Faulkner, Barbara Harrison, Travis Hodgdon, Kenneth LaQuire, Katie Pavlik and Heather Yurek. At Christmas time, an afternoon assembly of music performed by students was attended by many parents and citizens. In addition, last May the Goshen-Lempster School held its first evening Spring Concert. Mrs. Rudenfeldt directed performances by the sixth, seventh and eighth grade chorus; the fourth and fifth grade on recorders; and the eighth grade class in a series of variety skits.

On an evening in May, the Goshen-Lempster School held its first school-wide Science Fair, with each student submitting a project. As parents perused the various demonstrations, illustrations and experiments, they voted on the projects, choosing the best within three categories. The Parent-Teachers' Club (P.T.C.) provided cash prizes and certificates of honorable mention (1st prize - \$15, 2nd prize - \$5, 3rd prize - Certificate of Award). Students whose projects were distinguished were:

On the evening of June 18, the Goshen-Lempster School graduated the largest eighth grade class ever. Of the twenty-four graduates, the students taking honors were: Barbara Harrison (Valedictorian), Jennifer Adler (Salutatorian) and Katie Pavlik (Third Honors). The Reverend Lilian Warner gave the invocation and the benediction, School Board Chairman Robert Seavey issued diplomas, and P.T.C. President Darlene Purdie and Principal Bonfiglio presented awards. A reception for the graduates was prepared by the P.T.C. and mothers of the seventh grade students.

The P.T.C. conducted a Mascot/Logo contest among students in grades 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8. The members decided that it was time that the school had an emblem; they also decided that the emblem should be designed by a student. With the help of Mrs. Jan Struble, entries for a mascot/logo came flooding in. The choice was difficult, the design chosen was a sketch of an owl with the caption: "Goshen-Lempster Kids Are Wise.", entered by Christy Hurd (grade 5). Other entrants that were seriously considered were: Gary Caron, Jaime Ficket, Wayne Hebert, Shannon Hopkins, Travis Hurd and Lauren Winterholer. Various items including stickers and shirts with the Goshen-Lempster Mascot/Logo will be produced and made available through the Parent-Teachers' Club.

In September, a pioneer project entitled *Elementary School/Conflict Management* began with a target population of fifth and eighth graders. The project, created by Nurse Marilyn Sherman and Principal Bonfiglio, was sponsored through grants from the New Hampshire Public Health Agency and the Sullivan County Mental Health Association. The facet of the program geared for fifth grade students consisted of a standard model dealing with values clarification on social issues. The eighth grade portion of the project was a first time event consisting of sessions of group therapy in the classroom. The design was to help young adolescents to evaluate their perceptions of themselves in relation to their environment and to help them learn how to deal with the often intense stress brought on by puberty and peer pressure. The goal was to concentrate on the students making and asserting their decisions when confronted with such issues as alcohol, tobacco, drug abuse and sexuality. The group counselor guided the students as they evolved their own topics through group discussion. As the topics came to light, various group strategies were utilized (role playing, etc.) in scrutinizing the dynamics of the issue in regards to stresses in "street situations." Skills of forethought, communication, decision making, coping and assertiveness were developed. Upon initial evaluation of the project (data from pre- and post-student surveys), the statistical analysis implies twenty to fifty percent increases (group medians) in knowledge base and ability for decision making on each issue.

In conclusion, there are many facets of support that keep the Goshen-Lempster Cooperative School humming along. There are conscientious community members who volunteer their time to work with students in the classroom or to work with support groups such as the P.T.C. There are dedicated staff members carrying out the various school functions with a high degree of proficiency. There are School Administrative Unit 43 personnel who are taking care of upper level management procedures. Assistant Superintendent Peter Hutchins, succeeding Mr. Paul Linehan, has been instrumental in guiding Goshen-Lempster into a successful school year. Finally, the School Board must be commended for maintaining the delicate balance of ensuring a quality education for the children of the community while bearing the ultimate responsibility to the taxpayers for the provision of a cost effective and cost efficient program. The zeal of all of these groups and people is the fuel which propels us on our quest for quality.

## REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR OF PUPIL PERSONNEL SERVICES

Special Education services are available to every student in the Goshen-Lempster Cooperative School District. The Goshen-Lempster School has a pupil placement team consisting of the child's classroom teacher, nurse, special education teacher and building administrator. When a child is in need of special education services, the team together with the parents plan and develop an individualized educational program designed to meet the educational needs of the student.

The Goshen-Lempster Cooperative School District has twenty handicapped students. Approximately 70% of these students receive their special education services in the Resource Room located in the Goshen-Lempster School. Most of these students have specific learning and language disabilities. The remaining 30% attend special education programs at Keene, Claremont and Newport High School.

This year a new Elementary Mentally Retarded Program was developed to serve the children from School Administrative Unit #43 who are between the ages of six and eleven. These students were previously placed in School Administrative Unit #43 Pre-School Program located on the campus of Colby-Sawyer College in New London. This new program is located at Richards School in Newport and provides special education services within a small class setting.

I want to thank our teachers, parents and School Board members for their continued support of our exceptional children. I encourage you to visit our programs and see first-hand the excellent work our teachers are doing in educating our special children.
