To the inhabitants of the Town of Hart's Location in the County of Carroll, State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Varney Residence in said Hart's Location on Tuesday, the Tenth of March, 1992 at five of the clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

Article 3. To authorize the Selectmen to borrow sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to operate with one (1) Trustee of Trust Funds.

#### MINUTES OF 1991 TOWN MEETING

Moderator Patricia Bernardin convened meeting at 8 A.M. as scheduled. Attending were the Selectmen John Bernardin, Ward "Tom" McAllister and William King. First order of business was to recess the meeting until 5:00 P.M. this same day. Voting to be 2 to 5 P.M.

Recessed meeting opened at 5:04 P.M. with 17 voters and one landowner present. Moderator Patricia Bernardin read the posted Warrant as follows:

To the inhabitants of the Town of Hart's Location in the County of Carroll, State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Varney Residence in said Hart's Location on Tuesday, the Twelfth of March, next at eight of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects.

We hereby certify that we gave notice to the inhabitants within named, to meet at time and place for the purpose within mentioned, by posting up an attested copy of the within Warrant at the place of meeting within named, and a like attested copy at The Crawford Notch General Store, being a public place in said town, on the 25th day of February, 1991. Signed John Bernardin, "Tom" McAllister, William King.

Motion made and seconded to have vote by ballot for all Articles after discussion of each. Passed.

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing. Voting from 2 to 5 P.M. \*will be tallied before closed of meeting.

Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same. Passed.

Article 3. To authorize the Selectmen to borrow sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same. Passed.

Article 4. To authorize the Selectmen of Hart's Location to collect and expend the sum of up to \$19,000 to participate in the Bartlett/
Jackson Transfer Station. (\$14,000 initial capital cost and \$3,000 to \$5,000 per year operating expenses.) Selectmen not in favor. Selectmen explained they were trying to find a less expensive method of waste disposal with the possiblilty of having a town dumpster installed or possibly door to door collection. Defeated 13 - 4.

Article 5. To increase the salary of the Town Clerk/Tax Collector from \$200.00 to \$350.00 due to the increase in the Town Clerks' responsibilities. Selectmen in favor. Passed.

Article 6. To approve the Town Budget for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same. Passed.

Emergency and maintenance vehicles excepted. Glenn passed away on 9-7-88 and Gloria on 3-13-89." Discussion. It was pointed out that the Trail was designated with the idea of it being a quiet place for walking and cross country skiin and that snowmobiles would defeat this purpose. Defeated 8 - 7.
