Dinner at 6 p. m. — Business Meeting at 7 p. m.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hebron, County of Grafton, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at The Community Hall in said Hebron on Tuesday, the ninth (9th) day of March, next, at seven of the clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,500 for the purchase of the "Grange Gift Shop" from Mrs. Louise Pickering.
4. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000 to defray expenses for graveling and paving the "Beachwood Road".
5. To see if town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500 to be added to the capital reserve fund for a future Refuse System. (This is in conjunction with a prior agreement.)
6. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500 for the new "Highway Sander" for the Highway Department.
7. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to charge a fee of \$15.00 per season for snow removal from private driveways.
8. To see if the town will vote to authorize and empower the Planning Board to approve or disapprove, in its discretion, new subdivision of plats or plans thereof showing streets, or the widening thereof, or parks, and further authorizing and empowering said Planning Board, after the public hearing required by law, to adopt regulations governing such new subdivisions within the town of Hebron in accordance with the provisions of RSA 36:19-24, and, upon the adoption of this article, it shall be the duty of the Town Clerk to file with the Register of Deeds for Grafton County an appropriate certificate or notice showing that the Planning Board has been so authorized, giving the date of authorization as provided by RSA

36:19. If this article is adopted, it shall further be the duty of the Town Clerk to issue all certificates required by law when the Planning Board shall fail to take action as provided by RSA 36:19-29.

9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 to be used for legal, professional, and incidental planning expenses, at the discretion of the Planning Board, if necessary.

10. To see if the town will vote to adopt the following ordinance in order to protect and preserve the Hebron town common and the surrounding environs:

1. **Purpose; authorization.** In order to protect and preserve the atmosphere, beauty, and historic values of the town common of the town of Hebron, and to promote public welfare of said town, the Selectmen of the town of Hebron are hereby empowered to approve or disapprove, in their discretion, any new construction, major alterations, or the erection or installation of any signs or other advertising material within one quarter mile, or 1,320 feet of the bench mark, (shown as "BM") indicated to be at the top of the watering trough located at the center of the Hebron town common and shown on a plan entitled "Suggested Plan of Development Hebron Center New Hampshire" by the New Hampshire State Planning and Development Commission, dated July 5, 1945, on file at the Selectmen's office for the town of Hebron.

2. **Permit required.** The Board of Selectmen, after the vote of the majority, shall, within 10 days of any application for such permit, either grant or deny the request for any construction, major alteration, or the erection of any signs or advertising material so as to maintain the esthetic atmosphere of the town common of the town of Hebron. Any permit granted shall specify, at least by reference to the plan submitted, the permitted construction.

3. **Prohibition.** The erection of any building, trailer, or major alteration to any building currently existing, or the erection or installation of any sign or other advertising material for which a permit is required, without first obtaining such permit, is hereby prohibited.

4. **Penalty.** The penalty for violations of the foregoing ordinance shall be a fine of not more than \$50 per day for each day the violation continues.

11. To see if the town will vote to adopt the following ordinance in order to provide adequate police, fire, sanitary, and parking facilities for public gatherings within the town of Hebron:

1. **Purpose; authorization.** In order to insure that any public gatherings within the town of Hebron are conducted so as not to damage the welfare of the town, the Selectmen of the town of Hebron are hereby empowered to regulate and grant permits for any proposed public gatherings of more than 50 people within the town of Hebron.

2. **Permit required.** Any individual, corporation, or group of individuals seeking to hold any gathering open to the public, whether admission is charged or not, shall first apply for a permit so to do. Such permit shall be granted by the Selectmen of the town of Hebron when, in their discretion, they believe that adequate police, fire, sanitary, and parking facilities have been provided for by the applicant so as to cause neither unnecessary public disorder nor pollution to water within the town of Hebron.

3. **Prior Approval.** Any person, corporation, or group of individuals seeking to hold such public gatherings, shall make application to the Selectmen of the town of Hebron for such permit at least 14 days prior to the proposed date of such public gathering. The Selectmen shall grant or deny such request within 7 days of the date of application.

4. **Exceptions.** The following organizations are exempt from the permit requirements set out above: The state of New Hampshire, the town of Hebron, and any political subdivision of either; any church, charitable organizations, camp or school, owning land within the town of Hebron, provided that such public gathering is held in conjunction with the normal activities of such organization.

5. **Prohibition.** It shall be unlawful for any person, corporation, or group of individuals to hold, sponsor, or organize any gathering which requires the permit as set out above, without first obtaining such permit.

6. **Bond.** When, in their discretion, the Selectmen find that the public gathering for which a permit is applied entails sufficient risk of damage or disturbance to the town of Hebron, they may require such bond or sureties as they think are proper and adequate to insure that the conditions of the permit are complied with.

7. **Penalty.** Any person, corporation, or group of individuals violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined not more than \$200 for the first violation, and not more than \$500 for each subsequent violation.

8. **Separability.** If any section, clause, provision or phrase of this ordinance shall be held to be invalid, or unconstitutional, by any court or competent authority, such holding shall not affect, impair or invalidate any other section, clause, provision, portion or phrase of this ordinance.

12. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

**REPORT of the FOREST FIRE WARDEN
and DISTRICT CHIEF**

The 1970 forest fire season was a quiet one in this area, quiet in part because of your continued cooperation and favorable weather conditions.

Fires that did occur were, for the most part, caused by debris burning, children and smokers.

The elimination of these three causes of forest fires would drastically change this picture — to bring about this change we make the following suggestions:

1. When the ground is not covered with snow a permit to burn must be obtained from the Forest Fire Warden. This permit covers waste burning, even if an incinerator, grass burning, as well as garden trash and brush burning such burning is restricted by regulation to prior to 9:00 A. M. and after 5:00 P. M. with the following exceptions:
Commercial or industrial burning is permissible at any time under normal conditions but only with the approval of the District Chief and a written permit from the Forest Fire Warden.
2. Fires caused by children can be prevented only with the complete cooperation of parents in the supervision of their children, keep matches out of reach of children, this action will help to prevent fires and may save a life, the life of your child. Try to explain this to your child, won't you?
3. Forest fires caused by smokers can be reduced in number by the exercise of more care in the discarding of matches and smoking material whether from a vehicle or by a hiker. In all cases, make sure that the butt or match you discard is out, dead out. Smokey says, "Thanks for your help", and invites you to join with him in setting a good example for others in the prevention of fires and the protection of our environment.
