# WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING TOWN OF MADBURY, N. H.

March 8, 1960

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Madbury, County of Strafford, and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Madbury on Tuesday, the 8th day of March A. D. at 11:00 o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following articles.

ARTICLE 1. To choose the following Town Officers.

A town clerk for the ensuing year. A selectman for the ensuing three years. A treasurer for the ensuing year. A collector of taxes for the ensuing year. Two auditors for the ensuing year. A trustee of trust funds for the ensuing three years.

- ARTICLE 2. To choose all other town officers.
- ARTICLE 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- ARTICLE 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$332.41 for Class V highways to match the sum of \$2216.09 to be contributed by the State.
- ARTICLE 5. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate a sum not exceeding \$2548.50 for the purpose of making improvements to the following Class V roads within the Town: Perkins and Hayes such sums to be raised through the issuance of bonds or notes under and in compliance with the provisions of chapter 83, laws of 1951 as amended by chapter 31, laws of 1955, and to authorize

the Selectmen to determine the date and place of payment of such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other steps as may be necessary to negotiate such bonds or notes as shall be to the best interests of the Town of Madbury.

- ARTICLE 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for construction of the Huckins Road.
- ARTICLE 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$25.00 to be expended in cooperation with the New Hampshire Forestry and Recreation Commission for the opening and maintaining of trails and old roads for forest fire protection. The New Hampshire Forestry and Recreation Commission to provide a matching sum not in excess of \$25.00 for this purpose.
- ARTICLE 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$70.00 for the Seacoast Regional Development Association.
- ARTICLE 9. To see what action the Town will take to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for the purchase of new fire hose. Said \$100.00 will purchase approximately 300 feet of 1½ inch hose.
- ARTICLE 10. To see what action the Town will take to allow the Madbury Volunteer Fire Dept. to construct an  $18 \times 30$  addition on the south end of the present Fire Station.
- ARTICLE 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of eight hundred dollars (\$800.00) for a new addition to the present fire house.
- ARTICLE 12. To see if the Town will vote to borrow the sum of \$3000.00 to put a basement beneath the Town Hall to house the furnace and toilet facilities.

- ARTICLE 13. To see if the Town will authorize the Service Organizations of the Town to improve the kitchen of the Town Hall, subject to the approval of the Selectmen.
- ARTICLE 14. To see what action the Town will take on the proposed budget for the current year.
- ARTICLE 15. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- ARTICLE 16. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

#### **RECORD OF TOWN MEETING**

March 10, 1959

ARTICLE 1. Balloting for town officers:

- For Town Clerk for the ensuing year, Edna P. Twombly received 38 votes and was declared elected. The oath of office was then administered by Moderator, Kenneth S. Morrow.
- For Selectman for the ensuing three years, Joseph Cole had 38 votes and was declared elected unanimously.
- For Treasurer for the ensuing year, voted that the clerk cast one ballot for Loretta J. Morrow, and this being done, Mrs. Morrow was declared elected.
- For Collector of Taxes for the ensuing year, voted that the clerk cast one ballot for Dorothy S. Dugan, and this being done, Mrs. Dugan was declared elected.
- For Auditors for the ensuing year, voted that the clerk cast one ballot for Charles S. Jennison and Henry W. Corrow, and this being done, the two were declared elected.
- For Trustee of Trust Funds for the ensuing three years, voted that the clerk cast one ballot for E. A. Adams, and this being done, Mr. Adams was declared elected.
- ARTICLE 2. Voted that the Selectmen be empowered to choose all other necessary town officers.
- ARTICLE 3. Voted to authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow a sum or sums of money not exceeding in the aggregate \$7500 in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the current municipal year.

- ARTICLE 4. Voted to raise and appropriate \$332.37 for Class V highways to match the sum of \$2167.63 to be contributed by the State.
- ARTICLE 5. Voted to table article to see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$70 for the Seasoast Regional Association.
- ARTICLE 6. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1000 to continue the construction work on Old Stage Roads.
- ARTICLE 7. Voted to raise \$25 to be expended in cooperation with the N. H. Forestry and Recreation Commission for the opening and maintaining of trails and old roads for forest fire protection. The N. H. Forestry and Recreation Commission to provide a matching sum not in excess of \$25 for this purpose.
- ARTICLE 8. Voted to accept with deep gratitude the 1956, 1½ ton International truck chassis so generously offered as a gift by Mr. John S. Elliott.
- ARTICLE 9. Voted that the money in the Fire Truck Capital Reserve Fund be transferred to the selectmen for the purpose of purchasing fire equipment for the International truck chassis.
- ARTICLE 10. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1300 to be used with the amount in the Fire Truck Capital Reserve Fund for equipment on the International truck chassis.
- ARTICLE 11. Voted to table the article to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 to be placed in the Fire Truck Capital Reserve Fund for purchase of a fire truck at a future date.
- ARTICLE 12. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100 for the purchase of approximately 300 feet of  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inch fire hose.

- ARTICLE 13. Voted to approve the budget of \$15,815.00 as proposed by the selectmen with amendments of \$500 for the Fire Department.
- ARTICLE 14. Voted by a count of 46 to 27 to allow public Beano games in the town.
- ARTICLE 15. Voted to refer the matter of trailer parks to the Planning Board and receive their recommendation at the next annual meeting.
- ARTICLE 16. Fire Chief, James Colprit expressed the appreciation of the Department for the money appropriated.
- ARTICLE 17. Then appeared the officers elected and took the oath of office as required by law.

The addition of our new Fire apparatus marked the high point of 1959 for our Fire Department. Its arrival was celebrated with a Chicken Barbecue and display of our equipment.

Since the arrival of the truck it has been equipped with all available equipment, and tested and found satisfactory.

Three hundred feet of hose was purchased with funds appropriated.

Our training program was continued with five members attending the N. H. Chief's Club Fire School at Meadowood Drill Grounds at Fitzwilliam, N. H.

Although we had a number of calls during the year, our losses were small. The largest loss being Walter Freeman's trailer, and damage to Austin Hopey's Shop.

Your continued cooperation is requested to maintain a good fire record. A written permit is required for an outdoor fire by New Hampshire State Law. A written permit is required for an incinerator by a Madbury Ordinance.
