TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Marlow in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Jones Hall in said Marlow on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects.

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and to make appropriations for the same.
- 3. To raise or appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of the poor.
- 4. To see if the Town will apply for Class Five money known as T.R.A. and raise the sum of \$300.20 required by the State.
- 5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the repairs of highways and bridges.
- 6. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the Town Library.
- 7. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the Observance of Memorial Day.
- 8. To see if the Town will authorize the selectmen to borrow money by temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.
- 9. To authorize the tax collector to give two per cent cash discount on all property and personal taxes for payments made within 30 days after the date of tax bill, and empower the collector to appoint a deputy collector.

- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise such sums of money as may be necessary to improve Town Cemeteries.
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$33.00 for the Monadnock Region Association.
- 12. To see if the Town will authorize the selectmen to sell or administer all real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collectors Deeds.
- 13. To see what action the Town will take in regard to those items in the Town budget not covered in the proceeding articles.
- 14. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to publish delinquent dog taxes in the Town report.
- 15. To see if the Town will vote for white pine blister rust control, and raise or appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for same.
- 16. To see what action the Town will take to raise and appropriate \$260.80 for the Elliot Community Hospital.
- 17. To hear the reports of officers, agents and committees heretofore chosen, and to pass any vote relating thereto, and to transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

To the inhabitants of the school district in the Town of Marlow qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Jones Hall, in said district on the 14th of March, 1950, at 2 o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a moderator for the coming year.
- 2. To choose a clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a member of the school board for the ensuing three years.
 - 4. To choose a treasurer for the ensuing year.

- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the school board and truant officer, and fix the compensation of any other officer or agent of the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or other officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose agents, auditors, committees, or other officers in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
- 9. To see if the district will authorize the school board to borrow money not to exceed \$600.00 to add to the present water fund so that this project may be completed as soon as possible.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Marlow:

I herewith present my fifth annual report as superintendent of your school.

There are two major needs of your school plant that are desirable to improve its appearance, and have it conform to state board of health regulations. For a number of years we have been studying the problem of putting water in the school. Each plant that has been studied has proven to be unsatisfactory, either because of excessive cost or because the source of water was found to be polluted. Your school board is now recommending that the district borrow enough more money to add to the present amount, \$723.00, to do a satisfactory job as soon as possible. By borrowing the money and paying it back over a period of three years the cost does not become too great a burden in any one year.

The outside of the building needs painting. In a number of school districts the people have gotten together on a painting bee, had fun, improved their property, and saved themselves some money. The school board has funds available to purchase the paint.

The PTA is becoming a source of benefit to the school. Their latest project is to sponsor a milk program in the school so that every child wanting it may have a bottle with his lunch. This is a federally-aided project, with the government paying part, the P.T.A. paying part, and the child paying part. The P.T.A. is also donating two rubber door mats, and gave candy and gifts to the children at Christmas. These activities are much appreciated by the pupils and teachers.

You will note that the amount of money to be raised this year is about the same as last. A few increases have been necessary in some items, but these have been kept as small as possible without impairing the efficiency of the school. We operate on a marginal budget, as can be seen from past reports, so that changes are only minor. High school tuition costs are rising rapidly. The last session of legislature made it possible for a district to charge the full cost of operating a school rather than just the cost of instruction. This accounts for some large increases in certain schools.

Our enrollment continues to drop off, somewhat.

HEALTH REPORT

Health inspection of pupils showed the following defects:

- 45 pupils were inspected.
- 28 pupils were in need of dental care.
 - 2 pupils were advised to have throat and nose examination by a physician.
 - 1 pupil had sufficient wax in ears to obstruct the canal.
 - 4 pupils had their teeth cared for.
 - 1 pupil had tonsil and adenoid operation.

All pupils were given sight and hearing tests with the Massachusetts Vision Test and Maico Audiometer, no defects were found.



FOREST FIRES—OUR MOST SHAMEFUL WASTE

Everyone apparently fears fires but too many are careless with it. This is particularly true of fires in and near woodlands. Official figures show that more than 98 percent of all forest fires result from human carelessness and can be prevented. Consequently, we may say "Forest Fires are our most shameful waste".

Annual forest fire losses are tremendous and their effects far reaching. Such fires destroy the raw products of the forests, the protection forests provide for game and the supply of ground water. They upset local economies by drawing men from gainful employment and requiring the expenditure of public funds to extinguish them.

Our forest fire organization is doing a good job in keeping the size of fires small but the number of fires is increasing. In 1949 there were 100 more fires in New Hampshire than in 1948, but they burned 500 acres less. For the warden and his deputies to do the job they are capable of, they must have the cooperation of the public—YOU!

The primary objective of all fire fighters is PREVENTION—fire stoppage. This is the goal toward which your local forest fire warden and his deputies are constantly working. It can be achieved ONLY if YOU and YOU cooperate with them. It is worth YOUR effort and can be accomplished by:

- (1) Being careful with fire in or near woodland, being particularly careful with matches and cigarettes.
- (2) Securing the required written permit from the warden when the ground is not covered with snow.
- (3) Insisting that others be careful and comply with burning requirements,
- (4) Calling the warden promptly when fire is detected and aiding him to extinguish it.

Let's reduce the number of forest fires and eliminate our most
