#### TOWN WARRANT

#### The State of New Hampshire

To the Inhabitants of the Town of New Hampton in the County of Belknap in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said New Hampton on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1 To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- 2 To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the repair of highways and bridges and make appropriation for the the same
- 4 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$698.23 for the Town Road Aid, the State contributing \$2,792.92.
- 5 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for permanent improvement of highways and bridges and make appropriation for the same.

- 6 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of Class V Roads.
- 7 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of seven thousand four hundred twenty dollars (\$7,420.00) for the payment of the balance due on the snow removal equipment.
- 8 To see if the Town will vote to rebuild the bridge on the Brook Road so-called, and raise and appropriate money for the same.
- 9 To see what additional sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the construction of an addition to the Tractor House.
- 10 (By Request) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to tar the road leading from the Plaisted School house road towards the residence of Dean Babbitt.
- 11 (By Petition) To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for the straightening and improvement of the Brook Road, so-called.
- 12 (By Request) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$182, which is 1/100 of 1 percent of the assessed valuation of the Town, to the Lakes Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region.

- 13 (By Request) To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$366.00 which is 1/50 of 1 percent of the assessed valuation of the Town to the Newfound Region for the purpose of advertising and other activities for the benefit of the Town, in cooperation with other towns of the Newfound Region.
- 14 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 as a contribution for the new Veterans' Memorial.
- 15 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day.
- 16 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Old Home Day.
- 17 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care of old Cemeteries.
- 18 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the care and maintenance for the New Hampton Village Cemetery.
- 19 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.
- 20 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the purchase of Forest Fire Equipment.

- 21 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250. for the improvement of the Town House driveway.
- 22 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the repair of the Town House roof.
- 23 To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 24 To vote upon the following question: "Shall the provisions of Chapter 171-A of the Revised Laws relative to playing the games of beano, be adopted in this town?"
- 25 To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

### Forest Fires-Our Most Shameful Waste

Everyone apparently fears fires but too many are careless with it. This is particularly true of fires in and near woodlands. Official figures show that more than ninety-eight percent of all forest fires result from human carelessness and can be prevented. Consequently, we may say "Forest Fires are our most shameful waste."

Annual forest fire losses are tremendous and their effects far reaching. Such fives destroy the raw products of the forests, the protection forests provide for game and the supply of ground water. They upset local economies by drawing men from gainful employment and requiring the expenditure of public funds to extinguish them.

Our forest fire organization is doing a good job in keeping the size of fires small but the number of fires is increasing. In 1949 there were 100 more fires in New Hampshire than in 1948, but they burned 500 acres less. For the warden and his deputies to do the job they are capable of, they must have the cooperattion of the public—YOU!

The primary objective of all fire fighters is PRE-VENTION—fire stoppage. This is the goal toward which your local forest fire warden and his deputies are constantly working. It can be achieved ONLY if YOU and YOU and YOU cooperate with them. It is worth YOUR effort and can be accomplished by:

1 Being careful with fire in or near woodland, being particularly careful with matches and cigarettes.

- 2 Securing the required WRITTEN PERMIT from the warden when the ground is not covered with snow.
- 3 Insisting that others be careful and comply with burning requirements.
- 4 Calling the warden promptly when fire is detected and aiding him to extinguish it.

Let's reduce the number of forest fires and eliminate our most shameful waste.

# ANNUAL REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

The new central school will probably be completed this spring. Because of the confusion attending changing of transportation routes and regrouping of pupils, it seems best to plan on occupying the school in September of 1950.

New Hampton will have one of the finest small elementary schools in this part of the country. The community is fortunate to have had an excellent building committee, a competent architect and a skillful general contractor. The new school will provide an environment in which the educational growth of New Hampton boys and girls will flourish. The school will be a source of pride to the community for many years to come.

It is unfortunate that the state legislature failed to appropriate money for the support of schools on the state level, for this has thrown the full burden of the cost of the new building on the local community. The New Hampton tax rate this year reflects the highest single year cost of the new school.

It is a pleasure to have associated with the members of the New Hampton School Building Committee, the New Hampton School Board, and teachers.

### REPORT OF SCHOOL NURSE

### October Through December, 1949

The routine physical checkup of all school children was made in October. The children were given instruction in hygiene during this inspection. The need for dental care appears to be urgent. After a very satisfactory talk with the School Board chairman, Dr. Deneault was contacted and he has promised a weekly appointment of all morning, one day a week starting the latter part of February.

New scales with a measuring device for heights has been purchased by the committee.

As in previous years, multiple vitamin capsules have been made available through the local Red Cross. These capsules have been given out daily by the teachers to all pupils.

I appreciate the patience and help received from all.

### REPORT OF BUILDING COMMITTEE

Following the Special Meeting of the School District held May 11, 1949, at which the District approved the new school house plans and authorized a bond issue of \$80,000, a meeting of the building committee was held on May 17, 1949 at which time inspection was made of the school house site and agreement was reached on the location of the new school. The School Board reported that they had accepted the bid of Messrs. Chace, Whiteside, Warren & Sears for \$80,000 bonds at par with interest at one and seven-eighths percent, payable \$8,000 annually, June 1, 1950 to June 1, 1959.

After a lengthy discussion of relative advantages of open and selective bidding, it was unanimously voted that specifications be submitted to Trumbull-Nelson and Leighton & Son and at least one other contractor of similar qualifications to be selected by the architect. After examination and discussion of the plans in detail by the committee and the architect it was unanimously voted to accept them subject to final approval by the State office.

On June 15th the committee held a public meeting for opening of bids. Four bids were received; from Leighton & Son, J. P. MacMillan Co., Blanchard Stebbins and Trumbull-Nelson. This meeting was adjourned for consideration of bids.

On June 17th the committee met, and Mr. Leighton's bid being considered the most satisfactory, the committee discussed with him thoroughly the plans and specifications and possible modifications for the purpose of effecting savings in construction costs. Certain modifications were approved and Mr. Leighton submitted a final bid of \$72,032, which the committee voted unanimously to accept.

The committee met again on September 30th for the discussion of the purchase of equipment. At Mr. Dunnan's suggestion, it was arranged that representatives should go to Swampscott, Mass., to see exhibits of school equipment that would be shown at a meeting of the New England Superintendent's Assn.

On October 28th the committee met with the architect and superintendent. Mr. Matthews, Mrs. Merrill and Mrs. Wolfe had attended the exhibit of school equipment in Swampscott and reported the pupil desks and seats sold by Gledhill Bros., seemed to them the most satisfactory. A representative of the firm was present with samples and it was voted to place an order with them for one hundred assorted sizes of desks and seats. Other equipment was discussed but no action taken.

The contract and architect's fee amount to approximately \$75,000. The pupil seating equipment ordered will amount to approximately \$2300. Other payments out of the building fund have been: \$550. for legal fees; \$242. for certification and printing of bonds; \$374. for builder's risk insurance on the new building; leaving a balance of approximately \$1500 for completion of equipment and landscaping. At a meeting of the committee on February 3, 1950, it was voted to leave the expenditure of this balance for equipment to the discretion of the School Board.

The building is at present, February 3rd, approximately 75 percent completed, and the architect anticipates that it will be completed, ready for occupancy by April first. While it will be impractical to transfer the schools there before the beginning of the school year next September, it is hoped that graduation exercises may be held in the new building and that the building may be dedicated at that time.

The tax rate in New Hampton has increased this year by about \$1.00. This represents not only an increase in school expenditures of about \$13,000, but also an increase in highway and other appropriations of about \$9,000. Of the school expenditures, \$9,500 is due to payments of interest and principal

on the bond issue for the new school, which accounts for approximately forty-two cents of the increase in the tax rate. We also lost approximately \$4,000 in State Aid through the Legislative cut in appropriation for this purpose. This would be reflected in another eighteen cents on our tax rate. In fact, if we had received this State Aid, our school budget, exclusive of the payments on the bond issue, would have been less than last year, so that the net increase in tax rate representing school appropriations is about fifty-nine cents.

This year has involved the largest payment on the building costs, since the interest payments will decrease each year as the principal of the bond issue is paid off. As inspection of the school budget will show, the payments for next year (1950-1951) will be \$9,350.

In conclusion, the committee wish to express their appreciation of the cooperation and valuable advice of the architect, Mr. Norman P. Randlett and of the School Superintendent.
