

- Establishing and maintaining a cooperative, open partnership between business, civic, non-profit, religious, educational, and town interests through regularly scheduled opportunities for dialogues.
- Continuing to foster business development by proactively attracting businesses and industries that will work in a cooperative partnership with the town.



Board of Selectman

Foremost in our responsibility as Selectmen to oversee the “prudential affairs” of the Town, was the challenge of preserving and maintaining the public services (Fire, Police, Highway, Waste Removal, Road Maintenance, Library, Recreation, etc.) working under a default budget. At the March Town Meeting, the voters rejected the budget that the Board of Selectmen and Budget Advisory Committee had recommended. No warrant articles were approved except the revaluation for \$72,000.

This third year of a default budget continued the slow erosion of basic Town services. And, three years of wage freezes have also taken a toll. Rindge now pays its employees less than employees with similar responsibility and experience in neighboring towns. As a result, we have seen the departure of experienced employees who have sought better employment opportunities elsewhere.

We strived to balance the need to provide good public services with the taxpayers’ approval and ability to pay for them. And, we tried to communicate to all of our citizens that we are all custodians of our community and that working together and budgeting with care is the only way we can maintain the services to which we are accustomed.

Communication with Rindge citizens continued as a high priority through out 2010. The Town Website provided current information about Town departments and activities. Our Facebook provided a forum for exchange of information, questions and answers, and advice regarding all Town matters. Public information sessions were conducted in December to provide information about the operation of our Town departments. The Rindge Connection, co-sponsored by the Town, Franklin Pierce University, and the Rindge Chamber of Commerce was published eight times and was mailed to every household. It provides a valuable resource for Town, University, and business matters.

After ten years of planning and development for low and moderate income housing for senior citizens, construction of Payson Village Senior Housing began! Rindge citizens consistently supported this effort along the way through two different approval votes. This project results from a partnership between the Town of Rindge and Southwestern Community Services. Total funding in the amount of \$3.5 million was secured from Federal and State sources. This was also good for our local economy as local contractors were selected for general contractor and site work. SWCS was responsible for oversight of construction and will continue to manage the on-going service of this twenty-four unit rental property when it is occupied in April 2011.

A revaluation of Town property, as required by State law, was conducted. This resulted in property value adjustments in line with current valuation. Overall, the value of property declined 5.7%.

The BOS continued to review all Town policies with the intent of keeping these policies current and effective.

The Board of Selectmen strived to help our town look to its future the opportunity to grow and develop in ways that are good for all residents. In the Fall of 2001, the Rindge 2020 Project brought hundreds of Rindge residents together for a series of forums to discuss their hopes and concerns for Rindge as it entered the 21st Century. The overwhelming response was that people wanted a Town that provided a good life for all its citizens, while preserving its natural resources and traditional character.

2010 marked the halfway point in the Town’s journey to 2020. The Economic Development Committee and the Planning Board, with the strong endorsement of the Board of Selectmen, began the Rindge Economic Development Initiative (REDI), a rejuvenation of the Rindge 2020 Project. Several community forums and an Economic Development Survey sent to every household and business in Rindge produced the following Vision for the Town:

- Preserve and protect the Town’s rich historic legacy, rural character, and abundant natural resources.
- Offer high quality of life with economic opportunities, affordable quality public services, and access to natural

resources for residents and visitors.

- Welcome new and existing businesses and entrepreneurs and be a preferred destination for visitors to the Monadnock Region.
- Encourage and support the Town's traditional New England architectural style, a sense of community, and unique history.
- Partner with Franklin Pierce University for our mutual advancement.

The Board of Selectmen sincerely appreciates the leadership of Town Administrator Carlotta Pini, the Department Heads, and the Town employees. Every employee, with their excellent skill, experience and dedication, contributes to keeping our community running smoothly. In addition to employees, over 100 citizens serve on elected and appointed boards and committees. In numerous ways these dedicated citizens "give back" to our community. They provide invaluable service, advice, and hours to help make Rindge a desirable place to live. All this effort continues to proactively shape and influence how our community is growing and developing in ways that benefit all of citizens.

Town Administrator

2010 began with budget workshops and hearings to finalize the 2010 budget. The Deliberative Session was held the first Saturday in February, providing voters an opportunity to learn about the proposed budget and warrant articles. Little was changed and the articles were forwarded to the printer for production of the ballots. At the March Town Meeting, voters rejected the proposed budget and all spending articles but one. Voters authorized spending \$72,000 for the mandatory revaluation of property.

The next week, Selectmen met with the Department Heads and I to discuss how to re-allocate the default budget to meet the Town's needs. Moneys were transferred out of several budgets to cover projected shortages in other departments. When the dust settled, department heads got back to the work at hand.

The Fire Chief solicited estimates to repair Engine 2, and nearly \$16,000 was transferred from the Recreation Department for the work. This was possible because one full time position had been eliminated in the Recreation Department. The Police Chief used the \$13,000 in the Vehicles line item of the Default budget to purchase a used 4-wheel drive vehicle to replace the 2000 Ford Explorer that had reached the end of its useful life. The Selectmen and I sought proposals from assessing firms to conduct the revaluation. We were pleased to hire J.F. Ryan & Associates for the job, which got underway in April.

After an exhaustive search which included reviewing 100 candidates resumes and interviewing a half dozen qualified recreation professionals, the citizen Recreation Director Search Committee recommended the Board of Selectmen hire Craig Fraley. Craig joined us in February and jumped in with both feet. By spring, he had the T-ball and softball programs in full swing; by summer, he not only grew the Summer Camp program but also introduced a new Teen Days program. I was sure glad to have Craig on board after serving as Interim Recreation Director for nearly an entire year!

The Planning Board contracted with Hawk and Associates to begin work on an economic initiative which they later named "REDI" an acronym for "Rindge Economic Development Initiative". The Planning Board worked closely with the Town's Economic Development Committee and the consultants to craft a survey to be sent to all households in Rindge. The purpose of the survey was to determine what types of economic development the townspeople wanted. The public's response to the survey was amazing, with nearly a 30% response rate. Once the surveys were tabulated, the Committees began meeting to synthesize the results and develop a draft vision for the Town. It has been an exciting process!

Spring sprung with new ideas for sustainability from local residents. Sue Massey partnered with Kim McCummings to start a Farmers & Crafters Market on the West Rindge Common. It got off to a slow start, but picked up speed throughout the season. We hope these dedicated volunteers are willing to keep this going year after year! John McCracken worked with Craig Fraley, the Recreation Director, and Mike Cloutier, the DPW Director, to start a Community Garden at Wellington Park. Mediocre soil and a lack of water made the first year a challenge, but John has partnered with other members of the Agriculture Committee to keep working on the project. And last but not least, Pat Martin spearheaded the establishment of an Energy Commission to identify ways to save energy (and money) for the Town government and its citizens. She was joined by Bob Cleland, Richard Mellor, Michelle Comeau, Dwight Shank and other committed residents who have sponsored programs on wind power, geothermal energy, and other topics. The Committee was successful in applying for ARRA funding for three energy initiatives – to insulate and weatherproof the police station, to replace street lights with energy efficient models, and to conduct professional grade energy audits on all town buildings.

In June we learned that the Fast Roads' Grant application to the National Telecommunications and Information Administration was approved. Rindge was named as one of two towns to receive last mile fiber connections on an open access network which will enable local Internet service providers to offer enhanced broadband service to residents and businesses. The application was limited to one census block group that was un-served or under-served. The census block identified in the grant is located in the southwest corner of town and includes Abel Road, Rand Road, and Kimball Road. Fast Roads invited me to join their Board of Directors which is charged with





overseeing the implementation of the grant. It is a very exciting project, and we are so fortunate to be the recipient of this funding. The project is planned to be completed by Fall of 2012. I plan to work closely with the Rindge Telecommunications Committee to ensure that residents are involved in and up-to-speed on the progress of this project.

At the end of June, there was a ground-breaking ceremony for the Payson Village Senior Housing, a project that has been in the works for over ten years! Senior Housing Committee members, past Selectmen, and others who have been involved with this project over the years gathered to celebrate this momentous occasion. As exciting as it was to see work getting started, it was just as exciting to see the project awarded to two local firms. Van Dyke Construction was awarded the site work and Hutter Construction was named as the General Contractor. Both firms got to work quickly and at year end, the building was nearly complete. Occupancy is planned for April of 2011!

Communication has been a priority for me throughout the year. I have spent a good deal of time checking and responding to residents' questions and concerns on the Town's Facebook page. I have written articles and worked on the editing and publication of the Rindge Connection. Getting each issue paid for is a challenge in this economy. Local businesses have trimmed their advertising budgets which has resulted in deficits in the Connection's revenues month after month. The Selectmen and I are committed to keeping this newsletter going because we continually hear from residents that they value having a town newsletter and look to reading about goings on in their community. We held the "Public Services Series in the Fall and Winter to give residents an opportunity to learn more about the various town departments. Attendance was less than we had hoped, but those who attended left with a better understanding of the operations of the Police, Fire, Highway, Recreation, and other departments. The economy remained a major challenge in preparation of the 2011 budget. I worked closely with Department Heads, the Budget Advisory Committee, the Capital Improvements Committee, and the Board of Selectmen to develop a budget proposal that maintained the services that the citizens of the Town have grown accustomed to, while keeping the tax impact reasonable. After three years of operating on a default budget, it was not easy. With the budget cut approved at the Deliberative Session, voters are now faced with a very difficult decision. Services will need to be cut if the amended budget passes. I await the voters' decision as I look forward to another year of service to the Town of Rindge in 2011.

Deliberative Session was called to order by Town Moderator, David M. Tower at 9:10am. David introduced Girl Scout Troop 12201, Troop Leaders Marie Pugh and Monique Stanway, Color Guard & Runners, Bradi Pugh, Riley Drew, Elizabeth Valcourt, and Kimberly Stanway. Girl Scout Troop 12201 led the meeting to the Pledge of Allegiance. David then introduced Town Officials; Administrator Carlotta Pini, Director of Planning, Jane Pitt, Director of Public & Life Safety, Rick Donovan, Chief of Police, Michael Sielicki. Board of Selectmen, Chair, Jed Brummer, Burt Goodrich and Patricia Lang-Barry; Town Clerk; Nancy Martin, Budget Advisory Committee; Chair, Dan Aho, Susan Emerson, Gordon Olin, Roberta Oeser, Jason Czekalski and Alex Douglas. He also introduced the Supervisors of the Checklist; Amy Raymond, Ida Mae Harmon and Roberta Letourneau, other town employees; Administrative Assistant Julie Labonte, Assessing Clerk/Code Enforcement Officer; David DuVernay, Tax Collector; Carol Donovan, Planning Assistant; Robyn Payson, Administrative Assistant for Fire & Building; Deb Douglas and FF/EMT; Casey Burrage.

The Moderator introduced each of the following warrant articles, and discussion ensued:

Article 4. 

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INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Board of Selectmen
Town of Rindge, New Hampshire

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the governmental activities, each major fund, and the aggregate remaining fund information of the Town of Rindge, New Hampshire, as of and for the year ended December 31, 2009, which collectively comprise the Town of Rindge, New Hampshire's basic financial statements as listed in the table of contents. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Town of Rindge, New Hampshire's management. Our responsibility is to express opinions on these financial statements based on our audit.

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards*, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinions.

As discussed in Note 2 to the financial statements, management has not recorded a liability for other post-employment benefits in governmental activities and, accordingly, has not recorded an expense for the current period change in that liability. Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require that other post-employment benefits attributable to employee services already rendered and that are not contingent on a specific event that is outside the control of the employer and employee be accrued as liabilities and expenses as employees earn the rights to the benefits, which would increase the liabilities, reduce the net assets, and change the expenses of the governmental activities. The amount by which this departure would affect the liabilities, net assets, and expenses of the governmental activities is not reasonably determinable.

In our opinion, because of the effects of the matter discussed in the preceding paragraph, the financial statements referred to previously do not present fairly, in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, the financial position of the governmental activities of the Town of Rindge, New Hampshire, as of December 31, 2009, or the changes in financial position thereof for the year then ended.

In addition, in our opinion, the financial statements referred to previously present fairly, in all material respects, the respective financial position of each major fund and the aggregate remaining fund information of the Town of Rindge, New Hampshire as of December 31, 2009, and the respective changes in financial position thereof for the year then ended in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

In accordance with *Government Auditing Standards*, we have also issued our report dated February 28, 2011 on our consideration of the Town of Rindge, New Hampshire's internal control over

contracts, and grant agreements. The purpose of that report is to describe the scope of our testing of internal control over financial reporting and compliance and the results of that testing, and not to provide an opinion on the internal control over financial reporting or on compliance. That report is an integral part of an audit performed in accordance with *Government Auditing Standards* and should be considered in assessing the results of our audit.

The management's discussion and analysis and the budgetary comparison information on pages i-vi and 21-22, respectively, are not a required part of the basic financial statements but are supplementary information required by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board. We have applied certain limited procedures, which consisted principally of inquiries of management regarding the methods of measurement and presentation of the required supplementary information. However, we did not audit the information and express no opinion on it.

Our audit was conducted for the purpose of forming opinions on the financial statements that collectively comprise the Town of Rindge, New Hampshire's basic financial statements. The accompanying schedule of expenditures of federal awards is presented for purposes of additional analysis as required by U.S. Office of Management and Budget Circular A-133, *Audits of States, Local Governments, and Non-Profit Organizations*, and is not a required part of the basic financial statements. The combining nonmajor fund financial statements are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the basic financial statements. Such information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the basic financial statements and, in our opinion, is fairly presented in all material respects, in relation to the basic financial statements taken as a whole.





3. Board of Adjustment



Building Department

The Rindge Building Department conducted approximately 476 inspections in 2010. We continue to update the inspection process to ensure that all applicable codes are met and all contractors performing the work are properly licensed in the State of New Hampshire. We will continue to look at ways to clarify the process for obtaining the necessary permits and documentation for commercial and residential building, occupancy and operation permits. This information will hopefully help the permit process go smoothly. In 2011 I continue to look forward to working with all homeowners and contractors performing work in the Town of Rindge.

The Town of Rindge Building Department issued eight (8) Residential Single Family Dwelling Permits; two (2) Replacement Single Family Dwelling; one (1) multi-family unit (24 Units); eighty-two (82) Residential Accessory Permits; two (2) Commercial Building Permits; seventeen (17) Commercial Accessory Permits; seven (7) Demolition Permits; eighty-six (86) Electrical Permits; thirty-one (31) Plumbing Permits; sixty-nine (69) Fire Safety Permits; twenty-two (22) Occupancy Permits; one (1) Mechanical Permit.

PERMIT REQUIREMENTS

Permits are required for all construction within the Town of Rindge including Remodeling, Additions, Demolition of a structure, sheds, outbuildings, decks, pools, sundecks, etc. A permit is also required for all electrical, plumbing, mechanical, oil and gas appliances including piping, wood burning equipment, chimneys, etc. Permit applications and information may be obtained at the Rindge Building Office located in the Rindge Town Office Building on Payson Hill Road. Permit applications may also be downloaded from the town's website.

The Building Department restructured the permit process in 2007. We no longer have a "one permit does all process". All contractors are required to file a permit application to obtain a permit for their respective trade. Examples are electrical, plumbing, mechanical permits, etc. This process will ensure better management of building projects within the town. This procedure will guarantee the contractor's endorsement for the building project.

Capital Improvements Program

The Capital Improvements Plan (CIP) Committee interviewed the various Department Heads and gathered their requests for capital improvements over the next six years. We prioritized these needs and presented our recommendations to the Board of Selectmen. They asked the Budget Advisory Committee for their recommendations, too.

We all recognize the urgency of replacing capital equipment which through long and hard use, even with regular maintenance, has seen better days and often fails when needed. It is expensive to replace equipment, but it is much more expensive and often foolish to try to repair equipment which has exceeded its useful life and whose parts keep failing.

The Committee's task in preparing a CIP has been made more difficult because taxpayers in recent years have rejected the final CIP proposals. Here's what we recommend this year.

While the Fire Department must replace several pieces of equipment soon, they have postponed where they can in order to seek your approval of the Fire Station renovation in 2011. We must replace the emergency response vehicle for \$35,000, but postpone buying SCBA air packs and reconditioning the Reel Truck pump.

The Police Department should replace at least two cruisers this year (3 cruisers have over 150,000 miles on them). Highway must replace an 18-year-old Plow truck (with a 10-year useful life) for \$155,000, bonding \$100,000 of its cost. We have to purchase a \$10,000 utility vehicle for the Rec Department.

We should save for future needs, too, such as putting away \$35,000 each year for the required 2015 Revaluation, as well as add \$25,000 for the Meeting House Maintenance Fund.

A few years ago the Committee had developed a plan to set aside \$275,000 a year to keep ahead of our future needs, but for various reasons voters over the years didn't agree. Now, we calculate we'll need to set aside about \$400,000 a year to keep up. We urge you to give serious consideration to voting in March to save for the future of Rindge.

Code Enforcement Officer

The Rindge Board of Selectmen is responsible for the enforcement of town ordinances, decisions of the Planning Board, and Board of Adjustment (ZBA) rulings, including any conditions imposed in any of them. The Board appointed me, Code Enforcement Officer, several years ago to carry out some of their responsibilities. I keep the Board informed of enforcement issues and my activities every step of the way.


Most citizens violating town ordinances are unaware their actions contravene an ordinance or regulation until they are so informed. Often a friendly telephone call to remind them of the ordinances or regulations is sufficient to induce a change. On some occasions it takes a bit more urging. Currently the list of situations I am monitoring rests at 18, down from 120 just three years ago, but most of them require only an annual or semi-annual update.

One litigation case is almost over and only two situations might result in stronger enforcement action.

I represent the Board of Selectmen at all ZBA hearings to interpret applicable laws or regulations. Many cases call for a Variance of town ordinances. Others require ZBA approval of a Special Exception. I consult with the Conservation Commission on potential violations of our Wetlands Conservation District Ordinance.

Conservation Commission

The Rindge Conservation Commission (RCC) strives to monitor and preserve the natural resources of Rindge. Its members work closely with the public, Select Board, Planning Board, Board of Adjustment and the N.H. Department of Environmental Services to give advice and make recommendations in an effort to protect environmentally sensitive areas in the present and for the future.

Activity Highlights:

- Pursuit of conservation land, easement acquisition and facilitation
- Conservation land and easement holdings management
- Wetland permit application reviews
- Environmental violation investigations and reports
- Promotion of environmental education

2010 has been a busy year for the Conservation Commission with 21 formal meetings held, 3 site reviews conducted and 21 work sessions, hearings or workshops totaling almost 450 hours of volunteer work. In addition, many more hours of work was accomplished by non-Commission individuals in support of the Commission's efforts.

The Commission was saddened with the passing of Rick Godin in 2010, a very knowledgeable and dedicated member that brought many years of experience and passion to the Town of Rindge. He is greatly missed.

In early 2010, the recently installed open bottom culvert at Converse Meadow was severely damaged by a storm that exceeded the 100 year storm design criteria, over flowing and bypassing the stream bed to the east and undermining the culvert footings. After a major repair design, Stenerson Excavating of Rindge repaired and upgraded the stream crossing. Former member Tom Peragallo oversaw the repair project for the Commission and was acknowledged for his years of service with a plaque at the crossing.

The Commission had a Forest Management Plan developed for the Town Forest, Hunt Forest and Tetreault Park in 2010 and will be looking to implement in the near future. The Commission also commissioned a natural resource inventory of Annett Forest with the intention of facilitating improvements to the State management plan for this very important Rindge natural, recreational and economic asset.

The Town Tree Policy was presented to, accepted and implemented by the Select Board for the maintenance and replacement of trees on Town property. The Commission purchased and the Highway Department planted one elm tree in the center of Town south of the Meeting House and two elms flanking the entrance to Hillside Cemetery. Much thanks to the Highway Department.

One of the larger projects for the Commission in 2010 was the purchase of high resolution aerial photography of Rindge. This system has been installed in the Planning Department and is being synchronized with the digital tax maps for use by the public, Highway Department and Planning Department for development, subdivision and conservation. The Commission will be using one feature of the system to develop highly accurate trail maps for the recreational use of the Town. On the subject of trails, the Commission this year opened up loop trails at the Town Forest and Tetreault Park and hopes to pursue water crossings on these properties in 2011.

The Commission also facilitated an easement on the Weinberg property just off South Main street that will protect this property near the center of Town.

Once again the Commission selected a Rindge youth to be awarded with a Camp Wildwood summer camp scholarship.

Property owners, who wish to help insure Rindge's natural future, and who may be interested in conserving their land under easement, through donation or possibly in conjunction with estate planning, should contact the





Energy Commission

The Rindge Energy Commission entered the new year with the mission to influence the town and its residents toward environmental sustainability and to analyze municipal energy for lowering energy costs and saving taxpayer money.

In order to reach these goals, the Commission:

- Conducted a series of in-house audits of the police and fire stations and the library. A report for each building was developed and suggestions to improve energy efficiency were offered to department heads.
- Developed a Sub-Committee, chaired by John McCracken, for a Community Garden which was open to the public during the summer months.
- Contributed monthly articles for the Rindge Connection.
- Participated in grant workshops in Concord and Antioch College - Members were extremely active in many workshops and webinars throughout the region.
- Developed an Anti-Idling Policy which was accepted by the Town.

By far the most aggressive activity of the Energy Commission was the grant process for EECBG funds which netted the Town the following grants:

- Professional Grade Audits for 6 Town buildings - \$13,750
- Streetlight Conversions - \$22,323
- Upgrades to the Police Station - \$5,008



Fire Department

The Rindge Fire Department responded to a total of 667 emergency and non-emergency calls for assistance. Fire related incidents accounted for 335 calls. EMS related incidents accounted for 332 calls. Southwestern District Fire Mutual Aid listed the Rindge Fire Department as one of the busiest fire departments and one of the busiest rescues in its 78-town (93 Agencies) mutual aid district. The department has seen a decrease in call volume over 2010. This decrease can be attributed to the working relationship between Franklin Pierce University and the Rindge Fire Department, as well as the fire department's Public Fire Prevention Programs.

The Rindge Fire Department operates with 3 full-time employees. Two of the full-time positions are shared with the Building Department and Emergency Management, which is a benefit to the town for many reasons: financial aspects, continuity of building/fire and life safety codes, and the ability for multi-tasking between departments are just a few examples. The third position is filled by a full-time FF/EMT-I. The department operates from 6 am to 6 pm with the full-time members and utilizes call members as needed. From 6 pm to 6 am the department operates with 33 call members along with 6 Franklin Pierce EMS members and 25 Franklin Pierce Fire Company members, which operate as a fire company within the Rindge Fire Department.

The fire department will continue to focus on building its call membership during 2011. This is a very important task for many reasons, which include firefighter and public safety, helping with the town's tax rate, etc. Without these dedicated individuals we would have to hire full-time employees to respond to emergency calls in order to preserve the safety of the town. These members are paid per call instead of manning the station. All members carry pagers that are activated by Keene Mutual Aid Dispatch when there is a call for emergency assistance. This allows the members to carry out their normal daily activities and respond as needed. The department is set up with 4 rotating duty crews who handle the lower priority EMS and fire calls. Each crew is on stand by 1 night per week and 1 weekend per month. In the event of a high priority call, all available members respond. Many new people who move to rural areas do not know that we don't have a full-time fire department and rely on the citizens to work as a community. If you are interested in making a difference, please contact the Director of Public and Life Safety for more details.

In the upcoming year, the department will continue to apply for grants and improve its efficiency and quality of service. We will also continue the following:

- Continue to provide quality, professional and efficient service
- Increase the department membership to capacity (35 Members)
- Increase public relations
- Continue to provide Fire Prevention and Education Programs
- Provide community CPR and First Aid Programs
- Continue to provide free Home Fire Safety Programs
- Develop training programs that will help the members be prepared for almost any emergency situation
- Develop preplans for every street and road in the town along with water supply plans
- Increase the available dry hydrants within the town

In closing, the Rindge Fire Department continues to seek new membership. Our membership is dwindling, our call volume is increasing. These are busy times for us all. Many of us have second part-time jobs; in most families, both parents work. Nationwide volunteerism is on the decline, Rindge is no exception. Please understand that we are not yet in crisis, we have sufficient personnel to meet our obligations, we are covering our calls... for now. About eight years ago a letter like this went out and five of you answered our call and joined the Department. Of the five, all five remain active. We thank all five for whatever time and commitment they are able to give.

We are your neighbors, we have jobs, and we have families just like you. We are the men and women of the Rindge Fire Department; we are volunteers and we need your help! Please hear us! Come and join! Join us and you will become a part of our proud 86 year tradition of neighbor helping neighbor, a shining example of all that is good and right about our small town. We need your time, your commitment and your sweat. In return we will

provide the equipment and the training... and the opportunity to be a part of our tradition. Share our pride, the excitement and the satisfaction of helping others in their time of need.

We are no longer just about fighting fires. Happily, fires are on the decline. Rescue calls are not. Nearly half of our calls are EMS, a mixture of trauma and medical. We need firefighters and we need people for EMS. Some of us on the Department are firefighters; some are in EMS, some do both. Not everybody wants to run into a burning building, not everybody can stand the sight of blood. We understand this. We welcome any and all that would like to try to help with any part of this job. We need people at night and we need people for days. If you are home days, and have children and only can respond when they are in school... we need your help too!

The members of the department are a proud group of individuals who are dedicated in their mission to preserving the safety of the citizens and to provide services or assistance whenever called upon day or night. The Rindge Fire Department maintains minimum training and certification levels for all emergency responders in accordance with the National Fire Protection Association's recommendations and National Registry of EMT's requirements. All members are required to participate in mandatory training, infectious disease training and monitoring, and mandatory random drug testing.

Apparatus Brief

The Rindge Fire Department has an on-going vehicle maintenance program in an effort to keep all emergency apparatus in a constant state of readiness. The maintenance program tasks include weekly in-house vehicle and equipment inspections; in-house fluid, filter, lubrication and oil changes, as well as pump and ladder maintenance; and lastly, major repairs performed by outside contractors. The cost of preventative maintenance is far less than the purchase of new apparatus. In our long-term planning, we have scheduled vehicle replacements based on the National Fire Protection Association's recommendations of a 20-year lifespan on fire apparatus. With current apparatus and future growth, this 20-year cycle will keep the Rindge Fire Department a modern and progressive organization.

In an effort to keep all equipment in a state of readiness, the Rindge Fire Department maintains and tests all department equipment throughout the year. Generators, portable pumps, chain saws, vent fans, and automatic defibrillators are tested bi-weekly. Ground ladders and apparatus pumps are tested by an independent test company on an annual basis. All Self Contained Breathing Apparatus are cleaned and tested weekly, in addition to being serviced by the manufacturer annually.

In 2010 Engine 2 was on the Warrant for replacement and failed to pass by the voters. The Board of Selectmen decided to spend roughly \$16,000 in pump repairs, radiator replacement and exhaust system replacement. This expenditure only addressed critical repairs; the vehicle has many other needed items to be repaired. It is the recommendation of the fire department to follow NFPA Standards and replace this 22 year old engine. This engine will appear on the 2012 Warrant for replacement.

Fire Prevention and Education

The Rindge Fire Department continues its Fire Prevention and Education Programs in the schools and other public and private events. The Rindge Fire Department continues to offer Fire Safety Programs, Fire Extinguisher and Prevention Programs, and CPR and First Aid to local businesses for their employees. The Rindge Fire Department also offers free Home Fire Safety Inspections to the residents of Rindge and continues to perform mandated inspections at businesses and multi-family dwellings located in town. The Rindge Fire Department maintains an open door policy for the citizens to visit the station during business hours to check out the equipment and apparatus the town owns. This is also a great time to see what is available and the importance of different equipment used in the fire service. Fire prevention materials are also available at the fire station.

The Rindge Fire Department is in the process of scheduling CPR, AED and First Aid classes to be offered to the general public in 2011. There will be 2 classes in the Spring and 2 classes in the Fall.

As a part of the Rindge Fire Department's "FREE Home Fire Safety Inspection" program, we still have FREE smoke detectors available to any homeowner. Contact the Fire Chief's Office at 899-3324 for more information.

Under NH State Fire Code and State Statutes, all businesses and residential rental units are subject to annual life

safety inspections. The Town of Rindge currently inspects 14 Businesses twice annually, 162 Businesses in 89 buildings annually, 15 Multi-Family Units annually, 54 Residential Rental Units annually and 10 Town and State Buildings annually. All single-family dwelling units or rental rooms within a dwelling used as rental units are subject to annual inspections under the State Fire Code.

Forest Warden & State Forest Ranger

Your local Forest Fire Warden Rickard Donovan, Rindge Fire Department, and the State of New Hampshire Division of Forests & Lands, work collaboratively to reduce the risk and frequency of wildland fires in New Hampshire. To help us assist you, please contact your local Forest Fire Warden or Fire Department at 899-3324 to determine if a permit is required before doing ANY outside burning. Under State law (RSA 227-L:17) a fire permit is required for all outside burning, unless the ground is completely covered with snow. The New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services also prohibits the open burning of household waste. Citizens are encouraged to contact the Rindge Fire Department or DES at 1-800-498-6868 or www.des.state.nh.us for more information. Safe open burning requires diligence and responsibility. Help us to protect New Hampshire's forest resources. For more information please contact the Division of Forests & Lands at (603) 271-2214, or online at www.nhdfl.org.

This past fire season had a slightly lower number of fires, as well as lower number of acres burned than the 5 year average. What made this fire season somewhat unusual was that it lasted most of the summer. New Hampshire typically has a fairly active spring fire season and then the summer rains tend to dampen fire activity later in the season. This year virtually all areas of the state had fires throughout the summer due to the periodic dry spells throughout the season. As has been the case over the last few years, state budget constraints have limited the staffing of our statewide system of 16 fire lookout towers to Class III or higher fire danger days. Despite the reduction in the number of days staffed, our fire lookouts are credited with keeping most fires small and saving several structures due to their quick and accurate spotting capabilities. The towers fire spotting was supplemented by contracted aircraft and the NH Civil Air Patrol when the fire danger was especially high. The largest fire for the season was a 10.3 acre fire in Charlestown. Many homes in New Hampshire are located in the wildland urban interface, which is the area where homes and flammable wildland fuels intermix. Several of the fires during the 2010 season threatened structures, a constant reminder that forest fires burn more than just trees. Homeowners should take measures to prevent a wildland fire from spreading to their home. Precautions include keeping your roof and gutters clear of leaves and pine needles, and maintaining adequate green space around your home free of flammable materials. Permits will only be issued after the state "Daily Fire Danger Class" announcement at 3 PM Monday thru Thursday at the Fire Department or Town Offices and after 3 PM on Friday, at the Fire Department. Weekend permits will be issued after 3 PM on Friday. You can obtain a Burn Permit on the day you plan to burn at:

FIRE STATION

Mon – Fri 3 PM – 6 PM

TOWN OFFICES

Mon. – Thurs. 3 PM – 4 PM

There will be no permits issued on Saturday, Sunday or Holidays so plan ahead if you plan to burn on these days.


NOTE

- You must obtain a Burn Permit for all outside fires
- You must notify the on-duty Warden of a burn when there is snow cover
- If we are out of the station or office during the scheduled time frame, please wait or call later, we may be on an emergency call or an inspection.
- Please DON'T call the Warden or Deputy Wardens at home. Call the cell phone.
- Please allow time for the Warden or Deputy Warden to call back after calling them. They could be on an emergency call or busy at that time, but will call you as soon as possible.
- It is the responsibility of seasonal permit holders to check the Danger Fire Class.
- It is illegal to burn household trash, treated wood, logs bigger than 5", etc. Please contact Warden or Deputy Warden if what you are burning is questionable. Only clean wood can be burned.

If you ignite a fire without a permit, the Ridge Fire Dept. will extinguish it at the owner's or responsible party's expense.

Meetinghouse Oversight Committee

This Second Rindge Meetinghouse was built in 1796. It was an outgrowth of a time when Proprietors of the Town were responsible for the encouragement of religion and when church and state were intertwined. Until 1819, regardless of denomination and belief, residents were considered members of this parish and their tax money supported the minister. In 1839 the Town became the owner of this edifice and the church society its tenant, an arrangement which remains today. This building of simple colonial architecture still embraces some of the religious and civil affairs of this community and stands as a monument to pure democracy. It has served the Town of Rindge and the First Congregational Church and Society for 215 years and is listed in the National Register of Historic Places.

Over the past 25 years this grand old Meetinghouse has benefited greatly from the generosity of the Ralph E. and Gertrude B. Ward Trust Fund. The Wards were very active in civic and community affairs and were devoted members of the First Congregational Church and Society located in the Meetinghouse. In his last years, after Mrs. Ward had passed away, Mr. Ward began to think about what he might do to benefit the Town and Church that was such a big part of their lives and which they both so loved. They had no direct heirs. With the counsel of Attorney David Tower, a respected member of our Town, it was decided that a trust fund would be established to help with the on-going care and preservation of this historic building. In so doing, the Ward Trust Fund would benefit all who cherish and use the Meetinghouse.

The Ralph B. and Gertrude E. Trust Fund was endowed in 1985. Over twenty-six years, it has grown and now provides an annual income of about \$20,000 which is made available for the care and preservation of the Meetinghouse. A committee of three trustees with representation from the Town of Rindge, the First Congregational Church and Society, and the Rindge Historical Society oversee the Ward Trust Fund.

The Ward Trust Fund shares with the Town and the Church expenses for major projects such as the 1999-2001 renovations which included a new roof, exterior painting, and fire suppression system. The Ward Trust Fund also provides total funding for many projects which in recent years have included -

- insulation to the attic
- a new floor and railing in the 3rd floor attic
- two lamp posts on the side parking area that match those on the common
- insulation and repairs to the foundation walls and sills
- repair and cleaning of the stage curtain

Improvements completed in 2010, and also funded by the Ward Trust Fund, included -

- a new energy efficient heating system
- painting and new lighting for the main entrance areas

A handsome brass plaque in the meeting room denotes that the Ralph B. and Gertrude E. Ward Trust Fund was established in 1985 for the care and preservation of this historic Meetinghouse. It is very appropriate that Rindge citizens recognize and appreciate all that has been done on our behalf for the Meetinghouse. And perhaps some will be inspired to establish similar trusts which provide a legacy for generations to share and appreciate.

Funding for Energy Audits of all Town buildings was secured in 2010 by the Rindge Energy Committee. An energy audit of the Meetinghouse will be conducted in 2011 and will provide valuable recommendations for on-going improvements.



Meetinghouse Oversight Committee

The Meetinghouse Oversight Committee continues to analyze its needs and to make recommendations for long-term capital improvements, including bell tower repairs, exterior painting, and windows and doors. Information and cost estimates were provided to the Capital Improvement Program Committee (CIP) for future planning and budgeting. There is a warrant article in the 2011 warrant to set \$25,000 aside for these purposes.




Personnel Committee

Planning Board

Economic Development in Rindge has been the major focus of the Planning Department and the Master Planning Subcommittee. In the Fall of 2001, the 2020 Project brought hundreds of Rindge residents together for a series of forums to discuss their hopes and concerns for Rindge as it entered the 21st Century. In 2010, at the halfway point in the Town's journey toward 2020, the Planning Board, the Master Plan Subcommittee and the Economic Development Committee, with the endorsement of the Board of Selectmen, began the Rindge Economic Development Initiative (REDI). REDI signals the rejuvenation of the Rindge 2020 Project. Several community forums and an economic development survey sent to every household and business (with an unprecedented 30% return!) in Rindge produced a vision for the Town which will guide its economic development planning. The overwhelming consensus was that people wanted a town that provided a good life and services for all its citizens while preserving its heritage and traditional rural character.

The Master Plan Subcommittee, with consulting services provided by Hawk Planning Resources and the Arnett Development Group, is developing a comprehensive economic development plan. This plan will continue to have strong input from the community and will contain concrete action steps which can be implemented, reviewed and updated over time.

Construction began on the Payson Village Senior Housing project as well as on the Tractor Supply Shopping Plaza. Both projects have employed local contractors and are proceeding at a brisk pace. Payson Village is scheduled to open in early spring.

The Zoning Subcommittee developed a number of amendments to the Zoning Ordinance which will appear on the Ballot in March. These included: (1) a provision permitting churches and places of religious assembly in every zoning district in Rindge; (2) the creation of the use category "Motor Vehicle Repair Shop"; (3) the creation of a new Conditional Use Permit; (4) an extension of the Gateway Central Zoning District; (5) a change to the Sign Ordinance making the process of maintaining and repairing signs less cumbersome.

The Wireless Telecommunications Subcommittee completed its work to revise and update the Rindge Telecommunications Facilities Ordinance to reflect current technology and streamline the telecommunications facilities permitting process. A Warrant Article will appear on the Ballot in March.

The Subdivision/Site Plan Review/PURD Subcommittee continued its work to update and streamline the Town's Subdivision Regulations.

Agriculture This year marked the beginning of an initiative to actively encourage Agriculture in Rindge. A series of free workshops organized by the Planning Department and presented by the University of New Hampshire Cooperative Extension Service were held that covered such topics as Invasive Species, Pest Control, Canning, and Composting. This was also the inaugural year of the Rindge Farmers Market held on the West Rindge Common.

During Calendar Year 2010, the Planning Board reviewed 5 applications and conducted 8 informal consultations.

These applications included:

- 1 Minor Site Plan
- 1 Minor Subdivision
- 3 Technical Subdivisions

The Planning Department continues to be actively involved in the work of the Roadway Committee, the Economic Development Committee, the Senior Housing Committee, the TIF Committee, Telecommunications Committee, Agriculture Committee and the Town/Gown Committee. Impact Fees of approximately \$29,000 were collected in 2010.

Mike Quinlan and Dave Tower joined the Planning Board as Members this year and April Hobart, Art Fiorelli and Jed Paquin joined the Board as Alternate Members.

In 2010, the Planning Board mourned the passing of Alternates Rick Godin and Chris Asaff.

Police Department



The year 2010, again brought many challenges to the Rindge Police Department with another officer leaving to accept a higher paying job with New Hampshire Liquor Enforcement. This year we also have one of our part-timers deployed to Iraq for a year leaving us short on the ability to cover shifts. The good news again is that one of our part-time officers stepped up and took the vacant full-time position. The turn over rates have been climbing again over the last few years because of how low we pay officers here in Rindge. This poses a financial burden on the community by continually having to replace officers and to deliver services and respond to calls for service with an aging fleet of cruisers and default budgets which have not been adequate enough to maintain vehicles and services.

It is only with the dedication of the remaining officers of the Rindge Police Department that the community has felt little or no impact on the professional service we provide. This however can only continue for so long before the community as a whole feels it or an individual feels it in their time of need. The continuation of default budgets place citizens and police officers in jeopardy by not having proper equipment or highly experienced officers to deal with serious situations that arise on a daily bases.

This past year we all have seen an increase in serious crimes here in Rindge with two bank robberies and a violent armed robbery that started out in Fitchburg, Massachusetts and came through Rindge placing several officers in danger and ended up back in Fitchburg in a shoot out with the suspect being killed and several officers being injured. My fear is that if we continue to receive default budgets year in and year out the safety of the officers and members of the community will be compromised and someone will get severely injured.

Operations

In 2010, the police department handled 1,922 offenses, while filing 554 criminal investigation reports. There were 369 misdemeanor arrests, 70 felony arrests and 40 juvenile cases handled this year. These arrests ranged from motor vehicle violations to major criminal arrests, which resulted in cases referred for prosecution. General calls for service in 2010 amounted to 9240.

The Rindge Prosecutor's office this year handled 265 arraignments, 191 trials, 13 Administrative License suspension hearings in Concord, 262 other related hearings which accounted for 731 court appearances this year.

In 2010, the department handled the following motor vehicle related incidents; 40 DWI Arrests, 131 reportable

accidents, issued 1409 warnings and issued 376 summonses.

Our Animal Control Officer handled over 656 animal complaints throughout the year.


In 2010 the Rindge Police Department applied for and received approximately \$18,000 in federal and state grants.

Public Works Department

The Rindge Department of Public Works strives to give the citizens of Rindge quality roads. Assessing the condition of and maintaining the town roads are our main priorities. The Town of Rindge maintains sixty-four miles of roads.

The Department was asked to develop a 5-year Road Plan by the Board of Selectmen. This plan is a fact-based foundation/profile of Rindge roads to develop a thoughtful ongoing strategy for road construction and maintenance and to expand this strategy into a longer range plan. The Board of Selectmen accepted this plan but unfortunately hard economic times has somewhat hindered the full fruition of this plan. The plan does give a solid direction for sections, evaluation of roads and year's sections need attention using the Hub and Spoke Paradigm. We also coupled this plan with funding a gravel road maintenance line item and purchased a calcium spreader tank. Our other Fall projects consist of preparing the Town trucks and equipment for the Winter months, raking leaves, preparing the Town parks for Winter, draining the water lines and winterizing bathrooms at Wellington Park, re-grading the gravel roads, and patching potholes.

The Winter months keep us very busy. Obviously, our main challenge is keeping the roads clear of snow and ice. This can be very challenging and tiring at times. It is not unusual for our crew to work 24-30 hours during major storms. We spend many sleepless nights to give the citizens of Rindge safe roads. We have very dedicated crew members that really care about their jobs and take a lot of pride in their work. I would like to personally thank them for their dedication and many hours of work put in during the Winter.

The Spring months keep us busy cleaning up from Winter and preparing for Summer. Projects in the Spring consist of: placing gravel on the dirt roads during mud season, patching potholes, raking the rest of leaves from the Fall, opening the cemeteries, maintaining lawns, cutting brush and trees in preparation for Summer projects, repairing damages to property and road signs from Winter plowing, and preparing and advertising bids for the major Summer projects.

The major Public Works projects are performed in the Summer. These consist of: replacing drainage pipes, reclaiming roads in preparation for paving, grading dirt roads and placing liquid calcium chloride for gravel stabilization and dust control, maintaining the Town Common, Parks, Cemeteries, and the Town Office lawn, preparing Wellington Park fields for Summer Recreation, and roadside mowing.

Highway Projects

- Paved Lord Brook Rd, Rand Rd and Goddard Rd
- Shimmed Forristall Rd
- Continued major ditching on several roads
- Replaced several drainage culverts
- Did 150' under drain on Middle Winchendon Rd.
- Applied some gravel on several gravel roads

Transfer Station

The Transfer Station and Swap Shop use continues to grow every year. We would like to thank the volunteers for all their personal time in organizing and staffing the Swap Shop. Without their help, the Swap Shop would not be the success that it is today. Household Hazardous Waste Day also continues to be a big success. Although it has taken a new direction due to the lack of grant funding for smaller municipalities. We have partnered with the City of Keene in their Household Hazardous Waste Days in the Spring and Fall.

The Recycling Program has recycled 358.56 tons in 2010; in 2009 we recycled 354.33 tons to the City of Keene. This is a difference of 4.23 ton. Disposal of Demo/Household waste to the Town of Bethlehem in 2010 was 813.53 tons, and in 2009 was 777.21 tons. This is a difference of 36.32 ton. We would like to thank the citizens

of Rindge for their conscious effort in reducing the amount of waste brought to the landfill and the increase for recyclables. Keep up the good work.

Building Maintenance

The full-time Maintenance Technician has worked hard all year at keeping up the buildings and repairing major safety and building issues. This has saved the town in having to hire out these projects to contractors. He is also responsible for winter plowing and sidewalks for all of the public buildings.

The Crew and I wish to thank the citizens of Rindge and other departments and boards for their cooperation and assistance during the past year. I especially wish to thank our Board of Selectmen and Town Administrator for all their guidance and assistance throughout the year.

Recreation Department

2010 was a very exciting year for the Recreation Department. Our goal was to bring back some of the old favorite programs as well as add some new high quality ones. Starting the position of Recreation Director in February was very exciting as this gave me time to get the department up and running before spring sports got into full swing. I was able to meet many Rindge residents and listened to what they would like to see the Recreation Department do for programming. In my second week I got to meet with the Recreation Committee. We discussed what had happened in the past and then we got right to work on planning Indoor Soccer, the Easter Egg Hunt, and Babe Ruth Softball. Needless to say the staff at the Recreation Department has been busy from the get go and we have not stopped since.

Prior to my arrival the Recreation Department was run by interim Recreation Director/Town Administrator Carlotta Pini. Carlotta did a wonderful job using the resources she had to keep some of the regular programs going. This included Senior Coffee, Weight Watchers, the Afterschool Program and all of the Youth Sports. Under Pini we had three staff members and one college intern working at the RRD. Ethan Perry, our sports coordinator, worked hard to keep basketball and soccer afloat, as well as day- to- day operations of the department. Maggie Doyle and Kathleen Silvia ran the Afterschool Program and any special events we offered. Carlotta also utilized many volunteers and Recreation Committee members to assist in the daily operation of the RRD. I personally want to thank all of these people for the many hours they gave to keep things afloat.

Programs

The Recreation Department's goal for 2010 was to offer something for everyone during each season. Some highlights in our program were:

- **Instructional Softball** - This year we had a record number of Instructional participants. We were able to turn this program into four all-girl teams.
- **Zumba**- This highly active exercise program has turned out to be a huge success. We saw 328 participants in the 2010 season. We hope this program continues to grow in 2011.
- **Babe Ruth Softball** – We had three teams of girls, ages 8-12. The Under 12 girls All-Star team made it all the way to the Babe Ruth World Series. Congratulations to all of the girls who participated.
- **Lunch Mobile** – Each month we seek out great eating establishment in NH, VT, and Northern MA. So far we have been to places like Lindy's diner in Keene, The Red Arrow Diner in Manchester, Bradford Junction, Joey's Diner and others. To date we have had 64 participants in this program.
- **Wellington Summer Camp** – The Wellington Summer Camp was a huge success this past summer. Participants came Monday through Friday to Wellington Park for some great adventures. Games, arts & crafts, swimming, group time and much more were enjoyed by all.
- **Summer Teen Days** – This new program was designed for the child who is too old to be in a summer day camp setting but not old enough to be home alone. The participants have set days where they must participate in order to go on the Fun Days. Monday is Community Service Day. On this day participants painted the concession stand and dugouts at Wellington Park, spread safety surfacing at the playground, and worked at Cathedral of the Pines. Fun days included trips to Outdoor Laser Tag and Six Flags New England. On the Wednesday of the program we had Good Choices day. Participants visited the Cheshire County Jail, learned about farming, visited colleges and Conant High School. We had 12 participants in this program. All parents stated this program was a huge success. We hope it continues for years to come.
- **After School Program (ASP)** - When I arrived last winter the ASP was being run by Maggie Doyle and Kathleen Silvia. The program has been in existence since 2007 and is a great resource to working parents. When school went back in session we decided to change the focus of the ASP to be an environment where health and exercise played a large role in the program. We were fortunate to receive a grant for the ASP program where we received \$2500 in materials and training to run the Coordinated Approach To Children's Health (CATCH) program. ASP leader Josh Lapinsky was hired to run this program. Since our re-focus on the

ASP program we have had a great increase in enrollment and activity. In October we hired Sierra Knight to assist Josh since our enrollment increase has required additional staff.

The RRD also offered a wide variety of trips for all ages, cooking classes, and a martial arts program.

Special Events

The RRD offers a large variety of special events throughout the year. Highlights of these events are:

- **Easter Egg Hunt** – 105 participants, pictures with the Easter Bunny and a whole lot of fun
- **Concert on the Common** – “Lunch at the Dump” performed on a beautiful July night for us. We had over 100 people come out of this. It is our plan to have at least three concerts in the summer of 2011.
- **5K Road Race** – Over 70 racers participated. All were very happy to see this event return.
- **Halloween Festivities** – Despite the weather we had a lot of people come out to do Tailgate Trunk or Treating, the Trail of Terror, and fortune telling at Wellington Park.
- **Tree Lighting/Breakfast with Santa** – We saw a great turnout for both of these events. It was great to see Santa back in the meetinghouse steeple, fireworks, and real pancakes at Breakfast with Santa. At both of these events we had close to 300 people.
- **Senior Holiday Dinner** – This year was a year to remember. The event was held at Hidden Hills and we served 200 meals to Rindge's Seniors at no cost to them. We want to be sure to thank the Hidden Hills/Four Star Catering Staff for their amazing work on the event. We also want to thank the Chamber of Commerce, Women's Club, and the RAMS for making this such a great event.

In 2010 the Recreation Committee held a Master Planning session to discuss what we would like the future of the Recreation Department to be. This session was moderated by Planning Director Jane Pitt. In this session participants were asked to brainstorm what they would like to see at the Recreation Department in years to come if money were not an issue. Some of the things that were brought out in this meeting were more field space including a rectangular multi-purpose field for both youth and adult sports, broaden programming to include both kids and adults, more certification programs (i.e. CPR, Hunter Safety), and options for teen programming. We also discussed finding an area for a town beach. Rindge has so many beautiful bodies of water and it would be great for the whole town to be able to utilize this water by having a town beach.

Recreation Committee

The Recreation Committee was hard at work this year getting their by-laws established, working on master planning, and all of the other events and facets they work on throughout the year. Tom Ciglar was the acting Committee Chair until September of 2010. In his time as Chair Tom worked on the Recreation Director hiring committee, as well as teaching baking classes and opening the building up when others were not available to do so. I want to thank Tom for his service as chair. Our new Recreation Committee Chair is Mike Dipasquale. The Recreation Committee meets the first Monday of each month at 5:30pm. Meetings are held at the Rindge Community Center at Wellington Park and are open to the public.

Facilities

Wellington Park is a huge asset to the town of Rindge. We currently have two tennis courts, a picnic pavilion, playground, large softball field, a smaller T-ball field, basketball courts, Community Center and Concession Stand. There are also some great walking trails that folks can take from the Wellington Park parking lot. In 2010 we painted the concession stand to match the color of the Rindge Community Center. We are in the process of slowly upgrading and maintaining the playground area. In 2010 we purchased new swings and installed safety surfacing. We also aerated the field for the first time in many years. This helps to keep the grass green, and makes the playing area stay level. I want to thank the Department of Public works (DPW) for all of their hard work in keeping the fields mowed and trash and litter picked up. Many of us don't realize how much the DPW does for the Recreation Department. Much of their work happens long before the Recreation Department is open. In summary it was an amazing first year for me as the new Recreation Director. I have met a lot of amazing

residents, staff and volunteers along the way. I want to take this time to thank the many volunteers, whether it be coaching, helping out with a special event or helping in the office, you are what makes this department run as smoothly as it does.

Lastly, I want to thank the small staff of the Recreation Department for all that they do. All of you work very hard to make the many programs and facilities we have run so well. The Recreation Department is a very busy year-round operation and we would not be able to do it without all of your passion and hard work.

In March the Board of Selectmen and Southwestern Community Services signed two agreements ie; the land and water leases.


Site work began in May and construction of the project began early June with a ground breaking ceremony on June 30th.

Telecommunications Committee

The Rindge Telecommunications Committee has had a very busy year. One of the biggest problems in Rindge has been the lack of broad based access to high speed internet. We still have Rindge citizens on dial-up who cannot avail themselves of many of the services available on the net from streaming video, to VOIP telephone and the ability to "work from home" using company intranets. This is an impediment to home sales, home based and commercial business development. The Internet has gone from a "nice to have" service to a necessity.

However, this past year has seen some major improvements with the addition of Fairpoint DSL which covers much, but not all of the town. Speeds are dependent on the distance to Fairpoint's central office or sub-stations. We will be talking with Fairpoint on how to add service to more of the town. Radius North and Granite Connection continue to add users to their wireless customer base but service is limited by topography. Argent has been working on their cable TV and internet system making continued improvements to infrastructure. We need now to work with Argent to establish a plan to expand service to more of the town and possibly offer more service such as internet telephone in addition to cable and internet access

A quantum leap in Internet availability is on the horizon. NH FastRoads, funded by a number of grants, is a plan to bring Internet access using fiber optic networks to Rindge and surrounding communities. We are delighted to report that Rindge is one of two New Hampshire towns selected to have residents in a selected part of town wired to this fiber optic network. Quoting from the Fast roads website "FastRoads will take on the initial cost of infrastructure and let any service provider use the FastRoads network to sell services directly to their existing customers. Providers will also be able to sell fiber-delivered services to a greatly expanded market of new customers. FastRoads wants to help New Hampshire providers grow and prosper. Using the FastRoads network, any service provider can provide a range of next-gen broadband services which were previously too costly to deliver." www.newhampshirefastroads.net The FastRoads program is beginning its design work and hopes to be stringing cable in the next twelve months.

At this time, only a portion of the Southwest corner of town will be wired to the FastRoads network when installed. It is the committee's desire to find ways to fund a broader base of customers for the Fiber network looking at state, federal and other grants.

We still are waiting for a decision from Google on their high speed network grant. Google's decision has been delayed but their website says a decision will be made by the end of the year. If we were to be selected by Google, it would mean the whole town would be wired with fiber.

In 2011, the committee will continue its work on improving access to the cable TV and the Internet and invites anyone interested to attend our meetings. People applying for assistance must have used up all available resources to them including savings and retirement monies before assistance will be granted. For many people around the country, this is the reality we are facing.


