REPORT OF PROGRESS by your Selectmen

Once again it is time to report to you of the financial status of your Town, and what your various Town Officials have and have not accomplished during the past year. We have tried to make this report as brief and understandable as possible.

Your Selectmen have carried out the mandates of your last Town meeting in the following projects:

The committee appointed to build a Town Barn has accomplished their project in a very efficient and satisfactory manner; the building has been completed, with the exception of a floor, and all highway equipment has been removed from the Fire Station Shed and is now in the new barn.

The two-way radio has been installed in the Fire Truck, with very good results, working exceptionally well in any part of the Town where it has been tried.

A new suspended type oil-fired forced hot air heating unit, approved by the Board of Underwriters, has been installed in the Fire Station. It functions much more satisfactorily than the oil burning stove which has been in use there and we hope that it will be more economical to operate.

The T.R.A. project on the Shedd Hill Road has been carried out as voted. While the available money was not sufficient to complete the entire length of this road, a large part of it has been completed and it is a very good type of gravel road. We hope to be able to have this black-topped next year, if money is made available.

Some of the other things your Selectmen have accomplished this year include:

Purchased a set of aerial photos of the Town. We think that these photos are quite valuable for a number of reasons, not only to the Selectmen but to the citizens as well. We hope eventually to make these into property maps to be used in assessing property, but before this is fully accomplished it will require a great amount of work. We believe in order to obtain full benefit from these maps it will be necessary to have them mounted. They may then be worked upon by the Selectmen and put on display, so that anyone wishing to may examine them. Therefore we are asking for an appropriation for this purpose this year.

We have perambulated all the Town Lines that were due or past due for perambulation, and renewed the bounds with aluminum stakes, which we feel will last longer than the wooden stakes which have been used in the past. Some of these bounds had not been renewed since 1931, even though legally required every seven years.

We have hired some clerical help this year to bring the copying in the invoice book up to date. We are glad to report that this is now current.

Due to lack of funds, we have not been able to complete the water hole at the Center Village this year. However, we will ask for an appropriation for this purpose this year and trust that the job can be completed.

With all the new developments that are being carried out on the various lakes in town, we can see the need for more money to be made available for our roads. The cottage owners pay a substantial part of our taxes and are certainly entitled to some consideration from the Town.

Also, with all this development of Lake Shore property and building of cottages, we feel that it will be necessary, in the near future, to set up a new and more standard method of assessing all property as fairly as possible. This will require spending much more time in making the assessment each year. It will probably be necessary to increase the salaries of the assessing officials, when this has to be done.

We wish to thank the citizens for their help and cooperation. Our particular thanks go to the people who are making these Lake Shore developments for providing copies of the plans of these developments which they have so kindly furnished us. They are certainly a great help in making the assessments.

Another thing that would help us greatly - and might be of help to the property owner in case of emergency - would be to have these cottages owners have their names on their property where it could be seen. We thank you for cooperation.

TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stoddard in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Stoddard on Tuesday, the Eleventh day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) to be expended as follows: \$1,000.00 for the Center Pond Road, \$1,000.00 for Tar surface for Shedd Hill Road, and \$3,000.00 for general maintenance of all roads.
- 4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for snow removal for the ensuing year.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of two hundred eighty-five dollars and eighty-four cents (\$285.84) for T. R. A.
- 6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the general expenses of the highway department.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectme to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) for the fire department, to be spent as follows: \$1,000.00 for general maintenance, and \$1,000.00 to purchase hose and finish the space in the Fire Station formerly used for the storage of highway equipment.
- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$550.00) to be expended by the Selectmen for the mounting and display, in the Library, of aerial photographic maps of Stoddard, and start on the same, the development of a property tax map.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to accept the deed of Trevor Price to a parcel of land situated near the bridge at Mill Village, for a public landing.
- 11. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of public landings and beaches.
- 12. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to complete filling, grading and installing of necessary culverts at the water hole at Stoddard Center.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Sixty-Two Dollars (\$62.00) to advertise the Town, said money to be paid to the Monadnock Region Association, for this purpose.
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to accept the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act.
- 15. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lights.
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the division of Municipal Accounting and raise the money to cover the expense of such an audit.

- 17. To see if the Town will vote to request the State Tax Commission to make a complete reappraisal of land and buildings within the Town to equalize valuation in accordance with the law and raise money for this purpose.
- 18. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the maintenance of the Library.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Seventy Dollars (\$70.00) as its fair share of the operating costs of the Elliot Community Hospital.
- 20. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the necessary improvements of the Town Dump.
- 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to initiate a program of compensation insurance covering all employees while engaged in official duties, and to authorize the Selectmen to enter into the necessary agreements to implement the program.

This vote to remain in effect until rescinded by a future Town Meeting.

22. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

HIGHLAND LAKE Stoddard, New Hampshire

Highland Lake, or Long Pond as it is also known, was formed in the mid 1800's. Water from three ponds was dammed by the Hillsboro Knitting Mills, Contoocook Knitting Mills and the Stoddard Lumber Company. The result was a lake seven miles in length, part of which extends into the town of Washington.

At the time this picture was taken there were only two or three camps on the lake. Today there are between one hundred and fifty and two hundred. Two developments now in progress will increase that number substantially.

In addition to the variety of fish native to these waters, the State of New Hampshire stocked the lake with bass in 1957.



These photographs were taken by the late Charles H. Newell of Chelsea, Massachusetts. Mr. Newell, associated with the National Shawmut Bank in Boston, was a summer resident of Stoddard for many years. The photographs are from a collection presented to the Stoddard Library by the Newell family.





This photograph, taken in 1887 shows a boat owned and operated by the Stoddard Lumber Company. Originally intended to tow logs to the sluiceway, the boat provided transportation for lumber company personnel and also served for some pleasure trips. It was in operation until 1915. A large portion of the area shown here was destroyed by the great forest fire of 1941.



The Stoddard Lumber Company saw mill was located at the outlet at Island Pond. Here, pine, fir and spruce logs were carried to the mill, where they were "turned" into various types of handles and other wooden products. Building lath was an important byproduct.

- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and the Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors, and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.

- 8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriations of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriations, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

- 10. To see if the district will vote to enter into a contract with another school district to pay tuition in excess of the State average.

The A. H. Rice Company was prevailed upon during the past year to present to the school an old film strip projector. Now it is possible to draw upon the film library of over 600 copies which was purchased by the Supervisory Union a few years ago.

A great deal has been written in the past few months regarding the inadequacy of American education. Unfortunately, many of the accusations are true. Our system is filled with problems which lead to a very low degree of our potential efficiency. I do not believe that it is necessary to increase the quantity of educational opportunities but a great deal could be said about the quality of our offerings and the inability of our schools to motivate our pupils to higher achievement.

To meet the challenge successfully, the state, your community and your local forest fire warden need YOUR thoughtful and cooperative effort - The rules are simple:

- 1. Don't burn at home use your town dump and avoid all fire problems.
- 2. If you do burn, be sure to secure a written permit from your local forest fire warden when the ground is not covered with snow. Permits are required for open debris fires, home incinerators, outdoor fire places and camp fires. Your warden is instructed to permit burning if weather conditions, site and type of burning are safe.
- 3. Be sure that all lighted material cigars, cigarettes and matches - are completely out before discarding them. Use ash trays in automobiles
- 4. Make certain that your debris, camp and cook fires are completely out before leaving them.
- 5. Insist that others be careful and comply with burning requirements.
- 6. Call the warden promptly when fire is detected and aid him to extinguish it.
- **REMEMBER** the fire you prevent might be the one which could burn YOUR property.
