TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Tamworth, New Hampshire in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the town hall in said Tamworth, N. H., on Tuesday, the ninth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for repairing highways and plowing snow for the ensuing year. \$6,000. Approved.
- 4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for sanding roads. \$500. Approved.
- 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for repairing and building bridges. \$750. Approved.
- 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day observance. \$10. Approved.
- 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate in addition to the amount required by law for the support of the Town Library. \$250.
- 8. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- 9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for repair of road equipment and road maintainance and general highway. \$1,000. Approved.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000. for the support of the Tamworth Community Nurse. Approved.

- 11. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to distribute the inventory blanks at the time they examine and appraise taxable property.
- 12. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Tarvia. \$2,500. Approved.
- 13. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for upkeep and maintainance of the Tamworth Fire Precinct. \$500. Approved.
- 14. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for upkeep of the Wonalancet Fire Precinct. \$100. Approved.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$162.00 to the Lake Region Association for issuance and distribution of printed matter, newspaper and magazine advertising of the town calling attention to the resources and natural advantages in cooperation with other towns in the Lake Region. Not approved.
- 16. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate \$200.00 for white pine blister rust control to be spent in cooperation with the State Forestry and Recreation Department. Not approved.
- 17. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 to be divided equally among the three road agents for cutting bushes on road side. Approved.
- 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25.00 for the upkeep and care of shrubs and plants around the Town building. Approved.
- 19. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through tax collector's deeds.
- 20. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Laconia Hospital, North Conway Hospital, Huggins Hospital. \$100.00 to

Laconia Hospital. \$25.00 a piece for the other two. Approved.

- 21. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500.00 to provide for additional fire protection due to the war emergency. Approved.
- 22. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the use of the town health officer and board of health due to the war emergency. Approved.

A vote pased in accordance with any of the two suggestions above, we believe would be entirely legal and could not be questioned by a taxpayer.

- 23. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$125.00 for Firemen's Insurance, which is at the rate of \$3.00 per year for each member in good standing of the Firemen's Ass'n. This being in compliance with the Public Laws of the State of New Hampshire, Section IV chapter 146 Paragraph 16. Approved.
- 24. To see if the town will vote to buy two \$1,000.00 Government Bonds. Approved.
- 25. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for resurfacing Fort Hill so called in South Tamworth. Approved.
- 26. To choose a Selectman for three years; to choose a Town Clerk, Tax collector, Town treasurer, Highway agents, Auditors, and all other officers and agents for the ensuing year.
- 27. To see if the town will vote to keep the polls open until six of the clock in the afternoon.
- 28. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 to purchase a bronze or wooden tablet for the town men in the service, with their names printed thereon.
 - 29. To transact any other business that may come

before said meeting legally.

SECRETARY'S REPORT OF THE TAMWORTH COMMUNITY NURSE ASSOCIATION, INC.

In the difficulties and uncertainties of this past year our town is fortunate in having the same Nurse as last year. Miss Lang knows us well by now; we know and trust her. Quietly and steadily she is giving her skillful service to the townspeople, as they need her, and is watching over the health of our school children. We hope to retain her for the duration and longer, and one means to that end will be to employ her by the year.

This longer time would increase her usefulness as a teacher of Home Nursing, since summer is the favorable time for classes. The effort recommended by the Red Cross to cultivate nursing skills in every family means that we should use Miss Lang's visits as chances to learn, by observation and by questions, all that she is able to impart to us. During the last three months of this year Miss Lang conducted a class of women in Home Nursing, and nine of the ten originally enrolled received the appropriate Red Cross certificate.

The pre-school child health clinic of last spring was a successful because useful piece of public health work; when mothers made sure of thirty babies' conditions, and learned what should be watched or corrected.

Last summer's campaign for contributions from our summer residents made us again realize gratefully their generous attitude to the needs of the community in which they find their refreshing summer pleasures. Even better than in times of less demands they have stood by us.

Transportation restrictions have made it necessary for the Association to meet only every other month, and several members have resigned because of temporary absences. But consultation

by telephone gives Miss Lang our advice and backing as she goes about her work, diligently as may be seen from the statistics herewith presented.

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL NURSE

At the beginning of the school year September 1942, the school nurse tested the visions of 173 children and they were weighed and measured.

In November all pupils were given the yearly physical examination by Dr. Remick, and assisted by the nurse.

At that time all defects were noted, cards sent to the parents, and the records are kept in the various school rooms.

Follow up work has been done with most splendid cooperation from the parents.

Last year dental clinics were held in Dr. Pottle's office in Meredith with thirty-five (35) children receiving the dental certificates.

The nurse instructed a class in Home Nursing and Hygiene in the High School Building with ten (10) girls receiving the Red Cross Certificates. The cooperation of the school physician, superintendent of schools, members of the Community Nurse Association, Red Cross Motor Corps, board of education, teachers, and parents is deeply appreciated.

ARTICLE NINE OF WARRANT

The toilets at the Whittier School must be replaced this coming year. This involves an outlay of five hundred and fifty dollars. It is the unanimous opinion of the FINANCE COMMITTEE that the school building at Whittier does not warrant spending this amount of the taxpayer's money. Within a short period the building will need major repairs, and it does not seem wise, in times like these, to invest five hundred and fifty dollars in this type of building.

The closing of the Whittier School would result in a substantial annual saving of taxpayer's money. One teacher would be eliminated, the annual cleaning and minor repairs would be eliminated, the janitor fees would be saved, fuel would be saved, electricity would be saved, there would be some saving in supplies, textbooks and janitor's supplies.

In addition to the financial saving each year there are other things which should be considered. If the children were transported to a larger school there would be only four grades in one room instead of eight as there now are. There would be more pupils in a class and there would therefore be more competition. Competition makes for better spirit and would be welcomed by the pupils themselves. Supervision of schools would be easier for the superintendent and

the school board, and would therefore be more efficient. This change would improve the schools generally.

With America at war, this seems to be the time to make such a change if one is to be made. The government has asked the curtailment of unnecessary building and repairs. The matter of locating teachers is difficult now. The adoption of article nine would save the taxpayers money, it would provide better school conditions, and it would indirectly aid the war effort.

The cost of transportation this year would be just about offset by the cost of the new toilets, and in other years it would be considerably less than the annual saving.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board of Tamworth:

I herewith submit my second annual report which is the second in the series of such reports.

Organization of Union No. 36

The eight school districts of Brookfield, Effingham, Freedom, Madison, Middleton, Ossipee, Tamworth and Wakefield continue to comprise this supervisory union. The Union expense of administration borne by each district is as follows: Brookfield, 1.42%; Effingham, 8.41%; Freedom, 5.80%; Madison, 11.25%; Middleton, 3.80%; Ossipee, 32.70%; Tamworth, 19.08%; Wakefield, 17.54%. The above percentages are based on the pupil registration in the various towns as of January 31, 1942.

In the high school Miss Doris Trafton replaces Miss Ruby Whittemore who accepted a teaching position at Goffstown while Mr. Robert Morris continues as your able headmaster. The subjects taught by the teachers have been rearranged somewhat. We should all be proud of the achievement made in the high school this year. I know that the boys and girls who are members of the school join with us in this feeling. Few high schools of the size of Tamworth would be able to purchase an excellent movie projector such as the one owned by them. An honor was bestowed upon the school when it was invited as one of three schools in the state of New Hampshire to choose a representative to be present at the launching of a Liberty Ship at Portland, Maine.

It is gratifying that the interest shown by the boys and girls in prize speaking continues to exist.

Beside the usual cleaning and repairing done at the schools, there was built a janitor's supply room at the high school building in order that the janitor might have a place to store his supplies. The girls toilet was improved and the hallway was completely painted. The roof on this building was partially shingled.

Your school nurse and physician, Miss Minnie Lang and Dr. Edwin Remick, have done excellent work examining the boys and girls and carrying on the follow-up work which is so vital. I suggest that you refer to Miss Lang's report for a more detailed account of what was accomplished.

May I commend the janitors for the fine work which they are doing.

The fine work being done by the teachers and the cooperation which has been given me this past year by you is appreciated.
