TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Bennington in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in Bennington on Tuesday, the llth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

 $\ensuremath{\mathsf{1.}}$ To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

Additionally, pursuant to RSA 39:2-a and the vote of the Town at the March 4, 1975 Annual Meeting, you are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town on Thursday, the 13th day of March, 1986, at seven o'clock in the evening to act upon the following subjects:

- 2. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for highways and bridges.
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums of money as may be necessary in anticipation of taxes.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to transfer tax liens and convey property acquired by the Town by tax collector's deed by public auction (or advertised sealed bid) or in such other manner as determined by the Selectmen as justice may require.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to accept legacies and gifts to the Town in trust or otherwise by any individual or individuals, or take any other action relating thereto.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to transfer any balance in either the Fire Department appropriation or the Water/Sewer Department appropriation to a Capital Reserve Fund to be used towards the purchase of equipment or plant in the future.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate and authorize from the Federal Revenue Sharing Fund for use as setoffs against budget appropriations in the amount indicated; and, further to authorize the Selectmen to make pro-rata reductions in the amounts if estimated entitlements are reduced or take any other action hereon.

- 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for, negotiate for, contract for, accept and expend and to do all other things necessary to obtain such Federal, State or other assistance (financial or otherwise), or take any other action relating thereto.
- 9. To see if the Town of Bennington will vote to oppose the selection of any site in New Hampshire as a disposal site for the high level radioactive materials; authorize town officials to cooperate with state officials and others in opposition to said selection; and direct town officials to communicate the sentiment expressed in this article to the President of the United States, the United States Department of Energy, the New Hampshire Congressional Delegation and the Governor of the State of New Hampshire.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to increase the salary of the tax collector to \$1,500 and to raise and appropriate the additional sum of \$750 to put the article into effect.
- 11. To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate to purchase a new police cruiser. The sum of \$6,850 (net of deductible) is available from the proceeds of the insurance settlement related to the cruiser accident. The Selectmen intend to withdraw \$2,137.53 from the Capital Reserve Fund.
- 12. To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate to purchase a replacement four-wheel drive truck for the use by the road agent. It is anticipated that the sum of \$4,850 will be realized from the sale of the old truck which the Selectmen intend to apply towards the purchase price. The Selectmen intend to withdraw \$15,030 from the Capital Reserve Fund.
- 13. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,000 to replace the body of the Fire Dept.'s rescue vehicle. Also to authorize the withdrawal of the Capital Reserve Fund and application towards this appropriation of sufficient funds as may be required.
- 14. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and appropriate for a fire alarm system for the Town Hall in order to avoid the restriction of the use of the building to a maximum of 49 people.
- 15. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,100 to replace the back stage curtain in the town hall auditorium.

The Pierce School has offered to attempt to raise sufficient money to cover 1/2 of the cost of this project.

- 16. To raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,120 as Bennington's portion of the cost in order to maintain the Probation Officer attached to the Hillsboro District Court.
- 17. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 for little league uniforms. This would represent the second year of a two year commitment.
- 18. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$2,500 to paint the Town Barn. Also to see if the Town will transfer the appropriation made at the 1985 annual meeting for hookup of the municipal buildings to the new sewer system to this appropriation.

The municipal sewer hookups will now be funded by $\ensuremath{\mathsf{FmHA}}$ grant.

- 19. To see if the Town will vote to establish the Selectmen as the franchising authority subject to the provisions of RSA 53:C with authority to grant franchises for the installation and operation of cable television systems within the town and to establish fees and other conditions for such franchises and to exercise all other authority granted by RSA 53:C.
- 20. To see if the Town will adopt revised regulations covering the public use of the town beach at Lake Whittemore as printed elsewhere in the town report.
- 21. To see what sum the Town will raise and appropriate to pay the normal operating costs of the Town (as set forth in the Town Budget), or take any other action in relation thereto.
 - 22. To hear reports of Committees and act thereon.

To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

SELECTMEN'S REPORT

The major project of the year was the completion of the construction of the town's sewer collection and force main to Antrim. The project was completed in the fall and went quite well. Because there were no substantial cost overruns the Selectmen were able to incorporate into the project a few extensions of coverage. The town's cost, originally estimated at approximately \$125,000, will be covered by a bond issue in early 1986, guaranteed by the FmHA, in the amount of \$128,200 and at an interest rate of 6 5/8%. In addition, the state's share of the project was bonded in February of 1985 and the annual debt service cost of principle and interest will be reimbursed to the town each year by the state. The EPA reimbursements have mostly been received but the final reimbursement will be paid a year from the completion of the construction.

Homeowner hookups to the sewer connection began in the fall of 1985 and must be completed this coming spring. The hookups to the municipal buildings and to the Pierce School were covered by a FmHA grant and will also be completed in the spring.

On the whole, the Selectmen were quite pleased with the construction of the project and more than satisfied with the road resurfacing which was a part of that project. The town should not face any major projects for the immediate future.

TOWN HALL

Concerns for fire safety were raised at the time of the combination Pierce School Christmas entertainment and the recreation committee's Christmas party which crowded the town hall's capacity.

An inspection by the state fire marshall's office, requested by the fire chief, has made it obvious that physical changes plus the installation of a fire alarm system will be required if the town hall is to be used for future gatherings of any size. A warrant article to this effect will be presented to the voters for their decision.

TAX RATE

The Selectmen continue to be much aware of the increase and burden of real estate taxes. The major portion of the tax rate is of course for the support of the school system and we hope that Bennington and other small towns will receive the support of the voters at school meeting in seeking a revision of the formula allocating costs to the various towns. Such a revision could be of substantial benefit to towns such as Bennington, Antrim and Greenfield.

ONSET SUBDIVISION ROAD

The construction of the Onset subdivision road and connection with Route 47 is expected to be in construction this spring.

The town is still engaged in litigation on this subject and despite the "cheap shots" in the Peterborough Transcript on this subject your officials have acted in the best interests of the town. The Transcript apparently bases its stories on letters from Mr. Koson who, quite naturally, is trying to promote his own interests. The fact that your selectmen refuse to try this case in the newspapers doesn't prove we do not have a good case and good legal counsel. In any event, we believe the town's liability insurance will protect the town from any major loss.

POLICE CRUISER

The police cruiser was badly damaged recently when it skidded on ice and went off the road. The Selectmen and budget committee agreed that in view of the extent and type of damage it would be wiser to replace the vehicle than to repair it. The insurance company agrees and the vehicle has been considered totalled.

The police chief recommended, and the Selectmen and budget committee agreed, that a four wheel drive Jeep Cherokee would be a more suitable vehicle for the town's needs and will propose a warrant article to purchase same. It is estimated that such a vehicle, fully equipped, will cost approximately \$4,000 after insurance settlement and application of the accumulated capital reserve account. The Chief and Selectmen feel that an all road vehicle would be much more important than a high speed pursuit vehicle. The net cost after considering the final trade-in value is expected to be no more, and probably less, than the purchase of a "state bid" cruiser.

MASTER PLAN

State legislation now requires that all towns have a master plan which will provide for the control of the desired future growth of the town. This is the responsibility of the planning board but they have requested, and the Selectmen will shortly appoint, a committee of the general public to assist them in this connection.

FIRE AND POLICE DEPARTMENTS

The town continues to receive excellent protection from our fine volunteer fire department and from the police department. The security services, all handled through

Fire Mutual Aid Dispatch Center, continue to provide efficient professional service.

PROBATION OFFICER

POLICE DEPARTMENT

Since accepting the position of Chief last April, this Department has been going through a period of change - a process that will continue in an ongoing effort to meet the specific needs of this community.

To provide you with ready and direct access to me, or to one of my officers, an extension from the Department's telephone has been installed in my residence, and in addition, a "call forwarding" feature has also been added to that number. This allows direct access to us except for those periods when we are on the road.

The office number is 588-6303.

The standard emergency number, 1--352--1100, is still in effect on those occasions when we cannot be reached on the office phone. In an actual emergency, this would be the number to call so that you are assured of immediate response.

Throughout my first months here it has been made readily apparent that there are a number of reoccurring problems that plague this community. One of these has been the lack of effective enforcement of animal control laws adopted by the Town. This Department has instituted operating procedures, and an Animal Control Officer has been assigned, to ensure that the regulations pertaining to licensing and control are strictly enforced through the use of abatement notices and court summonses. If you are having a problem with a noisy or loose animal, call.

One of the other major problems has been the irresponsible and illegal use of Off Highway Recreational Vehicles (OHRV's). In speaking with property owners throughout the Town, many who had willingly given permission for the use of these vehicles on their property, have now withdrawn that permission because of the manner in which some of the operators have abused the privilege.

If you or a member of your family operates an OHRV I would strongly suggest a review of the 1986 OHRV laws available through this Department. These regulations will be strictly enforced. The Officers of this Department have been directed that no further warnings will be issued for OHRV violations. Summonses will be issued and/or, when appropriate, OHRV's shall be impounded.

Those of you who are complying with the rules and wish to continue enjoying your machines might give some thought to forming an OHRV club to promote your sport. Such a club, responsibly run, might help a great deal in allowing the continued use of your neighbor's property. If I can help, give me a call.

This Department will continue, this coming year, to institute programs similar to the new school safety patrol, and to assist other community organizations present programs of general interest such as the Child Abuse lecture this last winter. One early project will be a bicycle rodeo this spring prior to the end of the school year.

Finally, on a personal note, I would like to offer my thanks, not only for myself but also on behalf of my family, to all of you who have made this first year's transition so much easier and smoother than we had hoped or expected.

WELFARE DEPARTMENT

1985 was a frustrating and expensive year due to state and court mandated financial responsibility for delinquent juveniles. This amounted to expenditures of \$21,087.55. Local assistance was a nominal \$608.37. The good news is that State and County have taken over state mandated ongoing expenses as of January 1, 1986. However, the legislature did not fund this and until such time as this is clarified I must include part of this expense in my 1986 budget. Hopefully it will not be needed.

Again, I am appreciative of the fuel assistance and weatherization programs for their help keeping our direct relief at a minimum.

Money was no problem for this department in 1985, we spent a little less than \$50.00 and as usual it was all for postage. Anyone contemplating an arrangement of this sort, be it the property owner or trailer inhabitant, would be wise to contact the Board of Selectmen and be advised of the requirements.

ANTRIM - BENNINGTON RECYCLING COMMISSION

A great many Antrim and Bennington citizens have quietly and carefully contributed to the success of the recycling area at the landfill. Mr. White, our glass buyer, is impressed with the amount and the cleanliness of glass that our relatively small population voluntarily recycles.

In December of 1985 we set up a magazine recycling area in the shed and would like to encourage everyone to look through the great variety of magazines that have already accumulated. Feel free to take any of interest to you, and add some of your own.

Most beverage cans are aluminum and can be recycled. There is also a market for newspapers. Those left in the shed are being recycled by private individuals at this time.

Some of the money made from the recycled glass was used to join the NH Resource Recovery Association which provides statewide and national recycling information. The rest of the money earned was used to offset landfill costs.

We miss our dedicated chairman, Richard Pleasants, who moved to Peterborough last spring. The hours of research and work he put into this committee were greatly appreciated by those of us who had the privilege of working with him.

We are grateful to all who have helped to make this our third successful year. Several people have commented on how easy recycling is and some have found it saves them trips to the dump. The members of this commission welcome any suggestions you may have for improvements or changes.

TIMBER TAX

A note to all timber land owners. Effective 04-01-86, the legislature has changed the law related to the so-called timber tax which is 10% of the fair market value of all timber cut for sale. As before, an Intent to Cut is required before any cutting operation begins but now the responsibility for the payment of the tax rests on the land owner, not the operator, and represents a tax lien on the property in the same manner as unpaid real estate tax. All land owners contemplating having timber cut on their land should be aware of their tax liability. The selectmen would recommend that they should engage the services of a forester in order to protect their own interests.

BUILDING PERMITS REQUIRED

The Selectmen would like to remind all property owners that building permits are required for all new buildings, and all new building additions or substantial building improvements as mandated by the federally required flood plane zoning.

In addition, the Selectmen require building permits in order that they can keep the town's assessment records uptodate, determine whether the building falls within the flood plane and if so has special building requirements, is in accordance with the subdivision requirements if within a subdivision, or if representing an additional separate dwelling unit results in the requirement for subdivision.

If the new building is a dwelling unit, either a state approved septic design, if outside the town sewer system, or a permit to hookup to the town sewer system is required. In addition, new state law requires that all new home construction conform to the requirements for the installation of smoke detectors. If conversion of an old home to a multiple unit apartment is involved, smoke detectors are also required.

Mobile homes are considered the equivalent of a building and a building permit is required before the placement of a mobile home. The town officials would appreciate the cooperation of all land owners as these requirements are intended to protect all property owners.

BENNINGTON FIRE DEPARTMENT

The Bennington Fire Department responded to 90 fire and rescue calls in 1985. Fire calls were as follows: one furnace problem, one lightning strike, three gas stove problems, eight chimmey, one partition, four structure, one couch, one grass, one electrical, one rekindle, one storm standby and four false alarms. Our equipment and men responded to 16 calls for mutual aid; four to Antrim, six to Francestown, once to Greenfield, four to Hancock and once to Weare. The rescue squad responded to 29 medical emergencies and 18 automobile accidents - twelve in Antrim and six in Bennington.

We wish to remind all residents that state law requires a permit for any outside fire (excluding barbecue grills), for the installation of an oil burning unit and also before the installation of a kerosene heater.

SCHOOL BOARD REPRESENTATIVE

"All's Quiet On The Western Front" is not the axiom for Conval School District for the next few years. We are facing many important decisions, such as: increased enrollments, new or renovated school buildings, early childhood education and funding.

This year Pierce School has an enrollment of 89 students in Readiness through sixth grade. In the fall of 1986 it will be necessary to move the sixth grade to Antrim Middle School. Except for two positions, the staff has remained the same as last year. The staff includes Mrs. Joan Schnare, teaching principal and readiness; Mrs. Claudia Sysyn, first and second grades; Mrs. Virginia Young, third and fourth grades; Mrs. Joyce Chiulli, fifth and sixth grades; Babette Merchant, R.N., Nurse; Joy Foster, remedial teacher; Priscilla Chicoine, Title I; Carol Reed, readiness aide; Janet Beach, library aide; Margaret (Scottie) Aborn, matron; Dale Pyer, instrumental music; and Vivian Genetes, classroom music.

The Student Council has many projects which has enabled them to purchase a VCR for the school. One of their goals for next year is to raise money towards new stage curtains at the Town Hall. Police Chief David Mancini has established a school safety patrol. You can recognize the patrol by their safety belts and red banners.

A Parent Teacher Organization (PTO) has been formed and meetings are held on the second Tuesday of the month at the Pierce School. One of their activities was to serve a Christmas buffet lunch at the Firemen's Hall for all the students of the various grade levels. PROPOSED

REGULATIONS FOR THE USE OF

PUBLIC BATHING FACILITIES

AT WHITTEMORE LAKE

TOWN OF BENNINGTON

- No person shall be in or upon the beach, bath house or parking area during the period from ten o'clock p.m. to four o'clock a.m.
- 2. No person shall make or keep an open fire.
- No person shall allow his dog or other pet to run or swim except on a leash.
- 4. No person shall play ball.
- 5. No person shall cause or permit a boat to be within thirty feet of the diving float.
- 6. No person shall go under the diving float.
- No person shall deposit paper, refuse or other material except in containers provided for that purpose.
- 8. No alcoholic beverages shall be allowed anywhere within the beach area.
- No person shall push, pull or otherwise interfere with another person while either is on the diving float.
- 10. Children under the age of twelve years shall be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian.
- 11. The assigned Life Guard shall have the responsibility and authority for the enforcement of all rules of safety and conduct during normal operating hours of the facility.
- 12. The assigned Life Guard may cause to be removed, or may refuse access, to any person that, in the Life Guard's opinion, is creating a situation that is disruptive to the safe and orderly conduct of the facility.
- 13. For any violation of these regulations, a person may be subject to a fine not to exceed the sum of one hundred dollars.
