TOWN OF CENTER HARBOR
Town Warrant

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Center Harbor in the County of Belknap in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at Center Harbor Town House in said Center Harbor on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise for Highways and Bridges.
4. To see if the Town will vote to raise money for aid to Laconia Hospital and if so, how much.
5. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$5,000. for Welfare and Town Poor.
6. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$2,500. for maintenance of the Center Harbor Volunteer Fire Co.
7. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid Assistance for class V roads, the Town to raise \$259.18, the State to contribute \$1,727.84.
8. To see if the Town will vote to raise money for Parks and Playgrounds, including Band Concerts, and if so, how much.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$115.80, which is 1/100 of 1% of the assessed valuation of the Town, to the Lakes Region Association.
10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400. for Civil Defense purposes.
11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150. for new equipment.
12. To see if the Town will vote to raise money for the maintenance of Dr. Morrill Memorial Park and if so how much.
13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,325. for Street Lighting throughout the Town which is to include a new installation at the corner of Town House Road and Route 3 and the resetting of three lights in the Town Square.
14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$400. to the Red Cross to be used for Life Guard Duty at the wharf area.
15. To see if the Town will vote to request the State to deed to the Town a parcel of land between Route 25 and 25B formerly owned by Granville Sargent for Park and Beautification purposes. (by request)
16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate money to improve the road to 'Over Look' and if so, how much.
17. To see if the Town will vote to adopt a plan for extending to employees of the Town the benefits of title II of the Federal Social Security Act (Old Age and Survivor's Insurance) as authorized by Chapter 301 and 332 of the Laws of 1955 and to raise and appropriate the sum of \$125.00 to defray the town's share of the cost thereof.
18. To see if the Town wishes to exclude from the plan services in any class or classes of positions the compensation for which is on a fee basis.
19. To see if the Town wishes to exclude from the plan services in any class or classes of position filled by popular election.

20. If a plan for Social Security coverage is adopted, to see if the town will authorize the selectmen to execute on behalf of the town the necessary agreements with the State of New Hampshire to carry into effect the plan and to see if the town will designate the Selectmen as the officers to be responsible for the administration of the plan.
21. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire money for town purposes in anticipation of taxes.
22. To choose agents or committees in relation to any article in the warrant and to hear reports of any here-to-fore chosen.
23. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Forest Fire Warden's Report

Everyone apparently fears fire but too many are careless with it. This is particularly true of fires in or near woodland. Official figures show that more than 98% of all forest fires results from human carelessness and can be prevented. Consequently we may say "Forest Fires are our most shameful waste."

Annual forest fire losses are tremendous and their effects are far reaching. Such fires destroy the raw products of the forest, the protection forest provides for game, and the supply of ground water. They upset the local economies by drawing men from gainful employment and requiring the expenditure of public funds to extinguish them.

Your local warden and his deputies are doing an excellent job in trying to prevent this shameful waste, but they must have the cooperation of the public and this means YOU. Remember there are laws that cover the making of a camp fire, also the burning of rubbish or debris, and also the burning of brush whether this is on your land or land of other people, and to disobey these laws can cost you a great deal of money. So please see your local warden and he will tell you how to burn the rubbish, also when you can burn it, and also issue you a permit to do so if conditions are right.

In the "Keep America Green" program there is a story of two bad boys who cause most of our forest fires. The first one we will call "I don't care." He is the person that builds a fire anywhere, never gets a permit to burn brush, or has a safe place for his home incinerator. He also is very careless with matches and cigarettes. The other one is called "I don't know any better" and the best way to describe him is he is a plain dunce. It is only with your help that these two bad actors are controlled. Their carelessness can be the cause of our valuable woodland being destroyed by fire. Even your homes can be burned by their carelessness.

It is up to you and you to report these two characters to your local forest warden whenever you see them operating. Remember it is with your cooperation that this shameful waste of timber and money can be stopped.
