### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Chatham in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Chatham on Tuesday, the eleventh (11) day of March, next at 6:30 of the clock in the evening to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of same.
- 3. To see if the Town will allow a 2% discount on all property taxes paid within 30 days of mailing tax bill.
- 4. To see if the Town will raise \$100.00 for Civil Defense.
- 5. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$717.50 as our share of the Fryeburg Rescue.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$750.00 to the Saco Valley Fire Department as our share of expenses.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for Solid Waste Disposal (use of Town of Fryeburg Dump) and take said amount from Revenue Sharing Funds.
- 8. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 to support the Eastern Slope Airport Authority.
- 9. To see if the Town of Chatham will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 for the support of the Children and Youth Project of Mt. Washington Valley.
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the support of the Community Action Outreach Program.

- 11. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$235.00 to assist the Carroll County Mental Health Services.
- 12. To see if the Town of Chatham will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$378.00 for the Visiting Nurse Services of Northern Carroll County, Inc., said sum being equal to \$1.80 per person in the Town of Chatham.

- 13. To see what action the Town will take on the Budget submitted by the Budget Committee.

### TOWN LIBRARY LEASED FROM CHURCH LEASE

Harold B. Andrews and John A. Rand, both of Chatham, Carroll County, State of New Hampshire, and Kenneth L. Small in said County and State, all as Trustees of the Chatham Congretational Church, of said Chatham, having the corporate powers as provided by Chapter 506, Section 4 of New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, herein after called LESSOR, hereby lease to the Town of Chatham, a municipal corporation of said County and State, hereinafter called LESSEE, the premises described in the conditional deed of said Church to Chatham School District dated July 12, 1957, recorded at Carroll County Registry of Deeds, Book 320, Page 229, together with the building now erected thereon and formerly known as the Chatham Center Schoolhouse.

- 1. The term of this lease shall be three (3) years, commencing on the 1st day of October, 1986.
- 2. This lease is made for and in consideration of the following stated services to be furnished to the Lessor by the LESSEE; Said Town shall maintain said building, exterior and interior; shall perform whatever yard work

and other work shall be necessary in order to keep the premises neat and clean and presentable in appearance; shall assume and pay all expenses of heating and utilities for said building; shall maintain during the term of this lease, at LESSE's expense, insurance in solvent companies doing business in the State of New Hampshire, in the joint names of LESSOR and LESSEE against fire and extended coverage to the full insurable replacement value of the building, subject to such deductible as may be required by the insurer on the extended coverage insurance, also owners, landlords, and tenants liability insurance with a limit of not less than \$100,000.00; shall maintain the property generally in good condition; shall make at its own expense all repairs of any kind whether ordinary or extraordinary, it being understood, however, that any structural alterations shall be subject to approval of LESSOR.

- 3. Said covenant on the part of the LESSEE to maintain said premises shall continue in effect as long as the present usage of said premises continues, and as long as the physical condition of the said premises remains the same as at present.
- 4. The LESSOR reserves the right to use the building for any Church purposes provided that such use does not interfere with the Town's use of said premises.

It is agreed that the impairment or destruction, either partial or total, of said building by fire or any other casualty, shall not have the effect of terminating this lease. The LESSEE hereby agrees to furnish the LESSOR rent insurance during the whole term of the lease to cover the period of non-occupancy from such cause for a period of six months.

This lease is made and signed by the parties hereto this 10th day of October, 1985.

### CHATHAM COMMUNITY LIBRARY

The Chatham Community Library has been open in the Center Chatham Schoolhouse for about 15 years. The books were moved from the Eastman Schoolhouse when the Town sold that building. We've grown from an 18 foot long book rack section to five times that amount or approximately 5,000 copies.

Over the years we've tried to buy as many local history, craft and how-to-do books as we could while keeping our fiction updated. We've received quite a few donations of books, as well as money and labor. Each is greatly appreciated. Each year in July, a flea market is held to raise money. Each year we receive \$200.00 from the Mulford Fund and \$200.00 from the Town. This money is all used for books and supplies to card them for borrowing. All help is donated. The Library is open in the winter 1st and 3rd Wednesdays of the month 1-3 and 6-8 p.m. In summer, starting in June, the Library is open every Wednesday 1-3 p.m. and 1st and 3rd Wednesdays 6-8 p.m.

This year, as in the near future, we need more shelves or racks and some general repairs inside the Library, such as floor sanded and sealed, paint and possibly converting part of the basement to a book room.

Another project I'd personally like to see started is a preservation of our Town History. If anyone has old deeds, pictures, family journals or records they'd share with the Library, please contact me. We'd like to photo-copy the material so it can be shared and preserved. Included in this same project would be pictures of all the houses in town, both past (if could be acquired) and present. Anyone interested? We could use donations of books and your time in helping these things happen. After all -Chatham's History as well as its future is you, the people right here, now. Lend us a hand. ### REPORT OF TOWN FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND STATE FOREST RANGER

Between July 1984 and June 1985, we experienced more forest fires throughout our state than in any year in the last 50. Two of the leading causes of the 1,605 fires were children and fires kindled without written permission of a Forest Fire Warden. Both causes are preventable, but only with your help.

Please help our town and state forest fire officials with forest fire prevention. Contact your Forest Fire Warden for more information.

Enforcement of a state timber harvest regulations is the responsibility of State Forestry officials. Our state has excellent timber harvest regulations; however, your assistance is needed.

If you know of a logging operation and suspect a state timber harvest law may ve violated, call your Forest Fire Warden.

If you own forest land, you will become responsible for the timber tax payment starting April 1, 1986. This is a change in the Timber Tax Law that will impact all forest landowners. Contact your Board of Selectmen for timber tax forms.

### FRYEBURG RESCUE

To the Citizens of the Towns:

1985 has been yet another busy year for the members of Fryeburg Rescue. We did not have as many runs this year – we handled 251 runs in 1985, which was 17 less than 1984. In addition to these runs, our members put in uncountable hours assisting in our many fund raising events which successfully raised the needed funds for our new ambulance which was put into service at the end of December. Our deepest thanks go to the businesses, residents and visitors whose patronage of these events and general donations to our appeals for funds made our goal a reality.

The 251 runs that we handled this year took approximately 2,550 man hours of labor, which is about 10 man hours per call on an average. These runs were divided among the towns as follows: Fryeburg - 154; Brownfield - 52; Lovell - 26; Stow - 3; Chatham & East Conway - 16. We also stood by at 4 area fires during the year. In addition to taking care of the emergency medical needs of our citizens and visitors, our members put in nearly 800 man hours in additional training courses, refresher courses, seminars, etc. to update and maintain our levels of training.

This year's Fryeburg Fair again saw our members putting in nearly 600 man hours in addition to all the other hours put in on our runs and training.

The continued support of the towns, their residents, our summer & winter visitors and all our area businesses is something without which we could not exist. Not only couldn't we continue our work to serve the people of our towns, but a fund raising campaign, such as we waged this year, would never have been so successful. It is such a thrill to realizee that your support and generosity has enabled us to raise \$40,000 for the purchase of a new ambulance in less that 1 year and without the assistance of any tax dollars.

On behalf of all the members of the Squad, I would like to thank each and every one of you who have given us your support during this busy year. We know with support like this we don't have to worry about continued support in the future. We know we can count on you to make it possible for us to be there when you need us.

To the Members of the School Administrative Unit No. 9 Board, Conway, New Hampshire -

We have examined the combined financial statements of the School Administrative Unit No. 9 as of and for the year ended June 30, 1985, as listed in the accompanying table of contents. Our examination was made in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and accordingly included such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances.

As described in note 1B, the combined financial statements referred to above do not include financial statements of the General Fixed Asset group of accounts, which should be included to conform with generally accepted accounting principles.

In our opinion, except that omission of the General Fixed Asset group of accounts results in an incomplete presentation as explained in the above paragraph, the combined financial statements referred to above present fairly the financial position of the School Adminsitrative Unit No. 9 at June 30, 1985 and the reults of its operations for the year then ended, in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles applied on a basis consistent with that of the preceding year.

Our examination was made for the purpose of forming an opinion on the combined financial statements taken as a whole. The supplemental schedules listed in the table of contents are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the combined financial statements of the School Administrative Unit No. 9. The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the examination of the combined financial statements and, in our cpinion is stated fairly in all material respects in relation to the combined financial statements taken as a whole.
