TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hancock in the County of Hillsborough in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Hancock on Tuesday, the fourteenth day of March, next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
3. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for labor in cemeteries, or take any action relating thereto.
4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$150.00 to paint and repair fence in cemetery, or take any action relating thereto.
5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for the services of Secretary-Treasurer of Trustees of Trust Funds, or take any action relating thereto.
6. To see if the Town will vote to have the Common and central school grounds surveyed, corners properly marked and blueprints made and raise and appropriate money for the same, or take any action relating thereto.
7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to purchase the Addison C. Ware estate to secure Juggernaut pond for auxiliary water supply and raise and appropriate money for the same, or take any action relating thereto.
8. To see if the Town will vote to extend the water main and install a fire hydrant on the Stoddard road near Howard Dorry's and raise and appropriate money for the same, or take any action relating thereto.
9. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes, or take any action relating thereto.
10. To see if the Town will vote to allow a discount of one percent on property taxes paid thirty days after date of bill, or take any action relating thereto.

11. To see if the Town will vote to establish a rate of pay per hour for the Town Officers and employees, or take any action relating thereto.

12. To see if the Town will vote to accept gifts and legacies left in trust for the use of the Town, or take any action relating thereto.

13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the road agent to plow driveways, making a charge for same, payable in advance, or take any action relating thereto.

14. To see if the Town will vote to make sufficient changes in the Town Hall to overcome existing fire hazards, as suggested by the State Board of Fire Control, or take any action relating thereto.

15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen or Moderator to appoint a zoning Commission, or take any action relating thereto.

16. To see if the Town will vote to extend the water main on School street when Mr. William Fowle or any other owners, may build on the former Fowle property, or take any action relating thereto.

17. To see if the Town will vote to extend the road on School Street toward the pond for the use of Mr. Fowle, or other property owners of the former Fowle estate, or take any action relating thereto.

18. To see if the Town will vote to purchase a rubber tired tractor with loader and snow plow attachments and raise and appropriate money for the same, or take any action relating thereto.

19. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue operating under the Municipal Budget Act, or take any action relating thereto.

20. To see if the Town will vote to establish an advisory Budget Committee, or take any action relating thereto.

21. To hear reports of Auditors and Committees heretofore chosen, and take any action relating thereto.

22. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

Forest Fires—Our Most Shameful Waste

Everyone apparently fears fire but too many are careless with it. This is particularly true of fires in and near woodlands. Official figures show that more than 98 percent of all forest fires result from human carelessness and can be prevented. Consequently, we may say "Forest Fires are our most shameful waste."

Our forest fire organization is doing a good job in keeping the size of fires small, but the number of fires is increasing. In 1949 there were 100 more fires in New Hampshire than in 1948, but they burned 500 acres less. For the warden and his deputies to do the job they are capable of, they must have the cooperation of the public—YOU!

The primary objective of all fire fighters is PREVENTION—fire stoppage. This is the goal toward which your local forest fire warden and his deputies are constantly working. It can be achieved ONLY if YOU and YOU and YOU cooperate with them. It is worth YOUR effort and can be accomplished by:

1. Being careful with fire in or near woodland, being particularly careful with matches and cigarettes.
2. Securing the required written permit from the warden when the ground is not covered with snow.
3. Insisting that others be careful and comply with burning requirements.
4. Calling the warden promptly when fire is detected and aiding him to extinguish it.

Let's reduce the number of forest fires and eliminate our most shameful waste.

B. ADMINISTRATIVE POLICY

The administrative policy adopted this year to employ the same person as Music Supervisor for Peterborough, Jaffrey, Dublin and Hancock is making for a much better coordinated program in music. 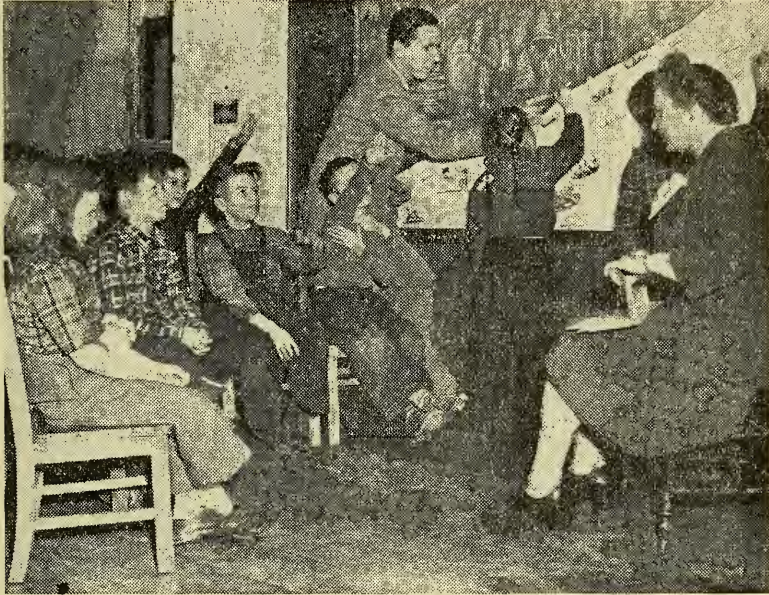

The present enrollment in Grades 7-8 is 14; in grades 9-12, 41.

B. PROGRAM AND METHODS

One of the most important subjects of study offered in our schools is that of reading and it is without doubt the most difficult to teach. In order to help teachers to acquire higher skill in this tremendously vital area all teachers of the Supervisory Union worked for five full school days (Nov. 7-11) under highly expert leaders from Boston University. The activity

was officially called a workshop, and it truly was. Doctors Durrell, Murphy and Sullivan gave as fine a course as could possibly be desired. There wasn't a dull moment from start to finish and all teachers have reported a very helpful experience. The teachers paid one-fourth of the total cost of the course and the school districts shared in meeting the balance of the expenses.

PART III. SCHOOL PLANT

During the past summer the toilets at the elementary school were moved from the basement onto the first floor, a much better location from the point of view of convenience in use and ease of supervision.

Another decided improvement was made by partitioning off a portion of the front hall for an office and health room.

To help correct the loss of play facilities caused by equipment wearing out a new junglegym has been installed this fall. This is proving very popular with all ages.

The greatest major need now appears to be the replacement of the worn-out heating system. The present equipment is probably near collapse. Estimates have been received and an article appears in the warrant to permit action on this matter.

PART VI. AUXILIARY REPORTS AND SPECIAL ACTIVITIES

A. REPORT OF HEALTH WORK

A. After the physical examinations had been conducted at the Hancock High School, and the Hancock Primary School by Dr. Moore assisted by the School Nurse, notices of defects found were sent to the parents.

B. Exclusion from school of students having symptoms of communicable diseases have been made in compliance with the regulations of the State Board of Health.

C. The First-Aid Room has been equipped by Dr. Moore. The equipment was donated by the Hancock Women's Club. The First Aid Cabinet is equipped for injuries and illness.

D. Defects found by the doctor have been followed up by the school nurse, by phone calls, personal interviews, and visits to the homes of parents.

E. The school nurse has visited the schools at regular intervals during the year.

F. Students have been weighed and measured three times during the year.

G. Vision tests have been conducted by means of the Mass. Vision Test.

H. Hearing tests have been made with the Maico Audiometer.

I. Dental clinics sponsored by the local Red Cross have been arranged and the students have had dental care by Dr. C. Temple Lawrence at his office.

J. On May 5, registration of pre-schoolers took place, and their vision and hearing were tested and reports made to the parents who were present.

K. On June 9, a public health clinic under the direction of the State Board of Health was held. Pre-schoolers attended with their parents, and physical examinations were conducted by Dr. Moore, Dr. Mahlon Mason, Mrs. C. A. Hamilton, R.N., and the School Nurse. Mrs. Aiken, R.N., County T.B. nurse, gave the Patch test to all who desired it.

L. The school nurse has recorded the disease census and physical growth record on the Health card, which is on file for each student.

M. The East Jaffrey Work Shop, and the Teachers Convention in Manchester, N. H., were attended by the school nurse.

At this time the school Health Dept. wishes to express its appreciation to the nurses, doctors, teachers, principals, Supt. of Schools, Board of Education, the local Women's Club and American Red Cross for their cooperation.

REPORT ON HEALTH EXAMINATIONS—HANCOCK—
1949-1950

A combination health service and teacher's room was made during the summer in the Elementary School, providing welcome privacy and quiet and a cabinet was built to house First Aid equipment.

In the High School a small space in the girls toilet large enough for a couch and some shelves has been enclosed. Inadequate as the space is, it does provide a place where a sick student can lie down.

The Hancock Womans Club has presented the School Department with equipment for health service in both schools. This has already proved its value.
