# THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

### TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Hinsdale qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall on Tuesday the 8th of March, 1966 at 10 o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following subjects:

- Article 1. To east your ballots for all necessary town officers.
- Article 2. To see if the provisions of Chapter 171-A of the revised laws relative to playing games of beano shall be adopted in this town.
- Article 3. Shall the zoning ordinance as proposed by the zoning commission, be adopted for this town?

Polls open on the above articles at 10 A.M. and shall not be closed earlier than 7:15 P.M.

Action to be taken on the following articles beginning at 7:30 P.M.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to accept and adopt the report of the Selectmen, Auditors and other Town Officers.

Article 5. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the payment of ordinary town charges for the maintenance of the fire department, highways, and for all other necessary expenses arising with the Town. (See Budget).

Article 6. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow a sum or sums not to ex-

ceed in the aggregate \$80,000.00 in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the current municipal year and to issue in the name and on the credit of the Town negotiable notes therefor, said notes to be repaid during the current municipal year from taxes collected with the current municipal year.

Article 7. To see if the Town will give the Water Department the authority to pay the sum of \$5,000.00 (Five Thousand Dollars) for the land the water rights from Clifford Stearns, located in North Hinsdale, N. H. for the purpose of building a gravel packed well. This land consists of 20 aeres more or less with a 20 foot wide right of way leading into the land from the Monument Road beside the airport. (Inserted by the Water Department)

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen and the Board of Water and Sewer Commissioners to apply for, and accept, an advance for Public Works and Planning from the United States of America under Public Law 560, 83rd Congress, as amended, an amount not to exceed \$7,500.00 (seventy-five hundred dollars) and to expend the same for obtaining surveys, engineering design and contract documents for additional water supply facilities for the Town of Hinsdale. (Inserted by Water Department)

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen and the Board of Water and Sewer Commissioners to apply for, accept and expend, any and all grants made available by the Federal and/or State Government for the purposes of planning, developing, improving, and extending water supply facilities for the Town of Hinsdale. (Inserted by Water Department)

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$556.04 to which the State will contribute \$3,706.96 to be expended on Class IV and Class V road construction?\*

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to borrow on the credit of the Town a sum not to exceed sixteen thousand dol-

lars (\$16,000.00) to purchase a new fire truck and to authorize the Selectmen to borrow (\$16,000.00) on the credit of the Town and to issue and sell notes or bonds in the name of and on the credit of the Town under and in accordance with the Municipal Finance Act of the State of New Hampshire and any amendments relating thereto, and to authorize the Selectmen to fix the time and place of payment of said principal of said notes and bonds and interest thereon, and the principal amount of each note or bond and to sell said notes or bonds and to take such other action with respect thereto as may be necessary or advisable. (Inserted by Fire Department)

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to allow a 3% discount for the first 30 days after tax bill is mailed and a subsequent 2% discount for next 30 days on payment of taxes, or act in any manner thereon. (Inserted by Selectmen)

Article 13. To authorize the Selectmen to have the inventory of assessed valuation printed as soon as possible after the assessing is finished; prior to the receipt of the tax rate, or act in any manner thereon. (Inserted by Selectmen)

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to install and maintain a street light at the intersection of Prospect Street and the Old Stage Road, or act in any manner thereon. (By petition)

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to accept the bequest of five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) for the improvement of Pine Grove Cemetery in Hinsdale, N. H. as set forth in clause nine of the will of William Pearson, late of Keene, N. H., or act in any manner thereon. (At the request of the Pearson Estate Lawyer.)

Article 16. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$9,000.00 (Nine thousand dollars) to repair the abutment, truss and sidewalk of the Depot Street Bridge over the Ashuelot River, and to sandblast and paint the same, or act in any manner thereon. (Inserted by Selectmen)

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of (\$5,000.00) Five Thousand Dollars to resurface Monument Road from the Sprague residence to the

intersection of Meetinghouse Road, thence continue from Meetinghouse Road to the intersection of Plain Road, the present route of the school bus, a distance of 134 miles, (one and three-fourths miles) or act in any manner thereon. (By petition.

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to amend the Town Highway Budget as follows: To change the present system of an hourly wage, to a regular weekly salary of one hundred and twenty-five dollars (\$125.00) for the office of Town Road Agent, and to raise and appropriate an additional sum of fifteen hundred (\$1,500.00) to be equally distributed to the employees of the Highway Department throughout the year in the form of a raise from their present rate of pay, both above mentioned amounts to compensate for the present high cost of living, or to act in any manner thereon. (By petition)

Article 19. In the event Article 3 is passed to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate an adequate sum to be set at the town meeting for the use of the zoning commission, or act in any manner thereon.

Article 20. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

### SUMMARY OF FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of an examination and audit of the accounts of the Town of Hinsdale for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1965, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the Town. Exhibits as hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

### SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the Board of Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector, Town Clerk, Water and Sewer Departments, Library, Trustees of Trust Funds, District Court and Cemetery Lot Fund.

### FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets: December 31, 1964—December 31, 1965: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of December 31, 1964 and December 31, 1965, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein the Net Debt decreased by \$24,730.03 in 1965.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the Town during the year is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein. These were as follows:

# Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures —Estimated and Actual Revenues: (Exhibits A-3 & A-4)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expenditures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1965, are presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the budget summary (Exhibit A-4), a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$7,215.08, plus a revenue surplus of \$9,612.95, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$16,828.03.

# Summary Statement of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit B-1)

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended December 31, 1965, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of December 31, 1965, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

# Water and Sewer Departments: (Exhibits E-1 & E-2)

Summary statements of the receipts and expenditures of the Water and Sewer Departments for the fiscal year are presented in Exhibits E-1 and E-2.

# Statement of Long Term Indebtedness: (Exhibit J)

A statement of outstanding long term indebtedness as of December 31, 1965, showing annual debt service requirements, is contained in Exhibit J.

### AUDIT PROCEDURE

The accounts and records of all town officials charged with the custody, receipt and disbursement of public funds were examined and audited. Vouchers and cancelled checks were compared with supporting invoices and payrolls as well as entries in the books of records. Receipts were checked by source insofar as possible and totals of receipts and expenditures verified. Book balances were verified by comparison with reconciled bank balances made from statements obtained from depository banks. Verification of uncollected taxes was made by mailing notices to delinquent taxpayers as indicated by the Collector's records. The amounts of uncollected and unredeemed taxes as indicated in this report are therefore subject to any changes which may be necessitated by the return of verification notices.

### Current Surplus:

### District Court:

Attention is again called to Chapter 331, Section 502—A:9 of the Laws of 1963, relative to the disposition of fines paid into the District Court. This section provides as follows:

"502—A:9 Payments. Payments to cities and towns shall be made monthly, on or before the fifth day of each month, and shall cover the net receipts as aforesaid of said court for the month preceding, with a detailed statement of the amount, date, and from whom all money has been received."

# Surety Bond:

The surety bond of the Town Treasurer should be increased from \$20,000.00 to \$25,000.00.

The provisions of Chapter 184, of the Laws of 1955, require that this report or the summary of findings and recommendations (letter of transmittal) shall be published in the next annual report of the Town.

### HINSDALE MUNICIPAL COURT 1965

The activity of the Municipal Court increased somewhat during 1965 in that the case load was up 17% and the total fines levied were up 108%. The noticeable difference between these two figures is due primarily to the type of case presented to the Court. In 1965 there were four 'driving while intoxicated' cases tried. This is in marked contrast to the years 1964 and 1963 where the record shows no DWI cases entered. The passage of the "Implied Consent" law has helped our law enforcement agencies in the prosecution of this type of case. In addition, there were three cases of leaving the scene of an accident, a serious charge that usually requires a more serious fine and possible jail sentence.

One case of assault was bound over to the Grand Jury and one Fish and Game Violation was entered. Two cases of assaulting a police officer were heard and the gravity of this charge is reflected in a 30 day jail sentence in one case and a fine and suspended jail sentence in the second. Five cases of Grand Larceny were reduced to Petty Larceny and handled in this Court. The balance of the cases were varied misdemeanors.

The Court has enjoyed the excellent cooperation of the Selectmen, Chief Wesley F. Ryan and his men, and the law enforcement agencies of the County and State. This cooperation has been sincerely appreciated, and I am looking forward to continuing this good relationship during the coming year.

### PUBLIC HEALTH NURSING SERVICE

January 24, 1966

The following is a report of the activities of the service from January 1, 1965 to December 31, 1965.

Field visits 372

School Pupils Attended 534

The annual school physical examinations were conducted in the fall by Dr. John Trumper, assisted by the nurse. A total of 297 pupils were examined. The major defect found was decayed teeth.

Hearing testing was done on 97 pupils and no serious defect was found in this group.

Vision testing was done on 611 pupils and 42 defects were found.

In January and February, the Sterneedle test for Tuberculosis was done in the schools and 588 persons were tested. Out of this group, 15 had chest x-rays when the Mobile x-rays Unit was in town in March. These examinations were sponsored by the N. H. Public Health Department.

In July, when Operation Head Start was held at the Elementary School, ten persons had Gamma Globulin injections because of exposure to hepatitis.

In August the 15 pupils attending Operation Headstart had physical examinations by Dr. Thomas O'Connor. At this time the following immunizations were done. T. B. Patch Test—13; Triple Toxoid—4; Small Pox—5: Salk Polio Vaccine—2.

Measles and Scarlet Fever were prevalent in the school during the winter months.

In October, the nurses attended a School Nurses meeting in Concord.

I wish to thank those who have helped in carrying out the work of the service.

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the town of Hinsdale qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Hinsdale High School in said district on the 11th day of March, 1966 at 8:00 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
  - 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see what sum of money the district will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the payment of salaries for school district officials and agents and for the payment of the statutory obligations of the district.
- 9. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to spend the income received from investing balances in the School Building Account in short term notes for the purpose of furnishing the high school with equipment of a lasting character in accordance with the laws of the State of New Hampshire, or take any action thereon.

- 10. To see if the district will vote to accept the provisions of Title I, Public Law 89-10 (Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965), and to appropriate such funds as may be made available to the district under said Federal Act for such particular projects as may be determined by the school board. Further, to see if the district will authorize the school board to make application for such funds and to expend the same for such projects as it may designate.
- 11. To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to make application for and to accept, on behalf of the district, any or all grants or other funds for educational purposes which may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the United States Government or from the State of New Hampshire.
- 12. To transact any other business which may legally come before the meeting.

# REPORT OF THE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL PRINCIPAL

To the Superintendent of Schools:

I hereby submit my Fifth Annual Report as Elementary Principal in the Hinsdale School District.

### Enrollment

Our school enrollment continues to increase at a high rate. Currently we have 481 pupils enrolled in grades K-7 with the largest number in the primary area. With this steady increase it will become necessary to add one additional teacher each year at each grade level. We now have three sections in grade one and will have three sections in grade two in the fall of 1966. Grade seven will be transferred to the high school building next year to allow for expansion in the elementary building. This move will enable the high school to operate a Junior High program and the 6, 6 division of pupils is best suited for over all educational development.

## Curriculum

Our new math program is now in its second year with an extension to grade five and one section of grade six. With the beginning of school in 1966 we will have a complete new math program for all grades.

New materials in reading have enabled us to strengthen our reading program. Last year the Greenfield, Massachusetts Elementary Schools used the Hinsdale Reading Plan as a guide in setting up a new reading program within their elementary schools.

The science program has been coordinated with the high school science program, thus making science a sequential curriculum. New books and supplies have been purchased in this area.

This year we have a special Education Class. The small number of pupils in this class makes it possible for more individual teacher help that will be measured in educational growth as the year progresses. The High School Guidance Director has given us much help in this area through pupil counsel.

At long last we have physical education facilities for some of our elementary pupils. It is a wonderful experience to see these young people have the privilege of using the facilities available in the new gymnasium. This year we will participate in a Junior High Invitational Tournament with several other towns.

# In-Service Training

Elementary teachers have received instruction in the Spaulding Unified Phonics Method for teaching children correct and accurate speech, writing, spelling, and reading — as one integrated subject. The Spalding Method is a technique by which the child learns to write down the sounds used in spoken English as they are combined into words. Thus, conversely the child can pronounce any printed word. We will integrate this material with our basic readers to further strengthen our reading program.

In-Service Training will continue with educational material for reading and English that has been developed in the Salisbury Summer School.

# Personnel

Kindergarten — Mrs. Charles Wilder. Changed from grade two to Kindergarten.

Grade 1 — Mrs. Barbara Huntley, Skidmore College.

Grade 1 — Mrs. Hazel Anderson, Lyndon State College, formerly taught at the Austine School.

Grade 4 — Miss Juanita Smith, Lyndon State College, formerly taught in Newfane, Vermont.

Grade 4 — Mrs. Paul Breckell, Plymouth State College.

Grade 5 — Mrs. Leonard Haubrick, University of Hartford, formerly taught in Deerfield, Massachusetts.

Grade 6 — Mr. John Gallagher, University of New Hampshire, has had experience as teacher in grades 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9, elementary principal, and had several years experience in remedial reading and language training.

Special Education — Miss Mary Gaffney, Keene State College.

Art — Mrs. Brandt, accepted a position in Bellows Falls.

Mrs. Ismay Campbell retired after many years in the teaching profession. In addition to being an excellent teacher, Mrs. Campbell worked in administration for several years as Assistant Principal. We sincerely wish her a rich and rewarding retirement.

We have the same fine quality of lunches being served in our school cafeterias through the cooperative efforts of Mrs. Helen Bouchie, Mrs. Hortense Stephens, Mrs. Elizabeth Butler, Mrs. Elizabeth Bordner, and Mrs. Anna Majer. I would like to point out that this program is a health program and our lunches meet the federal requirements for Class A school lunches in all respects. Participation has increased and we sincerely hope you will continue your support for this program.

The instrumental music program enables us to continue with our band work. Elementary youngsters are not participating in the High School Band this year, however, as these pupils move into the upper grades many of them will help strengthen this phase of music education.

Mrs. Richard Bradbury, District Nurse, has conducted Vision and Hearing tests in all grades and has assisted in clinics and physical examinations for our youngsters. We are thankful for the interest and assistance extended to us by Mrs. Bradbury.

Mr. Paduchak continues to maintain our school, adding new paint and material as it is needed for the upkeep of our building.

# Summary

The educational opportunities are exceptionally good in our schools because the people in our community are interested in high standards of excellence. Your continued cooperation will enable us to strengthen our program of instruction in every way possible. On behalf of the staff and pupils I extend my thanks for your help.

In closing may I again express my sincere appreciation to the School Boad, Superintendent, Faculty, and Pupils for their loyal support in promoting an educational program we can all be proud of.

# REPORT OF THE HIGH SCHOOL PRINCIPAL

To the Superintendent:

It gives me pleasure to submit to you the annual report of the Principal of Hinsdale High School. It embraces the growth and activities of the School during the past calendar vear.

In June 1965, we graduated forty-two young people from the High School. This was, in all probability, the last such graduation from the Town Hall. Among the list of graduates, the following are numbered.

Close to 35% of the graduates of this class have gone on to further their education. Some 17% of the group are today students at full colleges or universities, and another 17% are at specialized two-year college or vocational schools. These young people are studying at such points as Keene, Durham, Concord and Exeter, N. H.; Boston and Worcester, Mass., and Hartford, Conn.

Additionally, it is known that another five of our young men are today serving in the Armed Forces. Their duty stations are scattered around the world, from this country to the central highland of Viet Nam.

The balance of the graduates are, for the most part, gainfully employed in the Brattleboro-Hinsdale area.

In terms of our overall student population, there has been only slight growth this year over last year. In terms of percentages, we can customarily expect a 4% enrollment increase from year to year. The future enrollments, which will, in total, encompass a six-year Junior-Senior High School, will exceed 300 students by September 1966. Obviously, such growth will provide the impetus for curriculum enrichment to an even greater degree.

The faculty changes were few this past year, with one teacher leaving in June, and another in November. During the summer, Mr. Pratt was replaced by Miss Virginia May, a 1965 graduate of Keene State College. In November, Mr. Devoid left to accept a government position, and was replaced by Mrs. Phyllis Ross, an alumna of Hunter College, New York. Because of greater pupil enrollment and increased curriculum demands, an addition to our staff was made in the Science field. This position is being filled by Mr. Charles Larracey, a 1965 graduate of the University of New Hampshire. In addition to these changes and additions, our District Art Supervisor, Mrs. Brandt, left to accept a position in Bellows Falls, Vermont. The supervisor's position yet remains to be filled.

From time to time, as is our custom in these Reports, we like to mention various on-going features of the High School program. In the forefront in this area is our Guidance Department under the direction of Mr. Albert Studer. In our Hinsdale Schools, Guidance services are available to all students from

grades one through twelve. In the high school area more than just our college-bound students are served. The full resources of the Department are brought to bear for the terminal or business-oriented student as well. For those not going on to school, for example, the facilities of the New Hampshire Department of Employment Security are utilized in an aptitude testing program, the individual results of which are permanently filed in the local Employment Security office. When ever in later life a student is in need of a job, his potential employer need only contact this office to obtain all the information he needs on the strengths, weaknesses, and aptitudes of the person applying. And, working from another angle, knowing the qualifications of the individual who has been tested, the office can be of great benefit in helping that person locate employment.

Our Guidance Department further assists non-college students by "service counseling" for those who may be considering the Armed Forces following graduation. For those going directly into the business world, there are field trips, sponsored by the Department to local firms and industries, so that the young people might gain a better knowledge of the demands of such employment.

For those students still enrolled as pupils with us, there is the regular eight and tenth grade testing programs, plus the counseling for other specialized tests of the college-bound youngster. When needed, individualized tests and counseling of troubled or disturbed students is available, not only at the High School, but at the Elementary School as well.

In continuing this Report, there is another area that gives me considerable pleasure. That, of course, is the expanded facilities at the High School which now include a specialized Art Room, Music Room, and fully-equipped gymnasium. These facilities are seeing more and more use, with the gymnasium facilities being used almost continuously from eight o'clock in the morning to seven o'clock at night, and on special occasions, even later in the evening. The effect this has had on our students is becoming increasingly more obvious. The gymnasium, of course, also is our auditorium for theatrical, musical, or

other specialized uses. The convenience of these facilities to the School is very much appreciated. However, considerable work remains to be done in the area of the stage to fully equip it for musical or dramatic presentations. Of prime importance here is the need for a backdrop curtain and adequate and efficient lighting on stage. These features are expected to come with time.

It is always a pleasure to report to you the status of our student activity program. The high point in the life of this School, of course, was its designation as State Band for the 1965 Inaugural Parade in Washington. This prominence demonstrated many things, but chief among them are these three: the ability of our youngsters in the Band to rise to the occasion of their great honor; the tremendous loyalty and support of our community in backing our youngsters; and thirdly, the very effective and successful role a school of our size can play in a world so pre-occupied with largeness of size. All of this is most gratifying; and it must be mentioned, that this was made possible in part by the almost total endorsement and support of this School's faculty and administration. Honor came as a result of a total team effort.

In the area of our athletic program, it is a pleasure to report the decided improvement in performance. This is noted in several fields, among them — Soccer, in which Mr. Bonneville successfully guided the team to its second consecutive Southwestern League Championship with an impressive 12-2 record. With the completion of our new gymnasium and its basketball facilities, our Basketball squad under Mr. Beauregard is showing a vast improvement over the performance of previous years. To further build good Hinsdale teams of the future, a junior varsity and junior high program has been established. This will certainly cause an overall improvement in the athletic picture. Under the Athletic Directorship of Mr. Beauregard, an intramural athletic program involving grades six through twelve is being fostered.

It gives me further pleasure to report that an expanded Adult Education program was inaugurated this year. Five subjects were offered to a total enrollment of 42 people. Although

this enrollment figure is somewhat lower than we would like, the newness of the Program and the calendar dates in which it was held might offer some partial explanation. We will definitely continue this program in the months to come, and will strongly consider a fall offering rather than one during the Winter months. All things being considered, I would say the Program was a success.

In looking ahead to the future, and ascertaining the direction in which we will travel, I would indicate a continuance of the policies and philosophies now established. There is no doubting the fact that continued growth will be with us for several years to come. To better enhance the educational opportunities of our youngsters, the development of a "six-six" plan of education is welcomed. More can be done on the secondary level for our young people in a Junior-Senior High set-up. Further expansion of our curriculum is indicated. The success of such new programs as Driver Education and full-scale Physical Education point the way to future curriculum successes. An expansion of the Business Education department is definitely indicated in order that our graduates might keep pace with the fast-moving developments and trends in the commercial field.

In retrospect, it becomes immediately apparent that the progress being made by our High School is due in large part to support from several vital areas. Without the continued, willing support of the townspeople who have done so much for us in the past, without the continued strength of a dedicated School Board behind us, and without the untiring loyalty, patience and perseverance of a fine faculty, much of what Hinsdale High School now has and now stands for, would have been extremely difficult to achieve. Our unending gratitude is expressed for all this.

Mr. Bruce G. Mitchell, fourth grade teacher, resigned to accept a teaching position in a nearby community.

The current enrollment shows a total of 702 boys and girls enrolled in grades K through twelve. This is an increase of 48 over a year ago. There are thirty-eight more boys and girls in the elementary school and ten more in the high school.

In projecting future enrollments, it was assumed that grade seven would be moved into the high school. Therefore, although the elementary enrollment for next year is less than the current year, the high school enrollment increases. In combining both schools, it can be seen that the total enrollment will again increase. Although in and out migration affects predictions based upon enrollment projections, the trend, neverthe-

less, is for increasing numbers of boys and girls to be educated in our schools.

**SCHOOL FACILITIES:** The citizens of Hinsdale have again demonstrated their intention of providing the best possible educational program for their children. The addition of an auditorium-gymnasium and appurtenant facilities greatly enhances the opportunity for an improved program. The School Board and the School Planning Committee are also to be commended for the long hours and dedicated service they have given to the task of providing this addition to the high school.

EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM: A year ago, I indicated certain areas which were in need of attention. Among these needs were special education for intellectually retarded, physical education for high school boys and girls, driver education, and elementary school library services. In every case, except the last, we are now offering these services. Progress is indeed being made.

In order to expand and improve our educational offerings to boys and girls, it is recommended that the seventh grade be moved into the secondary school. Home Economics, Industrial Arts, Physical Education, and Art are offerings which can be effectively offered to these pupils. An expensive facility like an auditorium-gymnasium demands that it be as fully utilized as possible. Specialized services which are available in a high school program will reach a larger number of pupils in a 6-6 school organization.

In thinking back over the past five years, it becomes clear that Hinsdale has taken giant strides in meeting the demands of our complex age. The citizens of Hinsdale should take pride in their accomplishments but, at the same time, guard against complacency. Although the price tag at times seems unbearable, the dividends received from investing in education benefits the whole comunity.

Again, Iwish to express my sincere gratitude to the principals and teachers, pupils and parents, the School Board and

School Planning Committee, and the patrons of our schools for their understanding and cooperation.
