You are hereby notified to meet at Town House in said Lee on Tuesday, the eighth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for same.
3. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$400 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.
4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the construction of the Trunk Line Highway.
5. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of State Aid Highways.
6. To see if the Town will vote to build a cement bridge with State Aid and raise and appropriate a sum of money therefor.

7. To see if the Town will vote to close (subject to gates and bars) the road leading from Perry L. Harvey's to the main road near the residence of the late George Warren.

8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance of highways.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT.

To the School Board of Lee:

As I came to your District in October this report must deal with your schools as I found them at that time, and it will necessarily be brief.

The school houses show that you have been making an effort to keep them up to the standard set by the State. The lighting in the North Lee school house is good, although I would plan in the others to take the light from the east and south, as the west and north sides are exposed to the cold winds. The Lee Hill school house has windows on both sides thus giving cross lights. This is also true of the South Lee school house. Your former superintendent called your attention to this last year. I urge that in one of these houses the windows be changed this year. This will not be a heavy tax, and I feel confident that the good people of Lee will respond to reasonable suggestions made for the physical well-being of your pupils.

The following is a list of the teachers and number of pupils in your schools:

South Lee, Miss Edna Merrill,	22 pupils
Lee Hill, Miss Edwina Bagley,	33 pupils
North Lee, Mrs. Ruth Monroe,	18 pupils

The attendance has not been good as the whooping cough and other sickness has prevented many pupils from attending school. This remarkably warm winter with no bad storms has helped the attendance, and I hope for a creditable report for the year.

The instruction and discipline has been very good. The teachers are interested and have had good preparation for their work. Your School Board is intelligent

and deeply interested in the work of the schools, and I feel very grateful for its assistance to me, and the people of the town may be confident that the affairs of your schools will be administered wisely and prudently.

By the teachers' registers I find there were two pupils who had a perfect attendance for the year 1925-1926: Barbara James and Charles Mills. An important factor in making for success in life is to be punctual in meeting one's appointments, and I trust there may be many more who will be on this honor list next year.
