#### WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING TOWN OF MADBURY, N. H.

March 14, 1961

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Madbury, County of Strafford, and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Madbury on Tuesday, the 14th day of March A. D. at 8:00 o'clock in the evening to act upon the following articles.

ARTICLE 1. To choose the following Town Officers.

A town clerk for the ensuing year.

A selectman for the ensuing three years.

A treasurer for the ensuing year.

A collector of taxes for the ensuing year.

Two auditors for the ensuing year.

A trustee of trust funds for the ensuing three years.

ARTICLE 2. To choose all other town officers.

ARTICLE 3. To see of the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

ARTICLE 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$321.42 for Class V highways to match the sum of \$2,142.79 to be contributed by the State.

ARTICLE 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for construction of the Huckins Road.

ARTICLE 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$70.00 for the Seacoast Regional Development Association.

- ARTICLE 7. To see what action the Town will take to raise and appropriate the sum of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for the purchase of new fire hose.
- ARTICLE 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of eight hundred dollars (\$800.00) to remodel the Fire House.
- ARTICLE 9. To see what action the Town will take to raise and appropriate one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) to purchase a push frame and blade to be used for snow removal.
- ARTICLE 10. To see what action the Town will take on the proposed budget for the current year.
- ARTICLE 11. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees, or officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- ARTICLE 12. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

#### RECORD OF TOWN MEETING

March 8, 1960

#### ARTICLE 1. Balloting for town officers:

For Town Clerk for the ensuing year, Edna P. Twombly had 23 votes and was declared elected. The oath of office was administered by Moderator, Kenneth S. Morrow.

For Selectman for the ensuing three years, it was voted that the Clerk should cast one ballot for Paul M. Raynes, and this being done, Paul M. Raynes was declared elected.

For Treasurer for the ensuing year, voted that the Clerk should east one ballot for Loretta J. Morrow and, this being done, Loretta J. Morrow was declared elected.

For Collector of Taxes for the ensuing year, voted that the Clerk should east one ballot for Dorothy S. Dugan and, this being done, Dorothy S. Dugan was declared elected.

For Auditors for the ensuing year, voted that the Clerk should cast one ballot for Charles S. Jennison and Henry W. Corrow and, this being done, the two were declared elected.

For Trustee of Trust Funds for the ensuing three years, voted that the Clerk should cast one ballot for Harold S. Jones and, this being done, Harold S. Jones was declared elected.

ARTICLE 2. Voted that the Selectmen be empowered to appoint all other necessary town officers.

- ARTICLE 3. Voted that the Selectmen and Town Treasurer be authorized to borrow a sum or sums not exceeding in the aggregate \$7500 in anticipation of the collection of taxes for the ensuing municipal year, and to issue in the name of and on the credit of the town negotiable notes therefor, said notes to be paid in the current municipal year from taxes collected during the current municipal year. Vote, yes, 35.
- ARTICLE 4. Voted to raise and appropriate \$332.41 for Class V highways to match the sum of \$2216.09 to be contributed by the state.
- ARTICLE 5. Voted to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding \$2548.50 for the purpose of making improvements to the following Class V roads within the Town: Perkins and Hayes, such sums to be raised through the issuance of bonds or notes under and in compliance with the provisions of Chapter 83, Laws of 1951 as amended by Chapter 31, Laws of 1955, and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the date and place of payment of such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such steps as may be necessary to negotiate such bonds or notes as shall be to the best interests of the Town of Madbury.
- ARTICLE 6. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1000 for construction of the Huckins Road.
- ARTICLE 7. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25 to be expended in cooperation with the New Hampshire Forestry and Recreation Commission for the opening and maintaining of trails and old roads for forest fire protection. The New Hampshire Forestry and Recreation Commission to provide a matching sum not in excess of \$25 for this purpose.
- ARTICLE 8. Tabled an article to raise \$70 for the Seacoast Regional Development Association.

- ARTICLE 9. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100 for the purchase of new fire hose, said \$100 to purchase approximately 300 ft. of 1½ inch hose.
- ARTICLE 10. Voted to allow the Madbury Volunteer Fire Department to construct an 18 ft. by 30 ft. addition on the south end of the present Fire Station.
- ARTICLE 11. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$800 for an addition to the present Fire Station.
- ARTICLE 12. Voted that the Moderator shall appoint a committee of five to act with the directors of the building code to study the matter of putting a basement beneath the Town Hall to house the furnace, toilet facilities and record storage, the committee to report at the next annual Town Meeting whether they consider the project practical and the estimated cost.
- ARTICLE 13. Voted to authorize the service organizations of the town to improve the kitchen of the Town Hall, subject to the approval of the selectmen.
- ARTICLE 14. Approved a total budget of \$17,492.41, exclusive of school appropriations.
- ARTICLE 15. No reports made.
- ARTICLE 16. Voted to recommend that the 1961 annual Town Meeting be held in the evening, the time and place to be set by the selectmen.

Mr. John Kelly spoke on traffic conditions at the corner of the Pudding Hill Road and the need of warning signs. Mr. Cole announced that the selectmen would take steps to have signs erected.

#### FIRE DEPARTMENT REPORT

To the Citizens of Madbury:

Your Fire Department continued to improve through 1960.

The Fire station was remodeled on a plan that was considered more economical than the one proposed at the last town meeting. It was decided to house both trucks in the present building. All alterations were done with Fire Department funds, leaving the Building appropriation intact.

It is expected the Fire Department will make another proposal for improvement of the Fire station at Town Meeting.

The equipment is in good operating condition. The only improvement is the continued addition of 1½ inch hose.

Our greatest loss and only building fire was the Clement house. In all other fires, losses were very slight.

Grass, forest, and debris fires continue to be most frequent, with careless disposal of smoking materials, and careless debris burning the causes. The advent of modern heating and cooking apliances, while doing away with hazards, such as chimney fires, etc., has created new hazards with the use of electrical circuits and volatile fuels. Good maintenance and careful operation can keep danger at a minimum.
