CONSERVATION COMMISSION REPORT, 1969 and 1970

In April, 1969, the Commission was very fortunate in having an illustrated lecture given by Clement Lyons, New Hampshire Soil Conservationist and Ted Kelsey, Community Planning Specialist. They stressed the fact that all town groups be informed as to the extent of the resources in Rollinsford. These included natural resources (water, land, trees, etc.) and the nature of the population (about people, where they work, their interests in the Town, etc.). An interesting fact emerged from this lecture, the Town of Rollinsford at this time has approximately two and one-half acres of open space per person.

With all the efforts being made today in the direction of protecting our open spaces and natural resources, we are indeed fortunate. However, with the rapid change and population growth that is currently taking place in Southeastern New Hampshire, it is indeed important for all of us to be alert if we wish to keep Rollinsford a town in which we are proud to live.

As an Arbor Day project, the Commission planted one hundred and fifty white spruce and other seedlings at the rear of the old town cemetery. These were provided by the New Hampshire Forestry Department at no charge.

In May, the Commission arranged to have nine "October Glory" maple trees planted on Main Street between Locust and Foundry Streets, replacing those cut down. The citizens nearby were most cooperative in watering them.

Members of the Commission attended all Planning Board Meetings.

In 1970, Roto-tilling and replacing of seedling was done. Two flowering Crabapple Trees were given to the Garden Club for the landscaping of the Historical monument at the site of the Sullivan School House on Robert's Road. Under study, plans for replacing threes on Silver Street in the area of new road constuction, and maples damaged and dead on Main Street.

The Rollinsford Sewer District treatment plant has been in operation since May 1, 1969. Its object is to reduce the raw sewage to a minimum amount of removable sludge and to return the liquid to the river in a purified condition.

The plant, designed to treat 288,000 gallons per day is now processing about 150,000 gallons daily. The Commissioners are presently studying the feasibility of expanding the district and there is an article in the District Warrant for that purpose.

The Commission is aware of an 'odor' problem and steps are being taken to alleviate the condition.

Visitors are welcome at the Plant and the Superintendent will be pleased to conduct tours and explain the operation.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Rollinsford Grade School in said district on the 6th day of April 1971, at 7:30 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
- 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

It is again with pleasure that I present to you a report that covers in part some of the activities of the Rollinsford Grade School during the past year.

RESPONSIBILITY OF THE SCHOOL.

In accomplishing its purpose of educating for well rounded citizenship, the school is not alone in its efforts. The Home, The Church and other community agencies share this great responsibility. Schools are established to teach those essentials not taught by other agencies of society. If one of these other agencies fails in its duty toward the education of the child, the responsibility falls upon the school. thereby increasing its already heavy responsibility. Schools began originally with the introduction and wide use of written language, and in the beginning the curriculum was limited to reading, writing. and arithmetic. Cultural advancements and changes in our way of living brought new things to be taught, new methods to be employed, new devices to be used, great expansion of the things to be taught, together with the broadening, and deepening of the scope of the elementary school curriculum. Today because of the ever increasing amount of knowledge that is available, material that was formerly taught in high schools, and in some cases on the graduate level in college is now being taught in the elementary school. The result is that our equipment needs have been and steadily increasing from year to year, in order that we may best help the pupils to successfully compete with youngsters of other areas.

No other people has ever expected so much of its schools, and no other people has ever been so well served by its schools. The amount of education required for complete living has greatly increased while the educational service rendered by the home and some community agencies has declined substantially. As a result, the schools responsibility has increased disproportionately.

The public schools have primary responsibility for some phases of education, partial responsibility for other phases of education, and an over-all responsibility for educational leadership in the community. However the school can effectively assume its role only when it is supplied with the tools with which to work. If tools are lacking then the efforts of the school are curtailed and circumscribed by this lack. Of course the results are observable in that the pupil cannot compete successfully with his peer groups.

- (1) The phases of education for which the school has primary responsibility include reading, handwriting, arithmetic, spelling, and the basic essentials of oral and written composition, the social studies, and science. Reading is an important primary responsibility of the school. Legible handwriting, and proficiency in arithmetic for ordinary needs, and the ability to spell one's written vocabulary are also essential elements of education for which the schools accept primary responsibility. The basic elements of the social studies and science together with a working proficiency in the use of English are also primary responsibilities of the school.
- (2) Responsibility for some phases of education are shared jointly and in varying degrees by the school and other educational agencies (home, church, community, movies, television, and radio and press).

These shared responsibilities include vocational fitness and the broad outcomes of general education such as the American Way of Life, scientific attitude of mind, health and safety, consumer competence, conservation, scology, thrift and family living, the arts, and moral, ethical, and spiritual values. These shared outcomes include also proficiency in the worthy use of leisure time.

(3) The school has a community-wide responsibility for educational leadership. It supports and encourages other educational agencies in the performance of their established educational functions in order to provide a well-rounded educational program for the community as a whole.

These three responsibilities of the school are not separate and These three responsibilities of the school are not separate and apart, but are interrelated. They operate at the same time. The school, however, sees all three of these functions clearly and strives not alone but with the active aid of the other educational agencies, to perform each of them well. Unless the school performs well the first function (1) it cannot perform well the second (2); and unless the first two efficiently, it cannot perform the third and provide an adequate educational leadership for the community as a whole.

The general aim of elementary education, like the aims of education as a whole is the fullest development of each child to the utmost of the child's own abilities. The child himself must assume responsibility for his own actions and aims for furthering himself along the educational way. The day is long gone when the school could be considered a place for fun and games.

Modern elementary school is concerned with helping each child to affect a behavioral change of each of the following types:

Knowledge and understanding

Skill and competence Attitudes and Interests

FACULTY

There have been several changes in the faculty of the Rollinsford Grade School during the past year. Mrs. Mary Mittlestadt retired from active teaching to devote her full time to the car of her home. She was replaced by Mrs. Philip Chagnon who came well recommended and is teaching one-half of the third grade section in the fields of Language Arts, Reading, and Social Studies. Mrs. Chagnon teaches for a half day in the mornings. The balance of the day is covered by Mr. Hatfield.

Because of the large number of pupils in the third grade last year, It was necessary to split it and a new teacher Mrs. Malinda Lash was hired to take over the second section. Mrs. Lash came to us well recommended and with four years of prior teaching experience. She is teaching full time in the fourth grade.

Mrs. Marjorie Conway is teaching remedial reading for us on a part-time basis. She is with us two full days a week and has been carrying on her work in a very creditable and acceptable manner. She has had four years of teaching outside the Town of Rollinsford and came to us well recommended.

We share the services of Mrs. Nancy Sterling with other sections of the Union. Mrs. Sterling spends one full day per week with us. She is doing a very competent job as a speech therapist and filling a long felt need.

A very pressing need for a teacher in the Special Education field became apparent during the past year. This position is being capably filled at the present time by Mrs. Judy Konczeski who has some considerable experience in this field of work. She is handling her classes competently in this field.

As an adjunct to the music teaching (vocal) Mr. C. Carville is presently engaged in giving music leassons (instrumental) to many of the schools pupils.

HOT LUNCH PROGRAM

The hot lunch program of the school is under the management of Mrs. Kathaleen R. Burke, sided by Mrs. Rose Roberts and Mrs. Omer Morest. These ladies are charged with the preparation and serving of the noon meal. They handle their assignments in a very capable and efficient manner with menus that are well prepared, well balanced, and appealing. Of economic necessity, we are somewhat limited in the offerings that can be made. A Waldorf-Astoria we aren't.

Each meal is a Type A meal consisting of:

(1) (2) (3) (4) (5) A main dish (of meat, or poultry, or fish, or cheese)

A Vegetable

A sandwich of some sort. (Either sweet or plain)

A ½ pt. of Homogenized, Pasteurized milk

A dessert

Cost per lunch per child - 30¢ per day.

The number of meals served varies from day to day and from week to week.

The average number of pupil meals served per day is 190 or roughly 67% of the school.

SUMMARY REPORT

OF

Special Education Class

The class consists of two children. The two pupils are on two different levels academically, so they are following two separate schedules with integration in the areas of science, social studies and language development. The daily schedule consists of language development, math, science, social studies and reading. One pupil has two additional subjects of speech and sentence patterning. Both pupils integrate with the second grade during gym and music. The older pupil joins the fourth grade for gym. Mrs. Lord from the second grade teaches art one day a week to my class at which time I teach spelling to her class.

To aid in the social adjustment of my pupils I have taken a slow group in math from the fourth grade. I had hoped that further integration with peers would be a controlling and motivating device for them. Although each of the four students that join us are working individually on varying levels, they have some social contact. After limited time the project seems to be working, although I am cautiously optimistic. To further aid in social adjustment, we produce plays from some Language stories and act them out for the second grade. This seems to be a motivating device to use correct speech, an area that both have considerable difficulty with. We also take occasional trips to reinforce learning of a certain subject area.

In general, the pupils are being exposed to material appropriate to their level with emphasis for one on Language development and sentence patterning. The emphasis for the other pupil is placed on acquiring basic skills in reading and math.

Gentlemen:

Submitted herewith is the report of the annual examination and audit of the accounts of the Rollinsford School District for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1970, which was made by this Division in accordance with the vote of the District. Exhibits hereafter listed are included as part of the report.

SCOPE OF AUDIT

Included in the examination and audit were the accounts and records of the School Board, School District Treasurer, and the School Lunch Program.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Comparative Balance Sheets: (Exhibit A-1)

Comparative Balance Sheets as of June 30, 1969, and June 30, 1970, are presented in Exhibit A-1. As indicated therein the Net Debt decreased by \$17,962.92, from \$105,768.16 to \$87,805.24, during the fiscal year ended June 30, 1970.

Analysis of Change in Financial Condition: (Exhibit A-2)

An analysis of the change in financial condition of the School District during the fiscal year ended June 30, 1970, is made in Exhibit A-2, with the factors which caused the change indicated therein.

These were as follows:

<u>Comparative Statements of Appropriations and Expenditures - Estimated</u> <u>and Actual Revenues</u>: (Exhibits A-3 & A-4)

Comparative statements of appropriations and expendi-

tures, estimated and actual revenues for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1970, as presented in Exhibits A-3 and A-4. As indicated by the Budget Summary (Exhibit A-4), a net unexpended balance of appropriations of \$346.27, plus a revenue surplus of \$11,848.47, resulted in a net budget surplus of \$12,194.74.

Summary Statement of Receipts and Expenditures: (Exhibit B-1)

A summary statement of receipts and expenditures for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1970, made up in accordance with the uniform classification of accounts, is included in Exhibit B-1. Proof of the Treasurer's balance as of June 30, 1970, is indicated in Exhibit B-2.

School Lunch Program: (Exhibit C)

A statement of the School Lunch Program account is included in Exhibit C.

School Tax Accounts: (Exhibit D)

A statement of the School Tax account with the Town of Rollinsford is presented in Exhibit D. As indicated therein, at June 30, 1970, the School District had received from the Town the total amount of the 1969-70 School Tax of \$237,977.46, plus the balance of \$0.02 due the District on account of the 1968-69 School Tax.

Bonded Indebtness: (Exhibit E)

A statement of the outstanding bonded indebtedness of the District, as of June 30, 1970, showing annual debt service requirements, is contained in Exhibit E.

GENERAL COMMENTS

Current Surplus:

The current surplus (excess of total assets over current liabilities) increased by \$7,962.92, from \$4,231.84 to \$12,194.76, during the fiscal year ended June 30, 1970, as shown herewith.

Expenditures Made During Year For Purposes Not Included in Approved Budget:

As indicated in the Comparative Statement of Appropriations and Expenditures (Exhibit A-3), expenditures of \$2,661.00 were made during the fiscal year for Capital Outlay - Sites, a purpose for which appropriations had not been provided for in the 1969-70 School District budget

In this connection, we direct your attention to the provisions of R.S.A. 32:10, Municipal Budget Law, which the Town of Rollinsford has adopted. This statute prohibits the expenditure of 92

funds by the School Board for any purpose for which an appropriation has not been made. If an emergency arises during the year, which necessitates making an expenditure not provided for in the approved budget, R.S.A. 32:10-a requirs that the School Board, with the written approval of a majority of the budget committee, apply to the State Board of Education for authority to make such an expenditure.

We did not find evidence that the latter requirement was complied with in this instance.

Conclusion:

The provisions of Chapter 184 of the Laws of 1955 require that the auditors' summary of findings and recommendations (letter of transmittal) shall be published in the next annual report of the School District. Publication of the Exhibits contained in the audit report is optional, at the discretion of the School Board.

We extend our thanks to the officials of the Rollinsford School District for their assistance during the course of the audit.
