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## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Sanbornton in the County of Belknap in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Sanbornton on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations for the same.
3. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid for the construction of Class V roads and raise, appropriate or set aside for said purpose the sum of \$860.13.
4. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to purchase road equipment and raise and appropriate money for the same
5. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the town through Tax Collector's deeds.
6. To see what action the town will take in regard to discount on early payment of taxes.
7. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire such sums and amounts as necessary to defray town charges in anticipation of taxes.
8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for White Pine Blister Rust Control. By request.
9. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the Laconia Hospital. By request.

10. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the decoration of soldiers' graves and the proper observance of Memorial Day.

11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$82.00, which is 1/100th of 1% of the assessed valuation of the town, to the Lakes Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the town, in cooperation with other towns in the Lakes Region.

12. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the use of the Winnisquam Fire Department.

13. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

By vote at the annual meeting of the Company held January 7, 1901, policy holders wishing to remain away longer than thirty days may keep the insurance on their property good by applying to the secretary for a permit to leave premises unoccupied for such times as they may specify, paying for the same five cents per month for every one hundred dollars for which they are insured.

The cash premium for permits has been reduced from five to three cents per month.

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**REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS**

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I respectfully submit my second annual report as Superintendent of Schools for the Town of Sanbornton. This report covers the calendar year of 1946.

Fluctuation in pupil population and location has created many administrative problems in the year just closed. Coupled with the necessity of finding a new carrier for the Bay area and of opening the Square School because of increased enrollment, the Board and the Superintendent have been faced with many problems that have necessitated much time and attention. The schools were fortunate to obtain the services of Mrs. Anne Abbott as teacher of the Square School. Mrs. Abbott has had many years of experience on the elementary level.

A splendid site located in Sanbornton Square was purchased in conjunction with the authorizing vote of the School District. It is hoped that plans may be prepared for submission to the voters at the School District meeting. A thoroughly modern well-equipped, centralized school should do much to improve the educational program for Sanbornton's children. It will be easier to hold competent teachers when the more desirable environment is provided. While the cost of such a project may require special enabling legislation, as a long-term investment in community betterment, such a forward step seems thoroughly desirable.

A new reading system has been introduced in the first six grades of Sanbornton Schools and should do much to improve the program in elementary reading.

The School Board is to be commended for the attractive redecoration of the Gaza and Bay schools during the summer session.

It is a privilege and pleasure to work with the members of the Sanbornton School Board and teachers of the Sanbornton schools.
