REPORT OF PROGRESS by your Selectmen

Another year has passed and a report due you on the financial status of your Town and outlining, as briefly as possible, what has been accomplished by your Town Officials during the past year and what we believe should be attempted in 1959.

In compliance with the mandates given us by the 1958 Town Meeting your Selectmen have carried out the following projects, most of them to completion:

The aerial photomaps of the Town have been mounted and placed on a display rack in the Library where they may be seen by anyone during regular Library hours or, by special arrangement with the Librarian or Selectmen, at some other convenient time. A start has been made to develop these maps into property tax maps.

Work on the water hole at Stoddard Center has been completed except, perhaps, for a few minor changes that may be found desirable. This project, together with several others required by the Board of Fire Underwriters, has provided better fire protection for the Town and has resulted in lower fire insurance rates for all owners of property.

Center Pond road has been partially widened, graded, and some gravel put on. The work is not complete and additional work will be required in the future.

Shedd Hill Road has been partly black-topped and should have a seal-coat applied and some finish-up work done on the shoulders. The remaining surface should be blacktopped when funds become available.

The land deeded to the Town by Trevor Price for a public landing has been cleared and graded but will require some further work before it is in proper condition. Additional work should be done at the other public landings and money for this purpose has been included in the Budget.

All employees of the Town, while engaged in their official duties, are now covered by compensation insurance which was initiated during 1958.

For the year 1959 and extending into future years your Selectmen foresee the necessity for increased appropriations for the building and maintenance of new roads to serve the fastgrowing developments bordering on our several lakes.

We believe that the condition of a number of unusable structures along our highways detract from the appearance of our Town. While they may not constitute fire hazards they definitely reduce the sales value of nearby properties, reflecting in lower tax valuations and consequent loss of revenue to the Town.

Government surplus equipment which would be of great use to the Town is sometimes available through Civil Defense at a considerable saving in cost. We have included in the Budget an item of \$250 for the purchase of such equipment as may be useful to the Town.

The owner of the land upon which the Town Dump is located has requested its removal to another location at an early date. We have two other areas in prospect and have included in the Budget an item of \$800 for the purchase or rental of a new location and for properly covering the old location.

We have been advised by the Town Counsel, and by rulings of the State Tax Commission, that the plowing of private driveways without proper charge for labor and use of Town equipment is illegal and must be discontinued. Accordingly, we have inserted an Article in the Warrant covering the matter and requiring action at the Town Meeting.

In our 1957 Report we called attention to the probable necessity of increasing the salaries of assessing officials because of the additional time required each year to make the assessments of land and buildings in the new developments. In the Budget for 1959 we have included a sum to cover increases in the pay of all salaried Town Officers as the work of everyone has increased and their present pay is inadequate.

In closing our Report of Progress we wish to thank our citizens and summer residents for their cooperation and help. Without this our burden would be greatly increased.

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Stoddard in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Stoddard on Tuesday, the Tenth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

3. To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise for Highways and Bridges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.

4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for Snow Removal for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.

5. To see what action the Town wishes to take with respect to the plowing of private driveways.

6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Hundred Eighty-four Dollars and Forty-eight Cents (\$284.48) for T. R. A.

7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the general expenses of the Highway Department.

8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for the Fire Department, to be spent as follows: \$1,000 for general maintenance and \$500.00 for repairs to the Fire Station.

10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of public landings.

11. To see if the Town will vote to raise the pay of salaried Town Officers by, at least Fifty percent (50%), and appropriate the necessary money for the same.

12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Sixty-eight Dollars (\$68.00) to advertise the Town, said money to be paid to the Monadnock Region Association, for this purpose.

13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) for Civil Defense, to be spent by the Civil Defense Director with the approval of the Selectmen.

14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Fifty-five Dollars (\$55.00) as its fair share of the operating costs of the Elliot Community Hospital.

15. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for street lights.

16. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of the Library.

17. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to provide a water supply to the Town Hall, together with well, piping, tank, pump, and fixtures in Kitchen and new Toilets; complete with drains and septic tank; or take any other action relating thereto.

18. To see what action the Town will take relative to closing the present Town Dump and relocating the same by authorizing the Selectmen to make the necessary arrangements to acquire a new location by purchase or lease. (*The present Town Dump must be closed and covered by request of the owner of the land.*) 19. To see if the Town will vote to accept the provisions of the Municipal Budget Act.

20. To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting and raise money to cover the expense of such an audit.

21. To see if the Town will vote to request the State Tax Commission to make a complete reappraisal of land and buildings within the Town to equalize valuation in accordance with the law and raise money for this purpose.

22. To see if the Town will vote to request the State Legislature to change the name of Island Pond in Stoddard to Foster Lake, or take any other action relating thereto.

23. To hear the reports of Committees and take any action thereon.

24. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Spring cleaning of the Cemeteries was done and grass in the New and Robb Cemeteries mowed. The other much-needed work in all of the Cemeteries could not be done because of the continuing shortage of labor.

It seems likely that there will be no increase in available local labor in the foreseeable future and that the Trustees will be forced to employ out-of-town labor, if possible, if the Cemeteries are to be given proper care. This will probably result in greater expense if only the minimum amount of work is done and too much of a drain on our funds to do more.

- 10. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Stoddard:

It is a pleasure to present my fifth annual report for your consideration.

The enrollment at the Stoddard Central School no longer gives us concern for the lack of pupils; in fact, it gives us some concern because of its growth. The December 1st enrollment is as follows:

GradeI	4	Grade V	4
Grade II	4	Grade VI	3
Grade III	4	Grade VII	2
Grade IV	3	Grade VIII	0

This is an increase of eight over two years ago. With none graduating this year, three expected in the first grade next year, and a proposed increase during this present school year, it may be well to take a good look at our educational problems and discuss the possibilities of solving them.

The Board and I attended a meeting in Keene in November with the Junior High School Administrators and Board members from other pupil-sending districts and were quite frankly told that pupils coming into their school did not measure up scholastically with the products of their own school. Thus our pupils were finding it hard to cope with their new environment.

You and I do not have to be told of the many advantages of attending a one-room school. However, we also recognize the disadvantages of a teacher having to prepare for approximately 32 classes a day and being able to devote about ten minutes to each class. Naturally she needs a great deal of pupil help with her teaching and the older children find themselves spending time teaching the younger children materials which they have already covered when they should be working on new materials of their own.

There are several ways of coping with our growing pupil enrollment, but I shall deal with but two of them here.

One is to increase the facilities in order to split the grades into two sections and provide another teacher.

The second is to give consideration of a plan to send the seventh and eighth grades out on a tuition basis for their junior high work, thus cutting down both the pupil and preparation load of the teacher. It is not pleasant to be confronted by problems, but it seems quite apparent that Stoddard is a growing community and is going to be faced with a school problem. Whether the two suggestions above are the answers or not, is not important; they are merely stated here as a starting point for discussion and it is up to the citizens of Stoddard to work out what they feel will best provide for the education of their children.

CIVIL DEFENSE AIR RAID INSTRUCTIONS

Alert/Warning YELLOW Signal (attack probable)

Warning signal: A steady blast of 3 to 5 minutes on sirens, whistles, horns etc.

What to do: 1. Tune your AM radio to a CONELRAD station (640 or 1240) for emergency instructions.

- 2. Obey local Civil Defense instructions.
- 3. Prepare to receive evacuees into your homes.
- 4. Do not use telephones unnecessarily.
- 5. Do not drive private vehicles (except on civil defense assignments.)
- 6. Do not attempt to purchase food or other supplies.

Take Cover/Warning RED Signal

(attack imminent - enemy approaching)

Warning signal: Wailing tone or series of short blasts for 3 minutes.

What to do:

At Home: Get into your home shelter immediately. If you have none, shut all outside doors and windows and take cover in the basement or an interior first-floor room.

Outdoors: Seek the best available shelter.

- Stay put: Until you get word to come out.
- **Important:** If you see a bright flash of light, take cover instantly and protect your eyes.

No warning:

(an enemy strike has been made)

Warning signal: (Take Cover/Warning RED signal will be sounded) wailing tone or series of short blasts for 3 minutes.

What to do: (same actions as for "Take Cover/Warning RED," above.)

All Clear/Warning WHITE signal

(danger from attack and fallout has ended)

Warning signal: Series of steady blasts of 30 second duration with 2 minutes of silence between.

- What to do: 1. Come out from shelters, basements, etc. upon direction of local Civil Defense authorities.
 - 2. Assist Civil Defense staff whenever possible.

REMEMBER: Your knowledge and work in Civil Defense will benefit you, your family, and your community.
