TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Bedford in the County of Hillsborough, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March, next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- Article 1. To bring forward your ballots for the necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year and the ensuing three years.
- Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriations for the same.
- Article 3. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of the poor, and assistance to the aged.
- Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$6,000.00 for the maintenance of highways and bridges, and for any other necessary expense of the Town.
- Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes up to the sum of \$15,000.00 if needed.
- Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the Town Library.

- Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$20.00 for the care of the clock on the church.
- Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$910.45 for the construction of Class V highways, the State to contribute \$3,641.81.
- Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,000.00 for the tarring of Class V highways, under the direction of the Selectmen.
- Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for Memorial Day and patriotic purposes.
- Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the care of the New Cemetery; \$25.00 for pumping water for same; \$50.00 for the care of Joppa Cemetery; \$10.00 for the care of the Old Cemetery on The Back River Road; and \$15.00 for the care of the Beals Cemetery.
- Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 for the purchase of a new fire truck and in addition, authorize the selectmen to expend the \$4,000.00 in the Capital Reserve Fund previously established for this purpose.
- Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to establish a Temporary Honor Roll or Memorial to the sons of Bedford serving in the armed forces during World War II or take any action thereto.
- Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to establish four (4) additional street lights to be located as follows: one at the corner of Swan Avenue and Johnson Avenue, one at a point midway between the residence of Mr. L. E. Bagley and the existing light at the top of Daley Hill so-called, and one at each of the two locations previously abandoned on Worthley Hill.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to accept \$100.00 in trust from Hattie Beane, the interest from which to be expended for the care of lot No. 94 in Bedford Center Cemetery.

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to accept \$200.00 in trust from Mr. and Mrs. Charles Lenz, the interest to be expended for the care of lots No. 164 and No. 165 in Bedford Center Cemetery.

To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees and of other officers heretofore chosen, and to transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Town Auditors were elected to serve as School Auditors. A resolution was brought forward to change age requirements for school entrance to coincide with Manchester schools, thereby allowing children who are $5\frac{1}{2}$ to enter school.

Amount necessary to balance the school budget was \$27,297.59. This was voted.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

Bedford, New Hampshire, February 18, 1946

To the School Board and Citizens of the Town of Bedford:

I herewith submit my fifth annual report as Superintendent of Schools.

The shortage of teachers still continues, not only in New Hampshire, but throughout the country. The supply is certainly nowhere near equal to the demand. We have been very fortunate in securing experienced teachers from Manchester. At the opening of the school year, we decided not to fill the position which Mrs. Remick had held for the past two years. We rearranged the grades so that two teachers could do the work in the Stevens Buswell school. We changed the admission age so that two extra children were added to the first grade. Others moved in so that our first grade last fall numbered fourteen. This made the lower grades room overcrowded, thirty-four in all. It made far too many for a room under the four grade organization.

An attempt was made to combine the Peter Woodbury school with Stevens Buswell. The lower grade room at Peter Woodbury was very small—only seventeen pupils. The upper grade room at Peter Woodbury numbered twenty-seven, while the Stevens Buswell upper grade room was only twenty-one. This would have made a very good combination with a school of two grades to each teacher. After a public hearing on the matter, conducted by the School Board, it was decided that the combination of the two schools was not expedient at this time. At the present

time the lower grade room at Peter Woodbury numbers thirteen. Consequently the same problem continues and I am still convinced that it would be far better to combine these two centers.

A glance at the enrollment table connected with this report shows that the total enrollment last year at the same time was one hundred forty-two against one hundred forty-five this year. The Donald Street enrollment is small in the lower grades but large in the upper grades. There is no problem of crowding at this school. Miss Grace Driscoll left at the end of the last school year to take a much better position in Massachusetts. We were sorry that we could not keep her at Donald Street. She was an excellent teacher. After considerable difficulty, with three other teachers, we finally secured the services of Mrs. Eleanor Connors, of Manchester, who is proving very satisfactory and who expects to remain with us another year.

The over crowded condition of the first four grades at Stevens Buswell was remedied by employing Mrs. Isham on a half time basis. In spite of the small number in the upper grades it may be wise to reorganize the Stevens Buswell school on the former basis of three full time teachers. Sixteen pupils graduated from the eighth grade last June. The whole number entered High School. We expect next year at least ninety-three pupils in High School. This number may be a little larger.

The question has been asked, why not have a Bedford High School. The answer is, ninety to one hundred pupils is too small a number for an up-to-date high school. While there are many high schools in New Hampshire smaller than this, they cannot give the training that is required under modern conditions. Therefore, unless there are great changes, a Bedford high school is not a practical solution to our problem. Our pupils are all doing satisfactory work at the Manchester West and Manchester Central High Schools. During the school year we have tried to work out a plan whereby the Bedford schools can give some work

in manual training. It may be possible within a year or two to add this department to our public schools.

The general outlook for this year is good. We have a class of eighteen to graduate in June. With one or two exceptions, all these plan to enter high school. In closing I wish to thank the School Board, teachers and many other people who have contributed of their time and effort to the success of our schools.
