

SELECTMEN'S REPORT

The auditors report that the Town of Bridgewater is again in good fiscal condition for 1980. Revenues in excess of estimates were \$6,676 while expenditures exceeded appropriations by \$3,171 resulting in a budget surplus of \$3,505. The unreserved general fund balance as of December 31,1980 stands at \$8,269.

Weather conditions during the winter of 1980 were very difficult for the highway department. Lack of sufficient snow cover resulted in frozen culverts with icy road conditions and subsequent washouts late in the spring.

An unsafe condition of the rails and approaches to the bridge over Clay Brook at the foot of Bridgewater Hill Rd necessitated a considerable expense of time and funds. Steel guard rails replaced wooden ones, drainage was improved and the embankment on the down stream side of the bridge was riprapped to prevent further erosion of the concrete wing walls.

The Selectmen and the members of the Bridgewater Fire Brigade want to thank each and every individual who donated money towards the purchase of the new fire truck. The total now stands at \$5,892.

An article has been included in the warrant for an appropriation for improvements to the Grange Hall. An emergency due to an unsafe condition of the original furnace brought about the installation of a new system. The new furnance has been installed in the woodshed portion of the hall. Additional work planned would include rewiring the building, insulation and foundation work.

Article # 9 of the warrant, which is by petition, is to urge the General Court to adopt a resolution providing for a mandatory limit on increase of property taxes in the State.

The Selectmen of Bridgewater are unanamously opposed to the adoption of this article because the authors of this absurdity have little or no knowledge of the principals of municipal finances. We therefore urge careful consideration of the consequences.

1. To choose a Selectman for three (3) years and all other necessary Town Officers.

2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$552.42 for TRA, provided that the State contributes the sum of \$3,682.82.

3. To see if the Town will vote to expend the 1981 State Highway Subsidy fund in the amount of \$11,240.00 for Town construction.

4. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to Rease and appropriate for General Expenses as estimated in the budget.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$6,000.00 for building improvements.

6. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate eight thousand dollars (\$8,000.00) for a 3/4 ton 4 wheel drive pickup truck complete with plow and frame and authorize the withdrawal of the amount required for this purpose from the Federal Revenue Sharing Fund.

7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize withdrawal from the Federal Revenue Sharing Fund for use against the following debt service.

Purpose

1977 Highway Garage Note \$4,000.00

8. Be it resolved that the Town of Bridgewater will elect to approve town employees joining the State retirement system according to RSA 100:A.

9. To see if the Town will vote to petition the Representatives and Senators who represent the Town in the General Court to support in the current session of the General Court, the concurrent resolution to amend the State Constitution to limit the annual increase in property taxes to five percent and to limit the annual increase in spending by the state or any city, town, or other governmental unit of the state to five percent. 10. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to, apply for, accept and expend money from the State, Federal or another governmental unit or a private source which becomes available during the year in accordance with procedures set forth in RSA 31:95.

11. To see if the Town will vote to Authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

12. To transact any further business that may legally come before the meeting.

To the Members of the Board of Selectmen Town of Bridgewater Bridgewater, New Hampshire

We have examined the combined financial statements and the combining, individual fund and account group financial statements of the Town of Bridgewater, New Hampshire as of and for the year ended December 31, 1980, as listed in the table of contents. Our examination was made in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards and, accordingly, included such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances.

As described in Note 1F, the combined financial statements referred to above do not include financial statements of the General Fixed Asset group of accounts which should be included to conform with generally accepted accounting principles.

In our opinion, except that omission of the General Fixed Asset group of accounts results in an incomplete presentation, as explained in the preceding paragraph, the combined financial statements and combining, individual fund and account group financial statements referred to above present fairly the financial position of the Town of Bridgewater, New Hampshire at December 31, 1980, and the results of its operations for the year then ended, in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles applied on a basis consistent with that of the preceding year.

Our examination was made for the purpose of forming an opinion on the combined financial statements and the combining and individual fund financial statements taken as a whole. The accompanying financial information listed as supporting schedules in the table of contents is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the combined statements of the Town of Bridgewater, New Hampshire. The information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the examination of the combined, combining and individual fund financial statements and, in our opinion, is fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the combined financial statements taken as a whole.

REPORT OF FOREST WARDEN AND STATE FOREST FIRE SERVICE

Forestfire prevention: Your business, our business, good business. Forest fire prevention slogans have been seen in association with Smokey Bear since the late nineteen forties when a national effort to check the spread of forest fires was implemented.

New Hampshire residents recognized that forest fire prevention and suppression was the responsibility of every citizen, a half century before this national campaign, when our legislature established our first forest fire laws in 1903. Since that date, the State has appointed a town/city forest fire warden who is responsible for the forest fire law enforcement in his municipality.

All fires kindled out of doors when there is no snow on the ground must be approved in writing by the forest fire warden before being kindled. All forest fires must be suppressed by the warden and his deputies as soon as they are reported. The cost of fire suppression is shared jointly by the town/city and the State of New Hampshire, as are forest fire prevention and forest fire training costs.

This state and local municipality cooperative forest fire program has given N. H. one of the best forest fire records in the United States.

Report of Bridgewater Conservation Commission

Commission activities in 1980 were more varied than in recent years. Although the larger emphasis was centered on the recreation area on the Pemigawasset River.

The problem at Dick Brown Pond was settled amicably and satisfactorily.

A once over lightly inspection of the town forest on Dick Brown Road was made, with the object of possible use as asanctuary for those who enjoy the woodlands. The property is also being considered as a future location for a new town center.

We continue to seek ways to obtain a beach area on Newfound Lake.

At Sawhegenet Park the beach area drainage lines have been installed more area has been cleared of underbrush, the parking lot is being prepared and more work on the access road has been done.

Pine lumber was cut on the property for the bathhouse to be built in the spring. The foundation of the old toll house has been reconstructed and all materials are on hand to build the bathhouse.

The new members added this year, Mr. Robert Bent and Mrs Allan Dehls bring our commission membership to seven, for which we are happy.

In view of the assistance we have received this year, we wish to thank everyone who donated time and effort to the project. A special thanks to Alfred Jenness who hauled the lumber to his mill, sawed it to our needs and returned it to us. All of this at no cost, it was a real public service that is worth more than mere money.

REPORT TO THE TOWNS THE INTER-LAKES DAY CARE CENTER & NURSERY SCHOOL

This year has been a very busy year for your Day Care Center. During the last twelve months 129 children were served from 101 families from seven towns in the Inter-Lakes region. Operating on a year-round basis from 6:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. the Day Care Center has made it possible for the parents of 115 children to maintain employment bringing into the community a combined income of well over a million dollars! As a private, non-profit agency governed by a volunteer Board of Directors consisting of parents and interested people from the community, the Center operates a comprehensive preschool program for three to six year old, and before and after school program for children of elementary school age. In providing for social, emotional, physical, and educational development a full range of services is offered including education, health care, vision and hearing screening, immunizations, dental care, nutrition, and information and referral. As a participant in the New Hampshire Child Care Food Program sponsored by USDA, hot lunches, breakfasts, and snacks are served daily. During the last year 7553 lunches, 1934 breakfasts, and 15,539 snacks were served.

The total budget of the Inter-Lakes Day Care Center for 1981 is \$116,410.79. Of this we will be receiving in tuition paid by parents \$46,060.41, \$21,703.88 from N. H. Child Care Food Program (USDA), and \$5,692.50 from CETA. This also includes the following: \$42,954.00 of which \$24,668.00 is Title XX, \$8,436.00 from Aid to Families with Dependent Childred and \$9,850.00 which must be obtained in local funding in order to receive the federal amount. The money we receive from the towns that we serve is matched three times by the federal government.

Area residents are always invited to visit the Inter-Lakes Day Care Center and Nursery School at 11 Lang Street in Meredith.


