#### TOWN WARRANT

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Chatham in the County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Chatham on Tuesday, the tenth (10th) day of March, next at 6:30 p.m. of the clock in the evening, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 3. To see if the Town will allow a 2% discount on all property taxes paid within 30 days of mailing tax bill.
- 4. To see if the Town will raise \$100.00 for Civil Defense.
- 5. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$852.50 as our share of the Fryeburg Rescue.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$750.00 to the Saco Valley Fire Department as our share of expense.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for Solid Waste Disposal (use of Town of Fryeburg Dump) and authorize withdrawal of \$897.64 plus interest for this purpose from the Federal Revenue Sharing Fund with the balance to be raised by taxation.
- 8. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the support of the Eastern Slope Airport Authority.
- 9. To see if the Town of Chatham will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$300.00 for the support of the Children & Youth Project of Mt. Washington Valley.

- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred (\$100.00) for the support of the Community Action Outreach Program.
- 11. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$245.00 to assist the Carroll County Mental Health Services.
- 12. To see if the Town of Chatham will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$326.20 for the Visiting Nurse Services of Northern Carroll County, Inc. said sum being equal to \$1.80 per person in the Town of Chatham.
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for the purpose of maintenance of the So. Chatham Cemetery.
- 14. "Shall we adopt the provisions of RSA 72:37 for the exemption of the blind from property tax? This statute provides that every inhabitant who is legally blind shall be exempt each year from the property tax on a residence to the value of \$15,000.00"
- 15. To see if the Town of Chatham will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$114.95 for Children Unlimited, Inc. said sum being equal to \$.55 per person in the Town of Chatham.
- 16. To see what action the Town will take on the Budget submittal by the Budget Committee.
- 17. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

Between July 1985 and June 1986, we experienced fewer fires than normal. The two leading causes of forest fires were again children and fires kindled without written permission of a Forest Fire Warden. Both causes are preventable, but only with your help.

Please help our town and state forest fire officials with forest fire prevention. Contact your Forest Fire Warden for more information.

Enforcement of a state timber harvest regulation is the responsibility of State Forestry officials. Our state has excellent timber harvest regulations; however, your assistance is needed.

If you know of a logging operation and suspect a state timber harvest law may be violated, call your Forest Fire Warden.

If you own forest land, you became responsible for the timber tax payment starting April 1, 1986. This is a change in the Timber Tax Law that will impact all forest landowners. Contact your Board of Selectmen for timber tax forms.

#### FRYEBURG RESCUE

To the Citizens of the Towns:

1986 has proven to be one of the busiest years ever experienced by Fryeburg Rescue. We handled approximately 270 runs this year which was about 20 more than last year. Our members have maintained their levels of training or upgraded their training in order to be able to better serve the citizens and visitors in our area. As you are surely well aware, the population of our area is growing quite rapidly, and the more training we have, the better we can serve the growing needs of the community.

Our members have put in nearly 3,000 man hours in handling the calls from our community last year. They have put in an additional 500 man hours or more in updating and maintaining their training levels. This does not include the approximately 700 man hours spent by our members at our monthly meetings where we not only have additional training programs but have our own critiques of the calls of the past month so that we may learn from the experiences of other members' calls.

Our extrication vehicle, which was a second-hand vehicle to begin with, is just about making it at this writing. We have used it well and it is no longer able to give what we need from it. We have already ordered a new cab and chassis to replace it and this will be paid for with the funds that were left over from the purchase of our new ambulance in 1985 and from the funds generated by the many generous donations received in memory of members of our community who have passed away. We are glad to be able to use these funds for such a worthy purchase, and to be able to purchase the new extrication vehicle wihout having to ask for additional tax dollars to do so.

It is only after much deliberation that we have presented to the towns this year, a budget that is approximately 19% greater than it has been for the past couple of years. Several of our maintenance costs have shown an increase over the last 12 months, and we have received an increase in our insurance rates of nearly 25%. This is due to the rapidly increasing costs of malpractice insurance all over the country. We had hoped to be able to maintain our budget at last year's

level for at least another year, but escalating costs have forced our hand. We trust that you, the citizens of our community will understand.
