# Town of Deering State of New Hampshire

## TOWN WARRANT

To the inhabitants of the Town of Deering, in the County of Hillsborough, in said State, qualified to vote in Town affairs, greetings:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Deering on Tuesday, the 6th day of March next, at one of the clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subject:

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year. Polls will open at 1:00 P.M. and will remain open until 7:00 P.M. (The polls may be continued to be open following the above hour by vote of the meeting, but may not be closed before the hour of 7:00 P.M. — RSA 39:2).

Additionally, you are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Deering on Thursday, the 8th day of March next, at seven of the clock in the evening to act upon the following articles (RSA 39:2-a). (All articles herein after are submitted by the Selectmen unless otherwise noted.)

Article 2. To see if the Town will vote to accept the reports of the Town Officers, Agents and Auditors for the year 1972.

Article 3. To see if the Town will vote to raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the year of 1973 and to make appropriations of and for the same, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5100 for Town Officers' salaries and \$5,500 for Town Officers' expenses, and to authorize the Treasurer to pay each Selectman \$500 per year, with the Chairman of the Board of Selectmen to be paid \$250 annually as a supplement, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400 for election and registration expenses, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2000 for the upkeep of the Town Hall and other Town buildings, and purchase of office equipment, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5000 for remodeling, refinishing and equipping the interior of the Town Hall on the first floor, in the rear, for the provision of adequate Town offices.

Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$15,000 for the purpose of building a new public services building and garage to be located in the field behind the Town Library, to the west of the Town Hall and at a lower elevation by approximately 20 feet, and to raise such sum by the issuance of bonds or notes under and in compliance

with the provisions of Chapter 33, as amended, New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated (Municipal Finance Act), and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the date and place of payment of such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such steps as may be necessary to negotiate such bonds or notes as shall be to the best interests of the Town, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$900 for Social Security payments for Town employees, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sums of \$5000 for the Police Department and \$3500 for the Fire Department, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1000 for tree trimming, particularly along narrow roads, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2700 for Insurance, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$750 for Damages and Legal Expenses, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 for contributions to neighboring towns which permit the use of their dumps by Deering residents and for trash removal, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25 for Vital Statistics, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the following sums for Highway purposes: (1) \$12,000 for summer roads; (2) \$15,000 for winter roads; (3) \$9,000 for the general expenses of the Highway Department, and (4) \$7,500 for road sealing, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the additional sum of \$4000 to the originally authorized \$7500 as its share of the cost of reconstructing Bridge No. 103/053 on Reservoir Road, a Class V highway, at the dam of Deering Reservoir, and to request Town Bridge Aid from the State of New Hampshire for the balance, all under the provisions of New Hampshire RSA 242, and to raise such sums by the issuance of bonds or notes under and in compliance with the provisions of Chapter 33, as amended, New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated (Municipal Finance Act), and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the date and place of payment of such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such steps as may be necessary to negotiate such bonds or notes as shall be to the best interests of the Town, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 18. To see if the Town will vote to authorize withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 for use as set-offs against budget appropriations in the amount indicated; and, further, to authorize the Selectmen to make pro-rata reductions in the amounts if estimated entitlements are reduced, or take any other action hereon:

Article 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000 for the Capital Reserve Fund for highway equipment or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,177.72 to secure Town Road Aid (State share \$7,851.47), or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 21. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the additional sum of \$35,000 in addition to the original \$41,000 already appropriated for the purpose of widening, building up, and paving the Long Woods Road from the end of the present hard-top to the intersection with River Road, such sum to be raised by the issuance of bonds or notes under and in compliance with the provisions of Chapter 33, New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated (Municipal Finance Act) as amended, and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the date and place of payment of such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such steps as may be necessary to negotiate such bonds or notes as shall be to the best interests of the Town, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 22. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$700 for street lighting, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 23. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$35 for the Library, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 24. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sums of \$1200 for Town Poor, \$900 for Old Age Assistance, and \$750 for Aid to Permanently and Totally Disabled, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 25. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 for interest on long-term loans, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 26. To recall to the attention of the Town that the sum of \$11,000 in payment of TRA notes must be raised, under the provisions of RSA 33:2, with the note that most of the latter sum is provided for in TRA commitments.

Article 27. To recall to the attention of the Town that a County Tax will be levied on the Town, and it is estimated that the sum of \$13,000 as shown in the budget for this anticipated levy will be required.

Article 28. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$305 for the support of the Monadnock Region Assn., or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 29. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 for the care of Cemeteries (Required by Statute).

Article 30. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 for current operating expenses of the Conservation Commission, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 31. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 for Civil Defense, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 32. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4500 to complete the Tax Mapping of the Town as required by RSA 31:95-a, or to take any other action relating thereto.

Article 33. To see if the Town will vote to express the sense of the meeting, and to direct, if statutorily appropriate, the Deering Old Home Day Association to use its existing funds in the support of the Deering Bi-Centennial Activity.

Article 34. To see if the Town will vote to increase the membership of the Planning Board from five (5) members to seven (7) members (RSA 36:4), or to take any other action relating thereto. (Submitted by Planning Board.)

Article 35. To see if the Town will vote to become a member of the regional planning commission, now organized and named the Central New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission. This Commission has membership of more than ten municipalities and has jurisdiction over the planning region delineated by the Office of State Planning. The objective of the Commission is to plan for and encourage regional planning analysis, provide consensus on major problems of regional concern and to assist in the effectuation of projects within, and which extend beyond, the boundaries of a particular town.

The Commission has only the authority conferred on it by Chapter 36:45-53, Revised Statutes Annotated 1955, and is advisory to local governments in the Region. Members of the Commission shall be appointed by the Selectmen in accordance with State law. Two representatives

will be appointed from Deering, N. H.

Article 35-a. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$414 as the Town's share for the studies and operation of the Central New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission. These funds will be used for financing the staff, operation expenses, planning studies, technical assistance and other programs of the Commission. These funds may be used in conjunction with other State and Federal funds available for planning purposes.

Article 36. To see if the Town will vote to become a member of the regional planning commission, now organized and named the Southern New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission. This Commission has membership of six municipalities and has jurisdiction over the planning region delineated by the Office of State Planning. The objective of the Commission is to plan for and encourage regional planning analysis, provide consensus on major problems of regional concern and to assist in the effectuation of projects within, and which extend beyond, the boundaries of a particular town.

The Commission has only the authority conferred on it by Chapter 36:45-53, Revised Statutes Annotated 1955, and is advisory to local governments in the Region. Members of the Commission shall be appointed by the Selectmen in accordance with State law. Two representatives will be appointed from Deering, N. H.

Article 36-a. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$202 as the Town's share for the studies and operation of the Southern New Hampshire Regional Planning Commission. These funds will be used for financing the staff, operation expenses, planning studies, technical assistance and other programs of the Commission. These funds may be used in conjunction with other State and Federal funds available for planning purposes.

Article 37. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to sell and convey by quit-claim deed, under such conditions and to such persons as the Board may consider proper, the property known as the Old Deering School House site at or near the intersection of the Old Francestown Road with the Homestead Road, containing 0.23 acres, more or less.

Article 38. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1299 from the Town's general revenue sharing fund, as the Town's share of the Meals-on-Wheels program, sponsored by the Community Action Committee for Hillsborough County. This program will provide 2 home delivered meals, 5 days a week, to homebound elderly and those non-elderly recuperating from illnesses. Additionally, social contact, referral and emergency transportation will be provided for those participating in the program. This request for financial support is based on a formula that takes into consideration the elderly population of the town and the town's share of revenue sharing funds.

Article 39. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the Australian ballot system for the election of town officers, effective with the election of town officers at the Town Meeting in March, 1974 (RSA 59:71, 59:72, 59:74, 59:75, 59:76, and the pertinent provisions of RSA 56), or to take any other action related thereto. (Submitted by petition.)

Article 40. To see if the Town will vote to designate Old County Lane as a "scenic road," under provisions of RSA 253:17. (Submitted by the Conservation Commission.)

Article 41. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to auction property taken by Tax Collector's Deeds.

Article 42. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 43. To see if the Town will vote to change the name of the 2nd New Hampshire Turnpike to Cork Plains Road.

Article 44. To see whose photograph the Town will vote to place on the cover of the next Annual Report.

Article 45. To transact any other business which may legally be brought before this meeting.

#### SELECTMEN'S REPORT

Expenses for 1972 were less than appropriations by approximately \$18,800, excluding the Long Woods Road project.

For 1973 we are recommending a minimum budget for total necessary spending. We reiterate our concern at the expenses caused the Town by state-mandated programs which are forced on the towns without funds being supplied by the State. The Town of Deering is affected in the spending area by State-imposed regulations relating to schools, water pollution control, refuse dumps, tax-mapping and welfare, as well as roads and bridges.

At the same time the Town's tax base is eroded by State action with respect to tax exemptions of charitable and non-profit associations, "Open-Space" land tax abatements, elderly tax exemptions, veterans tax exemptions and the like, to the extent of millions of dollars of evaluation.

This results in forced increases in spending and a reduction in the tax base with which to support such added spending. Expenses go up and income goes down. The Federal Government can print money to overcome a deficit, but the Town is simply forced to dig deeper into the tax-payers' pocketbooks. This is one of the principal problems which lead to serious questions about the continuance of local government—its effectiveness and shortcomings.

New Hampshire has long modeled its local government on citizen participation. We are rapidly reaching the breaking point in this regard because of the thousands of details which Town Management must cope with. We have made a good estimate of time required by Town Officers to fully discharge their statutory requirements. Based on current rates, the compensation of Selectmen averages out to about 35¢ per hour and the Town Clerk to maybe a few cents more per hour. We are proposing modest increases in their compensation.

We can repeat almost exactly what we said last year about our share of school costs, which can be expected to increase substantially over the next several years, largely because our growth rate for both people and property is increasing at a higher rate than other towns in the school district. In addition, State-ordered programs in education will increase the overall school budget. It is still too early to figure exactly what our share of this budget will be, but we estimate it at \$140,000, up from \$120,000 currently.

The school apportionment cost question, which was reported on page 9 of last year's report, has been completed and we have been denied the restoration of the \$4,000 differential. Legal counsel Perkins, Douglas and Brock worked hard for us but could not overturn the established calculation practice done by the State Department of Education. Our cost for this work was surprisingly low, only \$277.50. In the long run, this will not change substantially our school apportionment figures, since we expect them to rise regularly unless and until educational financing is shifted from the property tax. You are aware that there are several Supreme Court actions now pending in this matter. We are unanimously and strongly in favor of a flat-rate, low-level (2-3%) income tax, PROVIDED that constitutional guarantees will be enacted to assure that the funds

from such a tax cannot be diverted from the cost of education, which represents about 2/3 of our total property taxes. If income tax monies were simply to be administered by the State, there would be no positive relief for the property taxpayer. This is the reason we personally would suggest an income tax ONLY IF there were to be constitutional protection against diversion of such funds. This will be a matter which will undoubtedly be considered at the Constitutional Convention which has been authorized by the voters and which hopefully will be convened in 1973.

During 1972, 26 building permits were issued and 18 subdivision plans approved.

The added costs for roads are more than made up by additional State funding of about \$15,000 in block grant distribution of State Highway Funds which now come directly to the towns. Added to this is almost \$10,000 in Class V Duncan Fund money and more than \$7,800 in Town Road Aid. Thus we receive back from all gas taxes more than \$32,500 for highways.

We haven't yet learned the basis of calculation, but we are happy to have received \$3,176 from Federal Revenue Sharing, which has been placed in a separate interest-bearing account, pending your decision as to how this money shall be used. Since Federal Revenue Sharing money cannot be accumulated but must be spent, we propose that the entire sum be allocated to the improvement of our Town's management and financial structure.

The Open-Space tax abatements, about which you have been regularly informed by separate letters, has reduced our tax base by approximately \$1,700,000, so that we now have a total tax-base loss, through exemptions, of more than \$2,600,000. This represents about ¼ of our total tax base and means that you pay \$4.00 for every \$3.00 which you would pay if such exemptions were not ordered upon us. We are hopeful that the General Court will take remedial action this year.

Along with your tax bills we supplied you with detailed factors used in our appraisal techniques. We reiterate our invitation to any and all taxpayers to see the Appraisal Map at the Town office. Because of the large size of the Town, it would be too expensive to reproduce individual copies to go to all taxpayers, but the figures are there for your inspection.

Following are our specific comments about each article in the Town Warrant:

Article 4: We propose an increase in Town Officers' salaries from \$1,200 to \$1,800 per year for the Town Clerk and Treasurer; from \$300 to \$500 for each Selectman with the Chairman receiving an additional \$250 per year, and regular retention of a secretary to the Selectmen at an estimated cost of about \$2,000 per year. We have seriously considered the question of the Tax Collector's salary but feel this should be left at \$1,200 per year, since under our new bookkeeping system the tax bills are computed, prepared and printed in the Selectmen's office and this leaves the Tax Collector with the only chore of receiving and accounting for taxes. This system was adopted in order to avoid possible errors, since the appraisal, assessment and tax calculations are all made and typed at one time, with carbon copies being available to each interested official as well as printed in this report. This means there can be no transposition of figures with subsequent errors.

Article 6: The outside of the Town Hall has now been painted entirely within the last two years; and as you will see when you come to Town Meeting, we have had the inside brightened up with a coat of paint. We consequently welcome a decrease of \$500 in this appropriation.

Article 7: Increasingly, groups of citizens, including the Planning Board, Conservation Committee, and activities in connection with the tax map, as well as meetings of the Selectmen, require larger, adequately heated facilities. The day of the outhouse on the Town common is long gone. We suggest to you that if we are going to be a town, we might as well act like one, and the figure asked for will provide adequate lavatory facilities. It would be our plan to keep the heat above freezing during the entire winter season. Your attention is respectfully invited to the fact that we are probably now in violation of the state water supply and pollution control requirements, and we propose to do away with the totally inadequate and unsanitary bathrooms now existing. We propose to keep the heating above freezing to protect the increasingly valuable tax maps and Town records.

Article 8: We support the recommendation of the special committee and recommend the construction of the Public Services building. It is not so much a question of highway equipment as it is our need to start to do at least a minimum of our fair share in the keeping down of fires once put out by our wonderful friends in the Hillsboro Fire Department.

Article 10: We recommend the same appropriation provided by the Town last year for police and fire services.

Special Note: The State Entomologist has advised that while pine blister rust is now under control and we have therefore not entered an appropriation for this item.

Article 12: Insurance rates have gone up, as you know; but in addition there is a need to protect Town officers against suits for honest judgmental differences or errors. It is our recommendation that the Town acquire such insurance, unless the legislature should pass what is known as the town officers' "Good Samaritan Act" now pending before the legislature.

Article 13: We recommend a reduction of \$750 for Damages and Legal Expenses since we do not anticipate any major legal actions.

Article 14: We recommend a reduction of \$500 in this appropriation since the Town of Weare voted last year to prohibit our use of their dump, even though we were prepared to make a financial contribution.

Your attention is directed to the fact that State law now mandates that each town shall have a refuse dump by July 1, 1974. Our Planning Board is working with the Hillsboro Planning Board in an attempt to make a joint dump operation. You will be informed at the Town Meeting of any later developments. It is obvious that our costs would be much higher if we had to establish our own separate dump.

Articles 16 and 17: As reported last year, the \$14,472.74 block grant highway aid from the State has substantially helped our road maintenance and improvement. If you approve the \$7,500 item for road sealing, we expect to be able to complete road sealing for all the Town's surfaced highways this year. This would save us substantially in future rebuilding appropriations.

At the Summer Town Informational Meeting, a question was raised as to the possibility of having Reservoir Road maintained completely by the State. It is currently maintained by the State for summer use approximately 7/10 of a mile from its intersection with Route 149. We requested the State to maintain Reservoir Road in its entirety, or at least as far as the State-owned dam. Information has now been received that the State summer maintenance was introduced in the 1930s, before the introduction of Town Road Aid funds, and that the State Highway Department is currently unwilling to support necessary legislation to convert Reservoir Road to a State highway. It is the State Highway Department's view that subsequent improvement of Reservoir Road should be accomplished by the Town, possibly using TRA future funds. We agree.

With respect to Article 17, the State has now completed its detailed planning for the reconstruction of the Reservoir Dam Bridge; and it will cost, as our share, approximately \$4,000 more than the \$7,500 already appropriated but not yet spent. We are recommending bonding these sums.

The so-called "Duncan Funds" (RSA 241:11), also called "Gas-Tax-Money," will be used, as authorized by the State Highway Department, for improvement along the North Road and the Dudley Pond Road toward the junction with Peter Woods Hill Road.

Article 19: For several years we have not made provision for the depreciation and amortization of the highway equipment, namely the Town grader. We recommend adding to existing Capital Reserve Funds the sum of \$5,000 to assist in eventual replacement of this equipment.

Article 20: Town Road Aid, paid mostly by the State (from highway funds), is used, as you know, for payment of the bonds. This item, in combination with Article 26, will pay the rest of the long term notes, and the Town will thus be ready in 1975 to consider an additional TRA road improvement. The TRA standards are very strict—otherwise we might recommend to you that the Long Woods Road under Article 20 be 1975's TRA project. But we suggest to you that it would be better and cheaper to make the Long Woods Road improvement under Town standards. In any event, you don't have to make up your mind on this until 1975.

Article 21: The necessary ledge removal, in order to meet the Town's own standards, on the Long Woods Road project meant that the minimum bid was about \$72,000 as compared with an appropriation of \$41,000 voted at last year's meeting. Long Woods Road is the major connection between West Deering and Deering Center and Hillsboro and is the second most heavily travelled road in Town after Route 149. While there is a possibility of discontinuance of the railroad line alongside the ledge portion of the Long Woods Road, it is our opinion that the Town may never be authorized by the State to acquire or use the roadbed, even if discontinued. The Road Agent thinks that the road can be built up additionally without removal of ledge for under \$25,000, and we intend to substitute for the article as drawn the reduced figure for your consideration. (Of the original \$41,000 proceeds of the note issue voted by the Town last year, \$40,000 is currently carried in Certificates of Deposit maturing in March, 1973, and approximately \$1,000 has been spent in road survey and plan preparation.)

Article 25: Last year's shift to semi-annual tax payments has saved the Town thousands of dollars by eliminating short-term borrowing and by raising Town revenues through placement of surplus funds in short-term certificates of deposit. Additionally, the semi-annual tax payments have reduced the prior heavy Christmas-time payments of the whole year's tax. Almost without exception, taxpayers have told us that the "pay-as-you-go" provisions of the semi-annual tax payments have helped them in their own personal budgeting. It certainly has helped the Town, and as a result has lowered the tax dollars we all have to pay.

Article 28: The Town has rarely seen fit to vote support for the Monadnock Region Assn., in view of the fact that we lie at the extreme perimeter of the region. It's up to you to decide what you want to do on this item, as well as on all other spending.

Article 32: Last year you approved our plan for a "do-it-yourself" tax map, and we are very happy to report that our plan has worked and is working well. Better than 1/3 of the tax map has been completed, and we expect to be able to substantially finish the job with the requested additional appropriation. We will save somewhere between \$15,000 and \$30,000 as a conservative estimate by doing the job ourselves. The Town is indebted to Mr. Irvin Tolles, a student and now teacher at Nathaniel Hawthorne College, for his many hours of professional work at a very reasonable \$2.50 per hour, for the successful commencement of this tough job.

Articles 35, 35-a, 36, and 36-a: These articles are introduced for the consideration of the Town in connection with membership in a regional planning commission. The Town was originally assigned to Region 4 (Keene and Southwestern New Hampshire) by the State Office of Comprehensive Planning, but has been reassigned to Region 5, which includes both Manchester and Concord. Planning will be of increasing importance, particularly as water pollution laws are strengthened. The health officers' work in maintaining the cleanliness of Deering Reservoir, the principal source of the Piscataquog River, indicates that we can reasonably expect no major problems in downstream pollution towards Manchester. But it is possible that our lands abutting the Contoocook River may later cause problems downriver toward Henniker and Concord. We therefore recommend that the Town approve membership in the Central Planning Commission, even though the cost is \$212 more than the Southern New Hampshire Planning Commission.

Article 37: The land suggested for transfer at one time apparently was owned by the Town, although we have no finite proof thereof. It lies near property owned by the heirs of Alexander P. Abbate, is less in area than is required for a building site and could, if the Town wishes, be appropriately transferred.

Article 38: This is inserted at the request of the Community Action Committee for Hillsborough County. While the Community Action Committee has said that persons in Deering have been contacted with respect to this program, and there is a "great need" for the program, we have been unable to prove this. We have substantial question as to this program and will not support it on the floor, although we are very concerned about the plight of our older citizens. We think that our primary concern at the present moment ought to be about the taxes the older citizens pay.

We continue our desire to answer any questions you may have about the operation of your Town.

#### BUILDING COMMITTEE REPORT

We, as citizens and government administrators of the Town of Deering, are still faced with the old problem of the inadequacy of the Deering highway shed and its many faults. Those who have been or are now forced to use this structure are aware of its problems. In general, the building is in poor condition, too narrow to house the Town grader. It is not designed for salt storage, resulting in about a 10% loss of salt each season. It is impossible to heat, poorly lighted, and has no sanitary facilities. Its location is also poor in that it does not have a good location to attach and detach plows, and in general it detracts from the surrounding picture of our Town common.

A committee consisting of two selectmen, two resident contractors and the highway agent determined it unwise to spend an estimated \$15,000 to overcome some of the shortcomings of our present building. A study of other towns shows that any new highway garages are being located away from the town commons.

This has brought about further search by the present selectmen to locate a 3-5 acre tract of land suited for the requirements of a new structure. To date no land has been found belonging to a willing seller.

We find that unless present town land behind the existing shed were to be used, that site selection is our first problem to be overcome before we enter into the design and cost of a new structure. However, plans and prices are being studied with respect to wood, concrete and steel buildings suited for present and future needs.

We invite your comments and any help in solving this problem.

#### DEERING PLANNING BOARD REPORT

The Deering Planning Board met fifteen times during 1972, including four public hearings and six joint meetings, i.e., Board of Selectmen, Conservation Commission and the Hillsboro Planning Board.

Willis R. Merrill was appointed by the Selectmen to a four-year term to fill the expired term of Mr. Irving W. Ireland, Jr. The Board expressed its thanks and appreciation to Mr. Ireland for his work on the Planning Board over the past six years. Dr. James M. Carew was elected by the Planning Board as Chairman for the year, and Willis Merrill was elected as Secretary.

A total of eleven subdivision plans were approved by the Board with five others being considered.

The continual increase in subdivision plans presented to the Board and the time required to process them, as well as future Town planning, have prompted the Planning Board to request an increase in its members from five to seven. The Board strongly recommends that the Town vote "yes" on this Article in the Town Warrant.

Joint meetings have been held throughout the year with the Hillsboro Planning Board re a sanitary fill dump. Deering currently pays Hillsboro for the privilege of using its town dump. However, as of July 1, 1974, Hillsboro will no longer be able to maintain an open burning dump. At present the two towns are working together to find a solution to the problem, and it appears that a sanitary fill dump will be the best alternative for the next several years. As yet, no site has been found and no definite action has been taken.

Discussions in joint meetings with the Conservation Commission included a long range plan for the Town to set aside areas for conservation, plans for future land usage and availability, the writing of a Town history, and plans for the Bi-centennial for Deering in 1974.

The question of Town Comprehensive Planning, or Zoning, is constantly before the Planning Board. It is generally agreed by the Board that a minimal form of Zoning will be necessary to protect Deering from haphazard growth—which will greatly influence our tax structure in an undesirable way. There is no doubt but that Deering is growing! Subdivision upon subdivision and the many new dwellings being built attest to this fact. The Board hopes that many citizens will take an active role in this major project of Comprehensive Planning before it is too late.

The Deering Planning Board feels much has been accomplished in the best interests of the Town during the past year. You are reminded that Planning Board members are appointed by the Board of Selectmen and serve without remuneration in true civic spirit. Suggestions and opinions from residents and non-residents on matters concerning the future planning of the Town are always welcome.

#### CONSERVATION COMMISSION REPORT

During the past year members of the Commission attended a hearing in Concord on Flood Plan Zoning. Legislation will be proposed at the current session of the Legislature based on a study of the problem. Members also attended the annual meeting of the New Hampshire Association of Conservation Commissions in Conway. The solid waste problem was the principal topic, and a visit was made to the experimental incinerator in Conway.

The Town's cemeteries were visited so that these small areas of green space could be plotted on our maps. At the request of the Selectmen, the triangles formed at some road intersections were located and measured.

The 6-acre "Gregg" tract was explored by Commission members. We feel that this could become an excellent nature preserve in the future, particularly if adjoining tracts could be obtained.

The Commission sent one student, Tony Fredericks, to the Conservation Camp at Bear Brook State Park last summer. We wish to increase the awareness of the young people of Deering of ecological problems. We met with the Planning Board twice during the year and are working with them in the preparation of a Town Plan. Our chairman, Bob Nugent, attended a 10-week seminar on zoning in Concord when none of the Planning Board members were available. The Commission was very fortunate in securing Tom Copadis as a replacement for Ron Elliott, who resigned.

#### HEALTH OFFICER'S REPORT

There were fortunately few problems facing the Board of Health during the past year.

The Deering Lake water remains very pure. However, it is suggested that those having cottages or homes along the lake shores take a serious look at their septic or disposal systems to be certain that they are not directly polluting the water being swum in. It is the responsibility of all, whether living at the lake or merely using the water for recreation, to help maintain the purity of the water.

Those subdividing land or purchasing land to build homes are reminded that approval for septic systems must be made first by the New Hampshire Water Supply and Pollution Control Commission.

For those who detest, or worse, are allergic to black flies and mosquitos, of which we have an overabundance, a report by the World Health Organization (WHO), 1972, might be worthy of note. It stated that millions of tons of DDT are used annually throughout the world to help eradicate certain diseases, and despite prolonged exposure of the general population and heavy occupational exposure to a number of workers, the only confirmed cases of injury have been the result of massive accidental or suicidal ingestion. The report pointed out that millions of people are spared serious disease by the use of residual insecticides, and particularly DDT, which has been the most important factor in making this possible.

Perhaps DDT will be our only answer to eradicate black flies and mosquitos during our few good weather months of the year. True, the balance of nature may be disturbed as many may argue, but the decision of beautiful birds, or beastly black flies and mammoth mosquitos, is ours.

The health of a community should be the prime concern to everyone in that community. The Board of Health, comprising the Health Officer and Board of Selectmen, with the help of all in the Town of Deering, should strive to maintain a healthy new year for all in 1973.

#### CIVIL DEFENSE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Civil Defense is simply civil government prepared to meet any emergency. Its effectiveness/readiness is a direct result of the support and participation by the people at all levels...professionals, community leaders, and all citizens.

The Director participated in one Civil Defense Alert and one rescue operation.

One  $2\frac{1}{2}$  ton GMC Army truck was provided through the State Civil Defense Agency to the Fire Department for use as a tanker truck. This was at no cost to the town.

One Weasel (Army tracked vehicle) was purchased through Civil Defense for the Police Department. The \$50 paper work charge was borne by Chief Dumais at no cost to the Town.

One DUKW (amphibious personnel carrier) was purchased through Civil Defense to be converted to a fire fighting platform necessary to reach lake cottages impossible to reach by conventional equipment. The \$50 paper work charge was paid by lake residents, who are forming a Volunteer Fire Fighting group.

All three vehicles mentioned above are now property of the Town of Deering. Various pieces of surplus property (tools and supplies) have been furnished to the Fire and Police Departments. This property was purchased through the State Civil Defense Agency and the expense has been borne by these departments.

# REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

In New Hampshire, forest fire control is a cooperative State-town program. The Town Forest Fire Warden, appointed by the Director, Division of Resources Development, upon recommendation by the Selectmen and the State's District Forest Fire Chief, is responsible for fire suppression and other related duties. The State shares equally with the town in the cost of most forest fires, except illegal and careless fires, which are charged to the responsible party. The State further provides fire detection services, prevention programs, fire training for town wardens and crews, and back up equipment for fire suppression.

By authority of the State, the Town Forest Fire Warden controls all outside burning in his town except backyard cooking fires. Any person wishing to kindle a fire when the ground is not covered with snow must obtain a fire permit, free of cost, from the Town Forest Fire Warden. No permits will be issued for fires between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. unless it is raining, except for commercial purposes.

Please be careful when using fire—remember it can be an extremely useful tool when under control; but once allowed to run wild, it can become a disastrous and devastating force. Only you can prevent a forest fire.

#### HISTORIAN'S REPORT DEERING'S SCHOOLS

In a school register of Banjamin Bartlett's, there is a list of "scholars in Deering as reported for the year ending March 1861." There were 190 children listed (with their ages) in 11 districts, ranging from 1 and 4 in Districts 11 and 10 to 29 each in Districts 5 and 9.

As well as I have been able to determine from the children's names, the districts were as follows:

No. 1 - Deering Center (the present Library)

No. 2 — Manselville (now a residence in West Deering after its having been moved to replace the burned West Deering School)

No. 3 — Clement Hill (fallen down)

No. 4 — North Deering (part of the Town Clerk's home)

No. 5 — East Deering (no longer a school)

No. 6 - Bartlett Hill

No. 7 — Bowen (now a residence)

No. 8 - Pond School (no longer in existence)

No. 9 — West Deering (then near the West Deering Cemetery, later moved and burned)

Among those attending Deering Center School were my former neighbors who lived in the present Long House: Alzira Gove (7), Sarah Gove (16), and their sister Laura (14—Mrs. Charles Kimball, who lived in Hillsboro); also Luther Buxton (10), who did some work on our house while we were still summer residents (prior to 1919), and Harlan Manahan (17), who lived in my house. My sister-in-law's grandmother, Anna J. McNeil (5), is listed in District No. 3. Many of us knew Mary Whitaker (Mrs. Clough, then 8 years old), who lived to be nearly 100.

More recent school records in town reports show that in 1901 there were 83 pupils attending school 22 weeks at a cost of \$877.33. In 1912 64 attended school 20 weeks, costing \$2015.54. In 1920 (the Census of that year showed Deering's smallest population), 34 children were in school for 34 weeks, costing \$4,754.46.

In the 1920-21 school year, Deering achieved the state standard of 36 weeks (180 days) of school, and the West Deering School was remodeled according to State Board of Education specifications.

By 1931-32 schools had been reduced to 4 (\$7,733.08). From 1936-37 through 1943-44 there were two schools in operation—West and East Deering. The school year of 1950-51 was the last in which Deering had an independent school—at a cost of \$18,978.88 for 70 pupils in attendance there and in Hillsboro as tuition students.

An entry in Banjamin Bartlett's diary for April 25, 1855, notes that "attended a Levee and Exhibition of the Deering High School." If anyone has any more information about this Deering High School or Academy, I should like to know about it.

#### MINUTES OF THE 1972 TOWN MEETING

A legal meeting of the inhabitants of the Town of Deering qualified to vote in Town Affairs was called to order at 7:15 p.m. March 7. It was voted that this meeting be recessed at 10 p.m. this evening, or as soon as possible thereafter as action shall have been completed on the article pending at 10 p.m., until Saturday, March 11, 1972, at 1 p.m. It was moved that this meeting not pass any article printed in the warrant, to permit full exposure and discussion of all articles submitted. Carried without dissent.

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year. Total ballots cast: 153.

Selectman for three years — Rocco Marotta — 123 Tax Collector — Howard E. Whitney — 145 Town Clerk — Clara T. Rich — 143 Town Treasurer — Clara T. Rich — 143 Trustee of Trust Funds — Gladys Snow — 144 Library Trustee — Myrtha Ireland — 139 Auditor — Marjorie Heath — 138 Auditor — Eunice Willgeroth — 134

- Article 2. It was voted, 83 yes, 24 no, to ratify the provisions of Chapter 361.1 of the Laws of New Hampshire of 1971, entitled "An act changing part of the boundry line between the Towns of Deering and Hillsborough, as required by RSA Chapter 51, Section 9."
- Article 3. It was voted to accept the reports of the Town Officers, agents and auditors for the year 1971.
- Article 4. It was voted to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the year 1972.
- Article 5. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$4,000 for Town Officers' salaries and \$3,500 for Town Officers' expenses.
- Article 6. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$550 for election and registration expenses.
- Article 7. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,500 for the upkeep of the Town Hall and other Town buildings and purchase of office equipment.
- Article 8. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$900 for Social Security payments for Town employees.
- Article 9. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sums of \$5,000 for the Police Department and \$3,500 for the Fire Department.
- Article 10. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$125 for Blister Rust Control.
- Article 11. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$500 for Tree Trimming.
- Article 12. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000 for Insurance.
- Article 13. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,500 for Damages and Legal Expenses.

Article 14. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000 for contributions to neighboring towns which permit the use of their dumps to Deering residents, and for trash removal.

Article 15. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$25 for Vital Statistics.

Article 16. It was voted the following sums for Highway purposes: 1.) \$12,000 for summer roads; 2.) \$15,000 for winter roads; 3.) \$7,500 for road sealing; 4.) \$7,500 for the general expenses of the Highway Department.

Article 17. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$7,500 for its share of the cost of reconstructing Bridge No. 103/053 on Reservoir Road, a Class V highway, at the dam of Deering Reservoir, and to request Town Bridge Aid from the State of New Hampshire for the balance, all under the provisions of New Hampshire RSA 242.

Article 18. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,190.01 to secure Town Road Aid (State share \$7,933.39).

Article 19. It was voted to take up articles 19 and 20 jointly.

Article 20. It was voted to appropriate a sum not exceeding \$41,000 for the purpose of widening, building up, and paving the Long Woods Road from the present hard-top to the intersection with River Road, such sum to be raised by the issuance of bonds or notes under and in compliance with the provisions of Chapter 33, New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated (Municipal Finance Act) as amended, and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the date and place of such bonds or notes and to take such steps as may be necessary to negotiate such bonds or notes as shall be to the best interests of the Town. The vote declared by the Moderator to be manifestly in excess of the 2/3 requirement with respect to bonding. The Moderator invited a challenge to his determination, and no challenge was made. The Moderator then directed the record to show that the vote was in excess of the 2/3 requirement. No dissent.

Article 21. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$750 for street lighting.

Article 22. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$35 for the library.

Article 23. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sums of \$1,200 for Town Poor, \$2,400 for Old Age Assistance, and \$600 for aid to Permanently and Totally Disabled.

Article 24. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$750 for interest on short-term loans and \$1,000 for interest on long-term loans.

Article 25. Recalled to the attention of the Town that the sum of \$11,000 in payment of TRA notes must be raised, under the provisions of RSA 33:2, with the note that most of the latter sum is provided for in TRA commitments.

Article 26. Recalled to the attention of the Town that a County Tax will be levied on the Town, and it is estimated that the sum of \$11,000 as shown in the budget for this anticipated levy.

Article 27. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 for the care of Cemeteries.

Article 28. Support of the Monadnock Region Association not voted.

Article 29. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 for current operating expenses of the Conservation Commission.

Article 30. It was voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200 for Civil Defense.

Article 31. It was moved that the Town vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$3,500 for the purchase of tax mapping negatives, prints, overlays, aerial photographs, micro film reader and appurtenant devices and instruments, and for the part-time basis of a person or persons to commence the construction of a tax map.

Article 32. Unanimous no vote on securing professional for Conservation Commission.

Article 33. Regarding a Scenic Road, the vote was 15 no and 10 yes.

Article 34. It was voted to authorize the Selectmen to auction property taken by Tax Collector's Deeds.

Article 35. It was voted to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 36. It was voted to change the names of the following roads: a.) Bartlett Hill Road from Poor Farm Road; b.) Wolf Hill Road to be extended to the junction of the present Fisher Road with Old County Road, with Fisher Road remaining from its junction with Route 149 to Wolf Hill Road.

Article 37. It was voted to place Archie Cote, Sr.'s photograph on the next Report.

Article 38. Unanimous no vote on \$14,000 to renovate the Town Garage.

Article 39. It was voted (18 yes, 11 no) to authorize the semi-annual collection of real property taxes, with partial payments of ½ of previous year's taxes to be due and payable July 1st of this and following years and the remainder (total tax less July 1st payment) due and payable December 1st of this year and following years, with a 6% interest rate on taxes due July 1st to December 1st only, all in accordance with Chapter 454 of the Laws of 1971.

Article 40. It was voted to have the same Building Committee continue their study and come up with a correct article next year. It was voted that the Town conduct the voting under Article 1 of the warrant on the first Tuesday of March in 1973 and succeeding years, and to have the business session of the Town held on the following Thursday at 7 p.m., all in accordance with RSA 39: 2-A. The Clerk was instructed to write a letter to Mr. John Griffiths for his duties as Selectman for the past three years.

Voted to adjourn without date. Meeting adjourned 10 p.m.




