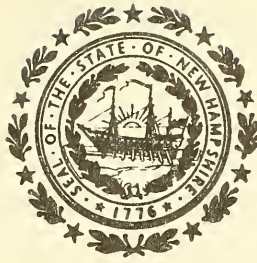

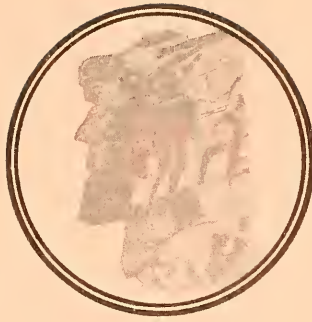

The Fire Department had a good year in 1983. We have worked in the fire station to make use of space that was created when the new roof was put on. Most of the material used was from the old Dow Building. This material was donated to the department if we removed it from the site. By doing this, the cost of the added space to the town was kept to a minimum.

In 1983 the State Legislature passed laws regarding Fire Warning Devices and Smoke Detectors. In keeping with these laws, the Fire Department must inspect all rental units to see if these laws have been followed. We have started inspections on these and will continue with them. These laws are important to help save lives. A copy of these laws follows.

### **RSA 153:10-A Automatic Fire Warning and Smoke Detection Devices**

I. Each unit contained in a multi-unit dwelling shall be equipped with automatic fire warning devices. On every floor level and in each common stairway and in each common hallway of a multi-unit dwelling, there shall be an automatic warning device.

II. Every single family dwelling which is built or substantially rehabilitated after January 1, 1982, shall be equipped with an automatic fire warning device.

II-a. Every rental unit as defined in RSA 153:1, IX-a shall be equipped with at least one automatic fire warning device. An automatic fire warning device shall be located in each hallway or area which is adjacent to a sleeping area. The provisions of this paragraph shall be in addition to any requirements under paragraph II. The owner of the rental unit shall be responsible for maintaining the automatic fire warning device in a suitable condition.

The members of the department have put in countless volunteer hours working for the department to save Franconia tax dollars. In spite of these efforts, however, the rising costs of things have forced us to increase the Fire Department budget by a small percent.

The men and women of the Franconia Fire Department sincerely express their thanks to the citizens of Franconia for their support and cooperation during 1983.

## FRANCONIA LIFE SQUAD

The Franconia Life Squad continued its growth in service this year responding to 64 calls in Franconia, Sugar Hill and Easton.

## FRANCONIA-SUGAR HILL POLICE DEPARTMENT

The number of calls received on the 8123 telephone line showed a slight decrease for the year of 1983 as compared to 1982. The largest decrease appeared to be in regard to information-seeking type of calls, "How are ski conditions," etc.

Traffic accidents were still on the decline with the major causes of the remaining accidents being Mother Nature with her unpredictable moods, outdated and overcrowded parking lots, and speed, with speed being the leading motor vehicle violation factor. As far as Mother Nature and the parking lots go, we seem to have little or no control. However, on the motor vehicle violations we do, and will continue to in the upcoming year of 1984.

I would like to commend the New Hampshire State Police for the way they spearheaded the campaign against drunk drivers. This campaign has been noticeably effective in bringing a serious problem under control through arrest and public awareness programs. A job well done, Troopers.

Getting away from the motor vehicle aspect of law enforcement and into criminal violations, which are consuming more and more of law enforcements time, we find small time petty thievery to be a serious problem. This problem seems to be compounded by being interconnected with drug abuse and alcohol problems, both of which seem to be socially acceptable even though most times both are in direct violation of law. We, in the law enforcement field, are greatly disturbed by this and if you keep your ear to the ground I promise you will hear it begin to rumble.

From time to time we draw some negative criticism on the amount of emphasis put on protection of the tourist trade, but we must look at it from a realistic point of view and that is the fact that we are primarily two tourist communities. 1983 was a good trade year with several of the local establishments showing their biggest days ever. The tourist trade puts very little demand on your budgets compared to what they have left behind.

A Government Of the People, For the People, and By the People could become just words in a history book if We the People don't stand by our commitments and obligations and make sure we keep this the greatest country in the world.

A fine police officer and good friend asked me one day not too long ago, what I had done for my country today, and the worst of it was that I had to stop and think about it. Hopefully, next time you ask me, Sheriff Ash, I won't have to hesitate before I give you an answer.

There are times when we feel that a law is the result of poor legislation, or an unfortunate decision by our Supreme Court, but there is a small group of individuals, known as Police Officers, who refuse to throw in the towel on you, so please don't give up on them. We may be stubborn at times, but we think you're worth it. At a time when I didn't think a group of volunteers could possibly be anymore efficient then they already were, they went ahead and proved me wrong. That's what your Life Squad and Fire Departments are all about, with Life Squad members showing up at the scene of a serious medical problem almost immediately, and the Fire Department putting out a fire so fast that it would make any large city full-time fire department turn green with envy. And let's not forget our Highway Department. Until we all get a chance to put in 30 or more hours without a break behind the wheel of a snow plow, we probably won't understand why our road wasn't plowed and sanded first. These are all people who work closely with the Police Department and are never more than a call away.

Sgt. Anderson underwent 10 weeks of intensive training at the New Hampshire Police Academy, graduating with a final grade in the high 90s. Congratulations, Bob, but I never expected anything less.

March of 1984 will mark the 20th anniversary of my career in law enforcement since I became Chief in Sugar Hill, and if it meets with your approval, I would like to hang around for a few more years.

I wish to thank all the members of the Police Department for their dedication and caring for the people they are sworn to protect, and especially for their nice way of understanding when it seemed like the Chief wasn't having one of his better days.

Disagree without being disagreeable! By the way what did you do for your country today?

## TRI-TOWN RECYCLING CENTER

With a vote of support in 1981, an appropriation of funds in March of 1982, and considerable support from the Selectman's Office and Highway Department, the Tri-Town Recycling Center was opened for use on July 9, 1982. Since then the Recycling Committee has continually monitored the use of the facility and has made changes as necessary. Two important changes have occurred this year. With the Recycling Center in daily operation the Committee felt it would be more efficient to have the Selectman's Office arrange for the transfer of collected materials. The other change was the decision to collect only aluminium cans which will result in a greater return of funds to the towns.

The volunteer efforts of the citizens of Franconia, Easton and Sugar Hill have resulted in savings to our towns in two ways; 1) direct reimbursement from the sale of collected recyclables, and 2) recycled materials are not thrown into the green bins so we do not pay for their removal.

In the future the Committee looks to a long term relationship with the New Hampshire Resource Recovery Association which is hoping to contract with one vendor to collect materials on a regular basis. This should result in increased revenues to the towns. The Committee will continue its efforts to beautify the Transfer Station with a garden planned for spring this year. Thank you for continued support.
