REPORT OF ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

Goffstown, N. H. - March 12, 1946

Meeting opened at 10:00 o'clock in the forenoon by Moderator, Alfred W. Poore, Article One of Warrant read and check-list posted.

On motion of R. M. Gordon it was voted that the polls be now opened for voting, that the balance of Warrant be read and Articles 2 to 32 be acted upon at 1:30 o'clock in the afternoon, that the polls close at 6:30 o'clock and that our next Annual Town Meeting open at 10:00 o'clock in the forenoon.

Polls now open for voting.

1:30 P. M. Voted to dispense with reading of Warrant.

Report of Planning board given by Mr. David V. Prugh. The Board have maps of the Town, as planned, for sale. The Board will be ready to give any desired help in Zoning Laws.

Report of Budget Committee given by Lawrence W. Shirley explaining the Budget Committee's recommendation of each article. He also Commended Mr. Sym's, Tax Collector, for his splendid job of collecting taxes during 1945.

- ARTICLE 2. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of Fourteen Hundred (\$1,400.00) Dollars for the Goffstown Public Library.
- ARTICLE 3. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of Fifteen Hundred (\$1,500.00) Dollars for the maintenance and improvement in the Cemeteries.
 - ARTICLE 4. Voted to dismiss this article.
- ARTICLE 5. Voted to authorize the Selectmen to borrow from time to time, as needed, certain sums of money in anticipation of taxes not to exceed in total at any time

the sum of Thirty Thousand (\$30,000.00) Dollars, giving the Selectmen the right to renew said loans in anticipation of taxes as may be found necessary.

ARTICLE 6. Voted to authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any Real Estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's Deeds.

ARTICLE 7. Voted to allow the Selectmen to renew the Bridge note, so called, held by the Hillsborough County Savings Bank, upon which Three Thousand (\$3,000.00) Dollars is due August 1, 1946, at such time as the Bank may require.

ARTICLE 8. Voted to accept State Aid for improvement of Class Five (5) Roads and to raise and appropriate the sum of Twelve Hundred Twenty-six and 39/100 (\$1,226.39) Dollars, The State to contribute Four Thouand Nine Hundred Five and 57/100 (\$4,905.57) Dollars.

ARTICLE 9. Voted to dismiss this article.

ARTICLE 10. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of Four Thousand (\$4,000.00) Dollars for the continuation of the Sewers in Pinardville.

ARTICLE 11. Voted to extend the sewer on North Mast Street from Clinton Street to the residence of Mrs. Lewis Hoyt and to raise and appropriate money for the same.

ARTICLES 12 and 13. Voted to combine articles 12 and 13 and raise and appropriate Twenty-five Hundred (\$2,500.00) Dollars to be used with Three Hundred seventy-seven and 82/100 (\$377.82) Dollars left from 1945 appropriation for Pinardville Streets and Moose Club Park road.

ARTICLE 14. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Thousand (\$3,000.00) Dollars and recommended the Selectmen use additional funds from Class 5 road money as the State may approve, to widen, straighten and improve certain sections of the Goffstown Back Road to Manchester.

ARTICLE 15. Voted to dismiss this article.

ARTICLE 16. Voted to raise and appropriate the necessary money to install and maintain Street Lights on Mast Road from Pinard Street to Fairview Street.

ARTICLE 17. Voted to dismiss this article.

ARTICLE 18. Voted to extend the Street Lights on Mast Road at Parker Station a distance of approximately four Hundred (400) feet westerly and raise and appropriate money for the same.

ARTICLE 19. Voted to install a street light on Mast Road at the bus stop at Grasmere Station and raise and appropriate money for the same.

ARTICLE 20. Voted to defer this article until 1947.

ARTICLE 21. Voted to raise and appropriate a sum of Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the Natural advantages and resources of the Town together with other Towns of the Merrimack Valley Regional Association.

ARTICLE 22. Voted to dismiss this article.

ARTICLE 23. Voted to authorize the Trustees of the Trust Fund to transfer the School Fund, so called, the

principal of said fund being Three Hundred fifty (\$350.00) Dollars to the School District and the Parsonage Fund, so called, the Principal of said fund being Eight Hundred (\$800.00) Dollars to be divided in proportion as the Interest has been paid to the Churches.

ARTICLE 24. Voted to dismiss this article.

ARTICLE 25. Voted to dismiss this article.

ARTICLE 26. Voted to dismiss this article.

ARTICLE 27. Voted to establish a sewer fund, so called, so that all entrance fees or rentals shall be kept as a separate and distinct fund and that the Selectmen be authorized and instructed to keep all monies received from sewer entrances, rentals or sewer appropriation in a separate sewer fund to be used only for the repair, replacement or extension of the Sewer system of the Town, also that a Committee of three (3) be appointed by the Selectmen, elected at this meeting, to investigate Part 22, of Chapter 188 of the Public Acts of 1945 relating to sidewalks and sewers and the operation of said law and report to the next annual meeting with their recommendations as to whether or not provisions of this law should be adopted by the Town of Goffstown.

ARTICLE 28. Voted to dismiss this article.

ARTICLE 29. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Hundred fifty (\$350.00) Dollars for the improvement and maintenance of Barnard Playground, and care of Commons.

ARTICLE 30. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of Ninety-seven Thousand four Hundred forty-five and

42/100 (\$97,445.42) Dollars for the Support of the poor, construction and Maintenance of Highways and Bridges and all other necessary Town expenses for the ensuing year including the amount required for Memorial Day.

ARTICLE 31. Voted to accept the printed Town Reports.

TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Goffstown, in the County of Hillsborough and in said State, qualied to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Grange Hall in Goffstown Village on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

Polls for voting to open at ten o'clock in the forenoon and close at six o'clock in the afternoon.

First—To choose all Town Officers and Agents for the ensuing year, including a member of the Board of Selectmen for three years.

Second—To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Goffstown Public Library.

Third—To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for maintenance and improvements in our cemeteries.

Fourth—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Four Hundred (\$400.00) Dollars for the suppression of the White Pine Blister Rust.

Fifth—To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow from time to time as needed, certain sums of money in anticipation of taxes not to exceed in total at any time the sum of Thirty-Thousand (\$30,000.00) Dollars, giving the Selectmen the right to renew said loans as may be found necessary.

Sixth—To see if the Town will vote to authorize its Selectmen to administer or dispose of any Real Estate acquired by the Town through the Tax Collector's Deed or by gifts.

Seventh—To see if the Town will vote to allow its Selectmen to renew the Bridge note, so called, held by the Hillsborough County Savings Bank, upon which Two Thousand (\$2,000.00) Dollars is due August 1, 1947 at such times as the bank may require.

Eighth—To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid for improvement of Class Five Roads and to raise and appropriate the sum of Twelve Hundred Thirty-three and 57/100 (\$1,233.57) Dollars, the State to contribute Four Thousand Nine Hundred Thirty-four and 29/100 (\$4,934.29) Dollars.

Ninth—To see if the Town will vote to petition the State Tax Commission to have an audit made by the Division of Municipal Accounting and to make an appropriation to cover the same.

Tenth—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be used toward the eradication of Poison Ivy on public grounds and road sides.

Eleventh—To see if the Town will elect to approve of the inclusion of its Officers and Employees in the Employees' Retirement System of the State of New Hampshire, which system is provided for by Chapter 27-A of the Revised Laws, as inserted by Chapter 281 of the laws of 1945, and as provided by Chapter 201 of the Laws of 1945 and any subsequent amendments thereto.

If the Town votes in the affirmative on the preceding article, to see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Dollars (\$)

for the purpose of providing funds for the Town's contribution to said retirement system, for the coming year.

Twelfth—To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to secure the assistance of the State Tax Commission in reappraising the taxable property in the Town in order to secure greater equality as between taxpayers, and to insure the assessment of all property in the Town on the same standard of value, and to raise and appropriate money to pay for the same.

Thirteenth—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not exceeding one-one hundredth of one per cent (1-1/100) of One (1%) of the assessed valuation based on the 1946 assessment to the Merrimack Valley Region Association for the purpose of publicizing and promoting the natural advantages and resources of the Town in cooperation with the other 37 communities in the Merrimack Valley Region.

Fourteenth—Deferred from the 1946 Town Meeting to be acted upon at this meeting—To see if the Town will vote to instruct its Selectmen to lay out and the Town to accept a public highway extending to the top of the South Uncanoonuc Mountain from the existing way, in such specific place as the Selectmen shall deem advisable and raise and appropriate money for the same. This article is inserted on petition of E. Grace Laxson and 35 others.

Fifteenth—To see if the .Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the improvement and maintenance of Barnard Playground and care of Commons.

Sixteenth—To see if the Town will vote to authorize its Selectmen to construct a basement up to the First

Floor, with suitable fire proof vaults for the storage of all Town Records, and office rooms on the sight of the Old Town Hall, so that a Town Building can be erected thereon at such future time as the Town may vote for a Town Hall, and to issue notes in a sum not to exceed Thirteen Thousand (\$13,000.00) Dollars to be used with the insurance money from the old Town Hall fire. This basement will provide a room with seating capacity for over six hundred persons, sufficient for all town business.

Seventeenth—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Thousand (\$2,000.00) Dollars to be spent on streets in Pinardville, the same to be decided upon by the Selectmen.

Eighteenth—To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Four Thousand (\$4,000.00) Dollars for the extension of sewers at Pinardville, the same to be decided by the Selectmen.

Nineteenth—To see what action the Town will take relative to the pay of the Town workmen.

Twentieth—To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell a piece of land on Depot Street adjoining the land owned by Stephen Karanikas containing approximately 5,000 Sq. Ft. This article is inserted on petition of Stephen Karanikas and ten others.

Twenty-one—To see what action the Town will take on the following article: We the undersigned residents on the New Boston Road, in the Town of Goffstown, respectfully request the extension of the Town Water Service with hydrants for Fire Protection for Fifteen Hundred (1,500) feet on the New Boston Road. This article is inserted on petition of Herbert J. Richards and Seventeen others.

Twenty-two—To see if the Town will vote to install a Street light at the Junction of Mast Road and Rockland

Avenue, and on College Avenue at Corner of Holley St., Roy St. and Desaulnier Street and raise and appropriate money for the same. This article is inserted on petition of Amie Ranger and thirteen others.

Twenty-three—To see if the Town will vote to install a Street light near the residence of Anthony Babotas on Pleasant Street and at the junction of West Union Street and Pleasant Street and raise and appropriate money for the same. This article is inserted on petition of L. A. Arnold and twelve others.

Twenty-four To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Thousand (\$2,000.00) Dollars for a sewer on Elm Street in Goffstown Village.

Twenty-five—To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the poor, construction and maintenance of highways and bridges and all other necessary Town expenses for the ensuing year, including the amount for Memorial Day.

Twenty-six—To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors and Committees and pass any vote relating thereto.

Twenty-seven—To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF TRUSTEES GOFFSTOWN PUBLIC LIBRARY

Early in February our library suffered a serious loss in the sudden death of Miss Louise E. Marden, librarian since 1925. Ever an enthusiastic worker, Miss Marden's twenty-one years of service were characterized by her conscientious devotion to duty and she gave unstintingly of her time and energy in building up the library and making it of greater value in the community.

We were fortunate in having Miss Annie Harrington to take over the work after Miss Marden's passing, with Mrs. Marjorie Corning as assistant. Miss Harrington had been assistant to Miss Marden for the past eighteen years so was acquainted with the different phases of library work and well qualified to assume the position of librarian.

In September Miss Pratt of the State Library at Concord spent a day in Goffstown to assist Miss Harrington in discarding out-of-date books of non-fiction which occupied space on the shelves needed for modern works. The advice of an expert was most helpful as she was able to recognize books which were of no value or might be of local interest, while discarding those no longer useful. This is one of the gratuitous services our State Library offers to the small libraries of New Hampshire.

Re-wiring one of the outside lights and spraying the shade trees on the lawn constituted the principal items of repair expenses for the year. As in former years, the men on the Board of Trustees have put in considerable time making minor repairs, thereby keeping down maintenance expenses.

Our library received a bequest of one hundred dollars from the estate of the late Miss Mary A. Warren, former trustee, which is being held in reserve until a suitable use for it shall have been decided upon. To the Shirley Club for its annual gift of twenty dollars for the purchase of children's books, and to all others who, by gifts of books and magazines and by their cooperation, have helped to extend the usefulness of our library the trustees express their gratitude.

SCHOOL WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the School District in the Town of Goffstown qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the High School in said district on the 15th day of March, 1947, at 2 o'clock in the afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.
 - 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see if the district will vote to make any alteration in the amount of money required to be assessed for the ensuing year for the support of public schools and the payment of the statutory obligations of the district, as determined by the school board in its annual report.

9. To see if the School District will authorize the Goffstown School Board to sell at public auction any or all of the following schoolhouses:

Pattee Hill, Parker Station, and East Part.

- 10. To see what amount the district will vote to raise and appropriate (in addition to the amount provided at the 1946 School District meeting) to complete the construction and equipment of the proposed addition to the High School, and in order to furnish such funds, to authorize the School Board to issue bonds and notes, maturing not longer than 20 years from date of issue, in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Bond Act, New Hampshire Revised Laws 1942, Chapter 72.
- 11. To see if the district will authorize the School Board to contract for transportation of school pupils for a period of five years.
- 12. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School District of Goffstown:

I hereby submit my annual report as superintendent of schools.

The current school year opened with several changes in our teaching staff. At the high school three teachers resigned:—Miss Eleanor Strobel, Mrs. Elizabeth Marden, and Mr. William Picerillo. Miss Strobel was replaced by Thelma M. Batchelder of Sanford, Maine, Nasson College '44, in the Home Economics Department. Eleanor Thomas of Norwich, Vermont, Plymouth Teachers College, '46, was selected for the Commercial Department. George L. Murray, a graduate of the University of Maine, was engaged as teacher of mathematics and science, and coach of athletics. Prior to his service in the armed forces, Mr. Murray taught in the Weare High School, and, following his discharge, completed the school year '45-'46 in the upper room at Grasmere.

In the elementary schools, Mrs. Josephine Merrill of Dunbarton replaced Mr. Murray at Grasmere. Miss Marion Nelson, primary teacher at the White Building, transferred to Manchester, and Mrs. Una McKee, who taught last year at the Shirley Hill School, was moved to the White School. Miss Phyllis M. Knox of Beverley was secured for the Shirley Hill School.

Our enrollment figures for the current year are approximately the same as a year ago. The crowded conditions at the White School were relieved by moving the sixth grade to the High School building. Miss Natalie Clough, who had taught for three years in Pike, was employed as teacher in the new room. This shift of pupils

has provided a much more satisfactory arrangement, for the teacher load was reduced from 38 to 46 pupils per room in the White Building to an average of 32. The present distribution finds the first and part of the second, the remainder of the second and the third, the fourth and fifth occupying the three rooms of the White School.

Such a shift, although vastly improving the quality of instruction in the White Building, has brought its problems to the High School. Including the sixth grade in the latter building has crowded the facilities of the High School. As the rear of the auditorium is now used for high school classes, it is not an ideal situation. The problem must be corrected as soon as possible.

At the 1946 School District meeting the school board was authorized to proceed with plans and specifications for an addition to the High School plant. The board was also authorized to borrow up to the bond limit of the district for such construction. The plans were completed late in the spring and bids were requested. With the costs of materials and labor as they were, no contractor was interested in making a competitive bid, and what figures were presented were out of reason and the ability of the district to accept.

However, the plans and specifications are ready for immediate construction as soon as a logical bid is received. The plans call for not only the addition of an auditorium gymnasium, but also shop and home economics facilities, together with three additional classrooms. The construction of this addition would allow for the immediate closing of the White Building. With the addition of an auditorium, the present assembly hall at the High School would be converted into two additional classrooms, giving us five more classrooms than at present.

Until such additional room is available, our problem of satisfactory facilities for our youngsters continues. This coming year we expect 52 pupils in Grades 7 and 8 (1946-47 enrollment 35). Just what adjustments can be

made are not known at this writing. Our grades in the Whire School are gradually increasing and our over-all village housing problem is even more acute for the coming school year than was the case this past fall. Additional facilities must be forthcoming at an early date.

The estimated expenses of the School Board for the coming school year is presented on an adjoining page of this report. Several items show increases due to higher costs, including fuel, books, and supplies. The major increases are in transportation and teachers' salaries. During the current school year our expenditures for transportation exceeded the estimate of a year ago, because of an added number of pupils on Paige Hill and Shirley Hill. There is no anticipated decrease in the number of pupils to be transported another year.

Our expenditures of teachers' salaries this current year approximated closely the amount appropriated last spring, the figure asked for in the budget plus an additional amount raised at the district meeting. The total amount available for teachers' salaries permitted us to pay our teachers an average salary approximating that paid teachers in comparable towns. However, bonus payments for the current year, those already made and those proposed for action at the March meetings, will necessitate our granting substantial increases for another year. With the supply of potential teachers in our Teachers' Colleges far below the demands of the schools of the state, the salaries paid beginning teachers will cause a corresponding increase for teachers now in service.

I feel that our schools have not only held their own during these difficult times, but I further feel that we have made substantial progress on both our high and elementary levels. If these gains are to be held and built upon, we must keep pace with other towns of equal size and wealth. To fail to take such action will mean that we are willing to sacrifice our gains for financial reasons.

To lose experienced and satisfactory teachers, and to be unable to hire competent replacing teachers would be far from wise; to lose a proven teacher and to have to pay slightly less for a teacher of unknown ability is not sound business.

On December first, Mrs. Florence P. Wakefield asked to be relieved from further service. Mrs. Wakefield has served well the young people of the Paige Hill and Bartlett Schools over a period of 35 years. Her efforts, I am sure, are appreciated by many parents and former pupils.

In closing may I express my appreciation to the teachers and School Board for their fine spirit of cooperation, and to the citizens of Goffstown for their support of our educational program. Their enthusiastic response to our problems, as manifested in the annual meeting of March, 1946, will long be appreciated.

REPORT OF THE SCHOOL NURSE

The school nurse submits the following report for the school year September, 1945 through December 1946.

About 500 pupils were weighed, measured and examined in September, the beginning of the school year. The following report shows the number of pupils affected at that time:

Defective vision 39. Number of defects corrected 32. Defective teeth 380. Number of defects corrected 180. Diseased tonsils 44. Number of defects corrected 15.

There were 17 cases of chicken pox from October 1945 through January 1946.

Eighteen children had measles during May and June, 1946.

Twenty-two children had mumps during the fall of 1945 and spring of 1946.

One child had poliomyelitis in January 1946.

One child was accompanied to the hospital for a slight operation.

One child was accompanied to the dentist.

One child was accompanied to the physician.

One child was accompanied to the hospital for complete blood test.

One child was accompanied to the mental hygiene clinic in Manchester.

One child went to the Hanover Eye Clinic for an examination and was fitted to glasses last summer.

A toxoid clinic was given December 14, 1945 and January 11, 1946. Eighty pupils took the treatment.

A Patch test was given March 4, 21, 1946. Three hundred and six children received the test. Four showed a positive reaction but later when X-rayed the report read normal. This test is given for the purpose of finding children who may be presenting early symptoms and signs of tuberculosis. Should there be a positive reaction to the test, it should be followed by a chest X-ray in order that prompt treatment may be properly prescribed. All those who showed a positive reaction were X-rayed at Dr. Kerr's tubercular clinic in Manchester. Those who were not in school last year will be given this test the first of February when it is given again in our schools.

REPORT OF THE PLANNING BOARD

During the past year the board has attempted to draft a Zoning Law intended to be feasible and practical for the various districts of the Town. The Law as proposed has not met with the approval of the majority of those to whom it has been presented. A Majority of the Town seem however to favor a zoning law.

Several provisions of the proposed law have caused such opposition that changes must be made to meet general approval. The time already spent upon the subject has

not seemed to be adequate.

Many groups and organizations in the Town have not had an opportunity to discuss the subject of zoning.

In view of the above the Planning Board has decided not to propose a zoning law for the present Town Meeting. During the next year the Board will continue its work on an improved draft of the law. The coming year will undoubtedly bring about considerable changes in the residential and commercial aspects of the Town, and these developments will affect the planning of our future zoning requirements.
